2. The delay in replying is regretted, and is due to the fact that matters concerning ITALIAN Army Intelligence and the set-up to be authorised have been under the discussion for some months and agreement was reached only on 16 Dec '46 when AFIS approved ITALIAN proposals outlined in a Ministry of War letter dated 7 Nov '46 (ref 5315).

3. At a meeting held on 27 Dec '46 at the Ministry of War the final figures were approved and attached charts furnish the set-up of the new ITALIAN 'I' Branch. Shortage of man-power is the chief reason for reduction in personnel shown by amendments to figures which were originally submitted by the ITALIANS in their letter of 7 Nov '46.

The delay in replying is regretted, and is due to the fact that matters concerning ITALIAN Army Intelligence and the set-up to be authorised have been under the discussion for some months and agreement was reached only on 16 Dec '46 when AFHQ approved ITALIAN proposals outlined in a Ministry of War letter dated 7 Nov '46 (ref 5315).
3. At a meeting held on 27 Dec '46 at the Ministry of War the final figures were approved and attached charts furnish the set-up of the new ITALIAN 'I' Branch. Shortage of man-power is the chief reason for reduction in personnel shown by amendments to figures which were originally submitted by the ITALIANS in their letter of 7 Nov '46.

1. Reference is made to tele conversation Lt-Col YOUNG - Major De THIERRY, morning 6 Dec 46, concerning the organisation of the Intelligence Branch of the ITALIAN Army.
2. Complying with Lt-Col YOUNG's request, copies of the undermentioned documents are attached hereto :-
  - (a) Minutes of the meeting held in MIA Conference Room, ROMA, on 20 Jul 46, re "Handing back of 808 GS Bn to ITALIAN Government".
  - (b) Letter No 5315/Ord/I di prot dated ROMA 7 Nov 46, of War Ministry, subject :- Disbandment of 808 GS Bn and Transformation of 'I' Branch.  
(Note this letter was not officially sent to MIA but was shown to Major De THIERRY by Tec.Col CALG of the Ufficio Ordinamento).

3. At the meeting on the 20th Jul 46 no mention appears to have been made by AMHQ rep of the ITALIAN Ministry of War Memorandum dated 7 Jul 46, addressed to AMHQ, subject :- Organisation of the ITALIAN Army Intelligence Service, in which a strength of 650 all ranks is suggested. No copy of this Memorandum was sent by Ministry of War to MIA.
4. Reference para 5 of the Minutes of the said meeting no letter appears to have been written to the ITALIAN War Ministry limiting the security 'I' B section to 119 all ranks.
5. Reference para (6) of the said Minutes. **138**

SUBJECT: Reorganization of the "I" Branch.

- 1) Yesterday morning 7 November an officer of the W/E branch of the General Staff of the Army called at the M.M.I.A. and submitted the new W/E prepared by the "I" Branch to Major DE THIERRY for examination.

Major DE THIERRY pointed out that according to instructions received by him the 2nd section of the branch (ex 808) should not exceed a total strength of 119 all ranks. Hence bearing in mind that the old organization of the "I" branch was fixed at 110 all ranks, the new organization should not exceed a total of 229 (110 + 119).

The new organization prepared by the branch and approved by the competent bodies of the General Staff comprises a personnel of about 750; there is therefore an enormous difference between the organization suggested by the branch and that according to Major DE THIERRY.

- 2) As a matter of fact on 7 July 1946 the chief of the "I" branch, in compliance with a verbal request of 2 July, submitted to the chief of G-2, R.F.H.Q., a memo setting out the scheme for the reorganization of the branch when the 808 would be handed back to the Italians.

Attached to the memo was a plan showing the subdivision of the branch into its several sections.

In the text of the memo it was contemplated that the new organization would have a total strength of about 650 personnel, pointing out the economy that would be effected over the preceding organization.

(1000 of the 808 plus 110 of the branch).

