2. At the end of January 46 thirty-one Cooperators were remustered as PW on security grounds. The question of formal trial did not arise. These personnel were known to have been active in instigating a mass protest which took the form of organised absenteeism from employment for a period of 24 hrs and the presentation of a memorandum containing certain complaints and demands. No disciplinary action was taken on this occasion, but when it became known that further agitations were afoot towards staging a second protest on a larger and more prolonged scale than the first one, it became necessary to remove the thirty-one personnel known to be taking an active part in the organisation.

3. They were told the reasons for their being remustered as PW.

4. They were despatched to Non-Coop Camps and received the normal treatment accorded to Non-Coops. Their change of status naturally resulted in their being confined in guarded camps, but in every way they had the same facilities in respect of religion, recreation and other amenities as other Non-Coops. In only one respect was their treatment different from that of other Non-Coops, i.e. special care was taken to prevent them having contact with Coops as they were known to be agitators whose object was to spread disaffection.

SUBJECT : Repatriation to Libia of ex Veterans
from Tripoli -

1°) As is known around about the first of last May, your Division succeeded in arriving at a favourable conclusion, in direct agreement with G.H.Q. Middle East, regarding the repatriation to Libia of the ex Libyan veterans; however on the 17th of the same month G.H.Q. Middle East telegraphed suspending all repatriations to Libia, due to new directives from the War Office.

2°) Following this order the veterans, who belonged to that category, in Naples, waiting to leave, remained in a large number, at the local lodging center, because it was difficult to arrange their transfer to the refugee camps, that depended from the Ministry of Post War Assistance, due to the different treatment given to refugees to that given to POW and because they were convinced that if they left Naples they would loss all chance of repatriation.

3°) The permanence of these individuals in a Military lodging center was the cause of great inconvenience, of a disciplinary and moral order due to the material damage they were suffering in being away from their families for such a long time.

4°) In consideration of the fact that in this period the repatriation has been allowed of 1.500 civilians to Libia, which might signify a change in the policy of the British Authorities, we renew our request that you obtain if possible, the repatriation of the veterans in question and that the first to go, be those who have no military status inasmuch that they are specialised workmen who were forced to work with German Units when under arms.

2°) Following this order the veterans, who belonged to that category, in Naples, waiting to leave, remained in a large number, at the local lodging center, because it was difficult to arrange their transfer to the refugee camps, that depended from the Ministry of Post War Assistance, due to the different treatment given to refugees to that given to POW and because they were convinced that if they left Naples they would lose all chance of repatriation.

3°) The permanence of these individuals in a Military lodging center was the cause of great inconvenience, of a disciplinary and moral order due to the material damage they were suffering in being away from their families for such a long time.

4°) In consideration of the fact that in this period the repatriation has been allowed of 1.500 civilians to Libya, which might signify a change in the policy of the British Authorities, we renew our request that you obtain if possible, the repatriation of the veterans in question and that the first to go, be those who have no military status inasmuch that they are specialised workmen who were forced to work with German Units when under arms.

1°) the Italian Military attaché at Stockholm has informed us that a Polish Officer, who escaped after a few years from an internment camp at Borisovic (near Leningrad) stated that in that camp, there were some hundreds of foreigners of various nationalities.

Amongst these individuals are, Americans, English, Italian and Spanish who have been prohibited to communicate with the diplomatic representatives of their respective countries.

2°) The same officer furthermore stated that there are other camps for foreigners in the U.R.S.S.

SUBJECT : Italian prisoners in the U.R.S.S. -

1°) The statement made by the Ministry of Post War Assistance, which recently appeared in the daily Press, regarding the assurance from the Soviet Government that no Italian prisoner has remained in the U.R.S.S.- with the exception of a group of sick people - has provoked many pressing requests from families who desire at least to know the fate of their dear ones.

2°) Anxiety and illusions of the families of soldiers who have not returned, is justified by the fact that the repatriations from the U.R.S.S. (12513 up to the 20.11.46) is greatly deficient in respect of 80.000 prisoners of the A.R.M.I.R. who were originally captured by the Russians, according to the statement of this Ministry which was confirmed by news that appeared in the Soviet Press in February 1943.

- but even in comparison with the official Soviet reports (19640 - prisoners as according to the note of August 1945 - to the It. Ministry of Foreign Affairs from the Soviet Embassy in Rome and again a semi official report, 21.193 prisoners, as was stated by the same Soviet Embassy in May 1946 to the Italian Press.

Therefore:

According to the original number of 80.000 prisoners the remaining prisoners should now be of about 67.500.

According to the 19.640, that the Russian Embassy declared as prisoners in August 1945 to our Ministry of Foreign Affairs, there should now remain 7.127.

According to the 21.193 that the Russian Embassy declared as
