Camp 25 Wing 3 - Bombay.

Repatriation requested from Allied Force Headquarters on 12 October 1945.

Allied Force Headquarters requested General Headquarters India to repatriate him if there were no security reasons against his release.

Letter received from Allied Force Headquarters dated 11 January 1945 stating General Headquarters India has advised that in view of his past political record in India the release of this officer cannot be agreed.

The Camp Gaetani is in is known as a Fascist camp but I understand there are quite a number in it who were never active Fascists.

I feel that we should be given more details in a case like this as after all if the Italian Government ask for a POW they are automatically responsible for him on his return.

If he is anti "Allies" it is a different question.

From what I can gather, Gaetani was never considered very clever and was much more the sportsman and a bit of a devil with the Roman ladies.

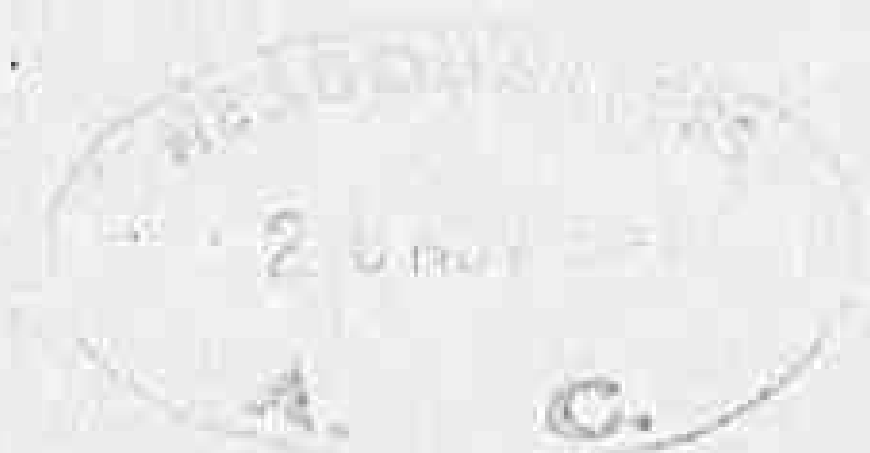

To: Col. J.A. CAMPBELL A.C. ROBE

Dear Colonel CAMPBELL

I turn to the profound humanitarian spirit with which you always take an interest in our unfortunate brothers in the Army who are still P.W., to beg you to take into consideration in all your goodness a very sad case, which I would like very much to see happily solved.

It is the well-known case of the 1st Lieutenant direct commission Aldanese. You will certainly remember that last spring Aldanese was sent as a Commander of a Detachment of 25 PW to the Training Establishment R.A.O.C. Fontecagnano (Salerno). The High Commissioner with letter 3902/Mil/I/C-27 dated 24th August informed the A.C. of the bad financial circumstances of his family living in Rome - which could not receive any subsidy from the Italian authorities because he was Commissioned directly from civilian life, and we heartily beg the A.C. to take into consideration the possibility of releasing him.

With letter D/O/IPW/A/1A/175 dated 12th October the A.C. informed us that, according to information received, the release of Aldanese is not justified because he was able to send the greater part of the money he got to his family to help them in their difficult economic circumstances, and besides, it would be very difficult to substitute him in the useful service he was rendering the War effort.

With reference to the above, Aldanese has asked you to consider that:

a) About money he received:

- 1 - Before being transferred to Italy he never received any money.
- 2 - After he was transferred to Italy in July, he received 2000 Lire per month, an additional 5 £. were not given to him but put in the "Account Card" and they were not at his disposal.  
In July and August he was left with almost none of the money because he had to pay 1400 Lire monthly for mess and for the Post-exchange (M.A.F.I.) Afterward, to save something to send to his family, he no longer went to the mess but took his meals with soldiers.  
In order that he might save 1000 Lire every month for his family. This sum, according with the cost of living in Rome, was evidently insufficient to support a family.

b) About his service:

- 1 - He thinks that he can easily be substituted in his service as interpreter because many youngmen and youngwomen are already working at the same

job in his out-fit.

2 - The service he could do, after his liberation, as a civilian in Rome, as interpreter or operator would be much more useful to the purpose of the War effort, than the one he was still doing.

Things were at that point, about the 15th of October, when he came home on leave.

