

Having controlled this case and finding it true the High Commissioner informs you as follows.

 PIETRELLA Luigi - aged 22 - taken up by the Germans and deported to Germany
 PIETRELLA Dorica - aged 30 - unmarried
 CAPORALSTTI Luigia - wife of PW. PIETRELLA Enrico - aged 31 with three children: Iolanda aged 10, Graziella aged 5, Marcella aged 3.

Taking into consideration that the family is so numerous and that of the four sons, two are POW's one missing and one interned in Germany, and therefore the men of the family are all absent except the father who is too old to take care of this family, they ask for the repatriation of the son PIETRELLA Enrico, father of the three small children.

We beg the Allied Commission to examine this case that is exceptionally compassionate, and if possible agree to the repatriation of PIETRELLA, who on his return would be of great help to the father in the cultivation of the ground and could take care of his own three children.



The family is composed of: SENTELLA Maria Orsola aged 47 and invalid because lame in her right leg, mother of the PW and SENTELLA Giuseppe PW aged 25, N.195843 etc, etc, SENTELLA Maria Antonia, sister of PW, aged 23, Carmela aged 19, Domenica aged 17, Arcangela aged 14 and Antonina aged 13 all five sisters are unmarried, the head of this numerous family is the mother who is lame and only one daughter is of age.

The economical situation of the family is very bad as they have only the allotments from the PW and a small bit of ground cultivated by the two elder sisters.

We warmly recommend this case to this Commission, that this repatriation may be accorded so that this PW on his return can, working as a peasant, help his family.

Please forgive me for bothering you personally. I know one Col. Campbell but I am afraid it is another and not yourself.





CURCIO Mario, father of the PW and head of the family, aged 60, employed at the Bank of Naples.

MONTANINI Anita, mother of the PW aged 48.

CURCIO Luigi, son, PW N.377303 Camp 18 Great Britain of the class 1920

CURCIO Enzo, son of the class of 1922, internee in Germany.

CURCIO Fernando, class of 1923, seaman, reported missing.

CURCIO Ada, daughter aged 20 and unmarried

The economic condition of the family is very poor; they have only the wage of the father (as they have no private means) which amounts to L.5000 a month.

Taking into consideration that the family is very numerous, that of ten children, 7 are minors and therefore not able to work, and of the three older sons, only one could come to the help of his family, because as above mentioned, one is internee in Germany and the other one is missing, we beg the Allied Commission to examine this case and the possibility of the repatriation of the son CURCIO Luigi, who on his return will have his job at the Bank of Naples.



Mr. ASSANTI Alarico, father of PW (seaman) ASSANTI Fulvio, 4 WI - 37757
Camp 5 Fort Meade - Box 20, New York, during the air raid of the 14th of May
1943, lost his entire family and all his possessions.

In fact under the ruins of his house, his wife Luigia de Somma and two
children Eli aged 17 and Giovanni aged 13, were found dead.

His only remaining son, who has not been informed of this tragedy is the
above mentioned PW for whom repatriation is requested to aid his father.

The father, whose state of health is very much undermined as he suffers
from Arteriosclerosis, has given signs of cerebral disturbances which are very
preoccupying.

The High Commissioner has controlled this case and begs the Allied Commission
to examine the possibility of the repatriation of the only survivor of this
unhappy family, that he may be of aid to his father so sorely tried by these
tragic circumstances.
