REORGANISATION OF THE ALLIED COMMISSION

1. With effect from 21 October 1946 the Civil Affairs Section together with the appointment of Vice President of the Civil Affairs Section will be abolished.

At the same time the following reorganisation will take place.

- (a) The Legal Sub-Commission, the Public Safety Sub-Commission and Displaced Persons and Repatriation Sub-Commission will cease to be designated as Sub-Commissions and will henceforth be known as Divisions. The Director of each of the former Sub-Commissions will now be named "Director of Division".
- (b) The Director of each of the three divisions designated in sub-para (a) above will be responsible to the Chief Commissioner through the Executive Commissioner.
- (c) The residual functions of the former office of the Vice President Civil Affairs Section will be absorbed into the office of the Executive Commissioner and will become, under the Executive Commissioner, the responsibility of his Chief Staff Officer by whom any necessary transfer of documents or personnel will be effected in conjunction with Executive Officer (B).

2. With effect from 21 October 1946 the Economic Section together with the appointment of Vice President will be abolished.

At the same time the following reorganisation will take place.

- (a) An Economic Division will be established, under an officer who will be known as the Director of the Economic Division. This officer will be responsible to the Chief Commissioner through the Executive Commissioner.
- (b) Within the Economic Division, the following Sub-Divisions will be established:

- (i) Food, Agriculture and AMG Supply
- (ii) Industry and Utilities
- (iii) Captured Enemy Material
- (iv) Commerce
- (v) Transportation

3. With effect from 21 October 1946 the Communications Sub-Commission will be re-named the Communications Division. The Division will be controlled by a Director who will be responsible to the Chief Commissioner through the Executive Commissioner

4. With effect from 24 October 1946 the Archives Branch will be renamed the Archives Division. The Division will be controlled by a Director who will be responsible to the Chief Commissioner through the Executive Commissioner.

All areas in Italy, including the Province of Bolzano and the Communes of Colle Salveti, Livorno, Naples and Pisa, and the fortress islands of Lampedusa, Linosa and Pantelleria, but excepting Uaine Province and that portion of Venezia Giulia west of the Morgan Line, will be returned to Italian administration as soon as possible and in any case no longer than 21 days after receipt of this directive (reference your radios NAF 1009, NAF 1071, NAF 1073, NAF 1092, and NAF 905).

Para 2. Simultaneously, in respect of any territories which may be retained under AMR, all command functions of ALCOM and AMR will be performed by 13 Corps, reporting directly to AFHQ. Military personnel detached from duty with ALCOM WILL NOT BE utilized as AFHQ Liaison to ALCOM.

- (a) Uaine is retained solely for military reasons and not because it is considered a disputed area.

- (b) Return of Bolzano is without prejudice to final disposal of province under peace treaty at which Italian rights will receive full consideration.

Para 4. As regards Lampedusa, Linosa, and Pantelleria, handback of these Provinces should be made at the same time, subject to your obtaining agreement of Italian Government to:

- (a) Their demilitarization;
- (b) Your retaining right of inspection to insure that demilitarization is maintained. You should provide, if you think it necessary, for Allied Officers to be stationed there, as in other parts of Italy administered by Italian Government, to ensure that Allied Military interests are safeguarded.

Para 5. You are completely relieved of Italian supply responsibility except for Venezia Giulia, and Province of Udine. Supplies will be the concern of the civilian departments of the United States and United

Kingdom Governments of the Italian Government programs. Pending further instructions, you should, as President of the Allied Commission, continue to advise and assist the Italian Government in the preparation of program of supplies for the areas covered by its programs and, when such programs have been established by the Italian Government review and transmit them with appropriate comments and recommendations to the Combined Chiefs of Affairs Committee which will transmit them to the Combined Liberated Areas Committee for action by the appropriate civilian agencies of the United States and British Governments. You may also give assistance to the Italian Government in connection with the preparation of bids for transportation for the supplies when received in Italy. In addition, as Military Commander, you will have the right to communicate with the United States and United Kingdom Governments on supply matters affecting the security or redeployment of your troops.

Para 6. Your channel of communication to the United States and United Kingdom Governments, both with respect to Allied Force Headquarters and Allied Commission matters will continue through the Combined Chiefs of Staff and the Combined Civil Affairs Committee in appropriate cable series. It is contemplated that necessary Italian civil supply arrangements will be handled between Allied Commission and Combined Liberated Areas admitted and use of COM-MOC cable series has been authorized for this purpose. However, you may submit any matters you deem appropriate to the Combined Chiefs of Staff or Combined Civil Affairs Committee through existing channels. Combined Chiefs of Staff or Combined Civil Affairs Committee will, where appropriate, communicate with responsible civilian agencies of the United States and United Kingdom Governments.

