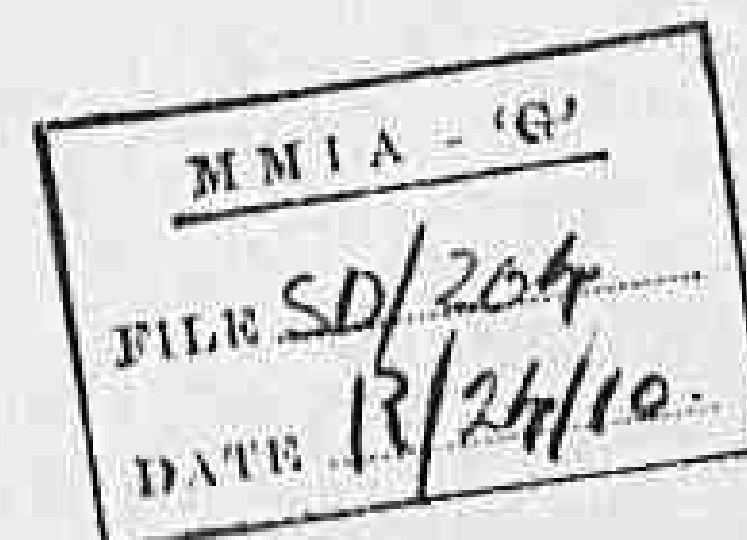

SUBJECT : US-ITI Personnel.

TO : Commanding General,
Peninsular Base Section,
A.P.O. 782, US Army.

1. Reference is made to your letter, subject as above, dated 5 September 1946, reference AG 383.6 BPATC, calling attention to the inferior type of replacements being received by the 6th Provisional Group for employment as US-ITI's.
2. I have made very strong representations to the Italian Ministry of War as to the urgent necessity of furnishing proper replacements for US-ITI units, representative of the Italian Army and not representative of an inverse selection to perform an unpalatable duty.
3. You will appreciate however that the continuance of US-ITI units after February 1946 was not envisaged, and in consequence no provision for replacements was made. Any replacements now required therefore must come from the strength of the Italian interim army which itself is far below its authorized ceiling, and which this Mission is making every effort to bring to a state of operational effectiveness.
4. Furthermore the morale position of US-ITI's is not good. These troops are engaged in performing service not for their own country but for the U.S. Their conditions of service are not satisfactory. They are in many instances poorly clothed, poorly housed and poorly fed. Their ration scale is below that of the US Army and of the Italian Army. They are in fact lowest priority from both the Italian and American points of view.
5. My G-3 has recently completed an inspection of all of these units. His reports indicate that there is very considerable variation in their relative effectiveness.

-2-

In general wherever the US commanding officers of the using services have taken a personal interest in the condition of service of US-ITI's they are markedly more effective.

6. I understand that a large number of the US-ITI's can be dispensed with when surplus property has been turned over to ARAR, but that the remainder will probably be required as long as US troops are in this theater. I suggest therefore that:

a. Undesirable or unsatisfactory elements be returned to the Italian Army as units are disbanded.

b. Adequate winter clothing and in particular shoes be supplied at an early date and before the beginning of cold weather.

c. Adequate winter billets be provided.

d. Ration scale be increased to include fresh meats and to approximate the equivalent of US Army ration.

e. Commanding officers of the using services be asked to interest themselves personally in the welfare of these troops. Some are already doing so with excellent results.

7. I am confident that if conditions of service are made attractive the US-ITI's will continue to be most useful and satisfactory. It must be borne in mind, however, that they in common with other elements of the Italian Army, are subject to organized subversive influences which will play upon their grievances and encourage absence, desertion and possibly open revolt.

