1. Reference your X511/11 of 20 June 46.
2. The 144 No. 38 sets have no batteries. 2 batteries are needed per set, therefore a total of 288 batteries dry HT/LT Nos. 1 or 2 is the minimum requirement. This leaves no margin for replacement of worn out or faulty batteries.
3. The 108 No. 19 LP sets have no batteries. 4 batteries are needed per set (2 in use and 2 on charge), therefore a total of 432 6 volt 125 amp batteries are required.
4. If 148 No. 19 LP sets are issued in lieu of No. 19 HP sets (not available) a further 592 batteries will be required.
5. The 70 No. 9 sets require two 125 amp batteries each, 140 in all.
6. According to Col. Celli, BOD refused to issue either the electrolyte or the remaining No. 9 set.

1. The commander of 6 Bde CC.RR. has asked if he can have publications on the British system of R/T Procedure in order to assist the R/T training in the Mobile Bn.
2. The present standard of R/T training in the Mobile Bn. is very low and very much an improvisation of their own owing to the fact that no personnel capable of instructing have yet returned from R/T Courses now in progress.
3. It is suggested therefore that either a translation be made of Pamphlet No.7 Signal Training (All Arms) 1945 and automatically distributed to CC.RR. H.Qs. or that an immediate distribution be made of the R/T Procedure Pamphlet which was actually translated and issued to Italian Combat Divisions in 1944-45.
4. In view of the impending elections on 2 June and possible commitments of CC.RR. mobile Bns the immediate improvement of their R/T training is considered urgent.

2. It is proposed to use these sets in the following manner:-

(a) <u>Radio Distribution</u>	Per each Battalion	Total for 14 Bns
N° 15 sets	5	108
N° 3 sets	8	24
N° 35 sets	12	144

(b) Carabinieri sets in Bns and 14 Legions outside Italy.  
Nineteen N° 2 sets (N° 100s, N° 11) to enable communication to be set up between units and agencies in the following cities:-

- TRIPOLI, ALGERIA, NUBIA, MILAN, ROMA, TURIN, VARESE, SIENA, FLORENCE, BOLOGNA, ANCONA, GENOVA, NAPLES, PALERMO, CATANIA, MESSINA, CAGLIARI.

(c) Two Legion sets in Bns.

Three N° 3 sets for communication between Carabinieri in Bns and the two legions in Bns. It is not necessary to have high powered sets for these two legions to communicate with Carabinieri sets.

(d) Twenty Legion sets.

There are twenty legions in Italy, Libya and Tunisia and they are divided into one hundred and eleven groups, one hundred and thirty one N° 3 sets are required for communication between legions and groups.

(e) It is impossible to equip every Carabinieri station with wireless, but in order that radio communication may be

possible, in times of trouble and disorder, it is proposed that three No. 9. Sets be kept at Legion HQ, together with trained operators. Total required sixty No. 9. Sets.

If trouble is expected, or is occurring in a town or village, a No. 9 set could be taken out by car to the nearest Carabinieri station, and kept there whilst trouble lasts. This would enable the Legion Commander to keep in touch by radio with the situation, whilst remaining in Legion HQ in some large town. The set would return to Legion HQ when the situation became normal.

- 4. A total of 218 No. 9 Sets are required for this plan, but only 70 No. 9 Sets are available and the difference is made up of 148 No. 19 U.S. Sets.
- 5. The whole of this radio equipment is at No 5 Sub-Depot, 557 B.O.D. Ponte Cagnano, near Salerno.

6. Arrangements have been made for Captain Clarke of No 10 B.L.U. at Naples (telephone Naples 55802) to accept delivery, which will commence almost immediately. The total weight is about 200 tons and it is considered that about 15 railway wagons will be required to move the whole consignment.

7. Captain Clarke will arrange for the rail transport, from Salerno to Rome, through the Italian Territorial Command at Naples.

8. Captain Clarke will require the services of one Carabinieri Officer, English speaking if possible, and a small number of Carabinieri to act as guards during the loading and the train journey to Rome. Will you please arrange for the Carabinieri Legion Commander at Naples to supply Captain Clarke with one officer and the necessary Carabinieri for guard duties at a time and date to be notified by Captain Clarke.

9. CC.M. HQ will be responsible for the distribution of these radio sets to Legions after the sets have arrived in Rome.

10. CC.M. HQ will arrange in conjunction with the Italian War Ministry, and any other Italian authority which may be involved, the following:-

- (a) adequate training for the Carabinieri operators on the operation of the set.

