SUBJECT: Transit-camps for repatriating P.W.

PROMEMORIA for Lt.Col. J.A. CAMPBELL

- 1/. The organisation of the Transit-camps for the repatriating soldiers is not quite perfect yet, as H.E., the Minister of War only gave the order on September 14th.
- 2/. Transit camps exist already in Bari, Brindisi, and Taranto; others are getting ready at Naples and Palermo.
- 3/. Actual address of the camps: ^{5,200} for Naples = "care of the Military Command of the Campania, NAPLES" for Bari, Brindisi and Taranto "care of the Military Command of Puglia and Lucania, BARI" for Palermo "care of the Military Command of Sicily, PALERMO"
- 4/. The camps don't own actually means of transport; the Mil.Commands of the Regions provide in their needs.
- 5/. More precise details about the Transit = camps are expected from the Mil.Commands of Naples, Bari and Palermo; they will be transmitted as soon as they arrive.
- 6/. Up till now have arrived:
 at Taranto: 800 ex P.W. (in Allied hands from North Africa.)
 at Naples: 340 ex P.W. from France (ex PW. in German hands liberated by the Allies)
 Their clothes are all in very miserable conditions.