War Materials is largely liaison and has been absorbed within economics. Italian Prisoners of War has been absorbed by Land Forces Sub-Commission. The others should remain for AMG purposes. No disadvantage can be seen in keeping them in ALCOM until they cease to function or until I can determine a more suitable assignment. Any transfer to AFHQ or other agencies will be notified to you prior to effective date. So far as the Italian Government is concerned, any transfer to AFHQ might well give rise to a feeling that military control was being tightened instead of being eased.

(i) As regards Finance Sub-Commission, I have implemented TAM 692 set up an Allied Supply Accounting Agency responsible to AFHQ. It is located in Rome and attached to ALCOM for administration. Agreed that currency supply and accounting functions of Allied Financial Agency including various services to Allied Forces can be transferred to AFHQ. I recommend that the Chief Financial Advisor remain with ALCOM to handle financial problems under the Armistice and to negotiate the currency agreement under paras 12-17 of FAN 583.

(ii) A portion of the functions of the Transportation Sub-Commission should remain in the ALCOM Supply Group until UNRRA takes over. The remaining functions are liaison and should not come to AFHQ.

F. Your para 2 D is agreed except that similar Sub-Commissions must function for AMG territory. It is assumed that this proposal is based on UNRRA supply of Italy. Should Italy be supplied otherwise further consideration will be necessary.

(i) As to Industry, the functions of advising the Italian Government and developing and reviewing projects for reconstruction of utilities including railways or industries should be transferred to the Embassies. The Embassies point out however that they are not yet in position to assume this function owing to lack of personnel.

(ii) As to Commerce, the advisory function (consisting of negotiations for re-opening private commercial trade) cannot be transferred to the Embassies because of their inability to receive them before 1 January 1946. The duties of screening export programmes and channelling clearances laid upon ALCOM by TAM 640 must be continued until the Combined Chiefs of Staff direct otherwise.

G. Read your para 2 E. The Displaced Persons Sub-Commission is less directly connected with the Italian Government than other Sub-Commissions. H. Your para 3 agreed except as pertains to AMG. I request prior consultation in respect of key positions. I. In view of above suggest deletion of your para 4.

This estimate concerns the formation of the army in a more progressed stage than the present one. Actually, besides a greater number of permanent personnel (N.C.O's) a greater number of volunteers (mainly skilled) who have signed for a five year period is expected. Even rates of pay etc. to cadres and tradesmen (at least for the main trades) is more adequate than the present one.

1. The first duty of Allied Commission Liaison Officers will be to keep themselves, at all times, informed of the situation in the areas with which they are concerned. This will involve the use of all available means of information: Press, Intelligence, Summaries, etc. They will inform HQ Allied Commission direct of any circumstances arising which may in their opinion adversely affect Allied interests or influence the general policy of the Commission. They will submit a monthly report to HQ which will include comment on the political situation.

2. Liaison Officers will, by study of previous Regional monthly reports and other records, inform themselves of the present position of various Commission functions now being handed over to Italian agencies. They will specifically watch those cases where previous difficulties have been encountered.

Liaison Officers will bear in mind that HQ Allied Commission and APAC are interested in activities in all parts of the area with which Liaison Officers are concerned and not merely with the situation in the leading cities. Consequently Liaison Officers should make frequent trips to the smaller towns and country districts and acquaint themselves with the political and economic conditions in such districts. They must endeavour to be on the spot where trouble is expected and observe any incidents, strikes, demonstrations and the like in their areas. All Liaison Officers will remember, however, that their role is solely that of observers and reporters and they will not interfere in any way in such incidents, nor will they give any advice to the Italian authorities in the handling thereof. Liaison Officers have no authority to pledge the use of Allied troops in quelling any disturbance; this is a matter for the local Allied Commander. Liaison Officers will also keep in touch with British and U.S. Consular Officers, as well as any U.S. Information Service and British Press Officials in their areas.

4. They will at all times avoid being involved in questions of Italian local government and, even if asked, they will not give official advice, on behalf of Allied Commission, to Prefects or other State employees. They will, in all cases, refer the Italian local official to his Ministry in Rome. On the question of the preparation of electoral lists they have an important duty to perform. The Allied Governments are most anxious to promote free and secret elections and an essential preliminary is the preparation of a proper electoral list. Hence one of the main duties of Liaison Officers is to observe and report on the proper progress of the preparation of these lists in their areas. Detailed directives will be issued as to their duties in this respect.

5. The officer in charge Liaison Group will be responsible for discipline and administration of all Allied Commission officers in his area.
