

1. Allied installations at Cecchignola consist of the South African (W.D.F.) Transit Camp and Rest Centre. The object of this Centre is the repatriation to South Africa of wives and families (largely of Italian origin) of South African Military Personnel. There is no possibility of a closure of this camp till the work is completed.
2. The only German troops are the Graves Concentration Unit. In their case also there is little chance of closure of their camp for some time.

SUBJECT:- Cecchignola - Area 800.

1. The School of Motorisation is unable to begin settling in at Cecchignola, as area 800, which was previously occupied by Polish is now occupied by a platoon of New Zealand troops, and by German POWs.
2. These, when the Allied troops vacated the area, took away a considerable quantity of material, so that we have been compelled to arrange for a proper out door guard to avoid further losses.
3. As regards the above, please see if it possible to order the removal of a/m New Zealand platoon and POWs, who are seriously affecting the carrying out of the definite plan for the organisation of the School.

SUBJECT:- Rome - Cecchignola - <sup>E</sup>8<sup>\*</sup> Heavy Artillery Barracks.

For the accomodation and training requirements of the trainee drivers battalion of the M.T. school, this Ministry decided to use the ex 8<sup>\*</sup> artillery barracks at Cecchignola, originally occupied by Polish troops and then, since October 1946, by the U.D.F. Transit Camp. RAF

We would be very grateful if your Section, which has always been so ready to meet the needs of the Italian Army, would kindly arrange for the return of the said barracks as soon as possible.

Should it not be possible for the Allied troops to vacate all the barracks, we would be grateful to have at our disposal at least barrack blocks 807 and 808, which would be, in such case, seperated from the rest of the barracks by a barbed wire fence.





- 2 - Said authorisation is granted in <sup>order</sup> view to give a start to the repair activities to be carried out in the building before the move of the refugees who are accomodated there takes place, so that the Academy can start in Modena the Scholar-Year 1946-47.
- 3 - It is understood that works will have to be limited to buildings which are not at present occupied and without causing prejudice to refugees accomodated there.

SUBJECT: Location of the Pioneers School

It is known that, whilst waiting for the retitution to the Italian Army of the "Pietralata" Barracks in Rome, the Engineer Pioneers School has been temporarily accommodated in the "Aurelia" Barracks, Civitavecchia.

The area in which the barracks is situated is notoriously malarious and while efficient prophylactic measures can be adopted for the troops billeted in buildings, the planned accommodation in tents in the courtyards of the barracks of a part of the recruits will create favourable conditions for the spread of the disease.


The departments of the medical service have been approached in order that they may take all the necessary measures to combat the outbreak and spreading of malaria, but in the meanwhile we request from your Mission that if possible the "Pietralata" Barracks be returned before the commencement of the epidemic season.

We would be pleased of the interest of your Mission in the matter.

Memoria for Lt. Col. Medlam

Subject; Location of H.Q. Central Military Schools

1) - General Ronco agrees with Colonel Mackay on the advisability of the H.Q. of the Military Schools with 12 BLU being transferred to Rome in view of the following advantages:

- a more central location as compared with the location of the various schools: Civitavecchia, Bracciano, Cesano, Rieti, Cecchignola, and, shortly, Pietralata and also perhaps Spoleto; this will not only facilitate communication by road and rail but will also render possible speedy telephonic communication with each of the schools, something which is practically out of the reckoning for Cesano to Rieti and Civitavecchia and is also very difficult to Cecchignola.
- proximity to the H.Q.s with which the C.M.S. and the BLU have the most frequent contact (SMRE - MMIA - Directorate Generals and Inspectorates, etc.) thus giving the possibility of speedy solution to urgent problems;
- appreciable easing of the question of married quarters for officers and S.NCOs (a question which at the moment has a large bearing on the morale and work of many) insofar as the transfer of the C.M.S.H.Q. and the BLU will release many buildings which are ready to be used as billets for the Infantry School.  
The measure will also be of appreciable assistance to the numerous officers of the Schools H.Q. who have families in Rome;
- the Police School, whose billets are at present inadequate, could extend itself to the premises at present occupied by NCOs and ORs of the two H.Q.s being transferred and thus attain a definitely suitable billeting arrangement.

