This is another example of many requests received by this Sub section for permission to supply arms to personnel of other Ministries, to which I referred in my discussion with you last week. I received a request in December from the War Ministry to permit the issue of 8 pistols and 8 automatic carbines to the Ministry of Grace and Justice for guarding dangerous foreign prisoners in UDINE and after consultation with Public Safety Sub Commission this small request was granted.</p> <p>Encouraged by this success the Ministry of Grace and Justice are now asking for the large numbers of weapons shown in Folio.2.</p> <p>I can find nothing in my directives which would authorize me to make a decision in a case like this though I understand that AFHQ considers the scale of armaments of the dependants of the various Ministries is a matter for the ITALIAN Government to decide. It should also be borne in mind that when the Peace Treaty is ratified there will be nothing to prevent the ITALIAN Government acting as it sees fit in the matter, whatever decision may be reached now.</p> <p>Although, by BRITISH and AMERICAN standards, the arms now requested, may appear excessive, the request is perfectly in keeping with the current ITALIAN policy of maintaining the peace by means of a maximum of armed bodies rather than insisting on a universal disarmament of the civil population.</p> <p>I do not think, therefore, that at this stage, any useful purpose would be served in opposing this request and I recommend that you should agree to it if you consider that you have the necessary authority to do so.</p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Dianna</i> <i>yes.</i></p> <p style="text-align: right;"><i>Stymulm</i></p>

I can find nothing in my directives which would authorize me to make a decision in a case like this though I understand that AFHQ considers the scale of armaments of the dependants of the various Ministries is a matter for the ITALIAN Government to decide. It should also be borne in mind that when the Peace Treaty is ratified there will be nothing to prevent the ITALIAN Government acting as it sees fit in the matter, whatever decision may be reached now.

Although, by BRITISH and AMERICAN standards, the arms now requested, may appear excessive, the request is perfectly in keeping with the current ITALIAN policy of maintaining the peace by means of a maximum of armed bodies rather than insisting on a universal disarmament of the civil population.

I do not think, therefore, that at this stage, any useful purpose would be served in opposing this request and I recommend that you should agree to it if you consider that you have the necessary authority to do so.

1. Paragraph 2 of PAN 711 authorizes the establishments of IMAS, to be charged with the control functions of supervision and direction of the Italian Armed Forces heretofore exercised by the Land, Naval and Air Force Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission and the control of the production of amaments.

2. Paragraph 4 of Acting Chief of Staff's letter, G-5 AFHQ/131/1 of 26 January states that "IMAS and its Sub-Sections will continue to operate in accordance with existing directives for, and practices of, the Service Sub-Commissions."

3. Since AFHQ Staff Memorandum No. 3 dated 31 January 1947 excludes from the responsibilities of the Chief Civil Affairs Officer, Assistant Chief of Staff, G-5, AFHQ, control of the production of amaments in Italy, and since existing directives and practices of the former Service Sub-Commissions of the Allied Commission did not include responsibility for Italian amament production control, instructions are requested as to whether this function should be assumed by IMAS. If so, it is recommended that this function be added to those of the Land Forces Sub-Section, with authority to co-opt services of the Naval and Air Forces Sub-Sections when necessary.

4. In this connection, it is the view of Director, Land Forces Sub-Section, with which I concur, that if the responsibilities of his Sub-Section are to include supervision and inspection of factories and arsenals, it may become necessary to augment the staff of his Sub-Section with personnel having technical qualifications beyond those at present available.

SUBJECT: - Armament prison guard personnel.

1. - The Ministry of Grace and Justice needs to complete the armament of guards under their command at prisons of large centres and the more important penitentiaries.
2. - This Ministry could release on payment the following arms and ammunition:
 - 30 "Schwarzlose" cal. 8 MMGs (no longer in use in the Army) with 2.000 rounds per weapon;
 - 150 "Beretta" automatic carbines with 500 rounds per weapon, in three successive lots to be withdrawn from each of the three future consignments of the "Beretta" factory;
 - 2000 "Beretta" pistols with 56 cartridges per weapon, in 10 successive lots, to be withdrawn solely from the 10% assigned to the P.S. from each consignment of the "Beretta" factory and not from the percentages assigned to the Army, the CC. and the Finance Guard;
 - 400 repeating pistols with 48 cartridges per weapon. In the course of time, another 10460 repeating pistols, with the relative ammunition, at present on issue to the Carabinieri could be released, as soon as they have been handed over when replaced with "Beretta" pistols.
3. - We beg your Mission to kindly inform us of your approval.
