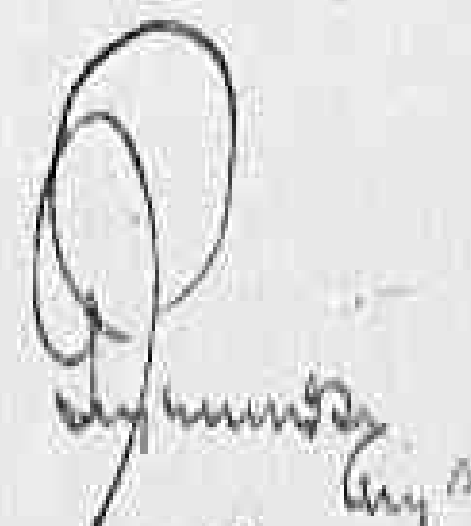

With reference to letter 299 PG dated 12 Jan 45 to you from H.E. General Nasi, para 3, the following is a copy of the relevant passage of the lecture quoted from the verbatim report and shows that General Nasi was correct in his assumption that the newspaper report was not entirely accurate.

" The conditions governing the treatment of Prisoners of War are laid down in the Geneva Convention 1929 and those clauses which deal with prohibited work are complicated in so far as the actual wording prohibits any work which has a direct connection with the operations of war. In these days of total war it is extremely difficult to draw a hard and fast line between what is, and what is not, permissible work. Italian prisoners of war were, therefore, asked to volunteer to cooperate with us and to renounce all such clauses of the Geneva Convention regarding prohibited work".

SUBJECT: Possession of Red Cross Cards by Combatant Personnel.

TO : All Concerned.

1. Reports have been received that German soldiers in possession of Red Cross identification cards certifying them as protected personnel have been captured while engaged in combatant duties. Where it is known that such personnel are captured while so engaged or where subsequent interrogation reveals that they were combatants at the time of capture, the identification cards will be taken from such individuals and will be forwarded to Headquarters MTCUSA, Attention: Provost Marshal General, or in the case of British owned prisoners of war, to this headquarters, Attention: G-1 (B). Personnel from whom these cards are removed will be accorded the status of prisoners of war and not that of protected personnel.

2. German military personnel who have received special instructions enabling them to be used when necessary as auxiliary attendants or litter bearers for the movement or treatment of sick and wounded and having possession of a Red Cross identification document attesting this fact will be treated as protected personnel if captured while they were actually engaged in the care or movement of sick and wounded.

"I am forwarding this letter through an Italo-American friend of mine who has been sent to Italy, in order that you should understand how I have been living and how I lived lately. There is one thing we, young men, cannot bear and that is that we are living in towns but cannot leave the camp where we sleep. This camp is always surrounded by barbed wire. Many of us go out in order to pass a few hours with Italian families, but as soon as they are pinched, they are punished very severely. This is how the Allies treat us after having worked for them as diggers etc... This is our reward."

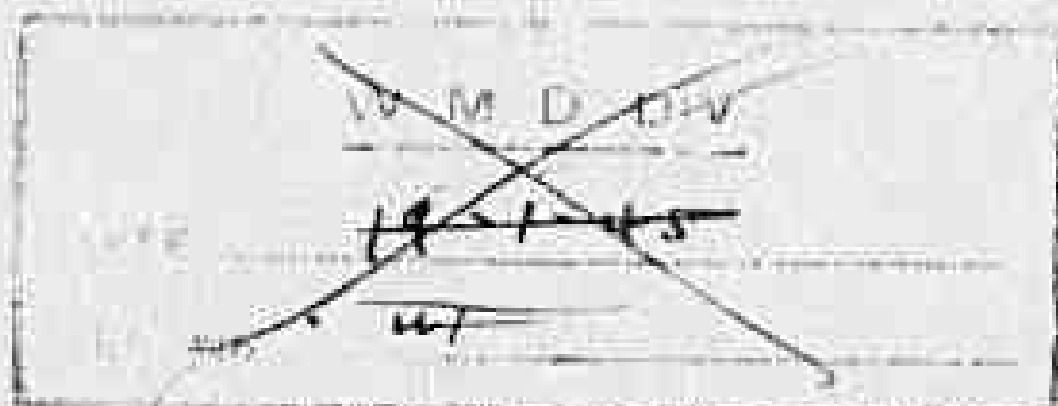

X I cannot get along any longer, the cost of living is very expensive. There is nothing left at home. I have had to sell everything, the pay being very low. I am now getting the same pay I used to receive 4 years ago and I was granted no increase. It is a real shame.

