(a) Reorganisation

Transport is being transferred to Padova Legion from other Legions to cope with the heavy additional commitments of this Legion when it will have to undertake frontier guard duties on the new frontier.

The export of prisoners, always a duty of the Carabinieri, was carried out 276,361 times during the year. One of the most important sides of police work is the supply of information and reports on various subjects to such bodies as Ministries, military HQs, Prefects, Magistrature, etc. 13,267,603 reports were supplied during the year. Enquiries were made more difficult owing to the destruction of archives.

Movement of Curiabinieri & reinforcements in the preservation of public order has employed 111,715 men for a total of 885,005 days. The Mobile Battalions have been of great service in this direction. Finally, 56 Carabinieri were killed and 160 wounded in armed conflict with criminals; 45 died and 438 wounded as a result of operations other than war.

6. IFOW

- (a) During April the Italian Section of the PW Accounts Office CMT was handed over by the Italian Government to the UK. All files and records were taken over by the UK. Direct communication is now maintained with all Italian PW accounts abroad and in the UK; it is hoped that this will lead to a speedier conclusion to the settlement of these accounts.
- (b) The Italian Government was notified of credits in respect of Italian Prisoners of War in British Custody for the total amount One thousand four hundred and thirty seven pounds (£ 1437). These credits represent final Credit Balances due to Italian PW repatriated from British Custody, or remittances made by the PWs to their families or Banks in Italy.
- (c) A big increase took place in the number of claims for impounded properties or certificates of Credit Balances dealt with by this office during April. Seven hundred and sixteen claims were processed and settled or passed to the appropriate agencies for action, against an average of three hundred claims per month during last year. This is probably due to the end of repatriation and the fear of disbandment of the Allied organisation for POWs.

(1) Morale. Generally good. The fall of the Monarchy has been more than counterbalanced by loyalty to the Corps, and no defections have been noted. Morale is adversely affected by the following considerations:-

(a) Difficult economic conditions due to rise of cost of living and low pay. This has been somewhat offset by the tripling of the public safety allowance and the proposed increase in lodging allowance.

(b) Large numbers of officers and men are still awaiting enquiry by the Epuration Commission. These proceedings drag on interminably, and the morale of the personnel concerned is seriously affected.

(2) Visits. This section, now consisting of only two officers, is in daily contact with Carabinieri GHQ and visits are frequently exchanged. The Carabinieri, except in the operational sphere, are controlled by the War Ministry, and the purposes of the visits

include assisting CC in their dealings with the Ministry and smoothing out difficulties in the supply and use of Allied equipment.

6. GENERAL SITUATION.

The assistance received by CC through the efforts of MMIA has been of very great value. Transport, arms, clothing, W/T equipment, etc. have been provided and CC have never previously been so well equipped, except for clothing which is far behind pre-war standards.

Wireless equipment sufficient for all the major needs of CC has been issued and the mobile battalions have been trained in its use. W/T communication has also been opened between Rome and Naples.

As time passes, the value of the War Diary in its present form is becoming reduced, and it is considered opportune to introduce in substitution for it a form of Historical Report, with the primary object of providing a record of the activities of the occupational forces and to ensure that the observations and recommendations of commanders on subjects such as the run-down of the Army to its post war organisation and the working of the Release Scheme, are preserved.

2.
