



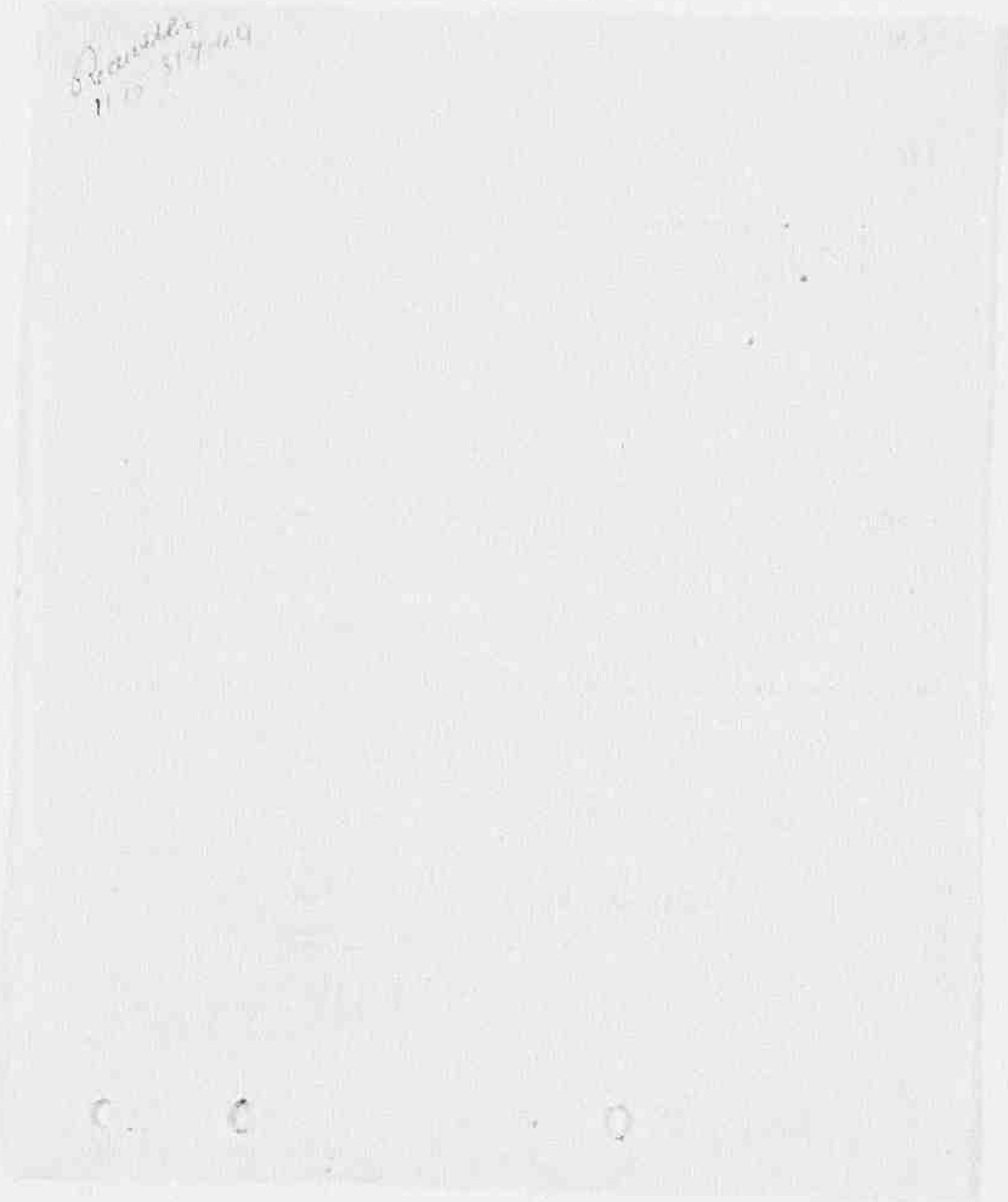

1. All Italian POWs in North Africa use the same return address and all mail for POWs is dispatched to a central point for sorting and forwarding according to the prisoner's current address. No matter how many camps the prisoner may pass through, his whereabouts is always known, because it is recorded on a locator card in the central dispatching point. Furthermore, prisoners are always given the privilege of writing their families as soon as they reach a new location.
 2. The instance of mail being returned marked "repatriated" must have been for prisoners enroute home, at their homes, or in the custody of the Italian Government.
 3. The request for a list of locations of transferred Italian prisoners and their addresses, is still under consideration.

2. This matter has been taken up on both the American and British sides.

3. The reply from the American side is as follows:-

a. Italian Prisoners of War in United States custody have been repatriated only for release to the Italian Government through the Allied Control Commission or to their families at their homes when circumstances were deemed to warrant.

b. No Italian Prisoners of War have been transferred to Italy for retention in United States custody as prisoners of war and all concerned have been notified that no such action will be tolerated.