The people who have been most neglected and forsaken are the families of the Ps/W, when they should get more help, seeing that these families are deprived of fathers who used to be their only support. ...

... The Allied troops came in June and they granted a general increase of 70 % on the pays but we, families of the prisoners, did not get anything. On August 16th, the Council of Ministers granted a new increase; almost all got something on account, but we received nothing. The Allies are not aware of this and are giving a lot of help to the Italian people, but the trouble is that there are still fascist elements in office who create obstacles and who do not care about those who are in need.

X Gino Carollo told me he wrote you a letter and that sometime ago, through a counter-order by the Navy Command, he failed to land at Haifa. Perhaps he hopes to come to see you afterwards. He told me that many of you try to escape, with the help of the sailors or even disguised, but, once in Italy, sooner or later, they have to present themselves to the Military Command for their money and documents in order to get a job. Several of those escaped prisoners do what your pal De Simone did. He came to see us and succeeded in hiding himself for about 2 months, after which he had to present himself to the Command and was put back into active service as a punishment.

Life here is very hard and the alms we get from them are not enough for our daily needs. We lack everything and the little we find on the Black Market is much too expensive. Macaroni cost 160 lire the kilo, bread, 110 lire, meat, 240 lire and so on. My salary is of 3800 lire a month and father's, 4500 lire, yet this money is not enough. I know of other people who keep selling everything they have, even the furniture. Cigarettes as well are to be bought on the black market. Two American cigarettes are paid 15 lire. A suit costs 20.000 lire, a tie, 320 lire and everybody goes about bare-legged, because stockings are not available. The prices of shoes go from 3000 to 4000 lire. One needs at least a salary of 100.000 to live on.

From all this you can easily picture to yourself how disappointed prisoners get when they reach Italy where instead of finding the Earthly Paradise they find starvation and no work. For enquiries when no Ref. No. is given, please

NOTES ON THE WORK OF THE WAR MATERIALS DISPOSAL AND ITALIAN PRISONERS OF WAR SUB COMMISSION.

1. The Original Directive to War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission was issued on the 10th of November with Colonel John T. Zellars (American), as Chief of Sub-Commission. Colonel Zellars is a Regular Army officer and as such was a well known character in the American Army.
2. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission would be the Agency throughout this Theatre of Operations to organize and initiate action in the field for the procurement, recovery, storage and distribution of war materials. This agency to supersede other agencies of the Allied Military Forces when designated by higher authority. The War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission to be the agency of control with Italian Government agencies formed or to be formed to eventually act as operating components of the Sub-Commission.
3. In the early stages of the Sub-Commission the Sub-Commission's activities mostly dealt with inspection of Italian material in military depots. Some 100 depots in Apulia, Campania, Calabria, Lucania, Abruzzi were visited, inspected and stock lists compiled. A separate inspection was made of the depots in Sardinia and Corsica during February where considerable quantities of clothing, boots, cloth and leather was found.
4. One of the outstanding things on the Island of Sardinia was a small factory which collected all salvaged clothing, boots and equipment. After sterilisation the material was broken down and remade into complete garments and boots. The work of this factory was the most outstanding example I have seen in this country of the Italians really trying to help themselves.
5. During the first five months of 1944 the Sub-Commission was as already stated mainly interested in seeing that all available Italian material in the South of Italy was returned to the Italian services and in this respect the Sub-Commission was to a certain extent responsible for the clothing including boots issued to the Carabinieri which although far below their requirements, at least was sufficient to make a number of men fit for duty.
6. During the inspection throughout Southern Italy a great deal of useful data was prepared and it was obvious if any real use was going to be made of the Italian Army it would have to be re-equipped as the available equipment and material in the depots was nothing like sufficient to equip Divisions in the field.

