Additional Notes on Inspection of No 9 C.A.R.

(BARI) by GSO II (Schools) on 25/24 May 1946.

1. General

The call up was satisfactory. The standard of recruit is particularly bad in this area some are quite illiterate. The "dialect" problem hinders the instructors considerably.

2. Accommodation

(a) The C.A.R. consists of 3 Barracks grouped close together on the outskirts of BARI.

SAN PASQUALE

Repair work is not yet complete. Will eventually be a very good centre as far as accommodation is concerned.

3. Clothing

(a) The boot situation is very serious. In nearly every squad I examined there were men with boots held together by pieces of string. A few had no soles and others had gaping holes at the sides. No cleaning is attempted. Dubbin or some such material would prevent a lot of the cracking.

The material however is definitely bad.

(b) Socks are really appalling. Most of the men are without any at all as they have shrunk almost out of sight.

Generally the turn-out is extremely bad. There is no attempt at smartness.

4. Medical

The M.O. stated that he found it impossible to carry out his normal medical inspections, inoculations, etc., and also to inspect the barracks regularly. He said that an additional M.O. was necessary to carry out medical duties satisfactorily.

5. Week end Leave

The Chief Instructor remarked that a certain amount of dissatisfaction was prevalent over this point.

The permanent staff are allowed Sunday afternoons off. I advised him to discuss the matter with Commandant and to suggest a 25% week end leave roster.

6. Transport

A car for each Bn commander is essential in this area. I.e. an increase of 3 staff cars.

7. Arms

The need of a trained armourer is very noticeable. I advised the Commandant to ensure that on arrival of the skilled civilian armourer he should detail one man (or two) per Bn to report to him for a course of instruction.

8. Range practices

It is strongly recommended that in of W issue a "Range Directive" to all CAR's laying down the method by which the Range Courses are to be carried out.

The following points illustrate the need of such a directive:-

- (a) Attached 30yd Range is too large. *Target.*

1. A rehearsal for the arrival of recruits was held at 9 Terr CAR on the 28 Feb. Two weaknesses were apparent.
2. Firstly, the time for documentation had been underestimated. One set of 3 clerks (one for each document) dealt with 20 men in one hour. The rate of the whole procedure was retarded accordingly.

It was decided that six sets of clerks are required, with others available if the influx of recruits should exceed 720 in one day.

3. Secondly, no-one had thought of the most important signpost. It is now being manufactured in large numbers and marked "GABINETTO"

4. The reason for the inclusion of Major Clark in the batch of "recruits" was not fully appreciated, except by his squad sergeant, who asked questions about his family and about his journey to the CAR. Each time a B.F. question was asked there was a tendency among officers to rush up and explain to the "Signor Maggiore".
