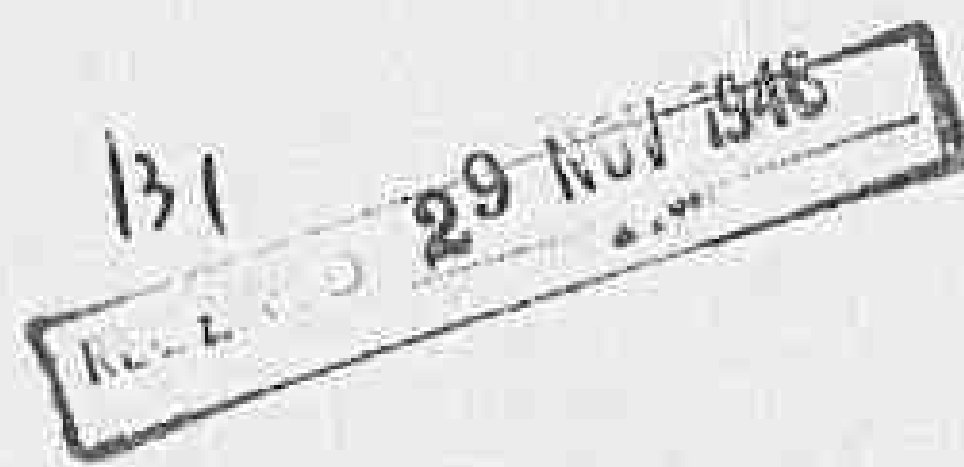

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE -

(A) PROMOTION has been stagnant for some years, and a fillip now would infuse a new spirit and incentive among all ranks, especially junior officers and N.C.O.s. It is recommended that the following points require immediate speeding up, as they are seriously retarding progress, and gravely affecting efficiency and morale:

- (i) Expiration.
 - (ii) Retirement of over age and reservist officers.
 - (iii) Recruitment of officers.
 - (iv) Unblocking of promotion.

(B) ENLISTMENT - O.R.s.-

- (i) It is recommended that the conditions of enlistment be altered, so that the minimum age of entry be raised to 19/20 years.
- (ii) The average type of man who enlists in the Carabinieri is from Contadini stock and therefore the standard of education is not very high.
- (iii) The following points are suggested as disadvantages of the present age minimum. 17 years is too young to accept or be expected to assume the heavy responsibility of a Police Officer. The recruit (bearing in mind his standard of education), is not fully mentally developed to assimilate the multitudinous aspects of law and police procedure, at the time when he is also receiving military training.
- (iv) Men in the Army who are contemplating joining the CC. could be encouraged to prepare themselves by provision of preparatory educational and technical instruction on similar lines to British Army Vocational Training Centres, attachment to Military Police Training Schools, or reduce Army service by say 4 - 6 months if transferring to CC. Approved Army service to count for CC. pension.

As the Ministry of War regard CC. as soldiers, they should be prepared to assist prospective CC. on the lines suggested.

(d) The annual intake of recruits is between 3,000 - 4,000, which means a heavy turn-over of personnel with consequent impairment of efficiency.

Suggestions are:-

- (a) A period of 25 years with full pension at expiration of service, with a modified pension after 20 years service.
- (b) A short period of 10 or 12 years with a gratuity on completion, and eligibility to reengage for the full 25 years with full pension rights.
- (c)
 - (i) It is strongly recommended that a longer term than a three years engagement should be introduced.
 - (ii) By prolonging the engagements by a number of years, it would, after the first few years, considerably reduce the annual discharges, the consequent intake of recruits, and have a stabilising effect on the service as a whole.
 - (iii) The decreased annual intake of recruits will materially improve the situation at the training schools, allowing for more accommodation for class rooms, which is urgently needed, smaller classes, tending to more individual instruction, and eventually a surplus of training instructors.

It is recommended that these instructors as they become surplus at the schools, be transferred to the Legions as Group Instructors, replacing casualties, or with the view of exchange, as continued instructional duties tend to staleness.

Even until such surplus arise, it is recommended that exchanges should be made between instructors from the Schools and those at Groups, as those at Groups are in close touch with practical police work, while those at Schools are more conversant with theoretical training. Exchange should re-act to the common good.