- 3) The chief of G-2 raised no objection to the memo presented by the chief of the "I" branch and therefore it must be assumed that the said memo was approved.

In confirmation of said approval AFHQ, with letter 384

G.B.I.- O of 26 July addressed to the Chief of Italian Staff, asked him to take over again the operational control of 808 C.S. Bn with effect from 15 August 1946.

In this letter no mention is made of reductions in strength hence it is logical to assume that the Italian General Staff could plan a new organization within the limits of strength allowed at that time (1000+110).

Thus the branch, in accord with the views expressed in the memo of 7 July, prepared a plan of the new organization which was yesterday submitted to Major DE THIERRY for his perusal.

- 4) From the above it will be realized how unexpected Major DE THIERRY'S remarks were.

A possible explanation is that M.M.I.A. was not aware of the conversations which took place between the chief of G-2 and the chief of the "I" branch on 7 July.

If this is the case, then it is advisable that M.M.I.A. be informed of the said memo.

- 5) It is advisable to mention that according to the figures mentioned by Major DE THIERRY (110+119) it would be possible to set up a modest central organization only and that all the centres in the provinces would have to be suppressed.

It is unnecessary to ~~contact~~<sup>communicate</sup> on the work such an organization could render.

Since the Allied authorities have made known their intention of entrusting the Italian authorities in the future with the supervision of the 808 CS Bn., it would be advisable to reorganize it with a view towards improving its efficiency. This would result in greater economy of personnel and proficiency of technique necessary for a peace-time service. In case the Allies should decide to avail themselves of the collaboration of Italian IS agencies, it is obvious that a reorganized 808 CS Bn would be of far greater utility to the Allies.

I. General Principles

The present memorandum is based on the following general principles:

- a) entrust the "Servizio I" with tasks of exclusively military interest, under a defensive and security viewpoint;
- b) make the service a completely apolitical organisation;
- c) unite the various branches of the service into a more unified whole;
- d) dismiss all elements in the organisation whose services are not considered indispensable.
- e) careful selection of all personnel who possess qualities necessary to the whole.

(1) Only the requirements of the General Army Service are taken into consideration omitting any reference to IS units attached to territorial commands, divisions or lesser units.

W. Specific Principles

- a) Gathering of information: the 1st Section should be entrusted with the task of total organising for the gathering of information;
- b) Evaluation and Dissemination of Information: These activities should be entrusted to the 3rd Section;
- c) Counter-Espionage: This agency should be reorganized along a line of policy more adaptable to the needs and requirements of peace time. Its personnel should be reduced and only efficient agents left in the cadre. Moreover, agents should be provided with proper cover, since most of the CS personnel is too well-known. This service would constitute le 2nd Section of the "Ufficio I".
- d) Other Activities: With a few changes, the 4th and 5th Sections should be entrusted with all other activities. (See Table attached).

III. Measures to be Taken.

In view of the above principles, it would be necessary to achieve the following:

a) Disbandment of 808 CS Bn.

As stated before, the 808 CS Bn is incapable to fulfilling the requirements of a peace-time counter-espionage agency, since this most delicate service should be entrusted to a limited but extremely capable personnel in complete secrecy. Moreover, the situation and assignments of each member of the battalion should be re-examined with a view to giving the organisation greater unity and, consequently, increasing its efficiency.

This information is no longer considered useful, and the disbandment of these groups is recommended, especially in view of the fact that many of their elements have expressed the desire to relinquish their posts.

It is suggested that detached groups take the place of the disbanded EI groups. These detached groups should operate under the supervision of the "Ufficio I", and should be stationed at the four Italian frontiers and at BARI. They should gather military information of a defensive character.

Specifically:

- report on the situation at the Italian frontiers;
- control the passage of foreigners entering or leaving Italy;
- gather information on the politico-military situation in the neighbouring countries and the Balkans.

These groups, which should consist of very few agents, should be formed partly by elements of the disbanded EI units and partly by the personnel of the "Situation Group" of the 808 CS Bn (former CSDIC).

