2. Notice is taken of paras. 1 to 5 thereof, giving a chronological history of correspondence covering this case.
3. Ref para. 6 of your ~~Am~~ letter, our files show that under date of 23 Apr 45, G1(Br) AFHQ wrote to the Commander-in-Chief INDIA as follows:  
"4. It is understood that No. 38163 DE ROSA Egidio will NOT be released owing to security objections (your No. 40076/11/PW1(b) of 11 Apr 45 refers)."
4. On the copy of this communication in our files is the penciled notation: "27 April - informed Min. of Air by phone. /s/ G.F."
5. Thus it will be seen that your Ministry was notified by telephone just a few days after the AFHQ letter went forward to INDIA. (Your letter states that "after approx a year we have not yet received a reply").
6. In view of the telephoned information to your Ministry, no further action was taken at the time.
7. Under date of 22 May 45, G1(Br) AFHQ notified this Division that Capt DE ROSA would not be available for release on security grounds, and this was communicated to the Italian High Commissioner with our 1/11/1350 of 30 May 45.
8. The notification to you, confirming our previous telephoned information, thus should have been forwarded to your Ministry by the Italian High Commissioner.
9. We are now asking SHQ CMF to inquire of INDIA whether security objections still exist in DE ROSA's case, and if not, to request his early repatriation. Upon receipt of a reply, you will be informed.

The families of Italian PW's turn to your Command requesting that the repatriation from India which is being taken care of by the English, be speeded up to the same rhythm as is being done from other regions.

Since the end of the last year up to date, only a few hundreds of sick people have been repatriated from India.

Contrarily to the agreements made, in India there is still a group of Officers over fifty years of age, whose repatriation was requested for National reconstruction, who for over a year have been ready to leave. These Officers (about 500) are in Camp 26 Yol. They should have left together with their comrades from other Camps around last December. For unknown and incomprehensible reasons they remained about there with all their papers and baggage ready to leave.

The Commander of the Camp Colonel Cook promised that in a few days they would be repatriated, but they were not and it seems now that nothing more is being done to repatriate them.

These officers are without news from their families because they are considered as being repatriated and no mail or messages are given them.

This matter has become worse due to the fact, that the fascist elements from Camp 25 have been repatriated before the Officers in question, which latter all of a good class of people and amongst them there are many Colonels and Majors from the regular Army.

We hope that a ship will soon be available for the prisoners located in India in order to bring them regularly to Italy, these prisoners who are asking themselves why they, who were the first to suffer should be the last to repatriate.

The undersigned ask your Sub-Commission to repatriate her husband, General of Division FEDELE Federico De Giorgis No.62812 General officers POW Camp Bombay.

General De Giorgis although having fought against the British troops in North Africa, at Solum Halfaya, always behaved in a highly humane manner toward the Allied Prisoners, not wishing to subject them to the privations, due to the lack of means, that was imposed on the Italian Military personnel, after having disarmed them, questioned them and given them food, sent them to Allied Units.

His behaviour was greatly appreciated by the enemy, so much so, that he when taken prisoner, was received by the English Commander of the 8th Army at the areoport of Cairo.

On one occasion an allied air plane falling and due to the crash, the members of the crew were all wounded. Gen. De Giorgis received them and had them accompanied, by the chaplain and personnel of the Sanitary Corp back to them units because he had no way of caring for them and no medicins to give them. The British in their gratitude, sent back, medicines and medical materials by the Sanitary Corps.

It results to the undersigned that in Nov. 1943, the repatriation of Gen. De Giorgis was requested by Gen. Messe, then head of the General Staff, on the grounds that General De Giorgis' was an officer of proved valour and energy and would be a valuable co-operator in the reconstruction of the Armed Forces. Said request was repeated many times and Gen. De Giorgis on his own account presented a request to the English Authorities to be repatriated in order to fight against the Nazi-fascists.

The undersigned is a citizen of the Republic of Ecuador and has three children and a sister to maintain, she hopes that your Sub-Commission will aid her in having her husband repatriated.

2. The War Office stated that the Italian Representative in London had advised that the three PWs had been recommended by the Italian Government for priority repatriation and that this had been approved by Allied Commission.

3. The War Office desired to know whether in fact this Division had forwarded such recommendations to the Commands concerned.

6. The War Office now advises that their repatriation is reported to have been submitted to the Allied Commission by the Foreign Office of the Italian Government.

7. As this Division, as stated in paragraph 5, has no record of these PWs or of any recommendation having been made in their behalf, may we please be advised if, at any time, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs submitted such a recommendation to any Allied authority?

1. Under date of 30 Oct 44, this Division forwarded to your office a list of 200 Italian PWs recommended for repatriation as essential for the reconstruction of ITALY.
2. Included in this number was subject PW, who was captured at AGEDABIA (NORTH AFRICA) on 8 Feb 41. He is married and the father of a small boy.
3. Transferred to INDIA, and following the Italian Government's request for his repatriation, he was informed on 29 March 45 by the British authorities of his camp that his repatriation would be expedited, along with others.
4. Ten months passed, however, without any action.
5. On 10 Dec 45, all PWs in GIOVANELLI's category were alerted for repatriation. Those in Camps 25, 27 and part of 28 were taken to the port of embarkation, but the order with respect to those in 26 Camp was countermanded on the grounds that there was insufficient accommodation on the train.
6. As a result, among those repatriated were elements who already found themselves at the port of embarkation, but who did not have priority reasons for repatriation.
7. In view of the circumstances as set forth above, may this Division be advised, please, if Lt GIOVANELLI can now be accorded priority repatriation, especially since he was requested a year and a half ago?