(E) N.C.O.s SELECTION AND PROMOTION.

(ii)

At present there are 3 permanent and 2 temporary Training Schools. Two of the 3 permanent Schools deal with recruits, and the third with the training of Officers and N.C.O.s. Syllabi and organisation of these Schools show a lack of standardisation.

(iii)

It is laid down that post-school training must be given in Legions. Due to local conditions, and the varying zeal of Legion Commanders, this training is in many cases not carried out at all, or is of doubtful value.

(iv)

By existing CC. regulations, Divisional Commanders should exercise supervision over schools and training generally. This does not allow a coordinated control over CC. generally and does not work satisfactorily.

(v)

It is therefore recommended that a CC. Officer be appointed as Director General of Training at CC. H.Q. with general duties of co-ordinating all training, supervision of training establishments, and refresher courses in Legions.

(vi)

The appointment of a Director of Training with adequate staff is considered to be a pre-requisite of efficient organisation, and no alternative can be envisaged.

(vii)

A possible composition of staff required is shown in appx "A".

(B) DIRECTORATE OF TRAINING.-

(a)

(i)

It is recommended that a Director of Training be appointed forthwith. It is essential that one Officer, with a good Police of Legal/Scholastic background should hold such an appointment to ensure that sound and progressive training programmes are drawn up and carried out. Further specialised training is required for prospective N.C.O.s, Instructors, Officers, Specialists (C.I.D., etc.) and refresher courses for CC. in Legion down to Group level.

(ii)

The importance of uniformity in training cannot be over emphasised; at present it rests with the

Chiefly as a result of the war, little attention has been given to the compilation of a standard text-book of instruction.

(vi)

One is in circulation, but it does not meet modern requirements.

(vii)

It is recommended that work should be commenced at once on a new text-book, for issue to each Carabinieri.

== DISBANDMENT OF DIVISIONAL AND BRIGADE COMMANDS. ==

- (i) The addition of Divisional and Brigade Commands to the CC. system after the last war cannot be said to have produced any tangible benefits.
- (ii) These Commands bear little resemblance to their military counterparts and their addition to the existing system was in the nature of a "grafting operation" entailing little or no reorganisation of CC.
- (iii) As before, Legion Commanders communicate directly with CC. H.Q. on most important matters. In matters of lesser importance, the Division and Brigade act as additional in the chain of command.
- (iv) A comparison of the detailed duties of the Div./Brigades and Legion Commanders indicates that the Legion Commander is the big man of the organisation.
- (v) Very few records relating to the Legions are available at Div./Bde. H.Q.s, and in fact these H.Q.s are administered by Legions instead of vice versa.
- (vi) Brigades are chiefly concerned with matters affecting discipline, awards, etc., and in these they only act as "submitting" authorities, adding of course, recommendations.
- (vii) It is proposed that Divisional and Brigade H.Q.s be abolished, and substituted by a CC. Inspectorate which will have the effect of:
- (a) Creating a more lively, efficient, and younger supervisory staff.
 - (b) Demonstrating to CC. and public that effective reorganisation has begun.
 - (c) Improving the prospects of promotion for all ranks, thus improving conditions of service and raising morale.

(A) Inspectorate at CC. H.Q.-

- (i) It is considered that there should be one Inspector General assisted by 3 Officers, all of high rank. The latter 3 should each have jurisdiction over areas corresponding to the present divisional areas, and each should have a sufficient staff to enable inspections to be made, at least once a year, to CC. Commands from Legions down to CC. Stations. Inspections would include examination of administrative records, crime statistics, disciplinary offences, welfare of men, state of arms, clothing, transport, etc.

- (ii) The inspection completed, the Inspector would report to the Inspector General on the efficiency of the Legions under his jurisdiction.

- (iii) Suggestions as to the duties of Inspectors are given in Appendix "B".

- (iv) The Inspector General should be responsible for submitting recommendations to H.Q. together with his own observations and should hold at frequent intervals conferences with his staff.

Points in favour of H.Q. Inspectorate:

- (i) Officers would be able to give their whole time to inspecting Legions.
- (ii) They would have a representative at H.Q. to press their recommendations.
- (iii) They would personally report on the Legions under their jurisdiction.
