Col. BRUNO Attilio, Italian liaison officer of the 7th American Army has informed us that within the present month all the Italian Co/operators at his dependence will be repatriated.

This officer during his stay in Germany besides performing his duties as liaison officer, helped a great deal in the repatriation of the Italians who were in the territories under the jurisdiction of the 7th U.S. Army.

This officer is one of our best elements and we therefore beg your Sub Commission to allow him to remain when his liaison duty is over, where he is, in order that he may continue in the valuable work that he is doing relative to the organization of these Italians who are wandering about Germany and all the welfare work that he is doing with Col. Vernazza and have him officially accredited to that office.

The Command of the 7th Army and the U. S.F.E.T. have expressed a favorable opinion to what is written above, due to the fact that the officer in question has collaborated with the Allies ever since their invasion of France.

As is known to you there are several soldiers repatriated from captivity and now working with the Labour-Units, who on the moment they were repatriated could not use their leave to go and see their family, because their relations lived in the part of Italy still occupied by the enemy or in the fighting-zone.

It happens that many of those soldiers ask for leave as soon as the place, where their family lives, has been liberated.

These requests, according to letter A/17 of 6 October '44 by M.M.I.A. cannot be granted.

This disposition has had strong moral and disciplinary repercussions, because it deprives the repatriating PW of a right, which they have not been able to enjoy on the moment of their repatriation.

For this reason we beg the AG to kindly examine the case and if possible give the soldiers in those particular conditions, the opportunity to go and see their families by granting them a special leave.

1. With reference to the application of W.M.D. and I.P.O.W. Sub-Commission, Allied Commission, (IPW/1/15/4 dated 26th January 1945), for permission to issue Civilian Movement Passes to Italian P.O.W. Co-operators.

2. As the numbers of Co-operators applying for leave will be small and as security is of paramount importance, it is suggested personnel due to go on leave make application in sufficient time to enable the normal procedure, as laid down in Executive Memorandum No. 77, to be followed.

3. In urgent cases, application can be made by signal.

4. It is necessary A.M.G. Army should always be advised of civilians moving into forward areas, as for special reasons, certain parts may be barred to civilians from time to time.

- 1/. A difficult question has arisen with regard to Italian POW co-operators, working in this country, when they are given leave from their units, to visit their families in A.M.G. territory.
- 2/. On a number of occasions recently, co-operators have called at this office to obtain a pass to enter A.M.G. territory. In following the normal procedure of making application in writing, the necessary passes arrive when the unfortunate co-operator's leave has expired.
- 3/. This office already has permission to issue passes to repatriated Italian POW whose homes are in A.M.G. territory, and it is therefore suggested that similar permission be given to issue passes to co-operators who are given leave to visit in Army territory - the numbers are small.
- 4/. I should be glad if you will give this matter your careful consideration, and advise me in due course if the S.C.A.Os, 5 and 9 Armies agree.
