1. Reference your second indorsement. This headquarters is familiar with "existing arrangements" and the Italian Ministry of War has discharged its duties as to personnel administration, replacements, pay and discipline to the satisfaction of this headquarters.

2. The division of supply responsibility has never been satisfactory and at the present time the U.S. is supplying nearly everything except the Italian component of the ration for US-ITI's.

3. The question at the present time, in the opinion of this headquarters, is one of operational control for which the U.S. is entirely responsible.

4. This headquarters is responsible for housing US-ITI units and desires that the 6th Provisional Group Headquarters remain where it is.

5. The duties connected with the operation of US-ITI units require the full time of Colonel Sartori, therefore, this headquarters feels that to add any duties not connected with US-ITI troops to Colonel Sartori's work would be detrimental to the best interests of the U.S. Army.

6. It is requested that par 6, 2nd Ind., be interpreted so as to inform the Florence Territorial Commander not to interfere with the "operation" of US-ITI units.

1. This Headquarters is not in possession of the references cited in par 1, 1st Ind.
2. The Italian Ministry of War has been informed of your views regarding the location of HQ 6th Provisional Group and the command of the Leghorn garrison.
3. With respect to the action you request in par 6, 1st Ind, it appears that the pertinent directive is letter AFHQ 2 November 1945 AG 091.711 G(SD)-0 Subject: Handover of Italian Army to Italian Government. Par 3 (a) which states in part "US-ITIunits.... will continue to be employed in accordance with existing arrangements as long as needed by the Allied military authorities. Such units will remain under the operational command of Allied Force Headquarters." Par 10 (d) states "US-ITI service units will be administered and maintained through US service channels." Command responsibility has been delegated to you and it would therefore appear that you are solely responsible for operation, administration and maintenance.
4. However the "existing arrangements" referred to evidently are those contained in
 - a) letter AFHQ 16 November 1944 AG 091.711/169 GCT-0 Subject: Command & Administration of Italian Army, which appears to hold the Italian military authorities responsible for personnel administration, replacements, pay and discipline.
 - b) Supply Directive No. 46, HQ MTOUSA 29 April 1945, which appears to divide the responsibility for supply and evacuation. 5216
5. The Italian Ministry of War and Ministry of Air have heretofore discharged their responsibilities through their respective territorial and zone commands for the areas in which the US-ITI troops were located.
6. I therefore feel that before informing the Italian ministries that their territorial and zone commanders have no jurisdiction over

US-ITI units and therefore no responsibilities in regard thereto it would be well to review the entire position. As I pointed out to you in my letter of 4 October 1946 the protracted retention of US-ITI troops beyond the time projected for their disbandment and the unsatisfactory conditions of service in many cases is affecting their morale and efficiency. Adverse press comment is beginning to appear. If you should desire a conference on this subject I should be glad to come to your Headquarters at a convenient time to be arranged.

1. With reference to basic communication, your attention is invited to cable from this headquarters, number 12254, dated 5 April 1946 and the reply from MTOUSA, number F64438, dated 9 April 1946 which deals with a similar matter.

2. As a result of the above mentioned cable no further difficulties were encountered.

3. It is still the desire of this headquarters for the 6th Provisional Group Hq. to remain at Castiglione for a number of reasons, namely that of command, and furthermore, if a move to Livorno was effected additional requisitioning of property would be necessitated and this cannot be accomplished.

4. In connection with par 5 of the 7th Territorial Command letter, it is not the wish of this headquarters for the Commanding Officer, 6th Provisional Group to assume command of the Leghorn garrison due to the fact that this garrison is not connected in any way with the duties being performed by the US-ITI Troops and the assumption of such a command should require a great amount of time on the part of the commanding officer and it is felt that the full time of the commander should be devoted to US-ITI Troops.

5. If complaints are being received on the behavior of US-ITI Troops in the Castiglione area it is requested that such complaints be forwarded to this headquarters for appropriate action.

6. It is again requested that the Florence Territorial Commander be instructed that he has no jurisdiction over the US-ITI's assigned to the Peninsular Base Section and that this headquarters be informed of action taken.

They are all North of CASTIGLIONCELLO, where Group HQ. is situated.

Bakery or Forage Barn!) 5 Italian Territorial Command can retain the accommodation which they already hold in PADUA. 1. The correspondence forwarded with the above is returned herewith.

2. (a) There is no doubt that the decision to move 5 Italian Territorial Command has caused a good deal of ill feeling, both amongst the Italian Military and perhaps more so amongst the civilian population. However it is thought that the views expressed by the writer of the anonymous letter are extreme and probably the letter was written in the heat of the moment.

