- 1 I refer to the attached letter of the IW Directorate at NAIROBI, Kenya, dated 13 Sep 45.
- 2 Epuration proceedings against Gen. Nasi were initiated in Aug 44 by Count Sforza in his capacity of High Commissioner for Sanctions against Fascism. These proceedings have been held in abeyance because of Gen. Nasi's status as a prisoner of war. No further steps are contemplated until Gen. Nasi returns and is in a position to put in a defence.
- 3 The charge made against Gen. Nasi was couched in very broad terms. In substance he is accused of supporting the Fascist regime by voting for Fascist laws in the Senate. The same charge was made against a number of other Senators, against whom epuration proceedings were initiated in Aug 44. I am advised also that the fact that Gen. Nasi occupied a position as Governor of a province in Ethiopia and that he was a General under the Fascist regime are mentioned in the charges although no specific allegations are made in connection therewith.
- 4 It should be noted that epuration proceedings affecting Senators are based upon purely political considerations entirely disassociated from the probity or attainments of the Senator involved.

The following is an extract from an article published in a recent edition of Kenya's daily paper:-

Marshal Badoglio, Premier of Italy after the armistice, heads a number of prominent Italians who are to lose their rights. The list includes Italian Senators whose political records, in the opinion of the Italian Government, fail to qualify them in the new Italian Advisory Council. **A report** from Rome says no further penalty is to be imposed on them at this stage.

General NASTI, who is the senior Italian Liaison Officer in this Command, is himself an Italian Senator and he held high office under the Fascist Regime. He is naturally anxious to know if he is one of the Italians who are to lose their rights and has requested information on the subject. He feels that, although he in fact entered the Senate only once - on the occasion of taking the oath - and has done nothing to earn reproach, he may not be "persona grata" with the present Italian regime.

General NASTI has heard, too, that his close relations in MODENA are receiving hostile treatment from the local inhabitants. This he ascribes to a false impression of his attitude during his captivity which, he claims, the Axis radio purposely misrepresented hoping to use his former popularity to influence the inhabitants in favour of the Axis.

In his capacity of Senior Italian Liaison Officer in this Command, General NASTI; up to the time of the Italian armistice, encouraged the PW to put out the maximum work consentant with the principles of the Geneva Convention. 5. General NASI suggests, and this HQ agrees, that in the regrettable event of his being one of the debarred Senators and of continued hostility towards his relatives at MODENA he will no longer have the necessary prestige to enable him to continue successfully as Senior Italian Liaison Officer in the Command.

6. Early authentic information is requested, therefore, on the points set out in paras 2 and 3 above, in order to make possible a decision as to the suitability of Gen NASI continuing to act as Senior Italian Liaison Officer in this Command, as well as to dispel any doubts or grounds for speculation amongst the Italian PW.

Notice of the decree shall be served on the person concerned. For the above purpose, the High Commissioner may require any director, manager or receiver of any company within the provisions of Art 1 hereof to complete within a stated time a special questionnaire to show whether he is within any of the descriptions

PENALTIES

4 Directors, Managers or Receivers of companies to which Art 1 applies, who are within any of the descriptions contained therein, who continue to exercise the functions of their office, shall be liable to one year's imprisonment and a fine of one hundred thousand lire. Persons within the above mentioned descriptions who (hereafter) take up a position referred to in Art 1 shall be liable to the same punishment.

The manager of any company who is aware of the fact that any person disqualified under Art 1 hereof continues to exercise in any such company the functions of his office and fails to notify the president of the tribunal which has jurisdiction over the district in question of such illegality, shall be liable to six months imprisonment and a fine of fifty thousand lire. A manager who, being aware that a person appointed director, manager or receiver of a company after this decree comes into force is disqualified under Art 1 hereof, fails to report such illegality to the Tribunal having jurisdiction, shall be liable to the same punishment.

Directors or owners of companies or concerns within Art 2 hereof who are within the description contained in Art 1, who nevertheless enter into contracts for public works or receive concessions of public utilities, shall be liable to the penalties laid down in the first paragraph (hereof).

ADMINISTRATION

5 Within thirty days from the coming into force of this decree every company within the provisions of Art 1 hereof shall file at the Chancery of the Tribunal having jurisdiction a declaration containing the names of their directors, managers or receivers who have ceased to act as such under the provisions of para 2 of the said Art and shall serve notice of the said declaration on the person concerned by registered letter.

On the expiration of such period the High Commissioner for sanctions against Fascism may issue a decree removing from office any director, manager or receiver whose name has not been reported under the preceding para as having vacated his office. Notice of the decree shall be served on the person concerned. For the above purpose, the High Commissioner may require any director, manager or receiver of any company within the provisions of Art 1 hereof to complete within a stated time a special questionnaire to show whether he is within any of the descriptions contained in the said article.

