Il Governo del C. L. N.

e i prigionieri

Non si può dire che i vari governi del C.L.N. che si sono succeduti sulla scena politica italiana abbiano preso molto a cuore il problema del rimpatrio dei prigionieri. Connesso, è vero, a tutta la situazione interna italiana, sembra anzi che l'esarchia — guidata in questo come al solito, dagli elementi di sinistra — paventi questo ritorno come chi abbia timore di una ventata di vero, autentico patriottismo contro i meschini compromessi e la scarsa dignità nazionale del Governo sorto con l'insegna del C.L.N.

Come non a tutti è noto, in Egitto e nel vicino Oriente esistono compagnie di cooperatori che dal giorno dell'armistizio collaborano allo sforzo bellico alleato. Alcuni mesi fa, 11 compagnie del Pioneer Corps sono state interne nel campo di prigionia nel Sudan e al famoso campo 305 (Criminal Camp). Costoro, all'atto di Ingaggio per la cooperazione, ebbero formale promessa di rimpatrio all'atto di cessazione delle ostilità. Poiché, già dopo qualche mese dal V. day, di rimpatrio non se ne parlava, questi militari — ufficiali e soldati che erano stati sino allora esempio di disciplina e di attaccamento al dovere — incrociarono le braccia rifiutandosi di lavorare.

A seguito di tale atteggiamento le autorità britanniche presero i provvedimenti di internamento nel Sudan e al campo 305, e, in una circolare comunicata agli interessati il 14 settembre scorso espressero « l'opinione ufficiale concernente alcune lagnanze e richieste dei P.O.W. italiane ».

In essa fra l'altro è detto:

« Il rimpatrio dipende:
a) dalla situazione in Italia che ha sofferto della denastazione di una guerra e dalla occupazione tedesca. Come risultato le autorità italiane, malgrado voci contrarie, non sono disposte ad accettare il rimpatrio di un gran numero di P.O.W. Il Governo italiano si trova in difficoltà per procurare lavoro ed alimentazione all'attuale popolazione; ogni aumento renderebbe precarie le già difficili condizioni. In riferimento a quanto sopra, il seguente articolo apparso sulla Egyptian Gazzet del 29 u. s., è sintomatico: "Operai italiani in Russia. - La delegazione della Federazione Italiana dei lavoratori attualmente in Russia ha dichiarato che sarebbe grande la possibilità dell'invio di lavoratori italiani in Russia. Tale fatto sembrerebbe sospendere il ritorno dei prigionieri".

b) Premesse le difficoltà dei trasporti e pur riconoscendo fondate le aspirazioni dei cooperatori e dei P.O.W., si precisa che i sforzi vengono fatti per far accettare da parte del Governo italiano piccole aliquote di P.O.W." ».

Seguono quindi le norme circa la precedenza nel rimpatrio.

La circolare porta la firma del maggior generale del Q. G. al Cairo, Dust, e la data, in calce, del 30 agosto 1945.

Di chi dunque la colpa? Agli italiani onesti giudicare una consorteria politica che, autonomizzata alle leve dello Stato, ha paura dei nostri prigionieri, dei loro sacrificio e dei diritti inalienabili che questo sacrificio comporta.

The Government of the C.L.N. and the Prisoners.

It cannot be said, that the various Governments of the C.L.N. that have succeeded each other on the Italian political stage, have taken to heart the problem regarding the repatriation of the prisoners.

The Italian Internal situation— guided as usual by the leftists- seem to fear a wave of real patriotism, against the lack of National dignity (that has come up under the banner of the C.L.N.), with the return of the prisoners.

As many people do not know, there are still in Egypt and the Near East, companies of co-operators who since the day of the armistice have co-operated with the Allied War effort. A few month ago, eleven companies of the " Pioneer Corps", were interned in the Sudan Camp 305 (Criminal Camp) these persons on accepting co-operation, received a formal promise that they would be repatriated at the end of hostilities. As after a few months after V-day, nothing had yet been said about repatriation, these officers and soldiers who had up to that time been an example of discipline and good workmen, crossed their arms and refused to continue to co-operate.

Following this their attitude, the British Authorities interned them in Camp 305 in the Sudan and with a circular dated 14th September 1945, expressed the official opinion concerning protests and requests of the IT.POW.