7. During April and May the work of the Sub-Commission was entirely of a routine nature. In April Colonel Zellars was appointed Regional Commissioner to Region 2 and Lt. Colonel J.A. Campbell took over the duties of Acting Director.

8. With the entry of the Allies into Rome the work of the Sub-Commission took on a new phase and in the early part of June two officers of the Sub-Commission proceeded to Rome as the Advanced Party of the Sub-Commission.

9. The depots in the newly liberated Regions were found to be very much like Mother Hubbard Cuppard bear. An odd amount of material was discovered in the Rome area. A considerable quantity of radio equipment valued at approximately 8,000,000 Lire was recovered from locations near the Airport Ciampino where it had been hidden.

10. M.T. spares consisting of complete assemblies, steering gears, back axels etc. etc. valued at 10,000,000 Lire was returned to the Italian Army during July. 1,000 pair of new boots and over 200 kilos of leather also was returned to the Italian War Ministry.

11. It is difficult to say the number of vehicles salvaged through the activities of the Sub-Commission but in the Rome area alone some 60 to 100 vehicles have been rebuilt and repaired and are now in the transport pools of Region IV and A.C.C.

12. A large number of ammunition dumps were inspected and proposals made to Allied Force Headquarters to have these dumps cleared by Italian civilian firms with the intention of breaking down ammunition which was no longer of military use with a view of using the components for the manufacture of explosives which were urgently required by the Mining Division.

13. On the 29th of July the title of the Sub-Commission was changed to War Materials Disposal and Italian Prisoners of War Sub-Commission.

14. The work in connection with Italian Prisoners of War had been handled by the staff of the War Materials Disposal Sub-Commission for some considerable time previously. The story of Italian Prisoners of War is rather a pathetic one. When one thinks that there are over a million of these prisoners scattered throughout the world working in countries which their own country is no longer at war with but for operational reasons cannot be repatriated to their own country. In India, America, South Africa, and the United Kingdom a large number, in fact a majority of these prisoners have all become what is known as cooperators and are working for the war effort of the Allies. Here in Italy the Italian Government cannot understand why or how it is possible

for their Italian soldiers to be any longer considered Prisoners of War while their brothers and fellow countrymen are actually fighting alongside the Allies. It is only a question which can be decided by the Chief of Staff who know the big picture and when one thinks that prisoners in Britain, America, India, South Africa and even those in Italy are much better off than their actual fellow countrymen in the Italian Army and in Italy one must draw the conclusion that the reason for these many requests to release these Italian prisoners from Prisoner of War status can but be for moral and sentimental reasons.

15. The following are approximate figures of Prisoners of War held in different countries:

United Kingdom

16. Some 65,000 Italian soldiers were taken prisoner but released on parole in Sicily in the early days of the battle in Sicily. These Italians were never really Prisoners of War in the sense that they had been put in cages but were captured, released and sent back to their homes. These 65,000 were released from Prisoner of War status on the 31st of July and are now free Italians.

17. During August over 1,000 Prisoners of War were repatriated to Italy, most of them from East Africa. Over 6,000 are in the process of returning and a number of these arrived in Italy during the month of September. Repatriations during the month of September were on the average of 30 per day and have now increased to over 100 per day. By the end of this month some 12,000 Italian Prisoners of War have been repatriated. In India they have some 10,000 officers who have no employment and in North Africa some 2,000 in a similar position. The repatriation of these officers has been suggested but their return to Italy constitute a certain amount of embarrassment as a number of them come from Districts in unliberated Italy and it will be difficult to find employment or homes for them. There is no clothing available for issue to them and the opinion at the moment is that they are better off in the countries where they are. Against this, of course, the Italian Government wish every and all Italian Prisoners of War repatriated to Italy when it is possible to repatriate.