Any person failing to complete and return such questionnaire within the said time limit or who makes a false or incomplete declaration shall be liable to the penalties prescribed for giving false or reticent testimony.

6 If the person concerned is of opinion that his removal has been unjustly ordered, he may within 10 days of receiving such notice appeal to the Commission formed under Art 3 hereof.

Decrees against which no appeal has been lodged within the prescribed time and decrees appeals against which have been rejected shall be transmitted to the chanceries of the Tribunals having jurisdiction.

deprived of his right to the position of director, manager or receiver in accordance with the preceding article, is hereby disqualified from holding the position of technical or administrative manager, departmental or office or official head, as to the companies in which he holds any of the above mentioned positions or in any associated company which is within Art 4 hereof.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Former member of the fascist republican army.

1. Reference is made to memo. n° 6/2392/1105 dated 25 July 1945.

2. Families of those persons interned by the Allies on the charge of having belonged to the fascist republican army have informed the Ministry of Foreign Affairs that their relatives would not be allowed to correspond regularly with their families.

3. They also have pointed out that, since lists of fascist republican prisoners of war have not been sent as yet to the Red Cross, many families still ignore what has happened to their relatives.

4. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs is not in a position to judge whether the above information is correct. Therefore they would appreciate it very much if the Allied Commission would kindly take the proper steps in order that this matter may be investigated with reference to the terms of the Geneva Agreement concerning the correspondence of the prisoners of war and the transmission of lists containing their names to the International Red Cross.

5. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs will be grateful to the Allied Commission for an early reply on this subject.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Former members of the fascist Republican Army.

1. According to numerous appeals received by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from persons interned by the Allies on the charge of having belonged to the fascist republican Army, it would appear that a certain doubt might reasonably exist as regards the consistency of some of these charges.

2. While the Ministry of Foreign Affairs are not in condition to value the aforesaid information, they believe, however, that there are sufficient grounds to warrant a display of interest on the part of the Italian Government.

3. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in agreement with the Ministry of War, therefore warmly request the Allied Commission to consider the possibility of instituting some Italo-Allied mixed commissions in order to examine each individual case on the basis of the strictest equity and justice.

It is reported that assurances to this effect would already have been given to the internees by the Allied camp Authorities.

4. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs thank the Allied Commission for those steps they will see fit to take in the matter.

To avoid those who are recognized from being a cause of new trouble, as well as to prevent those who escape popular anger from escaping also legal punishment, I ordered the arrest of the elements who have already arrived; I shall be most grateful if you will suggest to the Allied Military Authorities the advisability of gathering in adequate concentration camps in North Italy the members of the neo-fascist formations till their position will be defined, or somehow, to prevent their return as long as the necessary security measures have not been decided with the competent offices of the Commission.

SUBJECT : Disposal of Present and Former Members of the Republican
Fascist Armed Forces Captured by the Allies.

TO : All Concerned.

1. In accordance with the policy approved by the combined Chiefs of Staff, all Italians serving in the Republican Fascist Armed Forces who fall into the hands of the Allies, either during operations or behind our lines, wearing either uniform or a fixed distinctive emblem within the terms of the Hague Convention respecting the Laws and Customs of War on Land, will be treated as enemy prisoners of war.
2. This policy applies not only to personnel of the Republican Fascist Army, Navy and Air Force, but also to such forces as "The Black Brigades" (Brigate Nere) and "National Republican Guard" (Guardia Nazionale Repubblicana) with the exception that members of the GNR drawn from the CC.RR. (Carabinieri Reale) will be treated in accordance with paragraph 3 (d) below.
3. Italians who are encountered in the course of our advance will fall into one of the following classes:
 - a. Members of the enemy armed forces in uniform. These will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
 - b. Men who, although unarmed and in civilian clothes are found on investigation to have been members of the enemy armed forces at the time when they were over run. These will also be disposed of as military prisoners of war.
 - c. Civilians - including those who are able to prove that, either by dismissal or desertion, they had already ceased to be members of the enemy armed forces at the time they were over run. These will only be arrested if they are considered to be a danger to security in which case they will be disposed of as civilian internees.
 - d. CC.RR. personnel will normally be instructed to report to the nearest AM: Public Safety Officer, who will arrange for them to proceed to the appropriate CC.RR. reception centre where they will be screened. These centres are at present located at ROME (for officers) and FLORENCE (for enlisted men). Any information which FSP/CIC may obtain concerning such members which would assist the screening officers at the reception centres in deciding how to deal with them, should be passed to the nearest Public Safety Officer. If no Public Safety Officer is readily available, it would be of assistance to AMG if such CC.RR. personnel were despatched to the reception centre concerned. CC.RR. personnel will only be arrested if positive information is obtained indicating that they will probably present a danger to Allied security if left at liberty. In that case they will be disposed of as military prisoners of war.

