Movement of Tps & Incidents during Election Period.

During the period of the elections, 1 - 9 June 46 both dates inclusive, no incidents nor any movements of tps as precaution against incidents were reported by the following BLUs: No 1 Turin, No 2 Genoa, No 4 Bolzano, No 5 Udine, No 6 Bologna, No 8 Rome.

No 11 BLU Palermo on 5 June reported that the guard on the transport station at SALEMI was reinforced by 20 men.

No 7 BLU Florence reported a disturbance in PISA on 6 June in which 1 civilian was killed and 22 were wounded by hand grenades. A Bn of 7 CAR was moved from LUCA to PISA and a coy of the same CAR went from AREZZO to MASSA.

No 9 BLU Bari reported a clash between Communists and "Qualunquisti" at S. SEVERO on 11 June in which 3 Qualunquisti and 1 Communist were wounded. The CC.RR restored order.

No 3 BLU Milan reported that on 3 June shots were fired at the CC.RR near ZAVATTERLO who reacted. There were no casualties and the Prefect sent 1 arm vehicle and 50 tps from the PAVIA garrison. The following tp movements took place:-

- 3 June - 6 Group of 11 Arty Regt from CARDONE to BRESCIA.
- 5 June - 3 Bn 67 Inf Regt from VARESE to MILAN.
- 3 Bty 11 Arty Regt from CHIARI to MILAN.

- A large Monarchist demonstration in which 1 civilian was killed and 8 Public Security agents injured.
- Local Communist HQ set on fire.

- 130 CC.RR of FLORENCE Legion arrived in NAPLES.
- 300 Public Security Police under command of Questura arrived in NAPLES on June 9.

1. In continuance of my report of yesterday's date 12 June, relative to the above subject, I have to inform you of the following facts regarding the position in other towns in the Brigade Area.

REGGIO CALABRIA

About 1900 hrs 11 June a Monarchist Demonstration was held at which large numbers of persons attended.

Whilst passing along the VIA GARIBOLDI a clash occurred with a Republican Demonstration which was being held. The Monarchist flag was seized and a fight commenced. The CC.RR. observed that two hand grenades were thrown from the Communist Section of the crowd and as a result raided and searched the Communist Headquarters as a result of which, the following arms were seized :-

10 Hand grenades
6 Automatic rifles
3 Magazines for above
2 Pistols
2 Rifles
2 Knives

One known Communist was arrested whilst attempting to throw a hand grenade. Public order was restored by CC.RR. about 2300 hrs. 7 persons (Monarchists) were seriously wounded and a number of persons slightly injured. Situation reported "Still tense"

TORTUARO

At 0100 hrs 11 June a rumour was spread around the town that the Luogotenente had been re-elected as King. Monarchists held demonstration but apart from minor scuffles with Republicans no major incident occurred.

FRANCIVILLA FONTANA

At 1900 hrs 11 June Monarchist Demonstration clashed with Republicans. CC.RR. made attempts to prevent clash but were unsuccessful. Hand grenades and fire arms were used.

At 1900 hrs 11 June reported clash between Republican and Monarchist Demonstration in VIA BERA. It was noticeable that many sailors of the Italian Navy were fighting on either side. Fire arms were used extensively including automatic weapons and two hand grenades.

Casualties : 1 P.S. Agent seriously wounded
46 Persons including sailors slightly wounded

Police have the position in hand, although the situation is still reported as being tense.

FUGGIA

On 11 June Republican demonstration held. Number of persons assaulted and 4 people stabbed. Many persons were hit with blunt instruments.

The Monarchist HQ were attacked by the mob, papers, furniture etc. destroyed.

No serious casualties and no use of fire arms reported.

The Police authorities have the situation in hand.

BARI

Number of demonstrations reported but nothing of a serious nature. Leaflets have been distributed asking the Allies to intervene and cause another Referendum to be taken under their control, when

- A) all P.O.W. have been returned.
- B) Venetia Julia has been returned.
- C) A vote can be taken in the Italian Colonies.