(b) It would have been far more satisfactory if the instructions ordering the move could have emanated from the War Ministry, rather than from A.F.H. (The War Ministry telegram commences with the words "A.F.H. has issued orders that 5 Italian Territorial Command leave UDINS and move elsewhere").

As soon as it became certain that Italy would lose TRIESTE, ISPIRIA etc. it was realised by the War Ministry that UDINS would not be a geographically suitable location for 5 Italian Territorial Command. They had therefore decided that PADUA would be the permanent peace time home of the Command, and that a Division H.Q. would be established in UDINS. This in fact was the set up prior to world war 1

The above is appreciated by the Senior Officers but it is certainly not understood by the Junior Officers, rank and file and the civilian population.

(c) A certain amount of publicity concerning the move, has appeared in the Press, but the reason given in (b) above has not of course been quoted. All that is evident to the Italian Public, is that there are practically no Italian troops between the Jugoslav Frontier and the River PO, and that when 13 Corps are finally withdrawn, there will be nothing

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The above is appreciated by the Senior Officers but it is certainly not understood by the Junior Officers, rank and file and the civilian population.

(c) A certain amount of publicity concerning the move, has appeared in the Press, but the reason given in (b) above has not of course been quoted. All that is evident to the Italian Public, is that there are practically no Italian Troops between the Yugoslav Frontier and the River PO, and that when 15 Corps are finally withdrawn, there will be nothing to prevent TITO from overrunning the whole of the Territorial Command.

(d) There is no getting away from the fact that Allied stock has dropped considerably in this area during the last six months. The Italian Officer in particular, wonders what other calamity can befall him. He has had a long run of misfortune; - the demise of the Monarchy - the advent of the Republic, the Peace Treaty, poor pay and inadequate living accommodation, and finally the general difficulties of being stationed in an Area under Allied control as compared to other parts of Italy which are free.

(e) The move is causing considerable concern amongst the many civilians employees by the Command. They are in a quandary; are they to throw up good jobs but make certain of retaining their accommodation in UDINE ? or is it best to move with the Command, thus keeping their job, but having great difficulty in finding accommodation in their new location.

3.

As regards recommendations, it is difficult to name anything specific, but the following might be considered, although I am doubtful as to the desirability of (a) below.

(a) Issue a statement to the Press, pointing out that owing to the new boundaries, UDINE is no longer a suitable location for 5 Italian Territorial Command. Only Command H.Q. are moving. Italian troops are remaining (This is perhaps a bit thin as the only Combat Troops are the "TOIMBZZO" Bn under 13 Corps). At a later date, Italian Combat Troops will be moving into the area.

(b) I would ask that every consideration and assistance be given to the Command in their move. The Command H.Q. is a static organization and transport is very limited, the move of necessity must be a gradual process over a period of a few weeks.

(c) I would also ask that particular consideration be given to families. In UDINE and district there are nearly 400 military and civilian families connected with this H.Q. It is requested that they are not turned out of their homes until satisfactory accommodation is arranged in the new location.

(d) May the earliest possible firm information be given regarding the new location and dates of move ?

Rome, 13 August 1946

The Italian Government is aware that, for practical and economic purposes, Allied Military Headquarters might eventually amalgamate, and cannot but consider such an event favorably.

As far as choice of locality is concerned, the Italian Government wishes to point out that, apart from the office of PIS General Headquarters being in Leghorn, Padova would be more suitable and more preferable of the two places estimated, both for greater arrangements facility, and to avoid the unfavorable impression which might result if the Italian Command were removed from Udine.

This amalgamation will, unfortunately, bring about the occupation of new premises in the chosen zone. The Italian Government highly recommends that requisitions be limited to the strictly indispensable, and possibly be made in the suburbs, because, especially in Leghorn, the centre of the town is extremely damaged, and the number of homeless people still considerable. The Italian Government wishes that these requisitions be studied and prepared in collaboration with an Italian representative, who will be sent at your request. It is also necessary that the requisitioning of commercial and industrial premises be avoided, as this would result in furthering unemployment which is already causing much anxiety.

The inevitable inconveniences that will result owing to this amalgamation, should, however, bring about an improvement in the general situation south of the Appennines. Regarding this, it would be appreciated and desirable that, especially in Rome, the situation of the hotels be alleviated.

The Italian Government wishes to point out that it will do all in its power to facilitate this change.

Dear

I should like to bring to your notice certain points in connection with the move of 5 Military Territorial HQ from UDINE ordered in AFHQ signal FX 6979A of 29 Jul.

Owing to the definite form in which the signal was framed I did not consider it proper for me to argue the case or raise objections and I passed the necessary instructions on directly to the War Ministry who immediately took action to implement them.