Amongst other things it was stated as follows:

The circular was signed by the commanding general of G.16 .Q. Cairo, Dust and was dated 30th.August 1945.

Whose is the fault? The honest Italians must judge a political group that are afraid of our prisoners and the rights that their sacrifices give them."

Subject : Moral

REPATRIATION

There have been many requests regarding an official statement relative to the repatriation of Italian POW.

a) The repatriation depends:

1. On the present situation of the countries that have been devasted by war and German occupation. Notwithstanding all declarations to the contrary, the Italian Government cannot accept the repatriation of a large number of PW, due to the difficulty of finding jobs for them and the difficulty of feeding the Italian people.) Any increase of these problems would tend to aggravate the very serious conditions of the country. Relative to what is written above, we herewith cite a publication that was printed in the " Egyptian Gazette" on the 29th. of August 1945.

" Italian Workmen in Russia"

Moscow 29th. August 1945.

" The Delegation of the workers sindicate that is now in Russia, has stated that the possibility o^f sending workmen to Russia would be very well received. It is underlined, that the number of the unemployed in Italy is enormous and will greatly increase with the return o^f the POW"

2. Available shipping space.

Italy and her ex-allies, Germany and Japan, provoked a world war and the sinking of a great number o^f ships. The ships in use are being employed for the transport of food to the populations of Europe and to the populations in the Far East, who are dying of hunger.

Result.

It is even difficult to find the necessary ships 1853

- 2 -

in order to repatriate the Allied troops from the M.E. India and the Far East and it is absurd to expect that ex enemies will be repatriated before the Allied troops.

Notwithstanding all this the aspirations of the co-operators and Italian POW are held in esteem and continuous pressure is being brought on the Italian Government that they accept at least, a small quota of prisoners each month.

As soon as anything definite is decided upon, regarding this matter, an official announcement will be made. At the same time the British HQ., is doing all that is possible to hasten the beginning of the repatriation. Neither promises or previsions can be made as when they will begin, nor in what measure they will be carried out: it is thought that in the initiative stage only a small number will return which will gradually increase according to the capacity of the country to accept them and the available shipping space, needed to transfer them.

3. a) Priority in repatriation.

We can give the assurance that all ex co-belligerants who are now still employed as co-operators will have a priority in repatriation.

- b) After them will come the co-operators and at the last the non co-operators.
- c) The ex-belligerants, who have preferred to cease co-operation, will be repatriated without a special priority. If they again ask to co-operate they will be repatriated with the other co-operators.
- d) The repatriation of co-operators, according to their age and the years of their service has not been previewed; A ruling of that order would bring about too many unnecessary transfers and movements. Vice versa it is thought, that the repatriation will be formed of complete companies. However the groups that are complete and are composed of prisoners who have had many years imprisonment, will be taken in account.

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4. Agreement of the co-operators.

Many protests have been received, due to the fact that the declaration signed by the co-operators was to have ~~kept~~ them only, up to the end of hostilities with Germany and more are expected now, that the war with Japan is ended. These protests are to be answered as follows :

- a) Italian P.O.W. can accept or not to co-operate as they wish. Their repatriation is not held up because their work is indispensable. It is always possible to substitute them. There are more of a weight to carry than an advantage but those who have them are obliged to keep them, due to the fact that the available shipping is lacking in which to transport them to Italy. However as they have worked for the Allies in a moment when work was so much needed, they are kept in employment in order that their conditions of living may be better and that they may receive a better pay. If they do not desire to work they will be the only ones to suffer.
- b) Many companies however will be relieved shortly. This will not mean that they will be repatriated, but forms part of an established plan, of the working organizations, in order to find other work for the Italian companies.

5. Treatment of the Italian officers and soldiers.

Many protests have been made because the English soldiers have no respect for Italian officers and use offensive language regarding Italians in general. It is known that :

- a) Orders have been given that for what is written above, must cease.
- b) That bad language from an English soldier is not to be taken seriously as it is one of their defects and they have no intention of giving offense.

6. A visit from a representative of the Italian Government.

It will be arranged that a representative of the Italian Government may visit the Camps in the aim of reporting

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on the conditions in Italy.

This will not take place until something definite can be said, regarding the beginning of the repatriation.

7. Calculation of years of Service.

Certain prisoners are preoccupied because their service will not be calculated as effects their service in the Italian army.

The Italian Government has been asked to clear up this question and as soon as a decision has been reached it will be officially stated.