2. It is alleged that in the night of the 11 June the VICE PRESIDENT AMENDOLA was detained by the American M.P.s in the Questura Building NAELES due to this attitude in attempting to encourage the Police to open fire on the crowd.

He has later released after the intervention of the Prefect and Questura.

3. Attached hereto is a copy of a statement made by a person in connection with the recent voting also a covering report made by Lt Col MAURO NAELES CC.BR. Legion which is self explanatory. 244

It is respectfully pointed that stories of this nature are rampant in the NAELES area and are no doubt doing much to aggravate the situation.

4. It is interesting to note that the majority of the demonstrations took place on the 11 June which would rather signify that they had all been pre-conceived.

SUBJECT : Denunciation of electoral intrigues.

Today PROTO Enzo do Domenico from Ciro Marina (Catanzaro) presented himself to the undersigned. He was released on the 6 June 1946 from the prison in Bergamo, where he had been detained since 26 December 1945 for political reasons. PROTO stated that on the 2nd June 1946 partisans went to the Bergamo prison and took groups of prisoners on trucks to the polling stations (about 600)

PROTO added that the inmates were ordered to vote for the left parties and were promised that if the republicans won their cases would be reviewed. In fact, according to PROTO, it seems that some of the inmates have already been released on bail since 5th June. He also added, that this system has been used in other prisons in north of Italy.

PROTO in the end stated that some officers amongst whom General MOSCA former inmate of the S. Vittore prison in Milan and Colonel BORATTO of the black brigade, charged him to report the above mentioned facts.

I enclose PROTO's statement for any investigations you may wish to make.

STATEMENT

The undersigned PROTO Enzo di Domenico and di Malena Filomena, born at Ciro Marina (Catanzaro) on 13 April 1922, resident at Belluno (Como), Via Statale Colico N. 11, on being questioned by the Commander of the CC.PP. Legion of Naples, to whom he spontaneously presented himself, states the following: -

" As a political inmate in the prison of Bergamo, where I was detained from 26 Dec. 1945 to 6 June 1946, I had the opportunity of noticing that on the 2nd June last, some partisans, obviously in agreement with the Director of the prison and other employees, from the early hours of the 2nd, collected a few at a time, all the inmates (non-political) amounting to about 600 and with trucks took them to the polling stations and had them vote for the leftist parties, and therefore, for the Republic. The inmates were promised a review of their trials and if possible their sentences would have been annulled as soon as the result of the referendum would have been favourable to the Republic.

I understand that already some of said inmates have been released on bail and their trials have been delayed since June the 5th

I believe that the same systems have been used in all the prisons in northern Italy, the same allegations are rumoured in the north.

All the Italian officers interned in the prisons in the north for political crimes, and amongst others General MOSCA former inmate in the S. Vittore prison in Milan, and Colonel BORATTO of the black brigades are informed of the situation and have insisted that I present myself to your Legion to report the above

Subject: Behaviour of the Air Force before, during
and after the political elections.

I repeat in brief the subjects already brought to the notice of all personnel, through each commander, by my orders and on my directives, and personally dealt with by me in the last few weeks, in talks, to officers, NCOs, men and civilians of various HQs, units and Air Force garrisons.

1 - As ordered in circular dated 22 Feb. 1946, the Air Force, then engaged in the war of liberation and subsequently in the re-organising of the force and the reconstruction of the country, and taking part in the latter in every way possible, with its traditional fervour and devotion, has never had politics in its ranks.

I was pleased to have noted this personally and still more to have had special and due recognition of it from the authorities and political personalities roundabout, with whom I have had occasional contact, during my inspections.

2 - It now arrives at the institutional referendum and the elections for the Constituent, in the conditions wished for in order to fulfill without difficulties, uncertainties and hesitations, the duty imposed on every individual, as a citizen soldier serving the country, with the certain help of the esteem and faith of the nation and the protection of its prestige by the State authorities.