5. The whole of this radio equipment is at No 1 Sub-Depot, 597 B.O.D. Ponte Capuano, near Salerno.

6. Arrangements have been made for Captain Clarke of No 10 B.I.U. at Naples (telephone Naples 55802) to accept delivery, which will commence almost immediately. The total weight is about 100 tons and it is considered that about 15 railway wagons will be required to move the whole consignment.

Will you please arrange for the Carabinieri Legion Commander at Naples to supply Captain Clarke with one Officer and the necessary Carabinieri for guard duties at a time and date to be notified by Captain Clarke.

9. CC.M. GNC will be responsible for the distribution of these radio sets to Legions after the sets have arrived in Rome.





1. At the present time the Carabinieri have no wireless. There are wireless sets in the Regiment arranged cars, now being delivered, and operators will be trained to work them.
2. I have discussed at some length the question of wireless with Colonel SACCHI, the Carabinieri Chief of Staff.
3. The Carabinieri would like each Gruppo to be able to communicate by wireless to each Legion. There are 20 Legions and III Gruppo, and generally speaking each Legion will have 4 to 6 Groups within its area. The Gruppo HQ will usually not be more than 100 miles from the Legion HQ.
4. Sets of the 20 Legions should be able to communicate direct with the Carabinieri HQ in Rome. Headquarters in Rome would have to be able to transmit back to any of the 20 Legions.
5. The Legions are located as follows - MILAN, GORIZIA, COMO, INTRA, VERONA, PAVIA, VIGEVANO, BERGAMO, BRESCIA, TRENTO (2), GENOVA, CASALE MONFERRATO, ALESSANDRIA, ASTI, CUNEO, VARESE and SONDRIO.
6. The two Legions in Rome would probably only want the same type of set as those supplied to the Groups owing to the short distance.
7. 143 sets would be required for those Legions and the Groups.
8. 12 high power sets would be required for the Carabinieri HQ and the eighteen Legions outside Rome.
9. Col. SACCHI suggested that a further 2000 sets should be kept at each Legion HQ, with trained operators available. These sets would be taken in vehicles to places or small stations where trouble was expected. They would remain away from Legion HQ as long as trouble was expected, return with their operators, to the Legion HQ.
10. It is quite impossible to equip all the Carabinieri Legions with wireless, but if a limited number of sets were available and could be taken to places where trouble was expected, or was occurring, it would keep the Carabinieri in touch with the Legion concerned. The sets need not be fitted in vehicles.
11. This seems a most excellent idea and from a soldier's point of view

6. The two Legions in Rome would probably only want the same type of sets as those supplied to the Gruppo owing to the short distance.

7. 113 sets would be required for Rome Legions and the Gruppo.

8. 15 high power sets would be required for the Carabinieri HQ and the adjacent Legions outside Rome.

9. Col. Smith suggested that a further 3000 sets should be kept at each Legion HQ, with further specified available. These sets would be taken in vehicles to places or small stations where trouble was expected. They would remain away from Legion HQ as long as trouble lasted, and then return, with their operators, to the Legion HQ.

10. It is quite impossible to equip all the Carabinieri Companies with wirelens, but if a limited number of sets were available and could be taken to places where trouble was expected, or was occurring, it would keep the Carabinieri in touch with the Legion HQ. The sets need not be fitted in vehicles.

11. This seems a most excellent idea and from a police point of view most practical. Sixty more sets would be required, and of the same type as those supplied to the Gruppo.

12. 10 sets would be required at Division or Brigade HQ as they are always located in the same towns as Legion HQ, and often in the same positions. The strength of each HQ and its HQ is only 10 officers and men. They are hardly concerned with the police side of Carabinieri work.

In addition, it is discovered that the Legion of Sardinia has been allotted 1.2.2 shirts, to be collected from 21.1.15. It is considered that all allocations for Sardinia should be made available at Naples.

Regarding postal facilities, correspondence between Sardinia and the mainland now takes anything up to 24 days. Ordinary air-mail -limited by available 30.M. funds for the purpose- take about 12 days. On the other hand, there is an Italian military aeroplane service every other day. It is suggested that the War Ministry approach the Italian Air Ministry with a view to having use of this service for 30.M. correspondence.

It is recommended therefore that you take action on the lines suggested, and inform this Branch of the result.