SUBJECT : The listing of personnel for Lodging Centers.

In reference to the two letter N.417391 and N° 417378 respectively dated the 17th and the 20th of September 1945, regarding the organization for the repatriation of POW from over-seas and the relative necessary materials pertaining to the matter, herewith is prospected the question relative to the listing of military personnel for the Lodging Centers. I am forced to clear up this question, due to the news that I have received regarding the intention of the M.M.I.A. to furnish the Lodging Centers exclusively with Civilian personnel, to be used for the management of said centers to receive War Veterans.

These intentions are undoubtedly due to the Administrative Instruction N.1° dated the 15th of December 1944 that states: ""All individuals that have been members of the past Italian Army, are considered civilians until they have been enrolled or recalled according to the present military procedure.""

According to the letter and the spirit of the above mentioned instructions, civilian materials and civilian personnel should be provided, for the complex organization relative to the repatriation of POW, and notwithstanding that the Italian legislature considering POW as military personnel, up to the time that their administrative and matriculation status is defined, are not re-turned to civil life.

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A complete application of the above mentioned disposal is in contrast with the Italian legislature and could not but produce political and social repercussions of great importance.

In fact, apart from the fact that no civil organization is in the possibility of furnishing barracks, buildings or tentage to receive the Veterans, the materials such as cots and kitchens necessary for their stay during the period of transit, the transport from the Ports to the Centers and from there to the sorting-out stations, would be absolutely impossible to be performed by Civilians, who would not be experts in military matters and would not have the necessary authority and prestige.

In the meantime, although conforming that the Italian Government will give all the civilian help that is possible for the organization of the Lodging Centers, I call the benevolent attention of your office to the fact that it is necessary that we have military personnel for the Lodging Centers in number of 2,600 units, which represents the minimum indispensable number.

The 2,600 units represent the maximum number of personnel needed when all the Lodging Centers are working for the reception of the Veterans and internees.

In effect, when they enter into their functions in the Centers for the reception of the Veterans, those who are for the refugees will already have finished their work, for which reason the Contemporary Military Personnel for the necessities of the Veterans, will always be inferior in number to what be required.

- b) ACC stated that while rations on a ~~modific~~ 10 could be produced for such personnel, it would be impracticable to find boots, forest green clothing, cap etc.
- c) After discussion it was agreed that the retention of such personnel on the strength of the Italian Army would be impracticable. Accordingly "infectives" (i.e. sick, reinforcements, personnel in transit) must be covered within the ceiling figure.

Breakdown of the Ceiling figure of 44,300

6. The breakdown at Appendix 'A' attached was agreed. The following points and decisions were made in the course of discussion.

Service Units

7. a) British - cut from 100,000 to 93,000.

DJING accepted this unwillingly.

- b) US - cut from 96,000 to 71,000.

DCAO stated that he would provide breakdown for TBS, PBS, AGS and Fifth Army.

FES stated that they could accept a reduction provided four gd bns were provided from Internal security formations.

ACC

8. ACC rep pointed out that in order to carry out functions in the field areas, personnel in uniform must be provided. In view of the fluctuating and indefinite nature of the ACC requirement, it was decided that the figure for Internal Security formations should include an element for ACC and that the latter's requirements would be met from the Internal Security formations.

MA and CD

9. The original figure of 8,000 was based on a draft letter received from MACA and CD. It was agreed that AFHQ should be asked to examine this commitment with a view to reductions.

CORSICA

10. 5,000 represents present strength. It was believed that these personnel were of Yugoslav origin and on this basis AFHQ were to be asked that the MACA and CD should be informed of the situation in the light of the above.

b) US - cut from 96,000 to 71,000.

DQMG accepted this unwillingly.

DCDAO stated that he would provide breakdown for TBS, PBS,
AGS and Fifth Army.

PES stated that they could accept a reduction provided some

ACC

8. ACC rep pointed out that in order to carry out reductions in the field
areas, personnel in uniform must be provided. In view of the fluctuating and
indefinite nature of the ACC requirement, it was decided that the figure for
Internal Security formations should include an element for ACC and that the
latter's requirements would be met from the Internal Security formations.

AA and CD

9. The original figure of 8,000 was based on a draft letter received from
MCMA and CD. It was agreed that AFHQ should be asked to examine this commitment
with a view to reductions.

