TO : LAND FORCES SUB COMMISSION AC. (MMIA)

1.- As already known by your Mission, all Infantry Divisions (see our letter S.M.A./578 of 1/3/46), although on different scales, have a great need of ammunition, especially for the urgent necessities of training.

2.- In reply to verbal requests by Officers of this Ministry, it is stated that the issue of the 27 thousand tons of ammunition which your Mission plans as reserve for the Army (ref. yr. letter Q.003 and Q.125 respectively of 26/1 and 5/3/46) is imminent. It is foreseen however, that, even if this quantity can be supplied in the near future, before all the Divisions have received and can use their requirements, a time of about one month will elapse and be lost, for training purposes, unless in the meantime the Divisions are supplied with other ammunition.

3.- Consequently we ask you to kindly consider the necessity of :

- informing us immediately as to whether there is any objection to the Infantry Divisions being authorised to use for training purposes, all the ammunition at present constituting 2nd. line issues.
- urging AFHQ to give authority for the delivery of the 27 thousand tons of ammunition as per para 2.-

1. During the first week of July 46, 40,000 Italian recruits of the March call-up will be joining their units. Approximately 12,000 of these recruits are due to be posted to Independent Regiments and Internal Security Divisions that are still armed with obsolete Italian weapons. The recruits will represent about 35% of the full establishment of these formations.
2. It is considered essential that these formations should be re-equipped with modern British weapons by the date at which the recruits arrive.
3. It is understood that AWM are requesting a decision from the Combined Chiefs of Staff over the whole question of the re-equipment of the Italian Army but it is thought probable that a final decision will not be reached for some time. Even when the decision is reached, it will take a considerable time to arrange for issue and distribution of weapons. To indicate what this delay may be, it is significant that in the case of British weapons for C.A.R.s AWM agreed to the release of weapons on loan to the Italian Army on 8 Feb 46 and the weapons actually reached their destination on 1 Apr 46.

TO : MINISTRY OF WAR

1. Owing to delay in release by AFHQ of bulk quantities of ammunition for the ITALIAN Army, this HQ is in agreement with your suggestion that minimum quantities should be withdrawn for training purposes from second line holdings of Infantry Divisions. In this connection it is pointed out that there is a theatre shortage of ammunition for 2" and 3" Mortars and that re-
-placement of these natures is doubtful.

2. Information received by this HQ shows that at about 1 Nov 45 the five Infantry Divisions were completed by the ALLIES up to full first and second line holdings plus seven days contact rates. Recent returns submitted by you show that in most cases nothing approaching these amounts is at present held by the Divisions. No authority has previously been given by this HQ to expend one single round of these scales, which comprise operational ammunition only.

3. You are requested to investigate this matter and inform this HQ why the five Infantry Divisions are no longer in possession of the full scales issued to them last November.

2. The necessity for early discovery of JACOB alias is urgent. Some are now being buried or killed in England. No other method of detection is equally satisfactory.
3. It is reported that ALIAS pattern alias-detectives may be found officially to C.I. for this purpose.