8. I am enclosing translation of specific communications concerning the ration.

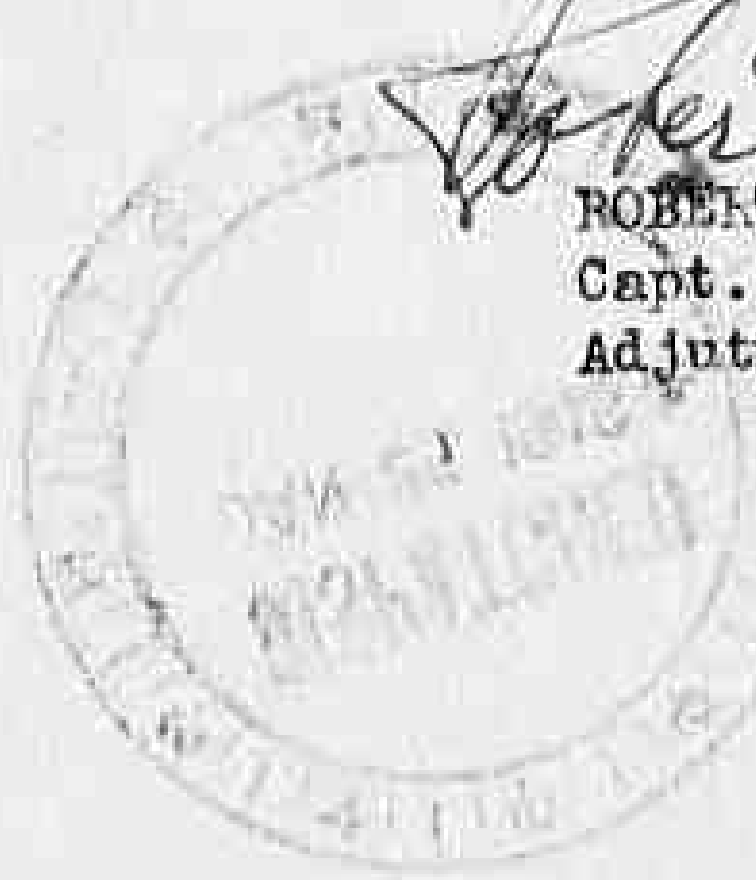

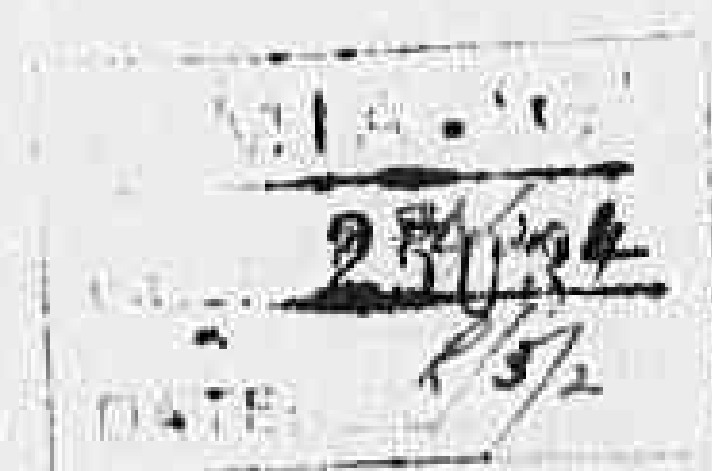

This reduction will not impair the smooth functioning of the 205th Div. under the present set up and will result in a saving of about 33 staff personnel over its authorized strength, while contrary to this it is deemed that the combined strength of two brigades would exceed the above mentioned total of 20 officers and 100 enlisted men.

b. The 205th Div. (Ital) has been under the operational control of the US Army Air Forces for over one year and through the efficient performance of its assigned tasks has considerably contributed to the successful consummation of the mission of the US Army Air Forces in the Mediterranean Theater of Operations. The administration of its subordinate units by Hqs 205th Div. has always been found as efficient as possible. It is deemed that any change in the Italian channels of commands at this time would more than offset the advantages that are sought by the Italian War Ministry, due to the unavoidable delay and confusion resulting from the turn over of the administrative records and duties to new agencies and personnel who are unfamiliar with the background and methods of operations of this Command.

c. While it is now possible for the 205th Div. to effect speedy and frequent movements of troops and interchanges of personnel from one area to another, in order to meet the operational requirements of this Command and to units at a constant level, the two brigades, each under administrative control of a separate Italian Territorial Region would find it extremely difficult to operate along similar lines.