CORSICA

10. 5,000 represents present strength. It was believed that these per-
sonnel were of Jugoslav origin and on this basis AFHQ were to be asked that the
commitment should not be included in the ceiling of the Italian Army. If this
were agreed, then 2,500 would be added to each of Serials 1 and 2.

Internal Security Formations

11. a) These represent a reserve for AAI. Serials 1 and 2 make no
allowance for gd duties on Allied installations.
Internal Security formations would provide units for these duties.
G (SD) AAI would review requirements and make the necessary
allocations in due course.
- b) In principle, in view of the reduction in numbers, the best
Italian bns will be retained in the internal security drive.

Italian Adm and Services

12. The figure has been cut to 40,000 which the meeting considered to
represent the bare minimum required for efficient adm. It was agreed to ask
AFHQ to

AHQ to allot 5,000 from Navy and Air Force ceilings to Italian Army adm on the grounds that the latter covered the entire Italian Armed Forces.

Carabinieri

13. Cut from 60,000 to 55,000. If subsequent events prove that 60,000 are essential the additional 5,000 will be provided at the expense of the Internal Security formations.

PART II - ACCELERATION OF PROVISION TO UNITS FOR PBS

14. Rep PBS referred to a letter from Gen WILSON (CG PBS) to HQ AAU which stressed the urgency of providing immediately Italian Army personnel for PBS. In this letter PBS recommended inter alia that :-

- a) Shipping list from SARDINIA should be increased.
- b) Priorities be reviewed.
- c) Outstanding engt, mechancl and truck-driver units be shipped immediately.
- d) Six labour regts now awaiting shipment be assigned to PBS.
- e) The CHELSEA Div be assigned to and moved to PBS.

15. It was agreed that :-

- a) Q (Mov) and PBS should signal AAHQ and CG MTOUSA respectively stressing the need for provision of additional shipping for 25,000 Personnel from SARDINIA to meet British and US needs.
- b) Priorities would be reviewed by DQMG and DCDAO and a proportion of labour regts in SARDINIA would be allotted to PBS.
- c) A division in SARDINIA to be selected by AAU in conjunction with SIE would be allotted to PBS.

16. Summary and action required

1. Reference your memo of 11 Jun 44 on "Employment of Italian Army."
2. A meeting was held at HQ AAI on 17 Jun to examine the breakdown shown in the Appx attached to your memo. The following were represented:-

3. Previous to the meeting, Comd MILE had had an interview with the Supreme Allied Commander-in-Chief, who had instructed him to inform the meeting that he, the Supreme Allied Commander-in-Chief, considered that the original demand submitted by HQ AAI (in letters 1605/50/3/1/G(SDI) of 3 Apr and 4 May) was sound and that no reduction should be made in those figures. Attached at Appx 'A' is a table showing the original demands of 3 Apr and 4 May and certain increases which are the result of continued detailed study of requirements since that date (coln (C)). This revised ceiling amounts to 540,481 for the Navy, Army and Air Force.

4. The meeting considered that in case it should prove impossible to obtain the agreement of the Combined Chiefs of Staff to the larger figure, the proposed breakdown of the ceiling figure of 44,300 in your memo of 15 Jun should be examined and recommendations submitted. These recommendations are embodied at Appx 'D' attached and have the concurrence of the organisations represented at the meeting. The following paragraphs are in amplification of Appx 'D'.

PERSONNEL IN EXCESS OF CEILING

5. The question as to whether part of the administrative establishments, sick, reinforcements and personnel in transit could be carried in excess of ceiling was considered. In view of the difficulties of implementation and the lack of clothing and other stores it was not found practicable for such personnel to exist on the strength of the Italian Army and be a charge against the Italian Government authorities.

Previous to the meeting, Comd 1771 had had an interview with the Supreme Allied Commander-in-Chief, who had instructed him to inform the meeting that he, the Supreme Allied Commander-in-Chief, considered that the original demand submitted by HQ AFHQ (in letters 1605/50/3/1/G(SDI) of 3 Apr and 4 May) was sound and that no reduction should be made in those figures. Attached at Appx 'A' is a table showing the original demands of 3 Apr and 4 May and certain increases which are the result of continued detailed study of requirements since that date (coln (c)). This revised ceiling amounts to 540,481 for the Navy, Army and Air Force.

