1. Basic Communication does not contain sufficient information to determine whether or not subject is eligible for repatriation on compassionate grounds in accordance with standards established by Allied Force Headquarters.

2. For your information in order that determination for eligibility for repatriation may be made at Prisoner of War Camp where PW is now held, the following classes only are subject for repatriation on compassionate grounds under standards set up by Allied Force Headquarters:

- a) When the mother or acting head of a family has died, and there are children who need care and attention, and there is no near relative or friend in the position to assume responsibility for these children, then the PW-husband is eligible for repatriation.
- b) When the mother or acting head of family is seriously ill and there are children remaining who need care and attention and they have no relative or friend in a position to assume the responsibility for these children, then the husband-PW is eligible for repatriation.
- c) When support is needed for the family of the PW and such support is so urgently needed that the family might be described as in "dire circumstances", and the family is also eligible for a "certificate of poverty".

- a) When the mother or acting head of a family has died, and there are children who need care and attention, and there is no near relative or friend in the position to assume responsibility for these children, then the PW-husband is eligible for repatriation.
- b) When the mother or acting head of family is seriously ill and there are children remaining who need care and attention and they have no relative or friend in a position to assume the responsibility for these children, then the husband-PW is eligible for repatriation.
- c) When support is needed for the family of the PW and such support is so urgently needed that the family might be described as in "dire circumstances", and the family is also eligible for a "certificate of poverty", and hardship grant from the Italian Government of from charitable sources, then the husband-PW is eligible for repatriation.

3/.

Though paragraph 2 above gives the only ground on which Italian PW are eligible for repatriation on compassionate grounds, there are three other classes of the Italian PW who are eligible for repatriation. For your information these other classes, now being repatriated in very limited number and subject to the availability of shipping space, are as follows:

- a) Medical cases approved by mixed medical commission.
- b) Italian PW who are 60 years old and those 50 years old who have been confined for 2 years.
- c) Certain specialists, requested by Allied Authorities or by the Italian Government and approved by Allied Authorities. These and for the organization of the Italian Government and the reconstruction of Italy.

The wife of the PW. Serg.Maj. Guido Vincenzo at the PW Camp N. 7621, Oran (Algiers) N. 81-I-35248, has sent a request for the repatriation of her husband to the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War on March 30th 1944. The High Commissioner has taken the request into consideration because her husband belongs to the Medical Personnel and also because his case comes under the provisions issued by the Superior Allied Authorities, the PW. being an orphan (his father fell in the War 1915-1918) and his wife living in pitious conditions and depending entirely on her very poor parents.

By a letter of April 26th 1944 the High Commission, assured her that the request had been considered benevolently and was on its way to the competent Allied Authorities. All the same the writer addresses herself to Col. J.A. CAMPBELL begging him to interpose his offices in order to get her husband repatriated, considering also the fact that he has been a PW for over 2 years. Since the above mentioned letter of April 26th 1944, she has ~~not~~ heard no more on the subject.