Seeing the sufferings of his family, who did not receive any subsidy, and their very bad conditions, which were getting worse, and the painful situation of being unable to help them, while he was a prisoner, shocked him so badly that his nervous system resented, and at the moment of leaving, he was unable to come back to the out-fit.

For the above said reason it seems to me that the case of Liet. Aldanese is a very particular one which must be examined with a special sense of humanity.

His persisting in urging for his liberation, his abnormal physical conditions, his delay in coming back to his out-fit are explainable with the profound suffering that he proved on account of the bad conditions of his family and his impossibility to provide until he was put in liberty.

Now, Aldanese, feeling in better health wishes to join his out-fit and obtain the said liberty.

I wish once again, Dear Colonel, that you examine with deep spirit of humanity the sad case and take into consideration the possibility that Lieut. Aldanese obtain what he wishes, and his family, already so much proved, will have a little peace.

I thank you heartily for now and I send you my best regards.

His wife and daughter (aged 5) had to escape from Padova, where they lost everything after the town was bombed.

A sister of his who was married to a Cavalry Captain Manfredi ABBARITA, is now a widow, her husband being killed at Sessa Ardeatina on 23rd March 1944.

His family has no financial resources and they have a hard life with the allowances they get from the I.C.

Under the above circumstances I beg the Allied Commission to repatriate the Lieutenant as soon as possible.

- 1/. The position with regard to this Prisoner of War has been fully investigated and it is requested that the repatriation of this Prisoner of War be further considered.
- 2/. The following give full particulars regarding this case:
  - (a) The family find themselves in difficult circumstances owing to the fact that there is no male member to look after them and the financial position is not sufficient for their support at the present cost of living.
  - (b) The prisoner has been in captivity over four years. He has a son nearly four years old he has never seen.
  - (c) The family harbored and helped to escape two British soldiers.
  - (d) The Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War has assured me that an appointment in Civil Administration will be available to the Prisoner of War on his return.
- 3/. For the reasons above stated I recommend the early repatriation of this Prisoner of War.

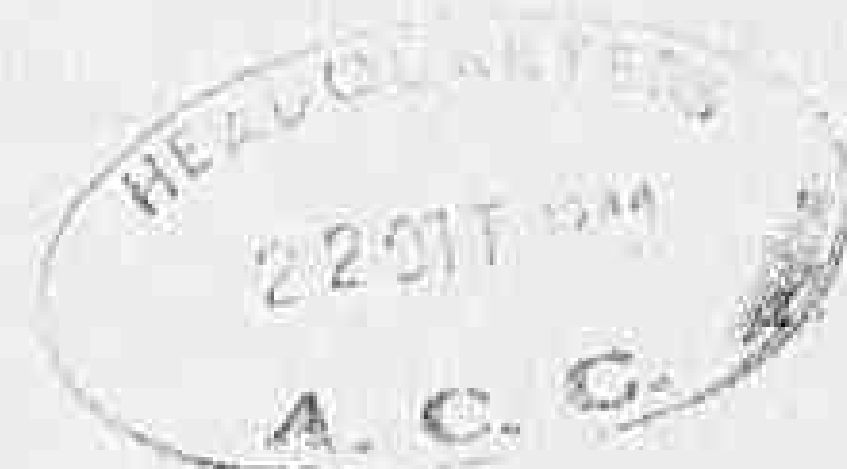

2. The above named two Officers have been interviewed by the I.O. who has obtained the following information:-

(i) Both these Officers belong to the Italian Air Force, and both escaped from the island of Rhodes where their units were stationed, and made for the Turkish mainland, where they joined other pro-United Nations Italian personnel ex the islands of Samos, Coss, etc. From Turkey, together with the others, they moved to EL BUREIT Camp in Palestine.

(ii) There is nothing to suggest that their actions whilst in EL BUREIT with No.5 Camp Staff (P.L.U.A.) were undesirable from a disciplinary or political point of view, and their records previous to that substantiate this statement.

(iii) It can, however, be stated that the transfer of these officers to Camp 305 was due to reports given by other Italian Officers, (Lt.Col. GIANONNI, Italian Air Force, for Lt. FERRI - - and Capt. BARACHIN, also Italian Air Force for Lt. CARASSAI). The British authorities at EL BUREIT Camp, (B.L.U.A. and No.5 Camp Staff) decided in view of the policy then followed to remove both Lts CARASSAI and FERRI in order not to foster trouble between the Senior Italian Officers and them.

