SUBJECT : Alleged refugees in Sardinia.

TO : Ministero Assistenza Post Bellica.

1. We have been informed through the Liaison Officer in Sardinia that there are 300 alleged refugees in Sardinia who wish to cross to the mainland.

2. This sounds almost impossible, and as the Liaison Officer has no means of checking up on the position himself, we would be grateful if you would ask the Prefect or other Italian Government official on the spot to check each case and report. Before we make arrangements to lift persons as refugees from Sardinia to Italy, we must make sure that they are genuine refugees, and if they appear to be genuine refugees we require an explanation of the circumstances which placed them in Sardinia.

SUBJECT : Military Personnel going to Sardinia.

1) We inform you that the Land Forces Sub Commission A C(/M.M.I.A.) with letter Q/I4/3, dated the 31th of July, has communicated to us the disposals concerning the transport of military personnel from the Continent to Sardinia.

2) These disposals are a confirmation of the fact that War Veterans from imprisonment or from internment can not use the military transport provided by the M.M.I.A. but must be transported by the civil authorities.

3) Notwithstanding, (because it is impossible to avoid) the militaty personnel returning from imprisonment and from concentration Camps directed to Sardinia, in an increasing number every day are being sent on to Naples if nothing to the contrary is ordered, for subsequent transfer to Sardinia with the unstanding that they will be transported as in the past, by the Displaced Persons and the Repatriation Sub Commission.

4) I will gratly appreciate if your Sub Commission will interest the "Displaced Persons"Sub Commission in their behalf that their transportation to Sardinia may be facilitated.

SUBJECT: Sicilian and Sardi veterans from imprisonment  
and from Balkans.

TO : Land Forces Sub Commissioner A.C. (MMIA)  
and for attention to:  
War Materials Disposal and Italian PW Sub-Comm.

As soldiers, who do not travel for service or for serious  
~~familiar~~ reasons, are not allowed to go to Sardegna, the war  
veterans from imprisonment and from the Balkans who have their  
home in those islands, and who are still in army service and  
therefore have no right for a leave, cannot see their families  
before reaching the units to which they are assigned.

You can easily imagine that this fact has serious moral  
repercussion on the spirit of those veterans who have long  
awaited with anxious impatience the moment in which, repatriated,  
they thought to be able to embrace their dear ones.

Therefore I beg the Sub-Commission to consider the pos-  
sibility of conceding to the above veterans to pass with their  
families a certain period of rest (or their convalescence leave)  
before taking service again.

For the transport from and to Sardegna of soldiers already  
repatriated, can be used the ship actually used for load of  
motocars which from that island are transferred to the continent.
