1. The question of the deportation of certain discontented Italian merchant seamen from the United States of America to Italy was discussed with the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War and Director General of the Italian and Mercantile Marines.

2. It is now considered that this matter should be taken up direct by your Ambassador in Washington and the United States Government.

3. In this connection the conditions under which the Italian Merchant Seamen are required to serve, and of which complaint has been made, could also be the subject of enquiry.

4. It has been decided that if a number of these men have to be deported, two groups numbering 40 each can be accepted, but it is felt that each case should be carefully screened in order to achieve the maximum deterring effect upon other seamen who contemplate leaving their ships.

5. This Headquarters must be informed of the names, dates and place of birth, and other pertinent information of all seamen to be deported, and this information must be received before departure from the United States, together with the estimated time of arrival.

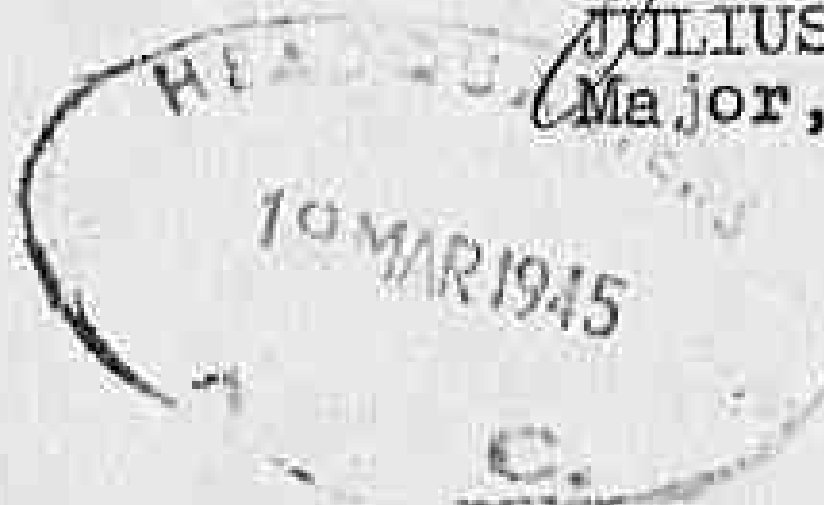

- (c) It is considered that the right to deport individuals should be supported unless there are compelling reasons to the contrary. While no specific data is available as to the result of such action with groups of other nationalities, it will at least relieve the United States from the responsibility of maintaining dissident groups. It is considered, however, that the repatriation of a few of these seamen would not help the position and might only encourage others to behave in a like manner in the hope of being repatriated to Italy. It is not believed that the numbers involved will materially affect the security problem in Italy.
- (d) It is recommended if it is decided that Italian merchant seamen in the United States who will not accept employment are to be deported it should be in accordance with the policy stated in the paragraph of the United States Department of Justice confidential letter No. 55204/Gen.E of 30 January 1945, a copy of which is attached to reference (a).

4. In order to get the views of the Italian Government a meeting was held with the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War and the Director General of the Italian Mercantile Marine. They expressed the following views:-

- (a) Deportation would be welcomed by a proportion of these seamen, particularly those with family connections in ITALY, whilst there would be also some to whom deportation would be quite a severe punishment. If the proposed scheme to deport 3 groups of about 40 each is to be carried out, very careful selection would have to be made to achieve the desired results.
- (b) It was suggested that the Italian Ambassador in Washington should be approached with a view to sending a suitable person to talk to these men and explain matters to them. This has been done elsewhere with great success.
- (c) The Director General of the Italian Mercantile Marine has already heard of these seamen, and stated that it had been reported to him that the main reason for inertia is the poor treatment they receive on board. Bad pay and lack of canteen facilities to purchase cigarettes etc.

- (d) Both the Italian High Commissioner for Prisoners of War and the Director General of the Italian Mercantile Marine are of the opinion that if better conditions are granted to these men and that if some suitable person talks to them, there should then be no trouble in making them work.

Allied Force Headquarters in reference (a) requested comments on the proposal to deport to Italy from the United States, Italian merchant seamen who do not accept employment in the merchant service. Two points are raised; first, whether deportation will have a favorable effect and second, whether the seamen deported would constitute a security menace in Italy.

2. It is considered that the right to deport individuals should be supported unless there are compelling reasons to the contrary. While no specific data is available as to the result of such action with groups of other nationalities, it will at least relieve the United States from the responsibility of maintaining dissident groups. It is not believed that the numbers involved will materially affect the security problem in Italy.