(iv) It should be noted that these officers were stated to have been properly disciplined, and to have shown a desire to cooperate in every way at PW Camp 305, (Lt.Col. DUGGAN).

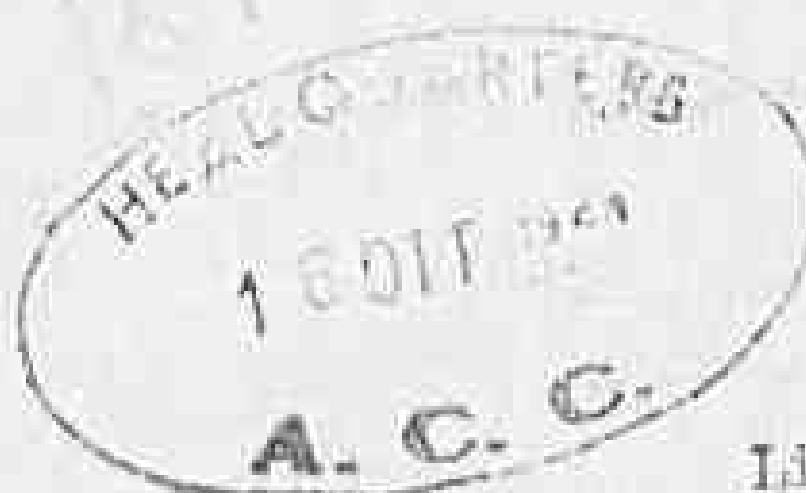

Under the circumstances, I do not see how I can continue to request Aldanese's release, but I shall be pleased to discuss this matter with you further at our next meeting, if you wish to do so.