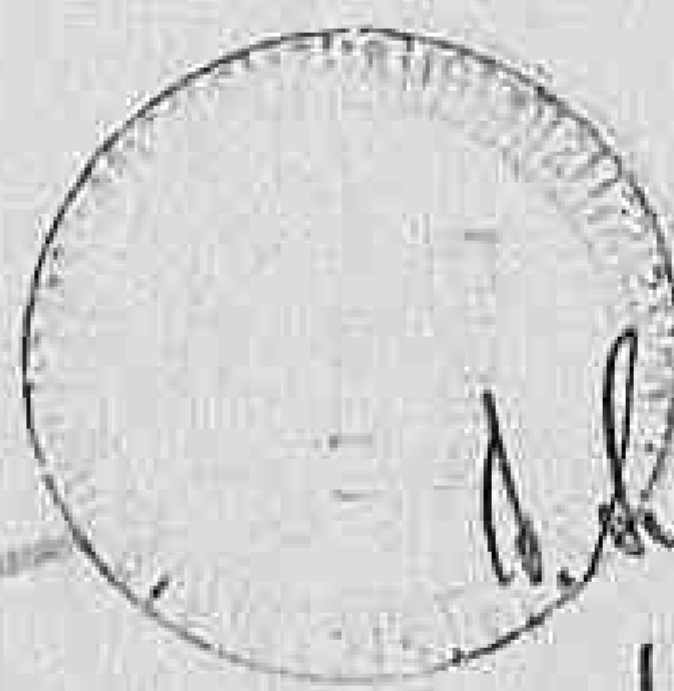

1. On 13 Nov 44 (our ref 1/6/56), this Division forwarded a list of Italian Pws recommended for repatriation, among whom was Lt PERRONE. This list was transmitted by you to C-in-C INDIA on 20 Dec 44 (your ref CR/3863/G1(Br)).
2. This Division is now in receipt of a communication from the Ministry of Post-War Assistance urging a priority repatriation for this PW as an extreme compassionate case. This communication (translated) is attached hereto, together with translations of letter from PW's father forwarding medical certificate attesting the mother's grave condition.
3. Lt BARZAN's repatriation was requested in our List 9-B (page 4), transmitted to you with our 1/11/1569 of 20 July 45.
4. The Ministry of Post-War Assistance now also requests the urgent repatriation of this PW as an especially compassionate case. It will be noted in attached documents forwarded by the Ministry that the mother is a widow, that her only other son died in a flying accident at MILAN on 17 Oct 41, that her daughter died in an air raid on 25 Sep 45, that she lacks funds, and that her daughter-in-law, the PW's wife, has peritonitis and water on the brain, and cannot care for their two small children.
5. It is therefore urgently requested that both of these cases now be treated as extreme compassionate ones, and that both of these PWs be given priority repatriation.
6. It would be appreciated if a signal to this effect could be sent by you to C-in-C INDIA.

1. On 16 Dec 44, this Division forwarded with our 1/7/405 a list of names of Italian PWs for whom examination by a Mixed Medical Commission was requested. Among these (No. 21 of EAST AFRICA list) was the name of subject PW, who was registered as suffering from grave nervous exhaustion.

2. Nothing more was heard on this matter, and on 20 Oct 45, this Division included subject PW's name in a list recommended for repatriation as specialists (our List 14-B, ref 1/11/2078, also 1/11/2353 of 8 Jan 46, and your 3855/A2 of 31 Dec 45 and even number of 28 Jan 46).

3. This Division is now in receipt of a letter from the wife of Lt GIAPPARONI, who states that he went to AFRICA in 1937 to establish a commercial enterprise at ADDIS ABABA.

4. During the intervening nine years he has not seen his family, and meanwhile his wife was left in ROME alone with three small children, now 14, 13 and 11 years old. At the time the father left them, they were 5, 4 and 2 years old, respectively.

On 10 December 1945, this Division received a request from someone in the Brazilian Embassy - possibly His Excellency the Ambassador himself - through Captain Peterson of the Transportation Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, to see what could be done toward hastening the repatriation of one Carlo ALHAIQUE, an Italian prisoner of war held in Camp 27, Wing 3, INDIA.

It was explained that ALHAIQUE is the husband of a Brazilian lady.

The undersigned immediately forwarded a request for an early repatriation of this prisoner to Allied Force Headquarters, advising that ALHAIQUE's repatriation had been recommended by us as far back as 15 February 1945, which recommendation had gone forward from AFHQ to INDIA on 18 March 1945.

I am pleased to advise you that this Division has now been notified by AFHQ that ALHAIQUE was repatriated from INDIA on 11 December 1945, so that it is quite possible that he may already have arrived in Italy.