- (a) The Italians may form their own intelligence organisation, on the basis of the W/E given in Ministry of War letter No. 18947/Ord I di Prot, dated Rome 2 Dec 45.
- (b) The Italians are not to be permitted to form an espionage organisation to penetrate other countries, nor are they to send any agents outside ITALY.
- (c) The Italians may be permitted the use of codes and ciphers.
- (d) 808 CS Bn is to remain under Allied Operational control for the present. When the situation permits, they will be handed back to the Italian army for disbandment, or such other duties as are deemed advisable.

Espionage and Counter-Espionage. Italians are not allowed to send agents east of Venice. Col de Pasquale gets information from travellers to various countries and it is assumed that he indicates the kind of information he requires. It would be very difficult to prevent Italians doing espionage and counter-espionage.

Ciphers and Wireless Interception. Italians are allowed to prepare and use their own Ciphers and can appoint personnel for Cipher work.

Wireless Interception. It is very difficult to stop Italians intercepting wireless communication.

Decision of Meeting regarding Organisation of Italian "I" Branch.

The Italians should organise their "I" Branch according to their proposals outlined in Ministry of War letter 18947/ORD. I di prot dated 2 Dec 1945.

They can use the personnel as they think fit as it is difficult to exercise any control as to the nature of information they obtain or how they employ their personnel.

The Security Section, (Sezione II) will be formed when the 808 C.S. Bn is handed back. These are accessory services which for security reasons must come under the control of the "I" Branch, although strictly speaking, they are not performing true "I" duties. Therefore the personnel engaged on "I" work is only 46 among which are included also the 100s doing office work (typists, filing clerks etc.).

The experience in these last months has shown that the author is small and barely sufficient to cope with the main function of the "I" Branch in a manner not wholly satisfactory.

3. Duties of the CC, RR

7. Switzerland, which has always observed strict neutrality, has an efficient "I" Branch.

8. The "I" Branch should be in a position to keep the War Minister informed on all developments all over the world which have a bearing on military matters. General information of this nature is contained in the press and technical publications.

9. To the question - "Why have the Italians a group studying North Africa?" - De Francesco stated that Tripoli, Misurata, Derna and Bengasi are Italian provinces and up to now are considered those of Italy proper. (Decree of Jan 9th 1939.)

10. Italians have a group studying Bulgaria, Rumania, Albania and Greece because these countries could give military aid to Jugoslavia.

- 11. The Italians now have Military Attaches in Bulgaria, Turkey, Sweden, Switzerland, Portugal, Spain, Argentine. As these Attaches send reports to Rome it follows that there must be an officer or officers to collate this information.