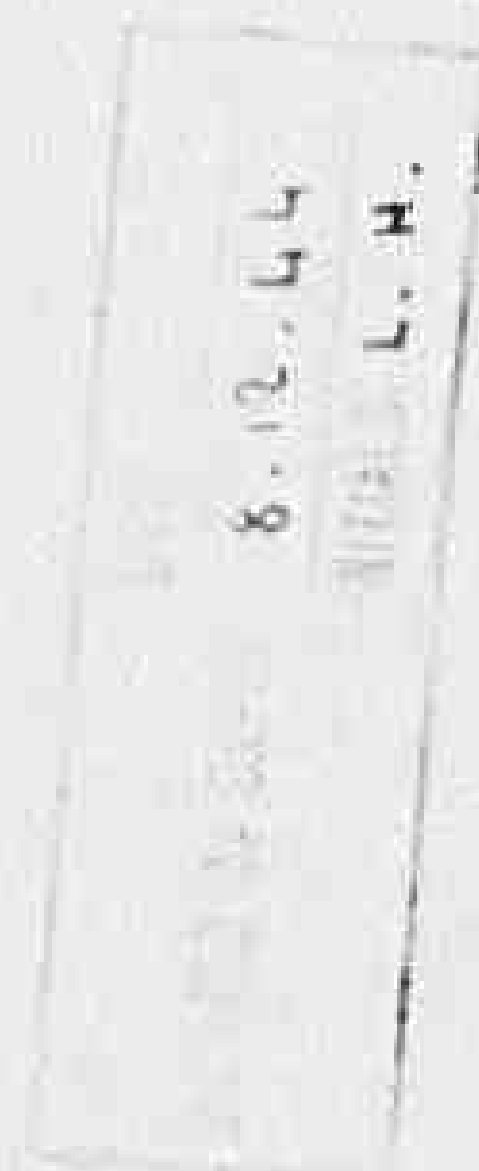

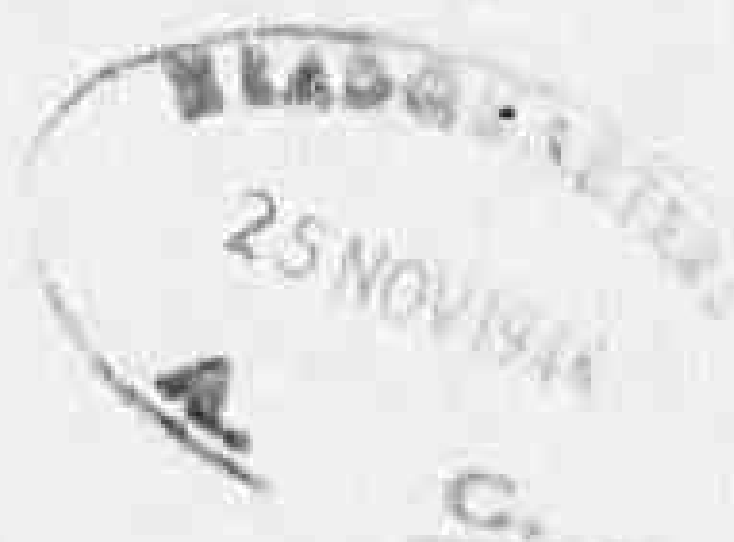

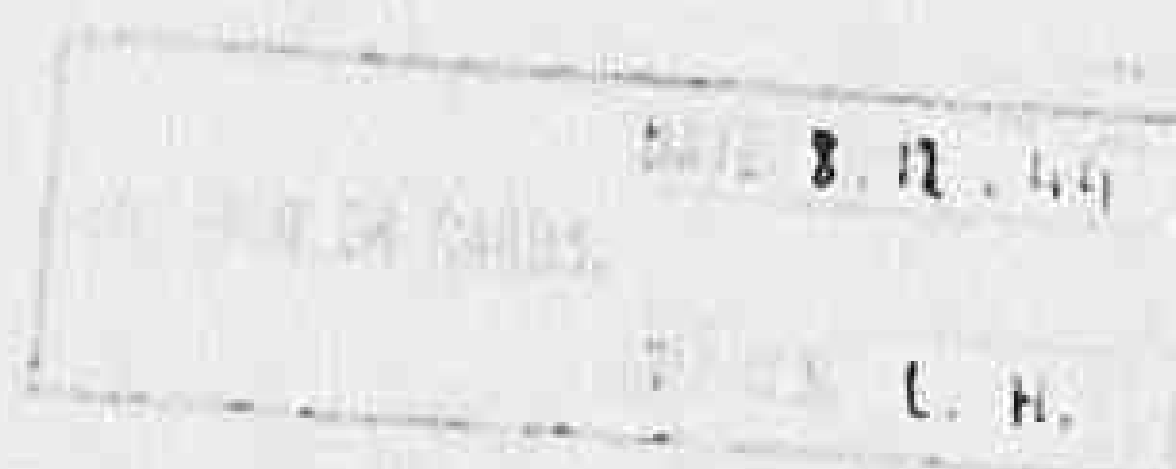

The undersigned Bettola Adelaide, who lives in Brindisi Via Vespasiano, No. 20, wife of the POW Doctor Martinelli Paolo son of Sebastiano, (deceased) class of 1906, makes request to The High Commissioner for Prisoners of War repatriation for the ~~husband~~ of her husband. At present he is a civilian internee at 33455 Evacuee Camp I B. Kenia Koloni. As a civilian he was a State employee at Addis-Ababa, he was called for military duty in 1940 as a Lieut in the Commissariato of the Royal Navy, and taken prisoner on the occupation of Addis-Ababa. He is the only support of his wife, and 2 children, who were returned to the Fatherland by A.O.I. in 1942. She arrived at Brindisi without any means, and found her husband's family completely destroyed by the air-raids of November 1941, deprived of their home, which was destroyed, and everything, and with the family solely on her shoulders.

