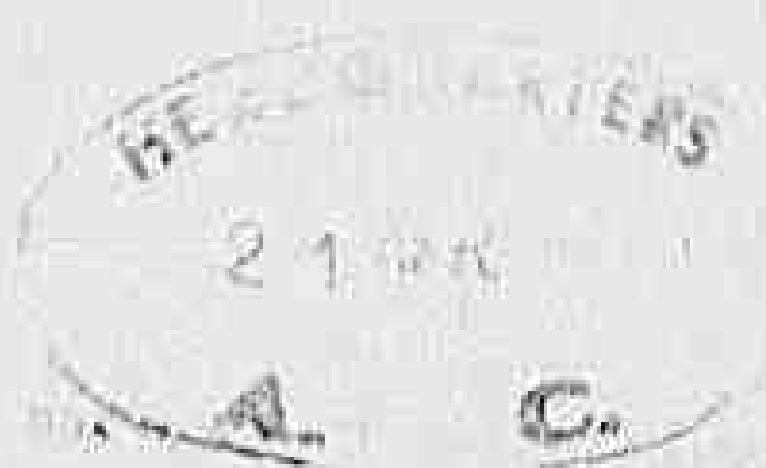

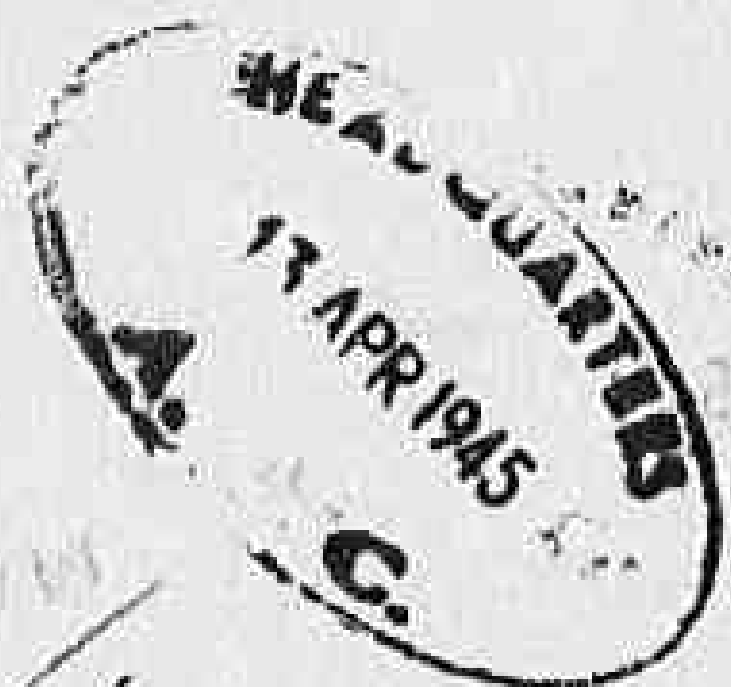

1. There are actually in Bulgaria 21 individuals, ex P.O.Ws. that the British delegation of the A.C.C. in that country, would like to keep with them in various employments until the delegation leaves.
2. The Allied Commission in Italy has asked the Italian Government to urgently inform, through the Italian Ambassador at Moscow to the Russian assistant of the A.C.C. in Bulgaria, their approval.
3. The Ministry of War informed of this matter through the High Commissariat has already given its approval and we therefore beg this Ministry to send this communication through the Italian representative at Moscow, underlining the fact that this approval is subject to the will of the individuals involved, that they will be paid as the civilians are paid in those localities and at the end of their employment will be repatriated by the British Delegation, as has been offered.

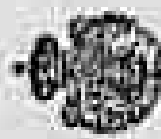

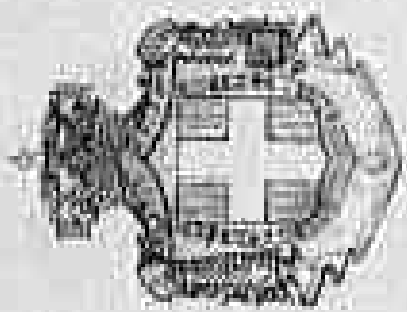

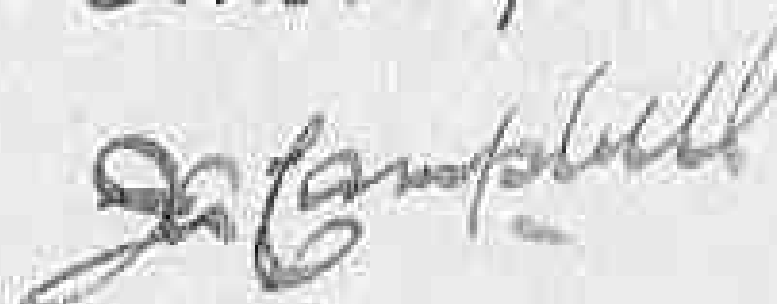

I have to acknowledge receipt of your letter N/28870/18344/1.1.12 dated 14 March with regard to the treatment of soldiers belonging to the Army and Partisan formations.