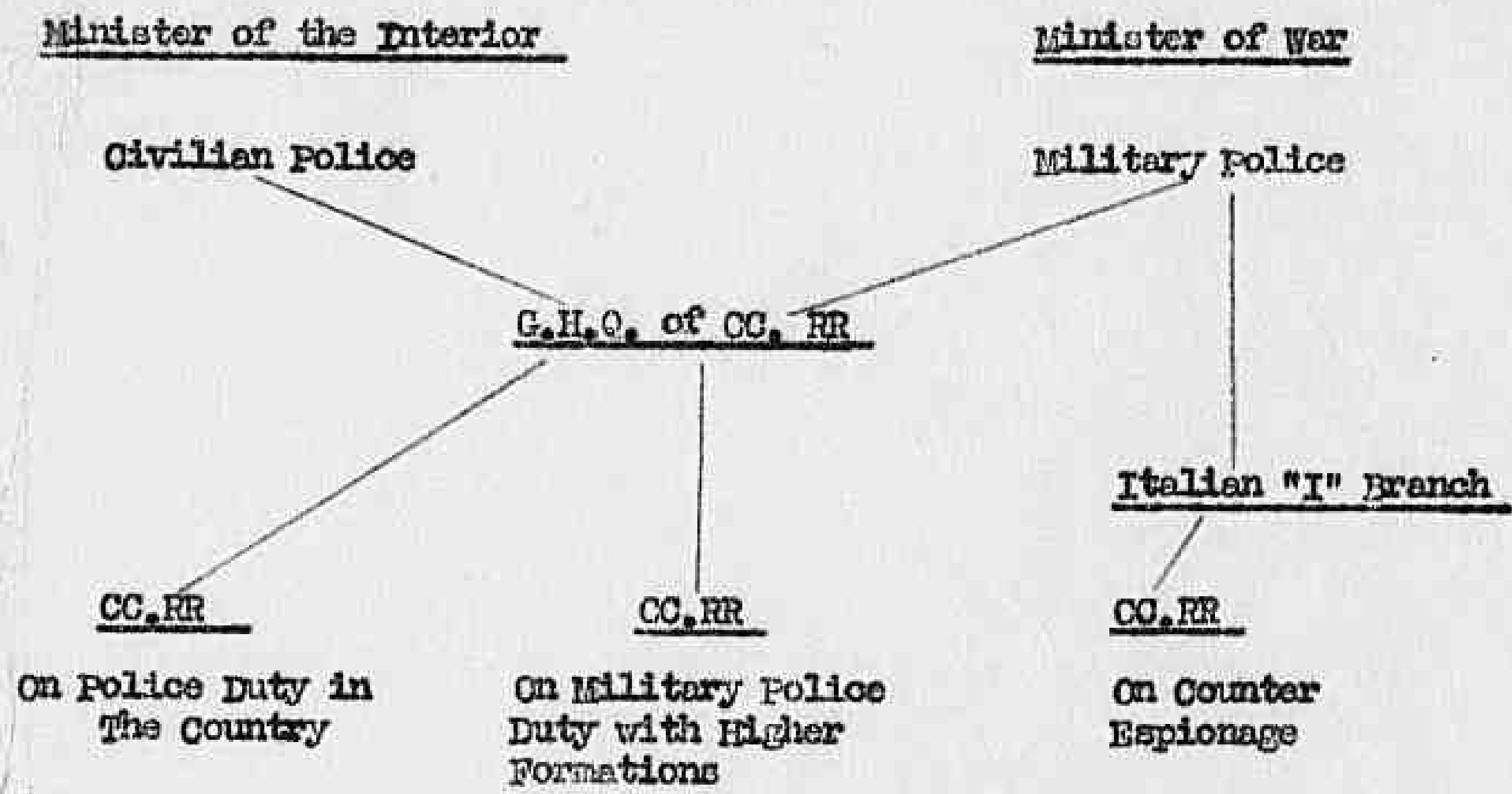

MEMORANDUM

Intelligence Organization of New Italian Army

B.

1. It is agreed with reference to Para 1 G.(4) of the ARHQ Staff Study that the Army will be responsible for purely military security as opposed to civil security. It is felt however that the drastic curtailment of the duties and functions of SOG U.S. Pa. and its employment for purely military security duties cannot be supported for the following reasons :

(a) SOG U.S. is a highly specialised body of men, whose knowledge and experience will be wasted if they are confined to purely military security duties.

(b) The present system of small semi independent U.S. detachments at important centres works well. These detachments have considerable latitude, develop their own individuality and method of working, and the excellent work they have done and are doing will be completely nullified by any form of regimentation or absorption into a military organization. The complete loss of individuality and initiative of personnel engaged in investigative work when drawn into the Italian Army organization is most marked and has been the despair of every public safety officer.

(c) Military and civil security are so inextricably mixed in practice, if not in theory, that the divorce of the functions of SOG U.S. from civil security would have a reverse effect from that intended in Para 2 (a). For example, in England, military intelligence could not function without the assistance of the civil police.

