Dear Admiral,

As a group of Italian workers who had worked in France for the American army and were returning to Italy through Switzerland, were crossing the border at Annemasse, the French customs-officials sequestered, without issuing individual receipts, the sums in France that belonged to these Italian subjects, and represented their savings, earned with their work. The greatest part of these workers came from the American depot n. 0609.

Also many ex Italian prisoners of war who returned from German concentration camps complained they had been ill-treated by the French military commands. I refer, among other things, to the note of the Ministry for Post-war Relief (Alta-Italia office), sent on August 29th, current year, to the Allied Commission, a propos of incidents which took place in Dorn (Austria).

I draw your attention on the last unpleasant incident which took place at Annemasse, and I suggest to contact the competent Allied Commands, so that, in agreement with the French Government, instructions be given to the frontier offices, not to prevent our workers and ex-prisoners, who worked for the Allies, from bringing their savings back to Italy.

It would be advisable to have the next convoys escorted to the frontier by allied representatives.

I shall greatly appreciate all that you can do about this matter, and I remain,

1. You are informed, as per your request, that the delay in subject correspondence was due to the ambiguity of the entire problem relating to Prisoners in such camps as 200- Afragola.

2. It has been the contention of this Division that Prisoners held in such camps come directly under the jurisdiction of the Provost Marshal General - as political Prisoners rather than Prisoners of War as dealt with by this Division.

3. Such Prisoners, it follows, would then be the concern of the Public Safety Sub-Commission- Security Division. As the subject deals with just this question, it has met with the fate, not unusual in these matters, of passing back and forth between Italian Prisoners of War Division and Security Division, and being refused by both, until this Office realizing that action must be taken, took it without further question even though it was not a matter within its competence.

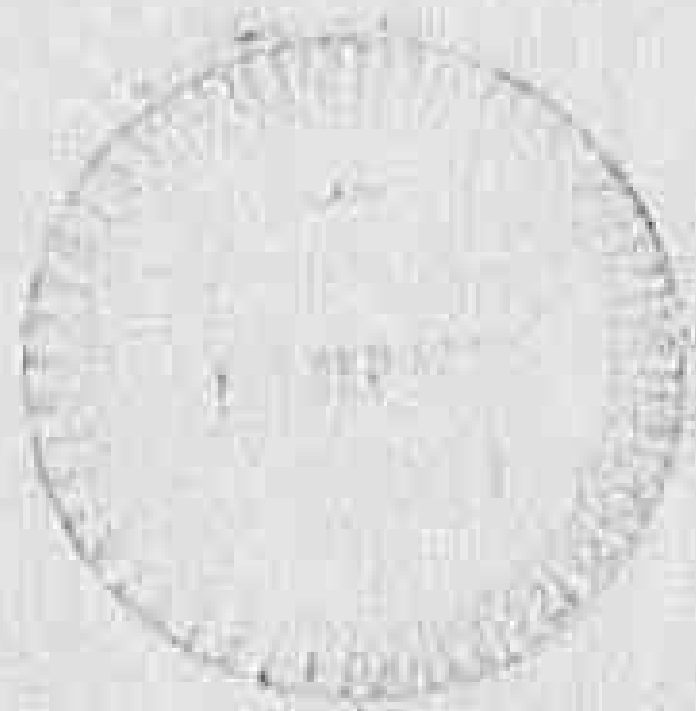

With his aim in view he has presented us the following witnesses: the employee Avallone Pasquale, son of Antonio. he is 21 years old, he was born at Naples and lives at Cagnazzi. 56.

2) Student Varriale Mario, son of Gennaro, 22 years old, born at Naples and lives V. Capodimonte 137

3) Esposito Gaetano, son of Francesco, 21 years old, born at Naples and lives at Vico Majorano 13.

They have been separately heard, one after the other, and they have upon their honour and conscience concordantly witnessed that it was within their knowledge that from the house of the requirer of this act, on the 27th of November 1943 two sons of his, Filippo of the class 1925 and Mario of the class 1925 had been deported by the German troops. Aponte Vincenzo and his wife Cappabianca Matilde were entirely dependent on their sons. They were employees, they lived with them and were their supporters. The sons are still deported, therefore the parents would like to be given a subsidy which they are entitled. The above named witnesses submit themselves to the punishments established by the penal code, if they have made a fraudulent statement.

Upon what precedes has been drawn this act. It has been read and confirmed.

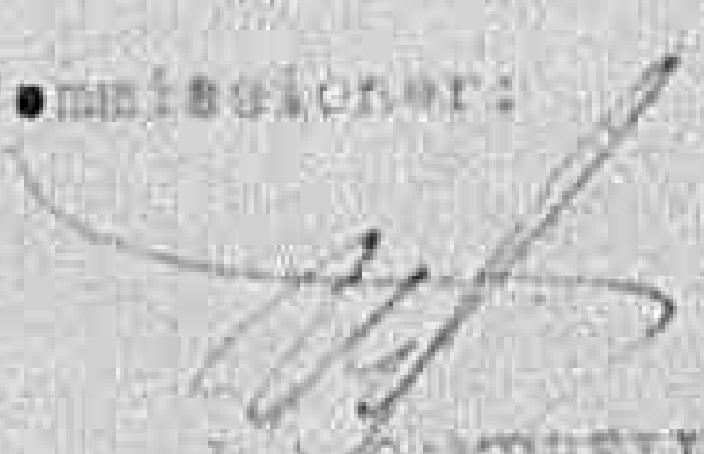

The undersigned Dr. Clarizio Venanzio, son of Pasquale born at Venosa (Potenza) on the 16 of March 1908, ex Lieut. of the P.A.I. who landed at Taranto on the 11-5-44 from imprisonment in the POW Camp 356 (Kenya East Africa Command) repatriated by request of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers, states as follows:

As Lieut. of the P.A.I. he was in Addis Abeba on the 6th April 1941 at the dependence of the Police Section of the Scioa on duty at the native market, at half-past seven in the evening he exchanged fire with the natives in revolt, wounding and killing some etiopians; subsequently he was arrested by the M.P. in Diredaia, transferred to Addis Abeba and put in the local "Akaki Prison" on the 1st May 1941.