CONFIDENTIAL

4. In order to ensure that such persons who have the status of military prisoner of war are not mistaken for civilian internees, even though they may be wearing civilian clothes, it is important that their escort should be provided with a nominal roll of all prisoners of war in civilian clothes stating they they are to be treated as prisoners of war because they have been identified as members of the enemy armed forces and adding when possible, the unit or organization to which they belonged. This document should be clearly distinguishable from the arrest report used for civilian internees.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTION NO. 51

DISPOSAL OF PW OF NON-GERMAN NATIONALITY

GENERAL

1. This instruction deals with the disposal of PW of non-German nationality who, immediately prior to their capture by, or desertion to, the Allied Forces, were serving in the German Armed Forces.

INTERROGATION

2. All PW referred to below will be interrogated by Allied Intelligence staff concerned in the normal way. Should any particular PW be required by the Intelligence staff for special purposes he will be routed to CSDIC and will not come within the scope of this instruction.

SEGREGATION

3. Immediately on establishment of nationality all Psw referred to below will be segregated from, and where practicable be kept out of the sight of other prisoners.

POLES AND RUSSIANS

4. The disposal of Polish PW has been dealt with in AFHQ Adv Admin Ech Adm Instruction No. 30, issued under reference 3152/9/A dated Feb. 44, as amended. The disposal of PW of Russian nationality has similarly been dealt with in AAI Adm Instr No. 31, issued under reference 3078/A dated 17 June 44.

FRENCH

5. PW of French nationality (including PW of Alsace-Lorraine origin) will be evacuated

(a) in the case of British owned PW, to 209 PW Camp AFRAGOLA (MR N 2675)

(b) in the case of US owned PW, to 326 PW Enclosure, AVERSA

GENERAL

1. This instruction deals with the disposal of PW of non-German nationality who, immediately prior to their capture by, or desertion to, the Allied Forces, were serving in the German Armed Forces.

INTERROGATION

5. PW of French nationality (including PW of Alsace-Lorraine origin) will be evacuated

(a) in the case of British owned PW, to 209 PW Camp AFRAGOLA (MR N 2675)

(b) in the case of US owned PW, to 326 PW Enclosure, AVERSA (MR N 1763)

HQ 3 District or PBS, as the case may be, will contact the French Military Base and arrange for such PW to be interrogated by the French Military authorities.

PW selected by the French Military Authorities will then be released on demand to those authorities. Those PW whose release is not demanded will be treated as ordinary German PW.

YUGO-SLAWS

6. PW of Yugo-Slav nationality will be evacuated to 207 PW Camp, GRUMO APUMMA (MR P2871). HQ 2 District will arrange for them to be interviewed by a British officer of 'Z' Military Mission. These who express Royalist sympathies will be released on demand to the Royal

Yugo-Slav Military Mission; the remainder will be released on demand to 'Z' Military Mission. PW not released will be treated as ordinary German PW.

DUTCH, CZECHS AND LUXEMBOURGERS

7. PW of Dutch, Czech or Luxembourg nationality will be evacuated to 209 PW Camp, AFRAGOLA (MR N2657). HQ 3 District will arrange for their evacuation in the status of PW to 204 PW Camp, NORTH AFRICA.

DANES AND BELGIANS

8. PW of Danish or Belgian nationality will be evacuated to 209 PW Camp, AFRAGOLA (MR N2657). Their names and all available details of their past history will be reported to 'A' Branch, HQ AAI, who will issue disposal instructions.

GREEK

9. PW of Greek nationality will be evacuated to 207 PW Camp, GRUMO APULLA (MR P2871). HQ 2 District will arrange for their evacuation in the status of PW to MIDDLE EAST.

ITALIANS

10. PW of Italian nationality captured whilst serving in the Italian Republican Army will be evacuated to 209 PW Camp, AFRAGOLA (MR N2657). We have been informed that there are in Corsica 431 Italian PW of the Republican Army, who have been captured by the French during the operations of the Island of Elba.

Of these PW, who nearly all are very young, 200 are kept near Bastia, and the remaining ones at Colle Vizzanova, where they work in the railroad Bastia-Corte-Vizzanova.

They seem to get a very hard treatment; sleeping under sheds without straw nor blankets, eating very badly and most of them in rags and without shoes. They declare that the Maroc soldiers took away their shoes.