(d) Even in war time, by far the greater part of police work in Italy is done by the carabinieri. In the large majority of the communes, the only police authority is the carabinieri, the various guardia municipali being only employed for the enforcement of local bye laws and regulations. The local detachments of U.S. therefore have their

It is considered that the recommendation would have the effect of destroying this system which is working extremely well.

(e) Although the first sentence of Para 1 (r) is not strictly accurate, most Questure having an Ufficio Politico with functions as described, the majority of communes have no Questura and therefore they are not so well informed with local trends and activities as are the carabinieri. Also the questure form part of provincial civil administration, being controlled by provincial and to a large extent by communal authorities. There is a lack of centralisation of their activities, a danger of interference by local authorities or local sentiment, and their reports pass through too many hands and take far too long a time to reach the proper authority.

Comments by MMA re the projected plan for the inclusion of Interrogator and Photographic <sup>and other</sup> personnel in the Intelligence Organization of the Future Indian Army.

### Interrogator Personnel

It is felt that the inclusion of a staff of interrogators in the organization of a peace time Army would be a waste of manpower. However, in order that such personnel might be available in case of necessity it is considered that the following measures should be taken:-

(a) <sup>Regular</sup> Interrogation and language courses should be organized at which suitable regular Army personnel of all ranks should be sent. A central register should be kept of such of them as reaching the required standard as interrogators but in normal times they would continue at their ordinary duties. From time to time refresher courses would have to be arranged to keep this personnel up to standard. The awarding of bonuses, pay to such in short and to these courses might encourage them to work hard to maintain the required standard.

(b) All officers holding "I" A or "I" B appointments should preferably be able to speak at least one appropriate foreign language. It would of course be necessary that the normal peace time status of a man listed as a trained interrogator on the central register were not of such a specialized nature that he could not easily be replaced in peacetime on his peacetime appointment.

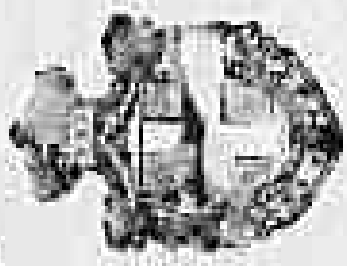

d. Executive, Administrative and Operational Functions.