2) - We have been informed that the Braschi building, in Rome, derequisitioned by the Allied Authorities will be handed over to the Italian Military Authorities. Billeting in the Braschi building offers every kind of facility for officers married, and the accommodation of officers and S.NCOs without families, both for British and Italian personnel.

- 3) - General Ronco has formally instructed me to obtain the opinion of the M.M.I.A. on the projected transfer and accomodation in the Braschi building.

Aide Memoire for CGC on Command and Staffs of Army Schools.

1. Background. Up to the present Brig Gen BRICO commanded FINEC TRS Div at CASANO, Brig Gen MARIOLLI was Commandant of Military Schools which consisted chiefly of SIVA and was subordinated to Gen RUMCO. Both are stationed at CASANO.

2. With the disbandment of FINEC Div, which is now in course of completion, the two Generals and their staffs result in an unnecessary duplication of effort which, apart from lack of economy, leads to friction and confusion.

3. Accommodation Angle. The quarters occupied by both Commanders and Staffs and also FINEC are all flats and living quarters badly needed for married families of the permanent staff at CASANO.

4. Location of Commandants of Military Schools. It is considered that Commandants of all Military Schools should not be located at one particular school as he tends to become biased in that direction and to give undue attention to that school at the expense of others, also there becomes a tendency to associate him particularly with the school at which he is stationed.

5. Recommendations.

A. Brig Gen BRICO and a small staff should move to RUMCO or vicinity and carry out the duties of co-ordinator of all schools. He could be regarded as an embryo "SCHOOLS" staff, in the future, right work in parallel with a staff who, in the future, might work in parallel with a staff to be permitted to adopt this system. A staff organization for the Commander and staff exists at CRANICOLA which is very close to RUMCO but has the same disadvantage as that given in para 4 above.

B. Brig Gen MARIOLLI and staff should move to CIVILAVICCHIA and become:-

i. Commandant of Tactical School whose importance warrants a Brigadier in command.

ii. CG Troops and local administrator for the various other schools and establishments that may be sited at CIVILAVICCHIA. It should be made quite clear however that as far as policy and training doctrine is concerned he is commandant of the Tactical School only.

C. It is for consideration if the size and importance of the Inf School at CASANO does not warrant a Brig Gen as Commandant. Accommodation for this small Inf could be made available at CASANO without the use of the buildings required for married quarters vide para 3 above. This Brig Gen would also act as CG Troops CASANO with similar responsibilities for other schools in the area as in 5 B (ii) above.

3. Accommodation Inq'. The quarters occupied by both Commanders and Staffs and also 12 BLD are all flats and living quarters badly needed for married families of the permanent staff at GEMANO.

4. Location of Commandant of Military Schools. It is considered that Commandant of all Military Schools should not be located at one particular school as he tends to become biased in that direction and to give undue attention to that school at the expense of others, also there becomes a tendency to associate him particularly with the school at which he is stationed.

5. Recommendations.

A. Brig Gen RAMGO and a small staff should move to RUMI or vicinity and carry out the duties of co-ordinator of all schools. He could be regarded as an embryo of "Schools", who, in the future, might work in parallel with a DME "field training" under a JG at SAMS, if the Ministry can be persuaded to adopt this system. Ample accommodation for the Commander and staff exists at CASUBENGA which is very close to RUMI but has the same disadvantages as that given in para 4 above.

B. Brig Gen MARIKOLI and staff should move to CIVILAVECCOLA and become:-

i. Commandant of Tactical School whose importance warrants a Brigadier in command.

ii. CO Troops and local administrator for the various other schools and establishments that may be sited at CIVILAVECCOLA. It should be made quite clear however that as for an Policy and training doctrine is concerned he is commandant of the Tactical School only.

C. It is for consideration if the size and importance of the Inf School at GEMANO does not warrant a Brig Gen as Commandant. Accommodation for this small HQ could be made available at GEMANO without the use of the buildings required for married quarters vide para 3 above. This Brig Gen would also act as CO Troops GEMANO with similar responsibilities for other schools in the area as in 5 B (ii) above.