4. The meeting considered that in case it should prove impossible to obtain the agreement of the Combined Chiefs of Staff to the larger figure, the proposed breakdown of the ceiling figure of 444,300 in your memo of 15 Jun should be examined and recommendations submitted. These recommendations are embodied at Appx 'B' attached and to the concurrence of the Organisations represented at the meeting. The following paragraphs are in amplification of Appx 'B'.

PERSONNEL IN EXCESS OF CEILING

5. The question as to whether part of the administrative establishments, sick, reinforcements and personnel in transit could be carried in excess of ceiling was considered. In view of the difficulties of implementation and the lack of clothing and other stores it was not found practicable for such personnel to exist on the strength of the Italian Army and be a charge against the Italian Government in this connection.

SARDINIA, CORSICA, M. & CD

6. In the AFHQ memo of 11 Jun no allowance was made for the following categories of personnel which exist at present:

It was assumed, however, that this complement must be catered for within the ceiling total of 347,000. LA and CD and CORPSICA are AFHQ responsibilities and it is recommended that this requirement should be carefully scrutinised with a view to reduction.

*(19k)**-2-*ITALIAN ADMINISTRATION AND SERVICES

7. The figure of 27,000 for Italian Administration and Services in the IFC memo is considered to be too small. If the Administration is to work efficiently, the bare minimum requirement is 40,000. In this connection it is felt that as the Italian administrative machinery serves both Navy and Air Force, 5,000 should be allotted from the Navy and Air Force ceilings to the Italian administration which would thus consist of 45,000 personnel.

US AND BRITISH REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVICE UNITS

8. As a result of the commitments described above, and in order to keep within the ceiling figure of 347,000, it has not been possible to meet in full US and British demands for Service units.
Bids have in effect been reduced - British from 100,000 to 93,000 and US from 96,000 to 71,000.
9. This Headquarters has impressed on all concerned the urgent need for utilising to the full the Italian personnel available, and thus to economise in Allied manpower, and that is being done. However if the ceiling is reduced as you propose, the effect will be inevitably the retention of Allied manpower on tasks which could otherwise be performed by Italians.

CONCLUSION

10. In view of the above, it is submitted that the best interests of the Allied war effort will be served by the maintenance of the Italian Forces at the ceiling recommended by AII at Appx 'A' attached - namely 540,481.



1. The following policy regarding the employment of ITALIAN Army Units and personnel, excluding Prisoners of War, is in amplification of the policy laid down in this HQ Letter AG 400-1 (Italy) GCT-AGM of 2 January 1944, and deals in detail with the conditions of service of the units, and general policy of the above letter as it applies to Italian Army Units and personnel serving with the British Forces. - S -

2. Priority of Employment.

The priority of employment of units of the Italian Army will

be :-

- (a) to complete the existing British Order of Battle requirements.
- (b) To replace British Units and personnel which are required to return to UK.

3. S.D. Matters.

For all S.D. matters, Italian Army Units (except for those in Italian formations), and units diluted with Italian personnel serving with British Forces, will be treated in a similar manner to units of the British Army.

4. Establishments.

Where whole units of the Italian Army are employed, the 4822 Italian War Establishment or its equivalent will be used for those units as far as is possible. Where no suitable ITALIAN Establishment exists for a body which is to be entirely ITALIAN, ACC is empowered to produce in conjunction with ITALIAN SUPREME COMMAND a suitable organization, which need only be submitted to AFHQ for approval if it involves the provision of vehicles or equipment from Allied sources. In the case of a unit diluted

and deals in detail with the conditions of service of the units, and personnel policy of the above letter as it applies to Italian Army Units and personnel serving with the British Forces.

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The War Establishment Committee of this Headquarters will be the authority for all cases of amendments where a British W.E. is affected.

5. Command and Punishment.

- (a) All British formation Commanders are given power of command over Italian formations or units which may be put under their command, including power to remove and appoint officers.
- (b) All British Commanders of units diluted with Italian troops are given power of command over all such personnel, and all British Officers, W.O's and NCO's in such units are given power of command over Italian personnel of equal or lower rank.

- (c) All personnel of the ITALIAN Army will remain subject to ITALIAN Military Law which will be administered by ITALIAN Officers in accordance with the ITALIAN code.