The matter has been investigated and instructions were issued - some few days ago to the Camp Commandants and others - for each case to be examined at the earliest possible moment to decide which class or category it should come under - Prisoners of War or civilian internees.

As the examination proceeds those classified as Civilian Internees will be moved to Padula while Prisoners of War will be interned in Prisoner of War Camps in accordance with the procedure as laid down.

It is considered that the examination and inspections will be completed in about three weeks time.

With reference to paragraph 4 of your letter, as your suggestion that each individual case should be examined is now being carried out, it would appear that there is no longer any necessity to form the Commission of Italian Officers.

Soldiers belonging to the partisan formations and to the Army are put together with the civilians in the concentration camps organized by the Allies in Afragola and Aversa.

The charges against them are quite different in kind; they go from that of being a combattant in the republican fascist forces and that of collaborating with the enemy to arbitrary absence from military service or suspect attitude.

Such a situation which implies the life in common of such different elements without classification or distinction of military rank, is likely to bring about quarrels and unpleasant incidents, if we keep in mind the present psychological condition of the prisoners.

To eliminate this possibility, I would like to propose to you, my dear Admiral, to take in consideration the opportunity of forming a commission of Italian officers, to examine every individual to see whether he must be classified as prisoner of war or interned for determinate reasons.

Let me tell you that this organ could contribute to shorten for many elements a stay which has been lasting for a very long time while they were waiting for their position to be cleared up.

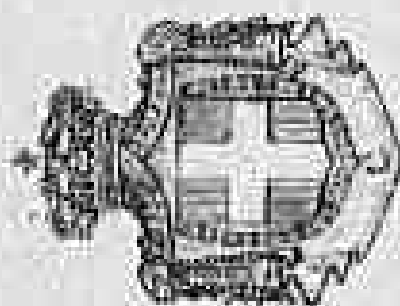

The atmosphere is very tense, and the ignorance in which the prisoners are kept as regards their fate, the charges which will be brought up against them, the punishments to be meted out to them, and their impatience to be judged and classified, have created a state of restlessness which results in quarrels, grudges and unpleasant incidents.

This situation mainly arises from the enforced proximity of members of the republican army and partisans.

This regrettable situation is only maintained for Italian nationals. P.O.Ws. of other nationalities are treated in a different manner, and have been examined and classified and suffer less restrictions.

In order to avoid the repetition of incidents such as those referred to above, it would be necessary - in my opinion - that a Commission of Italian Officers were appointed to examine the case of each prisoner and classify him as either a P.O.W. or an internee for various reasons for a predetermined period, or propose that he be discharged.

The work of such a Commission is all the more advisable since most of the prisoners have been interned for six or seven months without ever having been interrogated.

Should your Excellency approve of my proposal, I think that it should be mentioned to the Allied Commission in order that appropriate action may be taken.

Subject: Italians in Albania.

Our memorandums N. 6/1312/563 of December 19th and 6/178/87 of January 20th.

A British Officer who just returned from Albania supplied me with the following informations:

The number of the Italian Civilians and soldiers amounts to about 15.000 and their conditions, although they enjoy complete freedom are very precarious especially with regards to rations and clothing.

The temporary Albanian Government have founded an organ called "Garibaldi Club" to which all Italians, civilians as well as soldiers, have to apply to for the protection of their interests.

In what regards the repatriation of our compatriots, the Albanese Government, without opposing themselves openly, has assumed a dilatory attitude determined, as to my informer, by the following reasons:

- 1) The temporary Albanian Government is very inconstant and thinks that an acknowledgment in any way whatever from a foreign country would strengthen its position; for this reason Albania asks the Italian Government to present an official request for the repatriation of the Italians to Italy.
- 2/. The Albanian Government has to face a great amount of work for the reconstruction of the country and therefore has all the reasons possible to retain in Albania as many specialists and technicians as possible.

After the pressure the Allies exercised upon the Albanian Government the latter of late has consented on General lines to permit any Italian on request, to leave the country.

The recent nomination of General Piccini in Albania and his subsequent contacts with the Albanian Government is looked upon with approval by the Allied Authorities in the Country.

According to above mentioned officer it is very desirable that food and cloths be sent to the Italians residing in Albania. Help that should be sent through the said General .

The Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War has requested the locations of cemeteries used for the burying of Italian Prisoners of War who die in captivity, also the names of those POW buried in each cemetery, so that he may be in a position to inform relatives of the whereabouts of the bodies, and at the same time assure them that all cemeteries where Italian POW are buried are looked after in the proper religious manner by the Commanders and Chaplains of the respective POW camps.

2. I shall be pleased to have any information available on this subject so that I may reply suitably to the High Commissioner.

We are informed that the cemeteries used for the burying of It.P.O.Ws' who die in captivity are constructed on purpose for them and more or less near the PW Camps.