Clarizio was charged with murder by the British Military Court on the 8th May 41 and condemned to death by hanging.. Said sentence was changed, by General Cunningham, Commander of the Middle East into 15 years imprisonment.

On the 23rd of June 42, Clarizio with 24 other prisoners was transferred to the British Prison at Mogadiscio, from which he was dismissed on the 7th of Sept. 42 following a suspension of his sentence and sent to the POW Camp of Mogadiscio no.356 Camp East Africa Command.

On the 23rd of October Clarizio was called by Lt.Col. A. Stitt, Commander of Camp No. 356 who informed him the he would be transferred to Nairobi where he was to confer with a high British Authority.

In fact, on the 24th of that month he left and was received by Lord Rennel of Rood of the D.C.P.O. who in perfect italian, after having made a resumee of his case, informed him that his plea against his sentence, presented in June 42, was declared "officially annulled giving him retarded justice".

Clarizio then re-entered the POW Camp 356.

These are the facts: the undersigned in the need of proving his activities from the 6th April 1941 to the 10th Oct. 42 (period of imprisonment) the motives for which he was tried, asks the High Commissariat to obtain from the Allied Command a copy of the juridical files, from which results as follows:

- 1- That Clarizio's case was dismissed and sentence suspended in a complete and honorable form.
- 2- His behaviour during his imprisonment.
- 3- A statement made personally by Lord Rennel of Rood to Clarizio at Nairobi.

With the certainty that the High Commissariat was realize the necessity of the request and will show the undersigned their benevolent consideration.

Naples, 12-6-45

My dear son,

After having been many months without any news I received 3 letters of yours and one postcard dated 9-4-45, 30-4-46 and 1-5-45.

I am glad to hear you are well. We also are all well and our only thought is the hope to see you soon. Dear son, every day prisoners arrive home and I hope that your day will come soon. As you know we are old and have no other aim in our life than to see you.

The same thing as to you happened to Carmine, Emma's husband. But he did not mind so much. Now Emma lives with the family of Gallone and she does just what she likes.

My dear son, there is one thing I want to tell you. When you come home, at any time of the day or of the night, come and see us first. Afterwards you will decide yourself as to what to do.

Ernesto is with us and he is waiting for you. My dear son, I want to tell you that all what happened is not our fault. We hope and beg to have enough strength and health to await your arrival. But we also pray God with all our hearts, that you may be strong enough to face this hard experience in your life.

Dear son, as you insist so much I tell you everything. I did not want to because I did not want you to suffer so much. Your wife has not done all her duties as a wife. I think that you have two ~~sons~~ who are waiting for you and they think of you everyday.

Your father has informed the authorities of this, but as long as you are away there is nothing to do.

I have been at your house and I have seen things which I do not like and have reminded your wife of her duties, but she would not listen to my advice. She told me that she only had to answer for her conduct to you and so I had to leave her.

As I have told you Ernesto is with us.

No. 32057 ME, have received a letter from my parents in which after having insisted very much, I am informed that my wife is not leading a proper life. My parents inform me that they have invited my wife to respect her matrimonial duties. She told them that she only had to answer for her conduct to me.

Since a long time I suspected of the faithfulness of my wife as in a letter dated February she told me that she found herself in great difficulties owing to the lack of means and she begged me to leave the children with her. I point out that my parents have seen the local authorities, but nothing can be done as long as I am away. Could I please be transferred to a Camp or Company nearer home? If this is not possible could my allotment to the wife please be transferred to my parents and may they have charge of my children.

"Article 77 of the International Convention relative to the treatment of Prisoners of War dated at Geneva 27th July, 1929, to which all His Majesty's Governments and the Italian Government are signatories, imposes on belligerents the duty of instituting at the outbreak of war a Prisoners of War information Bureau to give information about prisoners of war in their territory. The Convention states that such information shall be communicated to the Powers concerned on the one hand through the intermediary of the Protecting Power and on the other hand through a Central Agency provided for in Article 79 of the Convention. In the event, this Central Agency was organised by the International Red Cross Committee and was established in Geneva.

In view of the re-establishment of direct relations between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Italian Government and the possibility of similar developments in respect of other of His Majesty's Governments it is considered that the time has come for a revision of the channels of communication prescribed by the Convention with a view to hastening the communication of information.

His Majesty's Governments accordingly suggest that

information regarding prisoners of war in their territories should no longer be communicated to the Central Agency at Geneva for the subsequent information of the Italian Government, but that the Prisoners of War Information Bureau functioning within the British Commonwealth shall communicate direct with the Italian Government. It is therefore requested to ascertain the views of the Italian Government in this matter and if the proposed modification is acceptable to ask the Italian Government to state to whom the information should be addressed.