Where there is no ITALIAN Officer competent to deal with the case with the diluted unit and where it is not desirable or legally possible to deal with an offender under Sec 176 (9) or (10) Army Act by BRITISH Court Martial the offender will be sent with a short statement of the offence in ordinary English and brief statements of witnesses to the nearest ITALIAN Unit for disciplinary action to be taken. Arrangements will be made for the ITALIAN Officer dealing with the case to report his action to the Commanding Officer of the diluted unit.

6. Arrest.

British Service authorities are given power to arrest and hold in custody ITALIANS alleged to be guilty of any offence punishable by ITALIAN Law, and any offence against BRITISH Military Law, although such offence may not be an offence against ITALIAN Law. Italian personnel will not be arrested by other than C.M.P. except in the event of the alleged commission of a serious crime or in the event of grave disorder. C.M.P. to include Military, R.A.F., and Naval Police.

7. Leave.

If and when possible, ITALIAN personnel, whose families are located in the occupied territory, may be permitted leave of furlough to their homes, provided that they receive not more than 7 days in every 6 months, and that only 5 per cent of the ITALIAN personnel of a unit are absent at any one time.

C. M.S. Matters.

Power to remove an Officer is dealt with in para 5 (a) (i) above, and all remaining M.S. matters will continue under ITALIAN Army organization.

9. Reinforcement and Casualties.

- (a) Complete ITALIAN Units.

The ITALIAN Military authorities are to be responsible for maintaining in personnel those complete Units or Formations of the

British Service authorities are given power to arrest and hold in custody ITALIANS alleged to be guilty of any offence punishable by ITALIAN Law, and any offence against BRITISH Military Law, although such offence may not be an offence against ITALIAN Law.

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C. U.S. Matters.

Power to remove an Officer is dealt with in para 5 (a) (i) above, and all remaining U.S. matters will continue under ITALIAN Army organization.

9. Reinforcement and Casualties.

(a) Complete ITALIAN Units.

The ITALIAN Military Authorities are to be responsible for maintaining in personnel those complete Units or Formations of the ITALIAN Army who are employed under BRITISH Command. The necessary return will be furnished monthly to this Headquarters by Land Forces Sub Commission of ACC. This return will be in the form of an Order of Battle showing the strength of ITALIAN Units and Formations serving under BRITISH Command.

(b) Diluted Units.

G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon are responsible for maintaining at W.E., those units of the BRITISH Army which are diluted with personnel of the ITALIAN Army holding a status other than that of E.P.W.

(c) Reinforcement Organization.

(i) Base Depot. The ITALIAN Government will undertake to guarantee a sufficient number of personnel for replacing wastage, in a Base Depot to be established for the purpose. This Base Depot will be situated in ITALY so as to facilitate the rapid despatch of reinforcement personnel to units. It will be under command of a BRITISH Officer with a BRITISH Staff, and will be capable of ensuring the qualifications of tradesmen or specialists held, and, where necessary, of ensuring that these men do not deteriorate during their stay in the depot.

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(iii) Method of Demanding Reconcents. Diluted units will render weekly A.F's W3000 and W3009 as at present, but will show its and strength of British and Italian personnel separately. Returns will be rendered as laid down in the 'Unit Guide to Documentation', and demands for reinforcements made by the Advance Rnts Sec concerned on the Base Depot.

(d) Documentation.

All formations and units with Italian Army personnel (other than E.P...), either filling vacancies within the ..Z, or attached in excess will render nominal rolls to G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon showing :

- (1) Number, Rank and Name.
- (2) Arms of the Service.
- (3) Civil Trade and Army Trade.
- (4) Whether within I.E. or att in excess.

All casualties affecting such ITALIAN Army personnel will be reported to G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon in exactly the same manner as for BRITISH personnel. The same Army Forms will be used with the exception that the A.F's W3012 A, B and C series will be used for both officers and O.Rs instead of the A.F's W3010 and W3011 series.

(c) Return of Ex Hospital Personnel.

Fitters discharged from medical units will report to the nearest COMINDO TAPPA Report Centre. Medical units will provide the necessary pass, rations and movement order for the journey.

10. Pay.

- (a) Whenever possible, the ITALIAN Government will pay its own troops wherever serving.
- (b) Where (a) is impracticable, ITALIAN units will draw bulk advances from the nearest BRITISH Field or ~~area~~ Cashier. *4821*
- (c) In diluted units, the senior ITALIAN Officer with the unit will draw separately from the nearest area or Field Cashier, and such amounts will not appear in the Pay account of the BRITISH Units concerned.
- (d) All advances of Pay will be in a bulk sum.