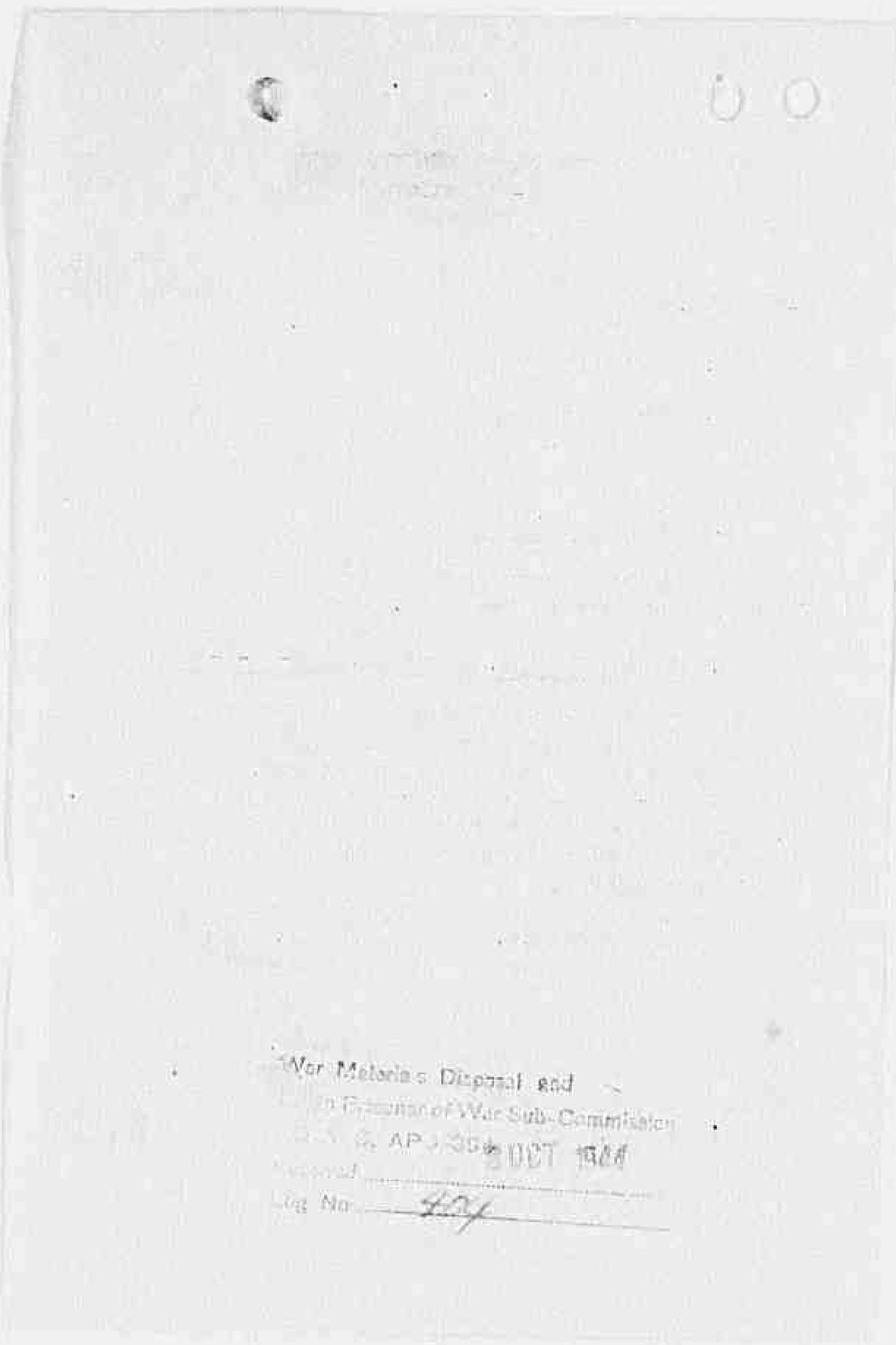

Dear Colonel Campbell,

With reference to my letter of September 12th (69/34/44) I am so sorry to trouble you again about two more cases - (a) that of a civilian internee, Ugo Fioretti, which has been brought to our attention by the San Marino Consul-General in Rome. I attach a memorandum in English sent to us by the Consul-General from which you will see that the internee in question would appear to have been passed for repatriation by a Medical Commission and (b) that of Second-Lieutenant Renato Ottaviani, nephew of His Excellency Monsignor Ottaviani (a very high Vatican official and a good friend of ours, who has asked me to interest myself in the case). Monsignor Ottaviani says that his nephew, whose address is Second-Lieutenant Renato Ottaviani 16707, Camp 26 Wing 1B Bombay, has been unwell for a long time and recently spent five months in hospital suffering from "sprue". His uncle is therefore extremely anxious that he should be repatriated as soon as possible.

As regards case (a), I have told the San Marino Consul-General that I would refer the matter to the Allied Control Commission in case there was anything they could do, in conjunction with the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War, to help expedite matters. As regards case (b) I have explained to Monsignor Ottaviani that his nephew has the right, if suffering from serious ill health, to apply to a mixed Medical Commission for repatriation but that otherwise there would seem to be little hope of his repatriation unless

Mr. Ugo Fioretti quodam Antonio, engineer, born in Roma 1894, contractor, went to Ethiopia in May 1940 for the approval of certain works which he had performed on behalf of some public institutions.

After Ethiopia had been occupied by the Allied troops, Mr. Fioretti, together with many other Italians, was interned in a concentration camp (337-Erba) .

In 1942 he underwent a medical examination, following which his repatriation was disposed. He is a veteran of the first great war where he lost one eye. Previously he had one arm and one leg injured due to a labour accident. Besides he is suffering from scurvy and diabetes.

Notwithstanding that, instead of being sent home he was interned in the Concentration Camp N°310, because he had been mistaken for a namesake a certain Ugo Fioretti quodam Antonio, who had been a prominent fascist official and was deceased a few weeks before.

