1. The "Advanced Training Centre for Subsistence Recruits" is located at MILAN - Via Olivieri (Baggio).

For the training the Centre uses also the establishments of MILAN Commissariat, the Municipal Slaughterery and Bakery.

2. The following personnel are at the Centre as instructors:-

This personnel is not counted against the training ceiling of 12,500, as it is temporarily attached to the Centre from all Commissariat Directorates of Military Territorial Commands, thus remaining on their strength.

The disciplinary and technical supervision is the care of Milan Commissariat Director.

The administration is devolved to 3 Supply Coy.

3. The syllabus of the course is attached herewith.

4. 502 men are due to be trained.

SUBJECT: Training of Supply Personnel

Land Forces Sub-Com, AC (MILIA)

TO : Ministry of War

Reference your letter 4166/R/9 of 22 Dec 45.

1. Your proposal that the training of subsistence personnel should be carried out in existing supply installations is agreed to. However this HQ does not consider, for the following reasons, that the installations in Rome offer the best possible training facilities:-

- (a) Training of personnel in Bulk Depot work would be impracticable since no Bulk Depot exists in Rome Territorial Command and the Distribution Depot does not hold large stocks.
- (b) There is no suitable Central Military Bakery where recruits can be trained.
- (c) Practical training could be carried out in the Distribution Depot, but this is not recommended for the following reasons:-
 - (i) personnel trained in the Distribution Depot would have no knowledge of handling bulk supplies, documentation of same, warranty expiry technicalities, recovery of damaged commodities or despatch of rail or road packs;
 - (ii) the Depot is sited in antiquated buildings; it does not lend itself to modern supply methods and would therefore give a wrong impression to recruits.

2. It is therefore suggested that training should be done in MILAN Territorial Command and it is requested that the following be considered in support of the suggestion:-

- (a) There is a Bulk Depot situated in MILAN approximately two miles from the Distribution Depot. This Depot is well laid-out in a modern warehouse. It is served by both rail and road.
- (b) The Distribution depot and Bakery are situated in one building.
- (c) The Distribution Depot is well laid-out and conforms to a high technical standard.
- (d) The Bakery has adequate facilities for training, and machinery exists for recovery of damaged or suspected flour.

- (e) It is understood that a location has now been found in MILAN for a Forage Depot. This would enable instruction to be given on this subject.
