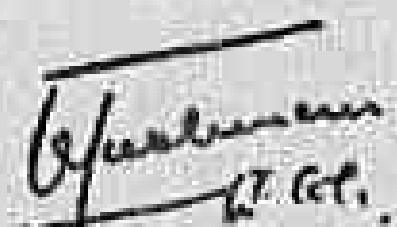

Amongst these are one officer and seven Men, who have been repatriated following the decisions of the American medical commissions, which recognized them as being sick and in need of care by their own families, a list of whose names is attached and who have their domicile at Tunis, where they were born and where they want to go to join their respective families.

We ask your Sub Commission to ask the competent American Authorities, so that the Military concerned may be authorized to reach Tunis on the first American means of transport bound for the said Tunis.

The persons concerned have informed us that other P.O.W.s who were in the same position as themselves and who were to be found in English and French Camps were repatriated direct to Tunisia without any trouble.

This H.Q. would be grateful to your Sub Commission to receive information about this matter.

I pray you to repatriate those instead.

Inreference to to the verbal communication of yesterday 2 July, I wish to confirm that the repatriation of 150 more invalids besides the 640 already announced, will be appericiated and can be affected immediately. Will the Commission kindly give an 8 day notice of the repatriation, indicating also the port of disembarkation, as well as the categories of the repatriates (when confined to stretchers; officers, enlisted men, sick and their allments).

As already known to you, we would appreciate it if the men are disembarked in a port of the eastern Mediterranean or of the Adriatic (Taranto, Brindisi or Bari), because inland of these ports there are better facilities of accomodating those repatriates needing hospital care, while in Sicily or in Campania, these afacilities are scanty.

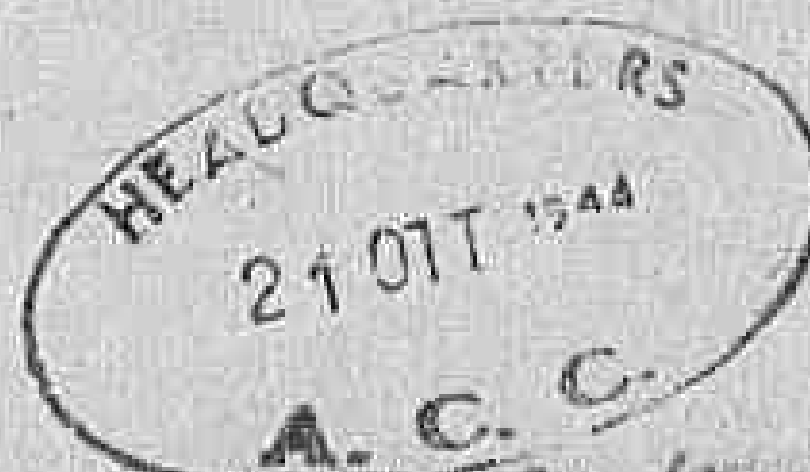

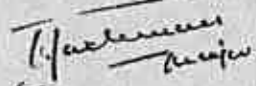

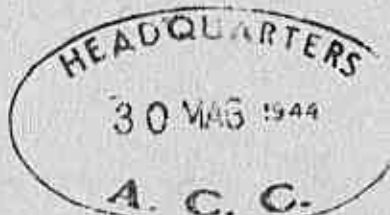