I now understand that the move refers to all ITALIAN Units and Installations in UDINE. I certainly did not read your signal in this way or inform the War Ministry as to this.

I do not think, until one goes into these matters closely, that one realises the very great difficulties and inconveniences which will be caused by moving a purely static HQ settled permanently in its Peace Time location. I am enclosing as Appendix 'A' a copy of a letter written by 5 DLI to 13 CORPS which gives you some idea of what I mean. The move of permanent repair shops and machinery, the dislocation to work involved, and the dismissal of civilian employees with the prospect of unemployment to these individuals is a serious matter.

Some of these installations, viz Military Districts and Depots and Staffs for DE and ex P of W Camp must either stay where they are, or they must cease to function altogether.

The accommodation problem for families of Officers, NCOs and men in ITALY is so serious, particularly when taking into consideration the almost starvation rates of pay which is all the country is at present able to afford, that any large scale move is a most disturbing event. The ITALIAN Army are

The accommodation problem for families of Officers, NCOs and men in IMAF is so serious, particularly when taking into consideration the almost starvation rates of pay which is all the country is at present able to afford, makes any large scale move a most disturbing event. The ITALIAN Army are forced to take domicile very largely into consideration when considering appointments of Officers and men and there is no doubt that the large majority of the UDINE Command Staff have been appointed there because UDINE is their home town.

The next point is expense, always a serious consideration to the ITALIAN War Ministry, a move now to any other than their permanent future location would be asking them to spend funds which are badly needed elsewhere.

...../2

In the opinion of the War Ministry PADUA must be the ultimate location but I am told no accommodation is at present available there owing to ALLIED requirements.

This move will have political repercussions, and no doubt certain sections will take the opportunity to stress that it is high-handed and over-bearing, and that the displacement of their own troops, in taking place in favour of troops who have only a short term of residence before them anyway.

It is not for me to decide on whether that should influence the decision in any way, but merely to point out the implication. (An extremely abusive anonymous letter received by this HQ, though naturally carrying no more weight than is given to any other communication of a similar nature is an indication of the passions which are so easily inflamed.)

I think you will agree that it is unfortunate that the War Ministry should have already heard through their own Territorial Command and not from me that the move has far more serious implications to them than I had told them of. They have passed this on to the Prime Minister, just at the same time as the ALLIED COMMISSION has written telling him of the proposed move of AFHQ and asking him politely and tactfully to co-operate.

I was at your Conference at CASERTA on 30th Jul. Your signal to which I referred at the beginning of my letter was dispatched from AFHQ on 29th Jul, I did not receive it until 31st Jul. I was naturally unable to mention the question at the Conference which would seem to have a first class opportunity to have done so, and I am surprised that the matter was not mentioned.

I agree that a few days previously a telephone message had been received from a GSO II at your HQ asking for our views on the implications of such a move. These implications were pointed out strongly, and it was understood that as a result of the views expressed the move was unlikely to be ordered.

My dear Mr. Prime Minister:

The Chief Commissioner has been directed by the Supreme Allied Commander to inform you that in view of the necessity of economy in manpower and for other reasons, a consolidation of Allied Military Headquarters may be directed by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

Consideration of presently known factors indicates that UDINE or PAVIA are the logical sites for a consolidated headquarters consisting of the present XIII Corps Headquarters, the present General Headquarters, Central Mediterranean Force, and a portion of Headquarters Mediterranean Theatre of Operations. The remainder of Headquarters, Mediterranean Theatre of Operations probably would consolidate with Headquarters, Peninsular Base Section at LIVORNO.

The consolidations and resulting moves will undoubtedly necessitate some additional requisitioning of real estate at and in the neighbourhood of the finally selected locations, but that taken as a whole more space will be released in Southern Italy than will be used in these selected locations.

Reconnaissances have already been started at LIVORNO, PAVIA and UDINE. These reconnaissances are simply exploratory in order that full information may be in hand, and they do not mean that consolidation and movement orders have been or will be issued.

The Supreme Allied Commander has directed the Chief Commissioner to point out that the presence of Allied troops in Italy serves as a protection of Italian interests in areas of unrest and dispute.

While such a change of location of Headquarters may cause some local inconvenience it will, in the opinion of the Supreme Allied Commander, result in an appreciable benefit to the Italian economy in port, rail, real estate and telecommunication facilities South of the Appenines.

The Supreme Allied Commander hopes that the Italian Government will appreciate the motives which may require the changes, will consider the overall benefits, will view the subject with sympathy and give its cooperation to the end that should the changes be directed they can be made with the least possible inconvenience and fanfare.

Finally, the Chief Commissioner is directed to ask you to give the views of the Italian Government on the anticipated change, particularly with regard to the locations predicted and to assure you that these views will be given full consideration.