In many cases, the care of these cemeteries is given to the Commanders or Chaplains of the respective Camps and are therefore taken care of in ^athe solemn manner, due to their religious and moral needs.

We however are not informed of the whereabouts of the bodies, not having a list of the names of those buried in each different cemetery.

The High Commissioner in realization of the moral necessity to have this information, in order to be able to inform the stricken families, begs the Allied Commission to procure if possible, the list of names of the dead in each cemetery and any other particulars pertaining to them.

Subject : Permit to travel to Lucca for Col. PASQUINELLI

Reference the opposition regarding the concession of the above permit, we inform you that:

The P.A.I. has never been either a political nor a military police. Colonel Pasquinelli, former Questore (Chief of the Eritrean police) of Eritrea, transmitted to the British Authority occupying Eritrea, a telegram forwarded by the Italian Government to the representatives in the colonies saying "the PAI is as every police all over the world. It prevents and represses common enemies. It makes laws and decrees by people etc."

The matter is that the police forces in Asmara (PAI and CC.RR.) during the first ten months of occupation were commanded by Col. PASQUINELLI in full collaboration with the British Authorities to whom the same officer had consigned the city of Asmara, as ordered by the withdrawn Italian military Authorities. The officer's service reports were made to Gen. PLATT, Gen. HENNEDY COOK, and Col. CUNNINGHAM, but moreover to Col. BUTTOLPH, Chief of the Police Headquarters with whom he had hearty relations.

The PAI, with reduced number of officers and soldiers, is still performing a normal police service in Asmara.

Col. PASQUINELLI has been interned in Sudan and in India until February 1942, therefore he has not had any relation with Germans. During his imprisonment he has been affected by pernicious anemiy because of which he has been repatriated. He has not seen his family for 5 years.

The officer's wife was born in S. Francisco, California (U.S.A.) her relatives being American citizens, and after 1921 she remained in Italy because of her marriage.

She fled from Livorno, where she has a little house in Via Montebello 41 and a big one in Via della Posta 14, and went first to S. Pietro (Lucca) and then in S. Macario in piano - Vignola (Lucca) where she lived with an uncle of hers.

Therefore, as there are no political obstacles and the family reasons are as stated by the officer, I beg you to kindly issue the above permit (for a short time.)

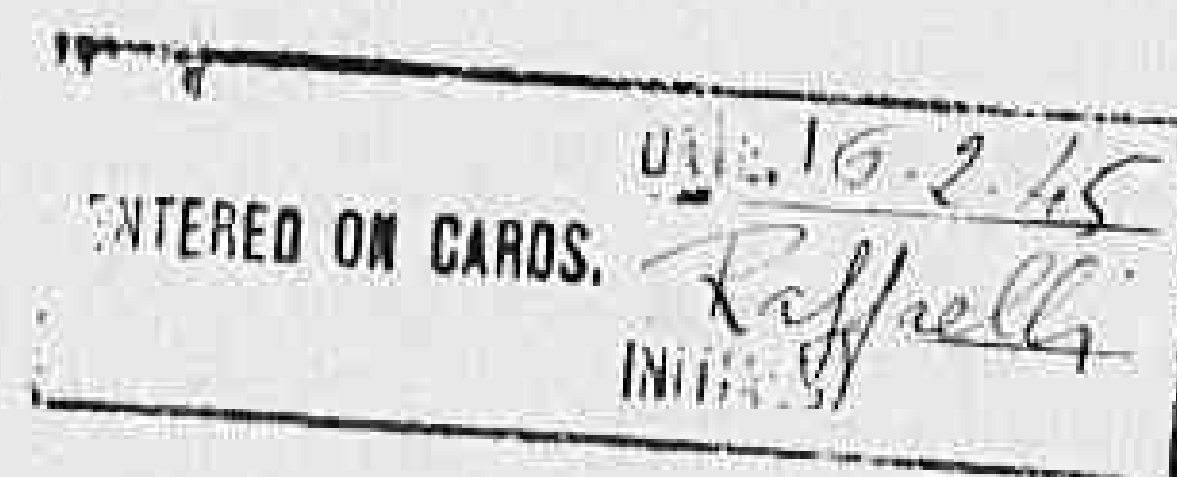

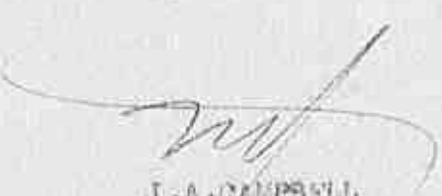

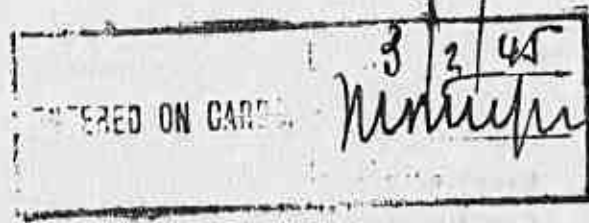