All casualties affecting such ITALIAN Army personnel will be reported to G.H.Q., 2nd Echelon in exactly the same manner as for BRITISH personnel. The same Army Forms will be used with the exception that the A.F's 13012 A, B and C series will be used for both officers and O.R.s instead of the A.F's 13010 and 13011 series.

(c) Return of Ex Hospital Personnel.

Fit men discharged from medical units will report to the nearest CALABRIO TRPPA Report Centre. Medical units will provide the necessary pass, rations and movement order for the journey.

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- (a) Whenever possible, the ITALIAN Government will pay its own troops wherever serving.
- (b) Where (a) is impracticable, ITALIAN units will draw bulk advances from the nearest BRITISH Field or Area Cashier.
- (c) In diluted units, the senior ITALIAN Officer with the unit will draw separately from the nearest Area or Field Cashier, and such amounts will not appear in the Present Account of the BRITISH Units concerned.
- (d) All advances of Pay will be in a bulk sum.
- (e) A list of authorized units will be supplied to the Comptend Paymaster, No. 3 Comptend Pay Office, T.RANTO, and in the case of diluted units, the BRITISH Commanding Officer, will authorize, by name, the ITALIAN Officer to whom payment should be made.

11. Prisoners of War.

Prisoners of War, of whatever nationality, who fall into the hands of ITALIAN Armed Forces, shall be handed over as soon as possible after capture to the nearest BRITISH or AMERICAN Unit, and shall be deemed to be prisoners taken by that unit.

12. Medical.

- (a) ITALIAN Military sick (incl C.R.BINERI) will be treated in ITALIAN hospitals. Provision will, therefore, be made for ITALIAN hospitals at 6% strength of ITALIAN formations.

- (b) Italian Base Depots of Medical Stores now at NAPLES and BARI will be responsible for the provision of medical supplies to the ITALIAN Forces and for supplying ITALIAN Military Medical Units, which are accepting cases from units to which this directive refers.
- Formations will be supplied through the normal ITALIAN Military channels.

- (c) The ITALIAN Military Authorities will be responsible for the disposal of patients discharged as unfit for further military service and for the rehabilitation and return to units of all others.

13. Welfare.

- (a) In complete ITALIAN units, welfare will be entirely the responsibility of the ITALIAN Government.

- (b) In diluted BRITISH units, welfare amenities on a limited scale will be provided from BRITISH sources. If conditions allow, canteen facilities, separate to those for BRITISH Troops, will be provided; a quota of indoor and outdoor games equipment will be made available and ITALIAN soldiers will be allowed to attend mobile cinema shows and ENSA concerts if no BRITISH Troops are excluded thereby.

14. Rations.

- (a) In Army Areas.

Supply will continue through normal supply channels from British depots to RHs. HQ AM will demand monthly on Army Sub Commission for compensating supplies.

- (b) In Areas in Rear of Army Boundaries.

- (i) Diluted ITALIAN units will draw through DHs.

- (ii) For complete ITALIAN units the policy will be :-

ITALIAN units (and units diluted with ITALIANS) serving with the BRITISH Army in Army Areas or elsewhere which form a permanent part of the Allied Order of Battle will be supplied as if they were Allied Units through the normal U.S. or BRITISH maintenance systems.

16. Postal.

Separate instructions will be issued in regard to Postal and Censorship Regulations.

17. Equipment.

Pending the receipt of full and final instructions from the Combined Chiefs of Staff, ITALIAN dilutees employed in British units and Italian units employed in place of British units within the approved British Order of Battle will be issued from British stocks with the personal equipment to the minimum scale necessary to make this class of ITALIAN soldier efficient for his task, if Italian Army stocks are not available.

The G.1098 equipment required to enable the unit to carry out its task will also be issued to the Italian units described above.

signal and you replied that you had not received above copy.
Both originators repeated their signals.

We traced our signal to BRINDISI but in spite of a
second query to No. 3 District records of the case are report-
ed "destroyed".

On March 25 FLAMBO cabled (SD1973 of 25 March) that
the matter was still under discussion.

As we still do not know what is the result of the
points you raised (if any), it would be appreciated if you
would state how the matter now stands.




