TO HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE LIEUTENANT GENERAL OF THE REALM

I Lieut.Colonel TATTONI, Fileno, having been informed that my son Lt. TATTONI, Giovanni, born at Trento on the 28 June 1922 is held as a prisoner at S. Rossore in Camp 82 G., 746767, H.P.W.E. 339/6, beg your R.H. to have him freed as soon as he is questioned.

Regarding the above matter, I state the following:

As a 2nd.Lt.Lt., Eng.Corps, he left the Academy in Turin on the 15 Mar 43, and was mobilised on the 1st. Aug 43 with the Division "Lombardia" then interned in Germany in following September. Certain of being able to desert and pass over to the Allies, following the example of many others, TATTONI, Giovanni accepted to be sent to the Italian Front. However, he was watched so closely and menaced with reprisals against his family if he deserted and therefore he was not able to carry out his plans in order to not endanger my condition, as I am ill with the Parkinson disease contracted while on duty.

He never professed fascist ideas, on the contrary he made a great deal of anti-fascist propaganda while going at school "Prati high school" and was suspended from lessons as a disciplinary measure, for 20 days.

I am sure he has no charges against him and that he is a brave soldier.

I beg respectfully your R.H. to give an order so that my son may be released.

Excellency,

I am ~~441~~ Col. Massi Giuseppe (Reserves of the Bersaglieri) born in Tolentino 18 Apr 1893 and now at the disposal of the Allied Command, in quality of witness since two months at Afragola, Camp 209, M. Compound, having been sent here from Fortezza da Basso (C.M.) of Florence.

The motive of my detention is the investigation regarding the Concentration Camp for Allies in Italian Territory during the war. I Commanded the Camp 21 in Chieti Scalo (Anglo American Officers) since Nov 1942 up to Sept 43.

During this period there were no evasions; the prisoners were satisfied of the human treatment given to them and in conformity to the International Conventions.

When questioned in Nov 45 and on the 27th of Mar 46, by Americans and English, I was informed that there were no charges against me for ill-treatment of prisoners.

I was cleared of the charge of having boasted that I had turned the Camp over to the German Command, during the Court of Enquiry made by the Military Tribunal of Florence, which had been stated by local elements due to the fact that I had to go as a refugee with my family to the city of my origin, where during the clandestine period I was a civilian commissary at the prefecture and was arrested twice by the nazi-fascists; for which accusation I was freed by the Allied Command after having been detained for two months and received orders to go as Police Commissioner to Sassari. I was arrested by a cousin of mine and an Officer that I had protected on the even of my departure, and since then, my imprisonment continues.

The present imprisonment is causing great damage to my private interests and my family is facing serious consequences.

My wife has sickened due to all these worries, two of my three children are students, one of whom is doing his second year in law at Macerata. They all live on 2000 Lire per month in addition of my pension of 1000 Lire per month as a war invalid (1915-1918).

In consideration of what is written above, I beg you to ask H.R.H. to intervene on my behalf with the Allied Command in order that I may receive Justice.

Excellency

I turn to your Excellency in the name of one who has suffered and fought for the institution that you represent.

I am Lieut. Espinosa Ipparco, in the Army since 1940 and fought in the war of liberation from the end of October 1943 up to the 14 February 1946; I was arrested by the British Authorities in Ancona where I reside, without any explanation to myself or family, during the first 20 days of imprisonment.

During this period my family was not even informed as to my whereabouts, during which time I was confined in the Guard Room at Ancona, thrown into a cell and obliged to wash myself with water already used by English prisoners charged with common crimes. I was then transferred in an iron cage from Ancona to Naples and subsequently to Afragola at which latter place I arrived the 6 Mar 46. On the 21 Mar 46, I was questioned by an English Captain, who owing to the fact that I had been in a Camp for Allied PWs in 1942, as English interpreter, asked me general information on the Camp and information relative to 5 particular incidents happened in that Camp. He told me that my testimony was needed for war trials. However 4 of the 5 incidents regarded Capt Somavilla Antonio the so-called war criminal who was released on the 15th. of this month. Regarding the 5th. incident I gave no particular information because on my word of honor, I never saw anything nor did I ever hear him talk.