3. In conclusion, it is recommended that Italian merchant seamen in the United States who will not accept employment be deported progressively, in accordance with the policy stated in the next to last paragraph of the U. S. Department of Justice confidential letter No. 55204/Gen.S of 20 January 1945, a copy of which is attached to reference (a).

1. Request that you ascertain the views of the theater commander with regard to the request of the Department of Justice contained in the penultimate paragraph of the enclosure.
2. Ten such seamen were deported in June 1944, under authority of reference d. This was granted after an initial disapproval on security grounds in reference b and an explanation in reference c that it was hoped that the deportation of this group would induce others to resume duties in the merchant service. When permission to deport an additional group was requested in reference e, the theater replied in reference f that since the deportation of the first group had not had the desired effect, no further groups would be accepted.
3. Reconsideration is requested by the Department of Justice because of the critical manpower situation, the pressing need for merchant seamen, and their experience with other nationalities under similar circumstances. This experience indicates that if two or three groups are deported, the impression is given to their compatriots that all who refuse sea duty will likewise be returned to their native land, and the practice has resulted in the remaining members volunteering to return to the maritime service.
4. Since references b and f indicate a feeling that such individuals would constitute a security danger in the theater, attention is invited to the second paragraph of the enclosure.

Dear Col. Sweeney:

I desire to refer to your letter of June 26, 1944 wherein you advised that the theater commander had disapproved the return of an additional group of Italian seamen to Italy and that the application of this Service for a military permit in behalf of such seamen was not favorably considered. The need for restoration of these seamen to duty is most imperative and this Service is definitely committed to that objective. However, lack of ability to enforce deportation has been a serious deterrent in overcoming the inertia manifest in this group. Experience with groups of other nationalities has been most favorable in the matter of compelling reshipment where recourse can be made to the imposition of more severe measures.

Of the 1,134 Italian seamen who were removed from Italian vessels previous to the participation of this country in hostilities and who now remain in the United States under the parole supervision of this Service, approximately five hundred last resided, or have families residing in Italian territory liberated by Allied forces. The seamen in this group, as in the cases of all aliens under supervision, were paroled only after a conclusion had been reached, following careful review of available records, that they were not dangerous. It is believed that this group should be compelled to resume maritime activity.

In addition to this large group, the expulsion of Italian seamen who have deserted vessels in the United States since the Fall of 1943 is of equal concern. Records of this Service indicate that a total of 1,445 Italian crew members arrived on vessels in the United States since November 1943 and of that number a total of 203 were reported as deserters. A considerable number of these deserters have already been arrested by this Service and some are now in custody.

The very high incidence of desertions from Italian-manned vessels has seriously impaired the operation of ships engaged in transportation vital to the prosecution of the war. In fact, two such vessels were so undermanned by recent desertions that the entire Italian crew had to be removed and replaced.

Incl # 3

The Recruitment and Manning Organization of the War Shipping Administration is exceedingly interested in vigorously enforcing all possible measures to compel Italian seamen to maintain their status as such. The Assistant Deputy Administrator expressed the attitude of that activity under date of December 20th last as follows:

"In response to the request of your Office, we wish to advise you that, in our opinion, there is a very urgent need for Italian seamen to man Italian flag vessels and that, from present indications, this situation will continue until such time as some drastic action is taken to compel these seamen to reship."

All of the seamen who come within the jurisdiction of this Service are given every opportunity to reship. In the case of the larger group of Italian parolees herein mentioned the individuals have been repeatedly canvassed to resume their calling, and recently, with the cooperation of the Recruitment and Manning Organization, efforts were made to induce certain of the seamen to accept berths on American vessel sailing coastwise at comparable wages, to no avail. It is now apparent that no persuasion or inducement will alter the complacency of this group.

To overcome the impassiveness of these seamen I feel that the deportation of a substantial and selected number will have a salutary effect upon the others. I should appreciate your further consideration of the matter of returning to Italy as many as two or three groups of forty seamen each at appropriate intervals, consistent with available sailing accommodations. The seamen selected will, of course, be chosen from the group of parolees returnable to liberated territory and those seamen who have deserted vessels in this country since October 1943.

Your advice regarding the disposition of the theater commander to favorably consider the grant of permission for return of an additional group of seamen to Italy will be appreciated.