The husband is in a pitiful physical condition. In prison his nervous system has been shaken, with acute Nevrostinia. He is also in need of continuous cure, because he has a heart condition caused by all the suffering he has gone through.

In view of the above the undersigned turns to the courtesy and goodness of the High Commissioner for POW, hoping that he will arrange, in the least possible time the repatriation of her husband to the Fatherland, for the following reasons: To help his own family, which is reduced to a pitiful state, and also to cure himself.

In the hope that my petition will be considered favourably, and with courteous greetings, I rest in hope of an assurance which will make the undersigned tranquil.

1. Approval of the return of Lt. Gen. Annibale Bergonzoli was formerly refused by this Headquarters on security grounds and because his services were not desired by the Italian Government or the Allies.
2. The War Department, however, urgently requests reconsideration of the matter and recommends agreement to his early return for the following reasons. The General has deteriorated greatly mentally and physically and any light infection might cause his early decease in the U.S. ~~and~~ This, the State Department considers, might have unfortunate political repercussions in Italy. U.S. Military Authorities are satisfied he cannot constitute a security danger, since his mental condition approaches complete incompetency.
3. It is requested that the Italian Government be asked whether in the circumstances they will now accept him into Italy and place him in an appropriate institution where he can be controlled during hostilities. On receipt of this assurance arrangements for repatriation will be made.

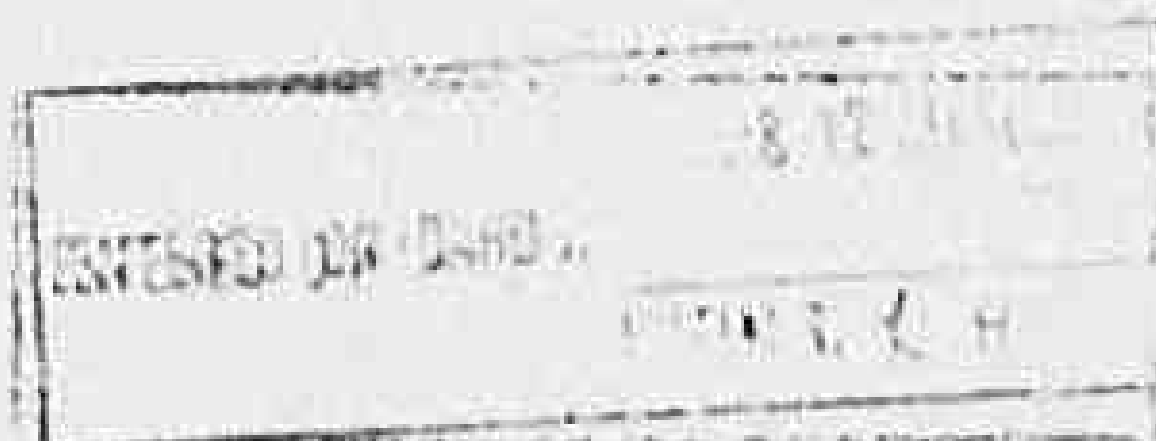

From communications made by liberated PW it appears that the Italian PW as soon as they enter in the Orleans Barrack in Algiers they are searched and their belongings are stolen from them by a Corsican Corporal who is in charge of them. These PW are then put in a large room (prison) full of insects and parasites, some of them were kept there from 20 to 30 days. The room is without sanitary accommodation.

The place where the PW are kept is not big enough for them all, sometime more than 40 PW are in this room and the cubic space is insufficient for the breathing and the smell is terrible.

The Corsican Corporal has violent and rowdy manners against the PW some of them wish had died in battle rather than support the violence of this infamous jailer!

I ask the Allied Commission to kindly enquire about this matter and inform the local Authorities of these dire facts and also disciplinary action should be taken against the Corporal.