On consideration of his poor state of health he has been revisited by the international medical Commission and received in an sanatorium where he is still waiting for is repatriation. 673

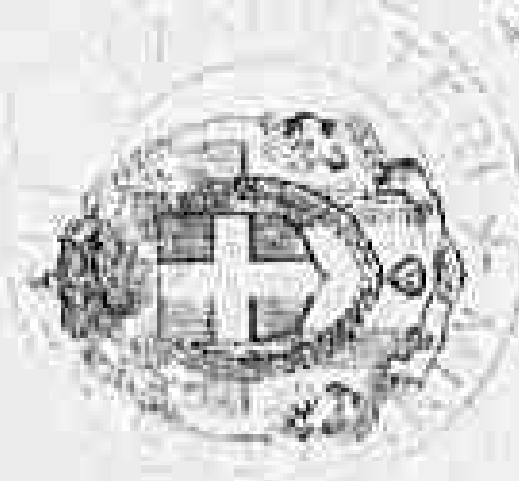

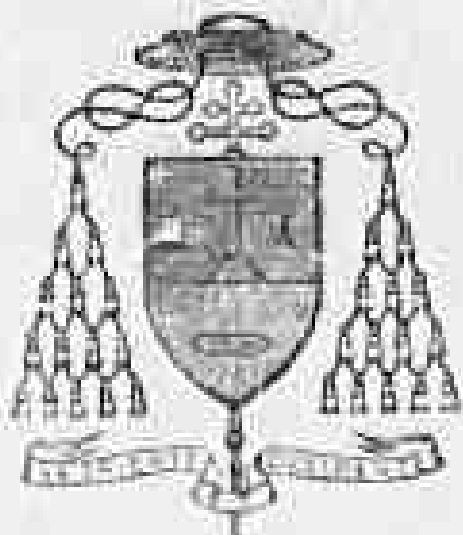

An ex-collaborator of the Vatican Library and a good friend of mine, Mr. Iginio Giordani, who is presently director of the Roman catholic newspaper, Il Quotidiano, asked me to do something in view of the early liberation of his brother-in-law, prisoner of war in Algeria, as we suppose, in an American camp.

The Major Geo SALVATI, born in Tivoli from Giacomo in the year 1892, is now at NATOUSA P.W.E. 126 (Oran, Algeria) No 81.J.51195. Lawyer in Tivoli, Major Salvati was taken while he was a judge at the military court of Palermo. He lost a brother, Ilo, killed at the Stazione Prenestina in the first bombardment of Rome, July 19, 1943, and a sister, Ida, killed in Tivoli on May 26, 1944, when the family house was destroyed. The coming back of Major Geo Salvati would allow him to take care of the brother's children and of all the interests of the family, a thing that Mr. Giordani and his wife cannot do easily, because they have themselves four children, the last one seriously ill in consequence of denutrition. Since that young child is a god-daughter of my niece, Mrs. Lottinville, and I procured myself food to the family before the arrival of the Allies, in difficult moments, I know how much the Giordanis would be relieved by the coming back of Major Salvati and therefore I take the liberty to tell you that I should be very much obliged for anything you may do towards the obtaining of the favor we wish.

A request has reached this Cabinet from R. It. Army Major Aldo CONTINI, at present POW No. 32247 at Camp No. 304, M.E.F.

The Major in question served with I.R.N. "SAN MARCO" Regt. from 1940 as L.O. and Chief of Operations, thus forming part of I.R.N. during the entire N. African campaign, until the date of his capture which occurred on 12.5.43.

He points out that, with a further 9 Army Officers who belonged to the S.MARCO Regt. who are also in Camp 304, M.E.F., he has been excluded from the number of I.R.N. personnel who are to take up war service again, and the reason given him is that Army Officers who served in the S.M.R. must be considered as R. It. Army Officers, and are therefore not included in the list of I.R.N. personnel to be repatriated. On the other hand he, differently from the other Army Officers, has been informed that those like him who had formed part of the S.M.R. should be held at the disposal of G.2 G.

In substance, Major CONTINI has seen any hope of immediate repatriation disappear, either one way or the other, since on the one hand he is "torn away" from I.R.N. and on the other he is even set apart from other Army Officers.

Having in mind that:-

- a) The Officers who have belonged to the S.M.R., a Corp of highly selected men who have given brilliant proofs when called upon, are all first-class;

- 1) Approach the Authorities concerned so as to obtain, if possible, the repatriation of Major CONTINI.
- 2) Explain the position in detail to the above Authorities so that all R.It. Army Officers who find themselves in the same situation (i.e., having belonged to S.M.R.), and unless there are special circumstances against it, be considered and treated in the same way as their comrades in I.R.N. in so far as repatriation is concerned.

I am sure that your Command will recognize the suitability of this request and that you will take steps to have remedied a situation which is really unfair.
