Subject:-Arms of recruits to be posted to Alpini Regts.To: General Staff R.E.
Training Branch
Rome.

The recruits at present being trained at the CAR with British weapons have to be sent to the units without arms.

I consider it opportune at the present time to point out that the recruits going to 'Alpini' Regts have to be armed on the other hand with Italian weapons when they reach their units.

This causes, in my opinion, a grave inconvenience as the tactical training, usage and firing of arms must be all gone over again with consequent loss of time and waste of material also it has a bad morale effect on the troops.

I therefore propose that the question of replacing the present Italian arms belonging to 'Alpini' Regts with British arms be looked into or at least that there be initially assigned to these regts a suitable quantity of British arms which would permit the recruits arriving next June to be armed with British weapons.

As a result of the a/n solution there would be, however, in an individual Bn units differently armed.