Proposed organization and personnel to perform these functions are set forth at Tab 'A', showing the overall intelligence organization of the General Staff and the combat formations. For the sake of clarity Tab 'A' also includes CI personnel of the General Staff and combat formations; military security aspects and CI personnel are considered in detail in Paragraph e. below. 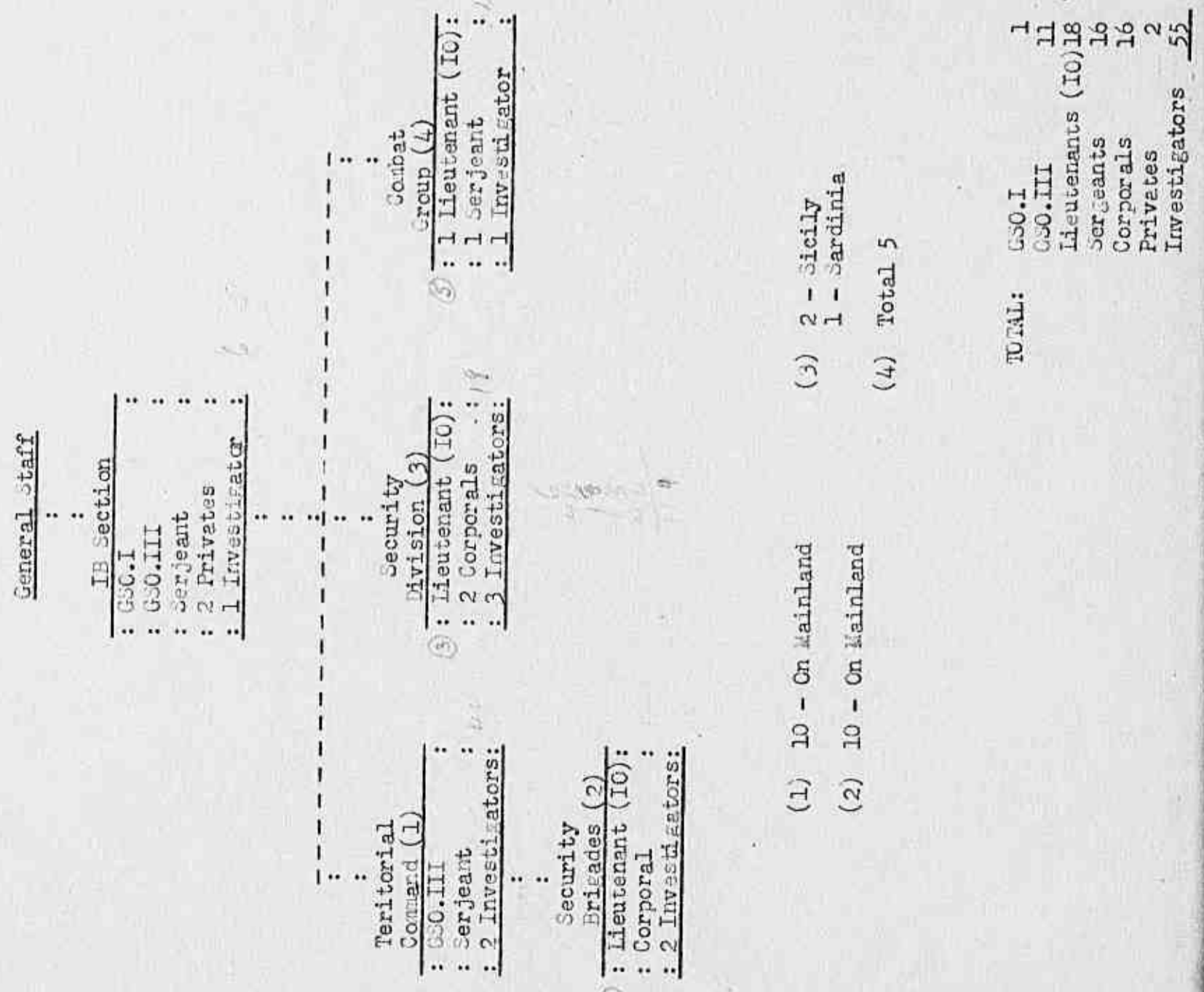

2. FUNCTIONS.

a. General Staff

- GSO.I - Chief Counter Intelligence (IB) Officer for the Army; establishes IB policy, prepares security training material, performs routine military security functions.
- GSO.III - Assists Chief Counter Intelligence Officer, liaises with other ministries for information concerning internal security situation.
- Clerks - Routine clerical work.
- Investigator - Performs security surveys, investigates loss or compromise of classified material, etc.

b. Territorial Command.

- GSO.III - Chief Counter Intelligence (IB) Officer in the territory, supervises training, liaises with territorial civilian authorities on local internal situation, performs routine security functions.
- Sgt. - Assists GSO.III and acts as a clerk.
- Investigators - Perform security surveys, investigates loss or compromise of classified material, assists GSO.III in training in security measures.

c. Security Division and Brigade.

- Lieutenant(IO) - Chief Counter Intelligence (IB) Officer for the unit, supervises training of troops in security measures, performs routine security functions, liaises with local civilian officials on internal security situation.
- Cpl. - Assists Lieutenant (IO) and acts as clerk.
- Investigators - Conduct training of troops in security measures, investigate loss or compromise of classified material, conduct security surveys, etc.

d. Combat Groups.

- Lieutenant (IO) - Chief Counter Intelligence (IB) Officer for the Group, supervises security training of troops,

The authorized strength of the 808th CS Battalion is 69 officers and 931 enlisted men. The actual strength is 79 officers and 789 men, or a total of 868 personnel.