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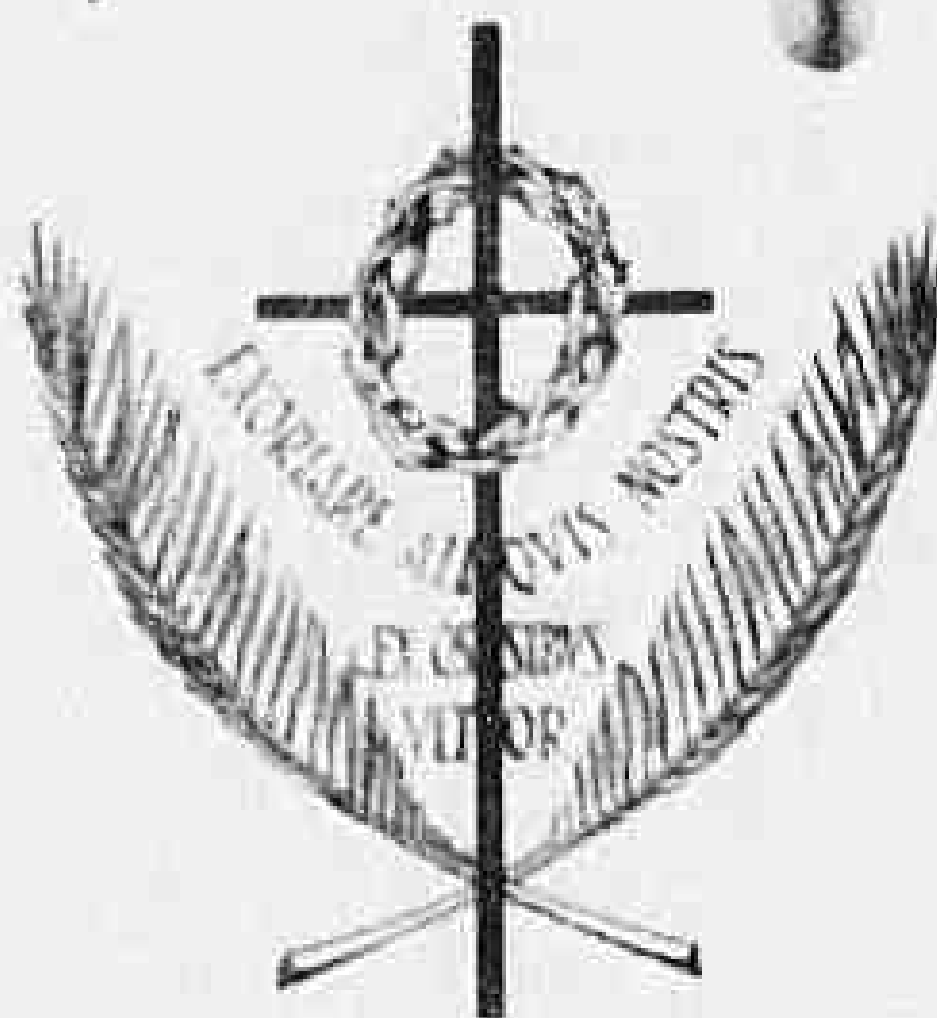

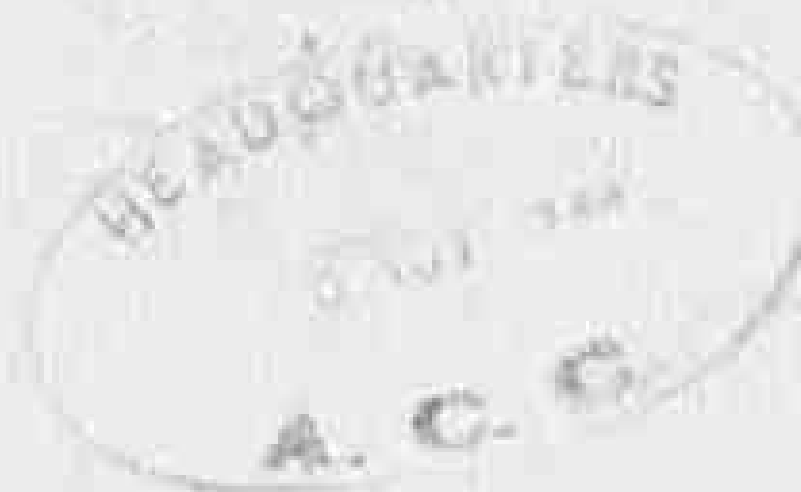

ON THE ARMISTICE'S ANNIVERSARY
THE "RE" DIVISION AT MONTEROTONDO

On the armistice's anniversary the wonderful behaviour of a certain number of groups of the "Re" Division against the Germans, should be known and remembered as a proof of resolution and bravery.

A number of the 2nd Infantry Regiment, coming from Postumia, was surprised during the journey towards Rome by the events that happened on September 8th.