18. The Sub-Commission are sending 2,000 copies per day of the Basic News in Italian to prisoners in North Africa. We have bi-weekly broadcasts from Rome radio giving names of repatriated prisoners. Cooperators are now permitted to make allotments to

their families and the rehabilitation of Italian Prisoners of War have commenced. It will be very necessary for some form of control to be arranged with regard to the repatriation of all Italian prisoners not only those held by the Allies but the large number in Germany. A scheme has been prepared by the Italian Government with regards to those in Germany and has in view the keeping of these prisoners where they are and returning them gradually as and when Italy is able to absorb them.

19. Finally, the work of the Sub-Commission has increased a thousand fold in the past three months. When the breakthrough into Northern Italy comes the work of the War Materials Disposal Division will be on an entirely different scale and with this in view an Italian Salvage Unit of 1500 strong is at present being formed. Officers of the Sub-Commission will be in control but it is hoped that the Italians themselves will do most of the work and that the work of the Sub-Commission should purely be in an advisory capacity and to give decisions on the disposal of the material.

20. With regard to the Italian Prisoners of War Division this also will increase as prisoners are repatriated. There is no doubt that the Italian Government requires a good deal of assistance and guidance to the repatriation of Prisoners of War. They are much too apt to accept every suggestion for the return of their prisoners sick and wounded as well as hale and hearty and in many instances when the sick and wounded arrive the question arises of where and how they are going to be looked after. The Sub-Commission have helped considerably in propaganda on behalf of the Italian Prisoners of War and there is no doubt that there is a more contented feeling with regard to Italian Prisoners of War than there was some months ago.

TO : All Concerned.

Letter, this headquarters, file and subject as above, dated 5 October 1944, is amended as follows:

a. Paragraph 2 is amended by renumbering it paragraph 2a, and subparagraphs 3 a, b, c, and d are respectively renumbered subparagraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4).

b. Subparagraph 2b is added as follows:

"b. Prisoner of War. A member of the armed forces who is captured by the forces or people of an opposing belligerent."

c. Subparagraph 3a (6) is amended by the addition of the following:

"The return of sick and wounded recovered prisoners of war by aircraft is encouraged."

d. Subparagraph 6c is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"c. Personnel enumerated in a (4) and (5), above, who are selected for reassignment within the theater will, if classified for Limited Assignment, be sent to the 7th Replacement Depot; and, if classified for General Assignment, be sent to the 1st Replacement Depot, except that all officers regardless of race or branch and all enlisted men former members of Infantry or Armored Force Units will be sent to the 24th Replacement Depot. All General Assignment Negro enlisted men, regardless of branch of service, will be sent to the 1st Replacement Depot."

e. Subparagraphs 6 f, g, h, i, j, and k are rescinded and the following substituted therefor, and subparagraphs l and m are added as follows:

"f. Medical Examinations and Records.

(1) Each former Prisoner of War will be given a thorough medical examination at the earliest practicable moment. Such examination will make special reference to the existence of infections or contagious diseases and mental afflictions and appropriate reference will be made

to treatment furnished by the enemy and to any illnesses or injuries suffered while in custody. Complete statements of such injuries, including affidavits from the individuals concerned, where possible, and from enemy or Allied personnel cognizant of the circumstances, will be obtained and forwarded to this headquarters in duplicate. Medical records, which will be improvised locally and likewise forwarded to this headquarters in duplicate, will contain the information obtained under the provisions of this paragraph.

(2) Other classes of Repatriates will be given a medical examination, as deemed necessary. No record or report is required in these cases.

G. Pay and Pay Records.

(1) Pay that has been received by officers from the enemy pursuant to the provisions of the Geneva Prisoners of War Convention, and work pay received by enlisted men, will not be deducted from the military pay accruing to such individuals while in prisoner status. However, pay records will note the amounts that were paid to the individual prisoners, except work pay, while in enemy custody.

(2) Each Repatriate may, if he so desires, be given a partial payment of not to exceed one full month's pay if pay for more than one month is due, or not to exceed 50% of one month's pay if pay for only one month is due.

(3) For the purpose of this paragraph, pay records will be construed to be:

(a) For Officers.

Pay data card, WD AGO Form 77.

(b) For enlisted men.