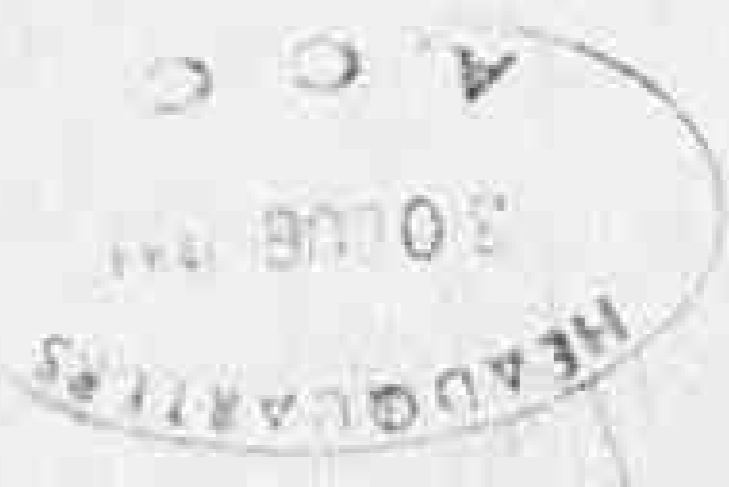

1. In relation to the recent representations and enquiries made by the High Commissioner for P.O.W. concerning some apparent delays in the delivery of mail to P.O.W., information has now come to hand as follows:-

* The transmittal of mail has been the subject of constant attention and every effort is being made to handle it expeditiously. Indications are that mail from Allied controlled territory is now being delivered to North African camps in an average of three weeks. Inquiries have been made of censorship units and postal authorities with view towards lessening channels through which mail passes.

The volume of incoming mail has shown considerable increase within the past few months and now averages over 250,000 pieces per month through the Prisoner of War Directory Service of the Provost Marshal General, SOE NATOUA. However, little of this mail is from Axis occupied territory. Inquiries have been made through the International Red Cross concerning such mail and report that mail is held up at Tangiers is being investigated.

It is believed that complaints are attributable to a relatively small number of prisoners of war whose correspondents may be residents of Allied-controlled localities where it has not been possible to extend mail service or who are residents of Axis occupied territory.

2. This appears to clear up much of the uncertainty which has existed, and it covers also the point of the reported hold up at Tangiers. Perhaps you will pass the information on to the High Commissioner. 6124

3. P.O.S. correspondence comes to hand for delivery prior to the opening of the normal civil mail services, and it is considered necessary to effect delivery, and afford collection facilities for letters posted to P.O.S., as early as possible after territory has been occupied. It was agreed that the most practicable means of carrying this out, in the absence of a normal mail service, was as follows:-

(a) Incoming letters.

After being released by Allied Censorship Control Officers at Naples and Bari, letters to be forwarded thence by the Italian Post Offices in bags addressed to the Provincial Commissioner at the Headquarters of the Province of destination. From there, after sub-division by the local Italian Post Office, the correspondence is to be forwarded to subordinate Post Offices for delivery to recipients. Conveyance from Naples and Bari to be made by normal mail services transportation as far forward as possible, hence by courier or other such official means as may be available.

(b) Outgoing letters -

P.O.S. letters posted at each Post Office to be made up into packages addressed to the Allied Censorship Control Officer at the Provincial Capital for onward conveyance to Naples or Bari. The conveyance of these packages also to be made by such civil or official transportation as is available from time to time.



SUBJECT:- Hospitalization of Italian POW in India suffering from Malaria.

An examination of the statistics of the Italian POW in India taken to hospital, belonging to the Camps of Group 6, show from the year 1943 a surprising progressive increase of those taken ill with malaria.

And the percentage of the malarial cases which in the months of March and September 1943 varies from 2.6 to 5.9% goes up in the winter months (October to December) to an average of 12%, reaching even 49% in Group 6 for the month of October 1943.

One can only deduce that the Camp of Group 6 are in a highly malarious region, and since the choice of such a site is in contrast to the regulations in Articles 9 and 10 of the Geneva Convention, I beg the ACC to kindly call the attention of the British Government to these undesirable conditions so that the necessary measures may be taken.

1/. Relations of PWs have had their letters, addressed to the normal PW camp address in North Africa, returned to them with "repatriated" written on the envelope.

The families who have their letters returned to them with the declaration "repatriated" and don't see their relative arrive home of course, after some time start to get worrisome speculating that some disgrace has happened to their relative PW and live in extreme anguish. It has now been stated that actually these soldiers have come to Italy and that they are, however always under the painful qualification of PW, united in labour groups in the retinue of the Anglo-American Army in Italy.

Perhaps the repatriation of the letters to the sender has been determined by the fact that contrary to Art. 6 of the Convention of Geneva the detaining powers have not yet communicated to the R. Italian Government and through it to the High Commissioner for PW, the official addresses to which the relatives of these PW can address their letters, or either the PW themselves have not yet been put in the position to correspond personally with their relatives, according to the conditions provided by the Articles 26 and 35 of the same Convention of Geneva.

I pray for the benevolent interest of the A.C.C. so that very soon this grave inconvenience mentioned above can be remedied, keeping present the serious repercussions of moral order, which would come forth if this situation was to be prolonged, either with regards to the PWs as to their families, who since many months, reciprocally are without any news.

