Subject:- return of reserve Officer
Cadets School Bks (PALERMO).

The Palermo Military Terr. HQ has pointed out that two barracks (Rocca and Turba) which the 11th CAR has, are absolutely insufficient to meet actual requirement. Rooms whose normal capacity is about 20 men, accommodate 56 men in double bunks, each touching without any spacing in between them.

The aforesaid HQ whilst reporting this situation, has reported that the CAR could be comfortably accommodated in the Reserve Cadet Officer's School Bks.

A Battalion could be comfortably accommodated there. This Bks is however at present occupied by a P.S. Unit, with a presumed strength of about 200 men. I.e. it is only partially used with a number of men with no more than 6 or 7 to a room.

Steps taken by the Military Authorities for the release of the Bks have been unsuccessful.

We ask your MMIA to examine the possibility of approaching the competent S/C to obtain the release of the Bks which could be put at the disposal of the Palermo Military Territorial HQ.

Reference your Trg/41/1 dated 29 May 46.

1. On 19 June 46 a reconnaissance of ROVEZZANO barracks . FLORENCE was made in company with Col. CHIARIOTTI (Chief of Staff 7 Terr. Comd). The question of moving one Bn. of 7 C.A.R. into these barracks was discussed.
2. Gen IRE SIMONE, Comd 7 Terr. Comd. has now decided against this move and has recommended to the MINISTRY of WAR that one bn. should move to CADORNA barracks AREZZO.
3. This reasons for this decision are :-
 - (a) that CADORNA barracks are in a better state of repair than ROVEZZANO barracks and can be made ready for occupation in a few weeks,
 - (b) that better facilities exist in AREZZO for the accommodation of married families,
 - (c) that training grounds are more accessible.
4. It is estimated that approximately six weeks work is necessary to prepare ROVEZZANO barracks for occupation at an estimated cost of 70,000,000 (seventy million) lire. In view of the lack of time available and the reasons given in para 3 above the move to AREZZO is considered desirable.

2. This HQ has no objections to the above, and agrees with your suggestions:
 - (a) to carry out further investigations,
 - (b) to enter into discussion with HQ 7 Terr. Comd.
3. In weighing up the merits of these Barracks over AREZZO, you should give particular attention to the problem of accommodation for married families.
4. A final ruling will be given when the results of your further investigations and discussion with 7 Terr. Comd are known.