The Commander, Colonel Gaetano DE RENZI, on the morning of September 9th, vigorously attacked exceedingly strong German parachute forces that were going to Monterotondo - North east of Rome, to attack Army's Headquarters.

A strong attack was directed by a group of courageous soldiers, among whom was Captain Raffaele Mini, against a German position in the sportive Camp of Monterotondo.

The action was favoured by surprise and from the start developed into a hard fight with hand grenades and side arms.

A number of Germans were killed, some others tried to hide in the fields, others pretended surrender, so to attack treacherously those who were advancing towards them.

With Colonel De Renzi twice wounded, Officers, S.G.'s and privates fought in a wonderful way.

During the victorious fight, over forty soldiers of the Headquarters Command and a lot of civilians, who had been caught by the Germans and locked in a house near the Sportive Camp, were liberated.

During the following days, September 9th, 10th, 11th, hard fights went on in the surrounding hills, between the reduced forces of the "Re" Division and the German troops.

Although they had no supplies, very little arms and munitions, the soldiers, courageously upheld by the surviving Officers, gave no respite to the enemy and inflicted serious losses on them.

The glorious standard of the Regiment was saved by the Commanding Colonel.

I am the eldest of other 5 sons and my poor mother is blind, I ask you to sympathize him after 5 long years as he is very old and suffering, wounded and invalid of 1918-19 war.

His family's present moral, physical and material conditions are very bad and getting worse, not to speak of the financial conditions - my father's emoluments are paid with an account on his salaries of 300 Liras per month.

I ask you how a family of 6 persons can live with only 300 Liras a day, without having any other resources.

If all this misfortune was to be added another one very discouraging that is the lack of news from our father from whom we couldn't hear in these last 6 months.

I ask for this Commission to urgent inquiry to avoid our ruin. I hope you will take all the above reasons into consideration. I'm faithfully waiting for news.

My family lives in Carabasso del Duero (Prov. of Lecce) and I live in Sirio (Prov. of Lecce).

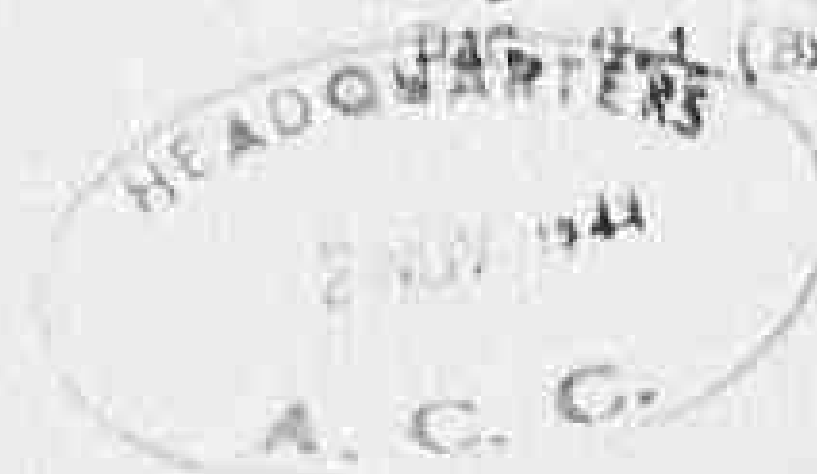

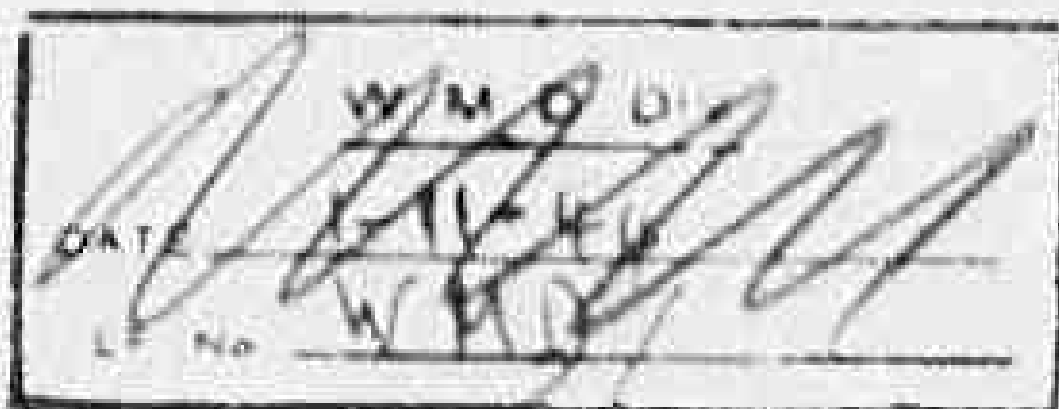
I was informed by the tenant that ALLANESS vacated the premises nine months ago.