These personnel are on duty covering all of ITALY, including SICILY and SARDINIA. Their order of battle and map showing locations of the offices are attached hereto. Their functions include the arrest of enemy agents, the penetration of subversive groups, assistance to the local Questura in riots and disturbances, observance and reporting on propaganda trends. As the only national CI body, they are of inestimable value to Allied Force Headquarters under whose control they work. If this group were dissolved it would leave the Italian Government without any means of keeping in touch with the situation in ITALY and would seriously affect the CI coverage of this Headquarters, as American and British field CI personnel are so few that they can do hardly more than supervise the work of the CS Battalion personnel.

It is recognized that the CI work of the CS Battalion is contrary to American and British principles in that the Army has a secret police and informant system. However, it is consonant with the Italian system of a peacetime Carabinieri assuming a military police function during war time. The Italian system cannot be abruptly changed without causing a certain stoppage of coverage for considerable time until another similar organization is formed, trained and in operation.

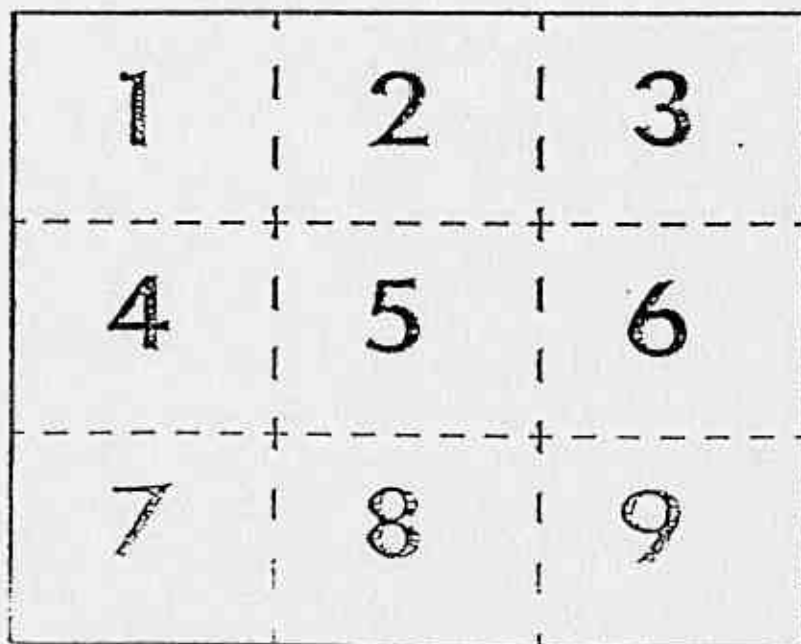
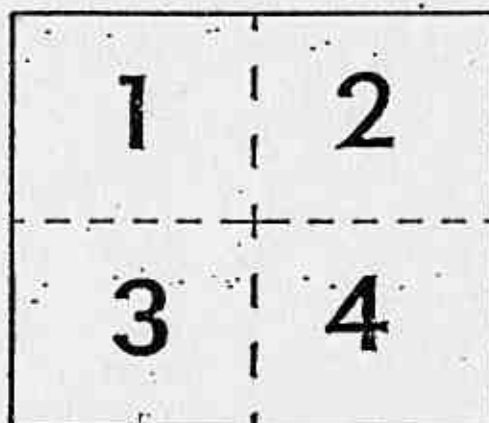