Since the 21 Mar 46 nothing more has happened. I am in a Camp that according to the English is a camp of witnesses.

I wish to bring to your attention this juridical procedure that is an offense to the dignity of a soldier who has offered all that is good in him to his Country.

I desire above all my liberty because there are no charges against me nor can any be made against me.

I beg your excellency to intervene in my behalf with H.R.H. in order to obtain my release from the Allied Authorities as I am being illegally detained from the point of view of International law.

Again I am obliged to turn to your courtesy on behalf of General Carlo ISASCA, whose case is extremely Compassionate.

General Carlo ISASCA Commanded the Infantry Division "Venezia" (subsequently Commanded the "Garibaldi" Division and after having fought heroically against the Germans in the Balkans (was decorated with the V.M.) he was imprisoned by the yugoslaves and sentenced to death - notwithstanding that (as he states in a letter dtd 20 Mar that he wrote his wife), no specific accusation was made against him.

The General made an appeal to the Superior Tribunal at Belgrad against the sentence in question.

I beg you Colonel Regis, to intervene on behalf of General ISASCA in order to avoid that a mourning may not be added to these years of family sufferings.

ROME

I the undersigned, wife of General Carlo ISASCA, who commanded the Infantry Divisions "Venezia" and "Garibaldi" in Montenegro, make the following report to Your Royal Highness.

My husband on the 8 Sept 43, after the Armistice in order to remain faithful to his beloved Sovereign as he wrote in his letter to me on the 25 July 43 of which I herewith quote:

"Animated with pure sentiment of patriotism I initiated a new Campaign of action in complete contrast with the orders received from the Germans. For more than two months I marched thousands of kilometers through Countries where the roads were terrible and suffered famine, thirst and cold, affronting all privations and holding the flag high, the ideal of the fight we were fighting" Montenegro, Sangiacato 8 Sept 43 - 30 June 44 (which was the motive for which my husband received the order V.M.).

From that period notwithstanding his heroism, not only he was not repatriated but in contrast to all human laws and international Conventions, I received no more news from him.

I asked help from the Holy See, the Ministry of War and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, but their intervention in my behalf gave no result.

By Officers returning from Yugoslavia I was told that he was kept by the partisans of Tito, after having fought with heroism on their side, in a prison, half nude and covered with lice.

On the 20 March 1946 I received the first letter from him, in which he informed me as having been in prison since Nov 1944, to have been tried and condemned to death; notwithstanding that no particular accusation had been made against him (Cettigne Zatvor Bugdanai Kraj), ~~EMIGRARE~~.

This sentence was refused sometime ago by Belgrad because of the Montenegrin population who know my husband as an honest and upright man, liked by all.

My husband appealed to the Superior Tribunal and is now awaiting their decision.

I turn to Your Royal Highness in my anguish and torment in order that you may take this matter up with the Allied Authorities and in particular with H.E. Admiral Stne to whom I am writing to obtain the release of my unfortunate and heroic husband, who is well known by Your Royal Highness for his numerous decorations of Military Valour that he wears.

I am sure that my application and my tears will move the generous heart of Your Royal Highness to whom I remain yours devotedly.