I would be grateful if the A.C.C. could send to the High Commissioner the lists of the PWs and who have been brought to Italy as well as their respective address. The interested families would be immediately informed by us. **6113**

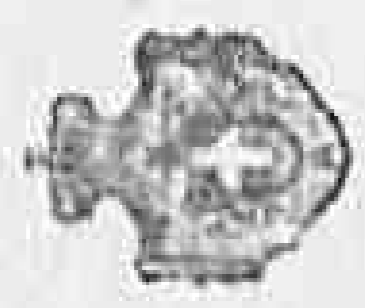

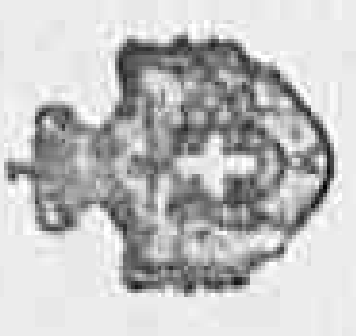

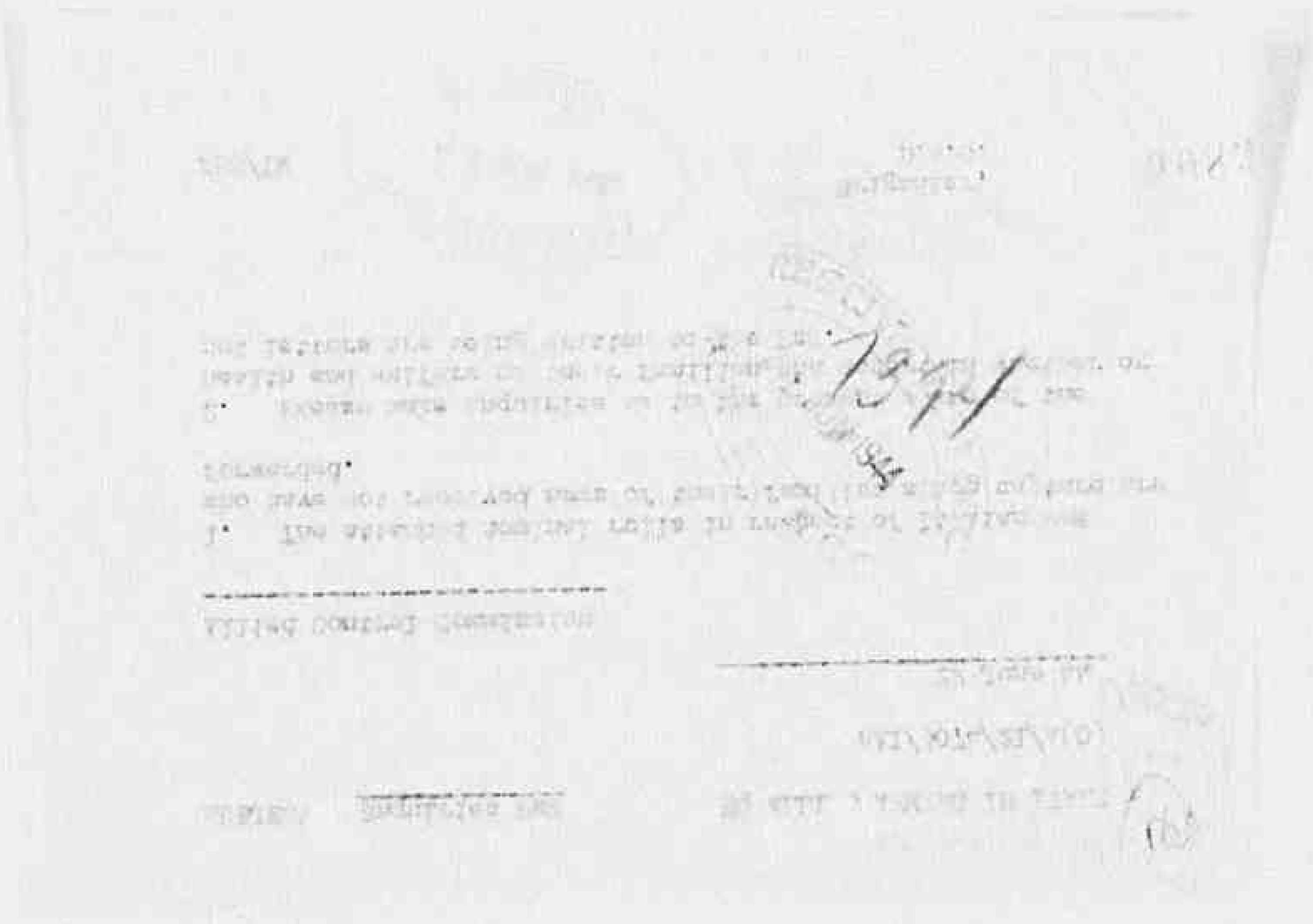

Consequently, I earnestly beg the A.C.C. to reassure said prisoner, who is greatly worried, by kindly informing him as soon as possible that I and all his relations are in excellent health and hope he will soon be able to see us again and are receiving his letters regularly.