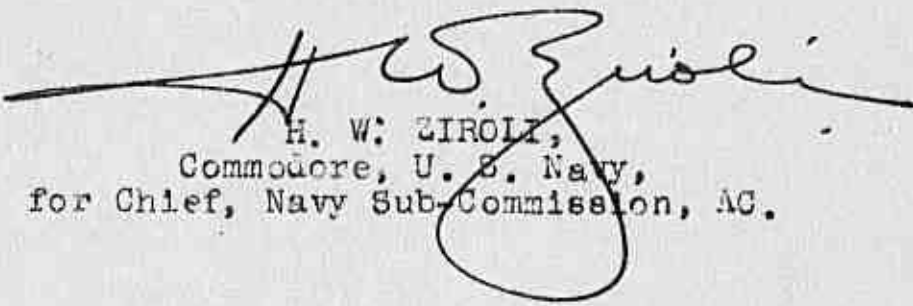

The International Committee of the Red Cross has informed us that the officers and seamen of the Italian Merchant Navy, who are interned in territories belonging to the British Empire, are living under very bad conditions, because since the day of the Armistice they have received no aid from the Navigation Societies that employed them; especially badly off, are those who are interned in the Camps of Egypt, Australia, and India (in the latter country our attention has been called particularly to those who are at Camp 24 Wing 3).

These men belonged to ships that had been requisitioned or rented by the Italian Government, or those who were free but at the opening of hostilities remained blocked in foreign parts, other formed parts of crews whose ships had been sunk or taken during the war and so fell into British hands and were transferred to that camp.

These men were at first treated as civilian internees, in 1942, following an agreement between the Italian and British Governments, were transferred from the Internee camps to those of the PWs and treated as such, except for all that regarded work, that for them was not considered obligatory and therefore they were excluded from the benefits of extra pay and facilities accorded to the PWs. In substitution of this, they received from the firms of the Armourers who employed them, monthly wages, but from the date of the Armistice these payments were suspended due to the impossibility of the firms to obtain foreign money.

These are the reasons that these people are living under very sad conditions for over a year, and the International Committee for the Red Cross retained the conditions so serious as to necessitate a report.

The Italian Authorities are very much preoccupied with their situation and are studying various ways to resolve it. It would seem however to the High Commissioner that the best and the most just way to resolve it would be to either repatriate this people or to employ them in the Italian Merchant Navy, or again, to put them on duty as cobelligerents.

After all it is a question of a few thousand people (at the opening of hostilities the crews who were blocked in foreign parts did not superate 5000 people) most of them middle aged, with families dependant on them, families who are left in very bad conditions in the various parts, which have been damaged by the war and in more, they are men who have been PWs for more than four years.

The Art. 72 of the Geneva Convention could be applied to this case to order the repatriation of these individuals, it appears to the High Commissioner that the Allied Authorities could not help but find that these individuals have the right to human treatment and that such action would be legal and just.

1. The Merchant Shipping Section has consulted MEDBO, MWT, COGENA, and the Italian Schooner traffic Committee, all of whom agree that the return of these men would aggravate an already difficult situation as regards the employment of Italian Merchant Seamen, of whom there are far too many for the jobs available.

2. There is no necessity, therefore, for seeking any degree of priority in the repatriation of these prisoners on grounds of their required for service in the Italian Mercantile Marine, but as they will have to be repatriated ultimately, it is considered that their case should not be overlooked for this reason alone.

Subject: Deportation of Italian Seamen.

Reference: (a) AFHQ ltr G-5: 014.33-20 of 16 February 1945.

1. Allied Force Headquarters in reference (a) requested comments on the proposal to deport to Italy from the United States, Italian merchant seamen who do not accept employment in the merchant service. Two points are raised; first, whether deportation will have a favorable effect and second, whether the seamen deported would constitute a security menace in Italy.

2. It is considered that the right to deport individuals should be supported unless there are compelling reasons to the contrary. While no specific data is available as to the result of such action with groups of other nationalities, it will at least relieve the United States from the responsibility of maintaining dissident groups. It is not believed that the numbers involved will materially effect the security problem in Italy.

3. In conclusion, it is recommended that Italian merchant seamen in the United States who will not accept employment be deported progressively, in accordance with the policy stated in the next to last paragraph of the U. S. Department of Justice confidential letter No. 55204/Gen.E of 20 January 1945, a copy of which is attached to reference (a).