3 - In accordance with the law, widely discussed in talks, on the 2 or June all personnel will fulfill their duty as citizens, with the full understanding that it has been permitted by the freeing of the oath taken, for only the institutional part and by the power to nominate the political party whose principles and programme they think better suited to reconstruct the country.

Having fulfilled this duty, all personnel will continue to carry out their duties as soldier in all aspects imposed by the oath taken, which remains fully in mind and active as far as the solemn pledge of faith assumed towards the State is concerned.

The law reminds that

The law reminds that in addition to the usual duties - always worthily carried out in peace and war, by the Italian soldier - it will be their duty to respect and make respected the results of the institutional referendum and the relative decisions of the Constitutional Assembly.

This duty will also be scrupulously fulfilled by whoever, having full knowledge of the risk, for the everlasting peacefulness offered by life, cannot but unite his every act with that high sense of honour, which in the present difficulties and miseries, forms his sole, real, undeniable possession.

4 - Further to a special request made to the authorities responsible, the following has been obtained:

that the possibility to exercise a vote be granted to all servicemen, that the soldier be respected, both during public order service and in the carrying out of his normal duties. The emblems, uniform, trophies and military denominations in use be respected, independently from the results of the institutional referendum and until the issue of new constitutional laws on the matter.

This has been requested and obtained in order that the forthcoming political events pass without the slightest influence on the normal life of the Force.

- c - In order to provide against the improbable occurrence of unpleasant sporadic incidents caused by irresponsible or malevolent persons, about which warning has been received through anonymous and untraceable instigations to infringe the bonds of discipline after the elections, responsibilities have been established as well as well defined measures, nevertheless firm and decisive suitable to maintain the internal order within the force without the slightest support from trouble makers.

- b - The Italian Air Force, in spite of all its past faults and mistakes, which we all know well, is still rich in glorious military tradition, sacrifices which ~~are~~ and will be the intangible heritage of the nation, a sure guarantee of the forthcoming fruitful reconstruction.

This precious tradition of ours must be handed sound and uncontaminated to the state which popular election will bring about in order that, drawing from the people whose sense of duty is identified with the mass of fallen and living, the Italian Air Force carries on without stop or interruption, along the glorious road indelibly traced in the country's skies by her heroes and best sons.

The Air Force therefore answer to the faith entrusted to it by all the nation and government, in order to be worthy of it to-day, to-morrow and always with the most absolute moral and material integrity, sorely tried, but never broken up, not even by past tragical events.

Text of the order on the day relating to the Armed Forces and the forthcoming institutional referendum, approved by the Council of Ministers at its meeting of May 46

The Council of Ministers, after examining the position of the Armed Forces in relation to the forthcoming institutional referendum and elections for the Constituent Assembly, which will be a big test of the political maturity of the nation:

- renews its expression of confidence in the Commanders of the Armed Forces, and in all Officers, men and men, engaged in the impartial execution of a worthy task under conditions which are often difficult;
- reiterates that while no limit has been placed on the freedom of opinion and vote of military personnel, their obligations of loyalty to the Nation and of the observance of the laws of the State must remain firm;
- reaffirms the duty of all members of the Armed Forces to observe disciplinary regulations most strictly, remaining at their post, so as to ensure at any moment, and particularly after 2 June, within the bounds of their own responsibilities, the defense of the Nation and of the institutions which it will have collected, and the maintenance of order in accordance with the instructions of the Government;
- rules that flags and emblems, which are expressions of honor and faith in the continuity of the nation, as well as the badges, the "stelletto" and every other detail of the uniforms of the Armed Forces must be fully respected by all citizens; any eventual changes can be decided by the Government alone; any unauthorized action must be immediately suppressed;
- appeals to all citizens to maintain proper respect for the Armed Forces, and pledges all parties to follow a honorable and straight course of political action in this connection;
- assures all troops that the Government, while desisting from them a conscientious discipline, will guarantee in all cases the integrity and dignity of the Armed Forces.