As Maj ORLANDO's repatriation was first requested in a letter to this Division dated 6 Sept 44 from General INFANTE, First Aide-de-Camp to His Royal Highness, The Lieutenant-General of the Realm - almost 17 months ago - this Division desires to press at this time for a priority repatriation for this PW.

We were advised on the 21st of August 1944 by Gen. Gamerra, First Adjutant of the Prince of Piemonte, that my husband would be requested by the Italian Government for immediate return. His name was placed on the request list in September 1944.

On the 28th of March 1945 I received a letter telling me that he had been ordered to prepare for departure and that I would receive no more mail from him. This departure was cancelled by the termination of the war in Europe.

Again in June 1945 he was advised to make all preparations for departure. This departure did not materialize.

In December 1945 Camps 25 and 27 as well as other camps in South India were returned to Italy. All officers in Camp 26 prepared to return at this same time, their luggage having been shipped on ahead, but again my husband was not returned.

My two brothers, Capt. Imigi Pentimalli and Lt. Maurizio Pentimalli have been on active duty with the Italian fleet, after the Italian Armistice, serving on escort duty with the British and American Convoys in the Mediterranean. My brother Imigi was north of the battle line at the time of the Armistice but immediately crossed the line to the Allied side and began service as Captain of the corvette Bayonette. The Bayonette was on escort duty under his command during the entire war period after the Armistice. 3. Strangely enough, on 27 Nov 45, you addressed a letter to this Division inquiring whether these PWs' services had been requested by the Italian Government, with MONDAINI's name added. (Your ref: 3855/A2).

4. On 3 Dec 45, our 1/11/2256 notified you that CRISTOFANETTI and GERARDIS had been requested as per paras. 1 and 2 above, but that we had no record of any request for MONDAINI. This information you forwarded to INDIA under your 3855/A2 of 8 Dec 45 (copy to us).

5. Now, under your 3836/A2 of 23 Jan 46, you inquire again as to whether these PWs have been asked for by the Italian Government. The answer is the same as before, and you are advised for the third time that CRISTOFANETTI and GERARDIS are definitely wanted for service in the Italian Navy, and that our request for their repatriation was submitted more than a year ago.

However, this Division is informed, S/Ten CURTI GIALDINO Massimo was not among those returning because, he wrote to his family here under date of 20 Dec 45, his name was not on the authorized list, according to information he obtained personally from the Camp Commandant.

4. It appears, therefore - unless there were security objections concerning which this Division has never been informed - that his name may have been omitted from the list because the list carried his name incompletely.

5. It is pointed out that the name appearing on list as S/Ten CURTI Gialdino, no serial number, should correctly read S/Ten CURTI GIALDINO Massimo, serial number 240181.

6. If no security objections exist, it is requested that S/Ten CURTI GIALDINO be given priority for repatriation by the first possible means, and this Division advised of ETA, ITALY.

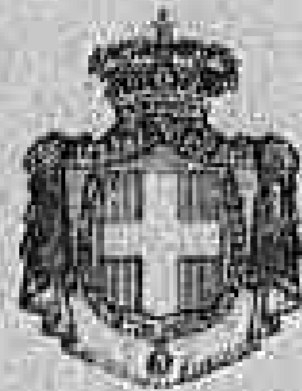

The undersigned states that his son Alberto, has never held any fascist position and has never had anything to do with politics. He was called up in May 1940 as a Lt. of Infantry and sent to the Gaf.; he was taken prisoner at Bardia on the 3rd. of January 1941, and is now POW in Camp 27, India. For that which regards his behaviour during imprisonment, herewith attached is a statement made by 2nd.Lt. Santè Nobili Vitelleschi, who was one of his companions during imprisonment: from this statement you will see that his sentiments are here clearly anti-fascist.

It is therefore to be supposed that there is a mistake, either in Judgement or person, and therefore a re-examination is requested, regarding his position.

Capt Stagnaro was the technical Director and co-producer, of the hooks's Firm.

He is the only one, who can carry this work, as the brothers direct the making of fish nets, and his absence is very much felt. It is the only firm which does this work in Italy and it is to say that there are only 7 or 8 of its kind in the whole of Europe.

The repatriation of the prisoner, will increase the activity of the firm, which has at its disposal enough and considerable quantity of material. Therefore the return of the mentioned Captain is very useful and almost indispensable.

2. From records in this office it appears that the wife of subject PW called at this office on 18 Sept 44 asking for the repatriation of her husband. The following is an extract from a card index in our files:

"The wife of subject asked on 18 Sept 44 for his repatriation in a personal conversation with me. The wife declared that her husband is well and heard from him regularly. He has been a prisoner for four years. Their financial conditions are obviously good. I told her that I could see no possibility of passing him before other prisoners in the camp. (Signed) E.B. (secretary to the then Deputy Director, IPW Division)."

3. It appears from this that there are no reasons why he should be granted priority release. However, his name was included in a list of specialists submitted by the Italian Government and passed to you under our IPW/1/11/1569 of 20 July 45, and in view of this it is considered that action should be taken to effect his repatriation.