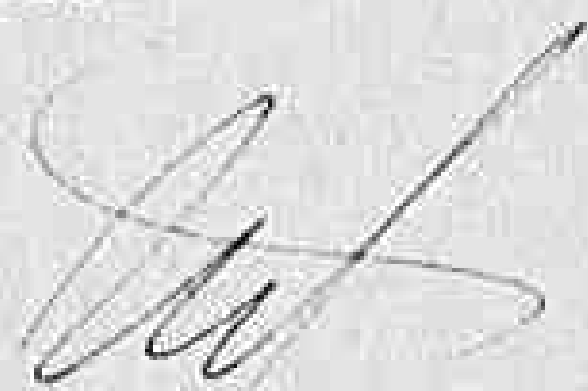

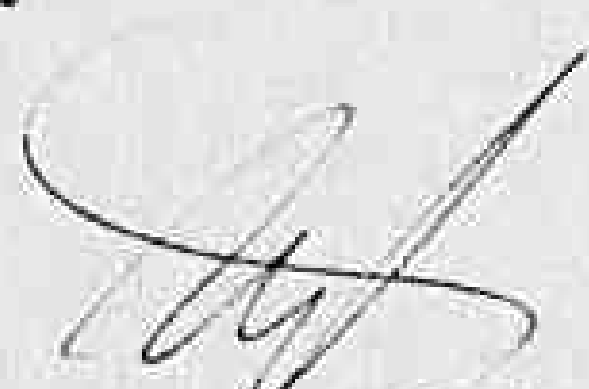

Ref your 3177/AG of 20 Apr 46, you are advised that this Division forwarded to AFHQ a recommendation for the repatriation of Lt COMITO Cino on 20 Oct 45.

His name was included in the last list of specialists requested by the Italian Ministry of Post-War Assistance.

Since six months have already elapsed since that list was forwarded, it is quite possible he may already be on the way or among those awaiting embarkation.

It is regretted that the fact that his father is gravely ill in itself does not constitute a sufficiently compassionate reason, under the instructions set down by AFHQ, for special consideration.

These specify that the mother or head of the family must have died or be seriously ill, and that minor children need care. It does not appear from your letter that any children are affected in this case.

However, if there should be any minor children requiring care, then we would be in position to request priority repatriation.

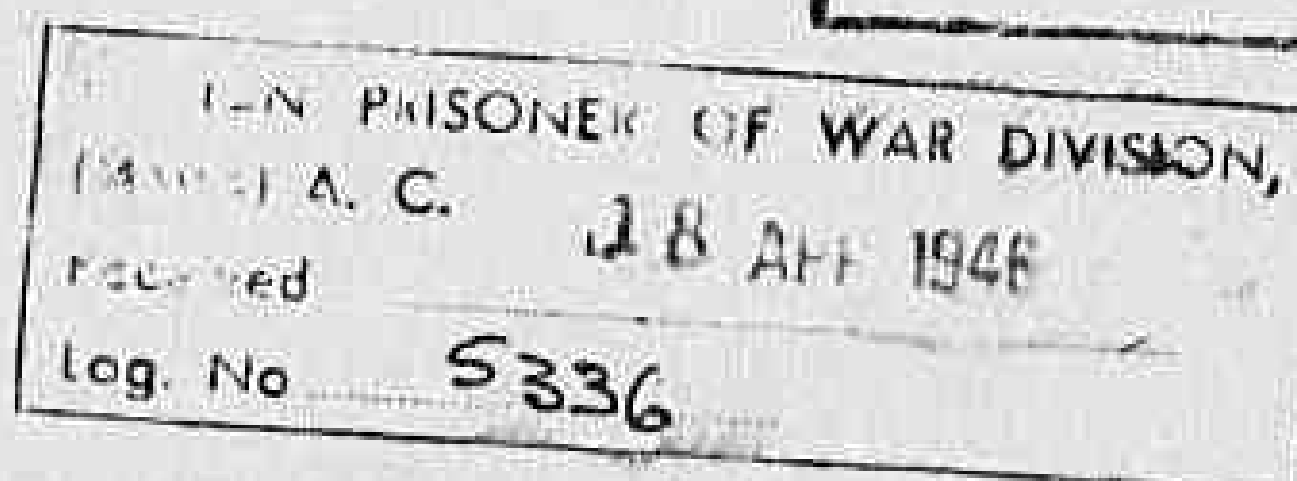
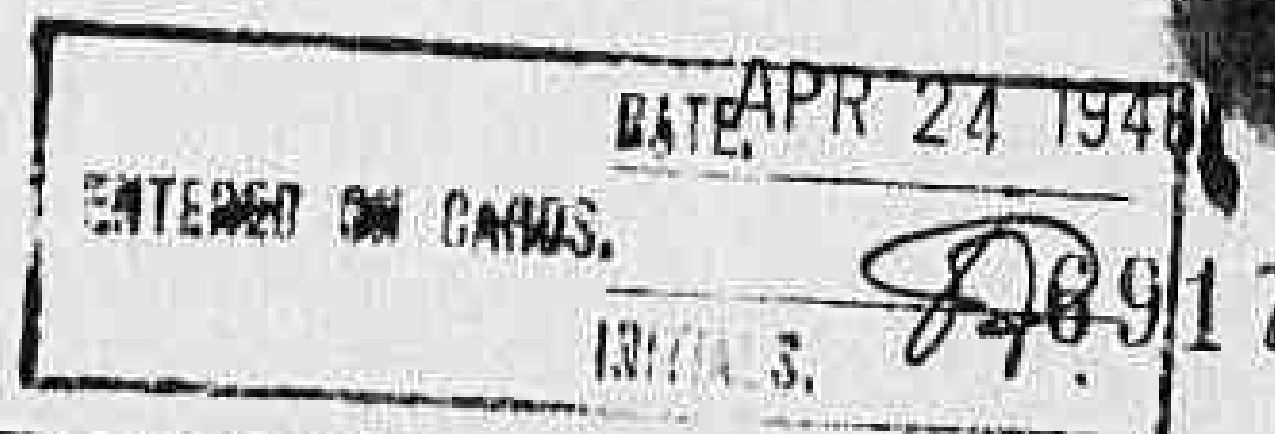

