1. Now that Inf Divs are being relieved of guard duties, it is suggested that these Divs should as far as possible be concentrated for training.

2. In view of the fact that elements of the Inf Divs are in many cases located in a number of different Territorial Comds, it is considered important that only one authority should be responsible for the training of each Div.

3. I shall therefore be grateful for confirmation that you are in agreement with this policy, and for information as to which Territorial Comds are respectively responsible for the training of the BRULI, CHERNA, HARTOVA and ENCHANO Divs.

4. The responsibility of HARTOVA Territorial Comd for ENCHANO Div was defined in your 6136/02 dated 17 Dec 45.

TO : MINISTRY OF WAR

1. It has been represented to this HQ by CG 10 BLN, that some confusion exists over the chain of command for units of Mantova Div which are at present located in no fewer than four different Territorial Comds, i.e. No. 1 (TURIN), No. 2 (GENOA), No. 3 (MILAN), No. 6 (BOLOGNA).
2. It seems that each Territorial Comd tries to give orders direct to whatever units of Mantova Div happen to be located in their own area. Conflicting orders thus reach the unit from the Territorial Comd and from their own Div HQ.
3. Territorial Comds also demand training programmes etc which are a concern only of the Territorial Comd in which that Div HQ is located.
4. It is requested that you will take steps to regularise this situation, and it is suggested that you should inform all Territorial Comds that they should deal ONLY with the Div HQ concerned and not direct with units or sub-units.

1. Units of Infantry Division MANTOVA are at present located within the boundaries of five separate territorial commands. Namely GENOA, MILAN, FLORENCE, BOLOGNA and TURIN.
2. This fact is leading to a great deal of confusion and extra correspondence as each territorial HQ tries to command direct the units of the division which are situated within its own particular area. Thus conflicting orders arrive at a unit from Div HQ and from the Territorial HQ. Territorial HQ's demand copies of training programmes and numerous other returns from a unit about matters which should only be the concern of Div HQ.
3. In short it appears that Territorial HQ's have no knowledge of the function and responsibilities of an "area" HQ with regard to units of a division which happens to be located within their area.
4. May action be taken to clarify this matter as the position of the GOC of Infantry Division MANTOVA, who has to cope with five Generals all of whom are trying to command units of his division, is obviously untenable.

General

The MANTOVA Division is still in the same locations, and is still carrying out a large number of Internal Security and guard duties under 59 Area, (2 District). The BLU is now so reduced that we are able to do very little for the Italian units, which is probably a very good thing, as they are thrown on their own resources, and will feel less difficulty when we are withdrawn.

Morale is high: very much higher than I expected. Our graphs relating to absence, sickness, Courts martial etc have shown a fairly steady improvement. We are just completing a book of statistics, of which I am sending a copy to MILA.

They do their duties reasonably well. With a reduced number of British officers it is difficult to ensure that every guard is regularly inspected, but we do not have many regrettable incidents.

114 Inf Regt is still under command LEGHANO Division, but there is a plan to move them to LIGURIA under command MANTOVA. I hope that this will happen soon. Variations of "grouping" are apt to upset the Italian staff system.

We have quite a good divisional school at SAVONA, which runs courses in a number of subjects for officers and NCO's. Instructors for CESANO are assembled there and "brushed up" before they leave. I have done all I can to get the best available instructors sent to CESANO, and I think the General will co-operate in this. I inspected a batch yesterday and they seem to be carefully chosen.

The Italian officers are genuinely sorry that the BLU is being withdrawn, and I think they will really miss us when we go. The feeling is mutual, we will miss them too, in spite of all the worry they have caused us.

We all greatly enjoyed Dick Southby's conference at MILAN, and we thought it a great success.

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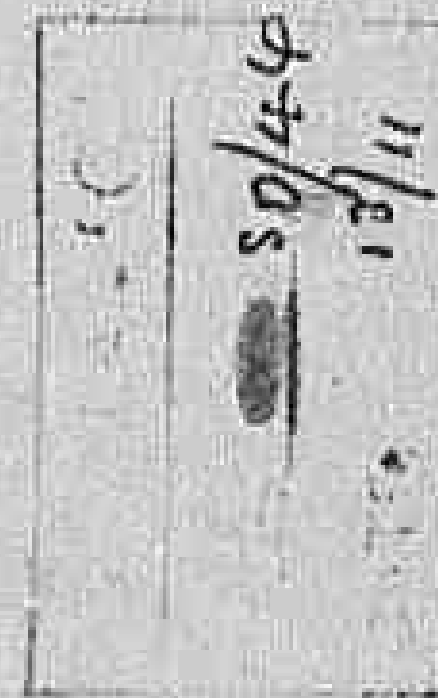

I came back from LIAP a few days ago, to find the MANTOVA Division in the same locations, and still doing guard duties. Since my return I have visited most of the units and I have found things pretty orderly. Morale is reasonably high, though I am a bit anxious about the effect of the reduction of pay, and discipline is not at all bad. Supplies and petrol are running quite well under Italian control.

The standard of training has dropped. The drafts from CESANO are not so well trained as the classes which have been released, and duties are so heavy that very little training in units is possible. We have started a divisional school at SAVONA, which runs courses of various types, and we are doing all we can to select good instructors for CESANO. It is a bit difficult to persuade the Italian Commanders to take a long view and part with good officers and NCO's.

Man management has improved. 76 Regt have excellent amenities, including a pig farm. The BLU is now very small, but we just manage to carry on.

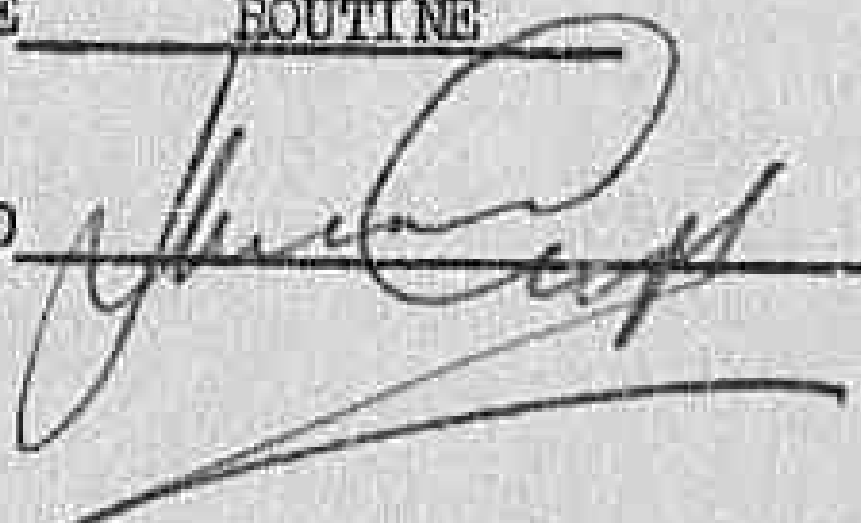

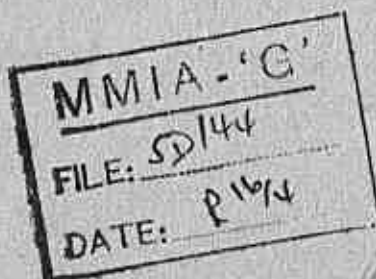
