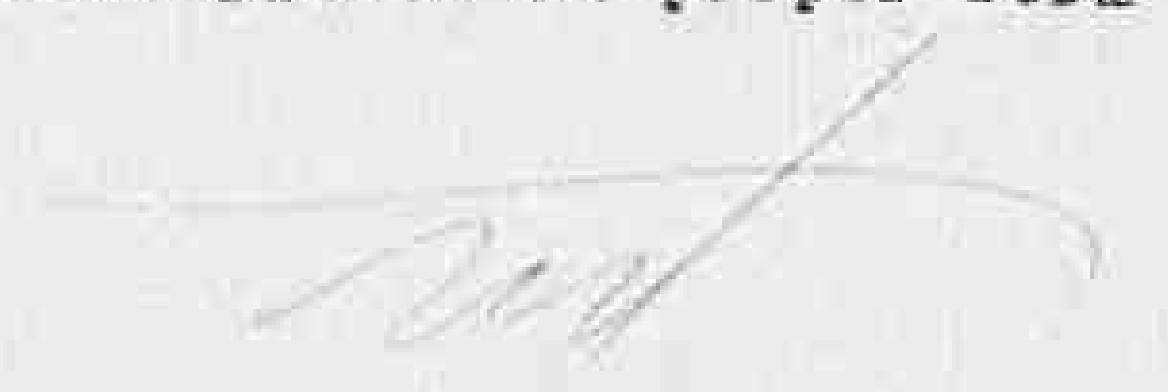

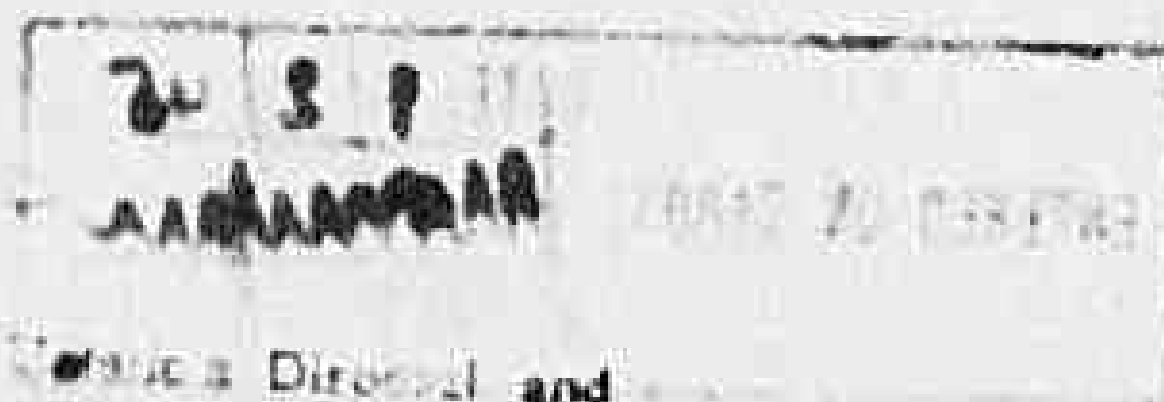

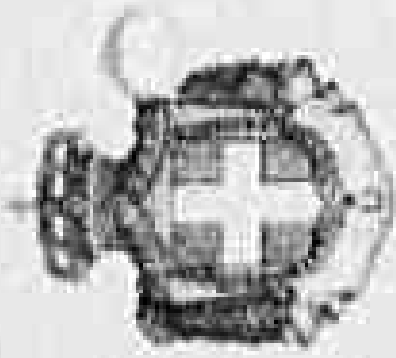

It is a request for the return of the husband of the applicant, from Ghinda (East Africa).

It appears that he should have come on the last boat but was left behind at the last moment because there was no room.

I know this case personally, and know that the family is in an almost desperate situation. The mother is also terribly anxious about the second son who seems to be getting into bad company and she feels that only the presence of his father can save him from ruin.

If there is anything which can be done to expedite this man's return it would be a very humane thing to do and I should personally be very grateful. I wonder if you would be kind enough to get someone in your office to 'phone me to say if there is any hope?

Please forgive me for bothering you personally. I know one Col. Campbell but I am afraid it is another and not yourself.

CURCIO Mario, father of the PW and head of the family, aged 60, employed at the Bank of Naples.

MONTANINI Anita, mother of the PW aged 48.

CURCIO Luigi, son, PW N. 377303 Camp 18 Great Britain of the class 1920

CURCIO Enzo, son of the class of 1922, internee in Germany.

CURCIO Fernando, class of 1923, seaman, reported missing.

CURCIO Ada, daughter aged 20 and unmarried

The economic condition of the family is very poor; they have only the wage of the father (as they have no private means) which amounts to L.5000 a month.

Taking into consideration that the family is very numerous, that of ten children, 7 are minors and therefore not able to work, and of the three older sons, only one could come to the help of his family, because as above mentioned, one is internee in Germany and the other one is missing, we beg the Allied Commission to examine this case and the possibility of the repatriation of the son CURCIO Luigi, who on his return will have his job at the Bank of Naples.

Mr. ASSANTI Alarico, father of PW (seaman) ASSANTI Fulvio, 4 WI - 37757 Camp 5 Fort Meade - Box 20, New York, during the air raid of the 14th of May 1943, lost his entire family and all his possessions.

In fact under the ruins of his house, his wife Luigia de Somma and two children Eli aged 17 and Giovanni aged 13, were found dead.

His only remaining son, who has not been informed of this tragedy is the above mentioned PW for whom repatriation is requested to aid his father.

The father, whose state of health is very much undermined as he suffers from Arteriosclerosis, has given signs of cerebral disturbances which are very preoccupying.

The High Commissioner has controlled this case and begs the Allied Commission to examine the possibility of the repatriation of the only survivor of this unhappy family, that he may be of aid to his father so sorely tried by these tragic circumstances.