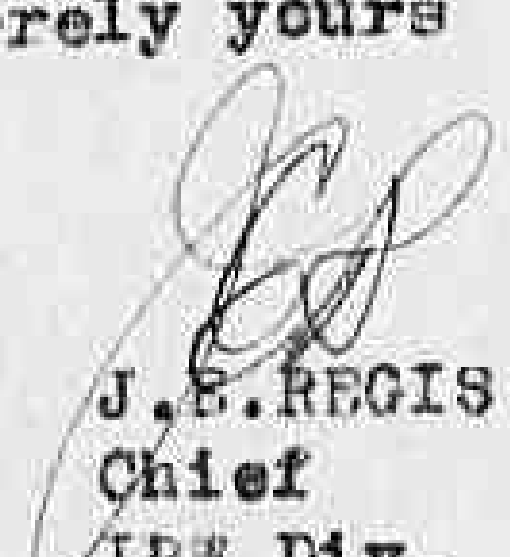

The undersigned informs this Command of what follows:

1°) From witness of some prisoners of war returned from India he has known that his brother S. Tenante Mario Tarantino fu Giuseppe, n. 1733, c. mp. N. 28 wing 1 India, prisoner since October 1940, is at present down with a nervous sickness and suicidal mania. In fact he has already tried to kill himself and being his attempt unsuccessful he grew worse than before. He wrote to his relations some letters from which it is easy to understand that he is sick without any doubt and that in case he could not come back home at once he might repeat his attempt at his life.

2°) That his brother's financial position is good and whenever he repatriated his family can meet all expenses for his living. Therefore he would not be of any charge on the National budget. The undersigned himself, surgeon and manager of a private Hospital and assistant surgeon at the Institut of Surgical Pathology of the R. University in Naples, wishes to provide the expenses of his brother's repatriation by paying with English money for his transportation to Italy with civilian means by sea or air.

3°) In case all that was not sufficient, the undersigned wishes, if it is possible, to go and take his brother's place as a prisoner of war in India, so that he can repatriate. Being a surgeon he could be useful in these camps of concentration, remaining there at his brother's place as long as he should have

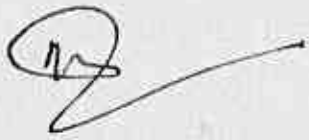