Reference your signal I(S) 429 of 18 Jun 1944.

1. We have made enquiries concerning the above POW and are still of the opinion that it would be most inadvisable to release him. On two occasions recently, in February and March 1944 had to mark him as pro-Fascist and a coward.
2. The Commander of No. 4 Italian Administration HQ, MEF, reports that during his stay at his camp he received several adverse reports on him and was compelled to put him alone with his batman in a special enclosure. During the 5 or 6 weeks spent in this enclosure near the Italian POW Camp, he was found to be inciting them against signing a declaration of co-operation. The Commander formed the opinion that he was an 'insincere and plausible Italian autocrat' who had no interest in his own men and whose greatest concern seemed to be to take his batman with him wherever he went.
3. A certain Major TAMACCHI, formerly employed by M.O. 4, stated that he collaborated with the Germans from the 8 - 30 September and was known among Italians as pro-German, being responsible, among others, for the surrender of the Germans of the 11th Army. He stated that he is certain, Fascist and that he would certainly work for the Germans if the opportunity presented itself.
4. On the basis of the above statements, we find it difficult to believe that his release is advisable.

I, the undersigned Concettina Mineo, married to engineer Giuseppe Mineo, resident in Catania, (in Vittorio Emanuele St, 104-106) hereby write the following:

My husband, engineer Giuseppe Mineo, Artillery Major, has been Prisoner of War since 17th August 1943. He was taken prisoner in the Province of Messina on the above date and now he is at the American Detention Camp P.O. 1. ELBA (Algeria).

As stated above, my husband has been away, a Prisoner, for over a year, thus causing inevitable and serious consequences of financial and moral nature.

I am alone in the family and I am awaiting - and hope only from him - the necessary and most urgent help.

His father who is eighty years old and is affected of arteriosclerosis high degree, of chronic asthma, of luxation of the right knee and posttraumatic fracture of the right arm - and therefore unable to work - is expecting the most help. He lives alone in LICOLI (Catania) in deep sorrow for the recent death of his wife who has not had, before dying, the so much desired wish to see his only son again coming back home. My husband would have great possibility of immediate earnings and could carry on with the many clients who owed his professional services. Before leaving for the Army, he worked with the architect of this city, Prof. Francesco Piccola, who was kind enough to give me a letter which I present as proof and from which it can be seen how my husband was left work incomplete also in his office.

My husband is a man of recognized respectability in private life as well as in the social one. Among all who know him, it is a well known fact that he was and later too, he has fought with the liberal party, resisting all pressure to the point of sacrificing himself rather than join the Fascist Party.

Therefore, in the name of the liberty which has been given back to us and in the name of the family affections, I ask for the liberation of my husband.

SUBJECT: Repatriation - Pietro CORTI.

TO : Headquarters, Allied Commission, APO 394

For your information, approval has this day been given for the repatriation of CORTI, Pietro, SI-I-235239, who was admitted to Italian PW hospital at PW camp 129 from the Port of Oran under the following circumstances:

a. Subject PW served as a carabinieri in the city of Orbetello, Province of Grosseto, during the German occupation. Threatened by the Germans with removal to Germany he fled to the mountains at Cappadocia and joined the Partisans under the command of Captain Brego. While serving with the group an American plane brought an Italian Officer named Lt. Paolo and he assumed command of the Partisans. When the Germans began to retreat about 11 May 1944, he and two other carabinieri and a civilian proceeded to the town of Cappadocia. On their way they met an American Officer, who was escorting a group of PW, and they told him their story. The American officer suggested that they report to headquarters and offered them transportation.

b. They arrived at PW enclosure and after unloading the PW they proceeded with an American driver to headquarters. On their way they hit a ditch, overturning the truck and injuring Corti, Pietro. He regained consciousness in a hospital at Tarquinia suffering from a fractured leg and bruises. He was processed at the hospital and from there sent to Africa and subsequently admitted to PW Camp 129 as a patient.