We have also been informed that these PW, by order of the Allied Command should have been sent to work in North-Africa, half of them at disposition of the British and the other half at disposition of the French Authorities.

I beg the ACC to be so kind as to let this High Commissioner have directly or through the Int. Red Cross, the nominal list of these PW with all the details possible and to interest also the competent Authorities in order that these PW of the Fascist Republic should get the treatment agreed to by the Geneva Convention.

International Red Cross Committee Delegate, M. Pradervant, has communicated to the President of the Council, Bonomi, that the Central Red Cross Committee desires to receive from the Italian Government an official communications confirming that Republican Italian Prisoners of War captured by Italian Armed Forces are considered Prisoners of War.

According to this delegate, this communication could effectively be used by the Central Committee for obtaining equal recognition toward Italian Military Personnel at present interned in Germany.

With reference also to my telegram No. 6 of 27 January, Your Excellency is asked to give formal assurance in the sense desired.

TELEGRAM 507, July 29, TO ITALIAN EMBASSY AT MADRID, SPAIN, FROM ITALIAN MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS:

From more and more sources this Ministry continues to learn of the increasingly serious situation of our military and civilian internees in Germany. It becomes urgent therefore to intensify the initiative of Italians abroad to speed up the work already being done by the delegations of the International Red Cross. Dispatches should contain above all medicines, food, and clothing. Packages should all be sent to the central sent of the International Red Cross to be subsequently sent to Germany.

Will your Excellency please take steps in this sense and transmit similar instructions to the Italian Representatives at Berne, Buenos Aires and Lisbon, who should do their utmost as soon as possible to begin this helpful activity and in particular with regard to resulting organizations which can be obtained in the heart of each community of Italians abroad and arrangements for transport through International Red Cross.

POLITICAL SECTION

In the course of a recent conversation with the President of the Council of Ministers, Mr. Pradervant, delegate of the I.R.C.C., expressed, on behalf of the Central Geneva Committee, the wish to receive an official communication to the effect that Germans and Republicans Italians made prisoners by Italian troops shall be considered as prisoners of war. Mr. Pradervant added that a similar communication would shortly be forthcoming from the Allies and he explained that such a statement would be of great help to the I.R.C.C. in their endeavor to obtain that the German authorities recognise as prisoners of war Italian troops deported in Germany after the Armistice of 8 September.

It is suggested that the above-mentioned statement would be much more effective if it were issued simultaneously by the Allied authorities and the Italian Government.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs would, therefore, much appreciate if it were informed if and when the Allied authorities are prepared to issue the official communication requested by the I.R.C.C.

Although the authorities at AFHQ are prepared to go ahead with the proposal, the Department has instructed us to take no further steps in the matter pending the receipt of a reply from the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

MEMORANDUM for Mr. Murphy

Mr. Pradervand, delegate of the International Red Cross, called this morning while you were out and asked me to bring to your attention the following information which he thought you would find of interest.

He said that when in Rome recently he saw Bonomi who told him that the Italian Government was prepared to declare its willingness to apply the provisions of the Geneva Convention to Italian neo-fascist troops made prisoner. Pradervand said that the Italian Government was willing to do this especially in view of the fact there were some 600,000 Italians held in Germany whose condition was even worse than that of the French and the Russians there. The International Red Cross on its part was also interested in the possibility of obtaining recognition as prisoners of war of these Italians in Germany. In reply to his question as to what was the status of the proposal to recognize captured neo-fascist Italians as prisoners of war, I replied that the Allied Governments were giving the matter their close attention and that a reply could be expected soon.

Pradervand stated further that he had been informed in Rome that the Italian Government was ready to accept the repatriation from North Africa of Italian prisoners of war eligible therefor. The French authorities on their part had indicated their willingness to let them go. The only remaining problem was one of transport which would, of course, have to be authorized by the Allies. As to the numbers involved, Mr. Pradervand said there were several hundred but less than one thousand.

Pradervand stated that his organization was receiving innumerable requests from small villages and organizations in Italy for aid in Italy for aid in facilitating the repatriation of Italian prisoners of war who were needed in their home community but who were not eligible for repatriation on a compassionate basis. He asked whether there was any possibility for repatriations of this type and if so what his organization should do with these requests. I explained that the present Allied policy was to facilitate the repatriation of individual Italians who might make a definite contribution to the war effort. The Allied authorities would only consider such cases as were certified them by the Italian Government and the Allied Control Commission for Italy. Accordingly, it would be appropriate for his organization in replying to requests of this kind to refer the petitioner to the Italian Government and the Allied Control Commission with the explanation that the fundamental consideration was the contribution to the war effort which could be made by the person whose repatriation was proposed.