Individual Pay Record, WD AGO Form 28

Service Record, Remarks Financial, WD AGO Form 24.

h. Gratuitous issues of clothing and canteen supplies necessary for health and comfort are authorized and directed.

i. The individual will be informed that his return to Allied control has been reported to the War Department and, by the War Department to his next of kin. He will be directed to refrain from corresponding by cable, RFI, or other means with relatives and friends for at least ten (10) days following return to Allied military control. This procedure will permit the

War Department sufficient time to make official notification to the next of kin and to clarify his status. Subsequent messages then received from the individual by the next of kin will not occasion doubt or alarm as to his safety and whereabouts. This procedure, together with the reason therefor, will be carefully explained to all Repatriates.

j. A temporary service record will be prepared for enlisted men as outlined in paragraph 42, AR 345-125, paragraph 13, AR 345-155, and MATOUSA Circular Number 100, 1944. An entry will be made on the cover of the record that the individual is an escaped prisoner of war, has avoided capture in enemy or enemy held territory, has escaped or been released from internment in a neutral country, or has been liberated from custody in enemy or enemy controlled country.

k. Whenever possible, all decorations and service medals awarded an individual but not yet issued him will be supplied. Ribbons in lieu of medals, when medals are not available for issue, will be supplied. Appropriate entry of such award will be made in temporary service records.

l. Personnel will not be detained longer than three (3) days at any one place unless unavoidable circumstances necessitate a longer delay.

m. In the cases of personnel enumerated in a (4), above, matters pertaining to pay, supply, quarters, subsistence, preparation of records, and award of decorations and service medals will be accomplished at the replacement depot to which forwarded."

2. Paragraph 7 a is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"a. An appropriate notation will be made in orders effecting return of the personnel concerned to indicate they are Evaders, Escapees, Internees, or Recovered Prisoners of War."

g. Paragraph 8 a and b is rescinded and the following substituted therefor:

"In the case of each Repatriate a separate report will be submitted showing:

(1) Name, grade, Army serial number.

Last organizational assignment.

Place and date of capture or internment.

Date of return to Allied Military control.

(3) Reports will be forwarded by Air Dispatch Letter Service, or other rapid means of transmission, to reach this headquarters in triplicate.

(4) Forms will be prepared locally by mimeograph or similar process."

h. Paragraph 10 is amended by the addition of the following:

"Recovered prisoners of war will be accorded priority in return to the United States over all other casual personnel, including rotation personnel, except sick and wounded."

Caller: Good evening, General, I wanted to know if you were acquainted with my husband, Captain Sagona; he was at camp 356.

Caltee: I knew them all, more or less, we were about 6,000 - it was a city, but I do not remember. How long is it since you have had news from him?

Caller: Since the 14th August but he was not in Kenia; it arrived from a certain place, from the west.

Caltee: Perhaps he went to some other colony for many of them offered to collaborate by working. It was a liberation; we were prisoners only in name, or almost so.

Caller: The letter came from camp 2 but from the west - no longer from the east as before. He says that he is commanding a group of workers.

Caltee: The only uncertainty is how much longer they will remain, otherwise they are well, especially those who collaborated are almost completely free; not as the propaganda here said. The only thing they lacked was news as out there we were completely in the dark.

Caller: But my husband tells me in his last letter that he has heard of the arrival of the Allies at Rome.

Caltee: Those of us who have just returned knew nothing but we returned because we were a part of the corps of volunteers who returned to our Country to fight. But instead, as soon as we disembarked, they set us free. All that is now being said on the radio is to calm the people; out there they live in complete darkness about everything, but I was out of the camp since October of last year; I do not know anything else about them. But what was your husband?

Caller: He was the Office Manager at the "Banco di Roma". He was the one who helped to expose Nairobi.

Caltee: Oh, yes, he was among those who exposed Nairobi; they did a good piece of work - and those remained with their eyes wide open.

Caller: Can you not do anything, General?

Caltee: We were a group of volunteers - then the sick, then little by little, the others, but for the moment I can tell you nothing; but those who collaborated will be the first to return. Then I shall go to the "Commissariato" to see how things stand for everybody. It is necessary to come to a definite decision about things.