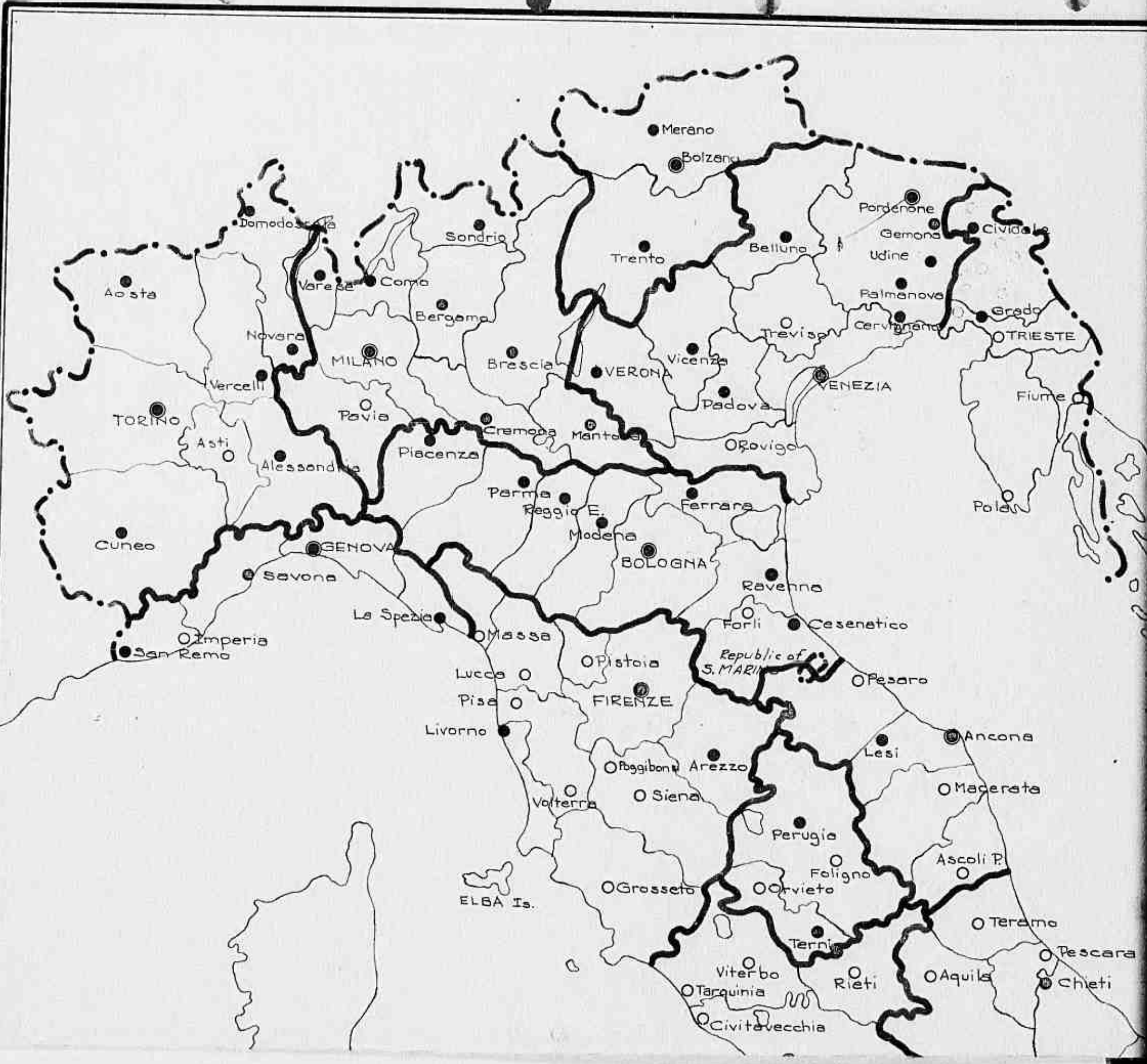
When and if an Italian National Police Force is formed, the Italian Government will be recommended to absorb this trained and reliable personnel for retention on the same duties. At that time the Government may screen out that personnel whom it considers undesirable. That personnel who are accepted by the Police Force will then lose their Army status.

If it is decided that the Army-Carabinieri system is to be retained for the National Police Organization, these personnel can be offered to the Carabinieri for re-absorption into the Carabinieri organization, thus retaining their Army rank. Again the Government may conduct such screening as it considers necessary.
