My home and family are situated in Misurata (Tripolitania), but I am now living in Sorge (Verona). It is my fervent wish to return to my family, but so far my efforts to be repatriated have been in vain.

During the war I served with the "Italia Redente" section, and was discharged on 7 Jun 46. I have applied to the Ministry of Italian Africa and all the UNRRA offices, and now, because of my desire to reach my family and because of my bad financial position, I am forced to apply to you.

As yet I have not received a reply or any sort of my enclosures.

RADIO AND PRESS COMMUNICATION

On 5 and 15 Jan 47 the 2,350 ex IPW in Egypt who had accepted voluntary repatriation in Palestine, will be embarked at Port Said in two drafts on Italian cruisers, respectively of 1,050 and 1,500 individuals.

This restriction has been obtained, even before the terms of the engagement ended, due to the strong and efflorescent pressure of the Allied Commission with the GHQ Middle East, following instant requests of the Ministry of War.

My dear Parents,

I think and think and thinking go crazy because I can not change my fate: as I write you sad thoughts come into my mind, that the cause of all this are the famous individuals who have covered themselves with dignity and adopt an attitude toward the friends who find themselves in this terrible country, and these people are no different than the others because they have arms and legs and that which counts more a different mentality. I find it logical that a person who is cultured and intelligent can understand what is near God, in a few words "who strikes with the sword by the sword dies".

I am a victim of these people as we all are but what hurts more is that they hate us as if we were criminals. They told us responsible for what has happened in the past and when they should have repatriated us they have obliged us to sign or you another six months of cooperation and they wash their hands of it by stating we are voluntary, but voluntary by force because we were in sick sad conditions. We could not resist, and I told myself "worse than this I could not be unless I died": I can not go into details in writing but as soon as these gentleman will take pains to free us I will tell you all about it.







1. According to records held in this Division, the position of IPW in the UK is as follows :-

Originally held...	153,029.
Repatriated (at 6 Sep 46)	156,607.

2. It was announced by Mr. Chuter Ede in the House of Commons in mid-July that a number of Italian PW had voluntarily deferred their repatriation in order to assist in agriculture for a period of twelve months.

3. May it be stated if any further IPW from UK can be expected, or confirmed that the remaining 1422 have deferred their return to Italy.

4. Clarification of the status of the "deferred volunteers" or "ex-IPW in England" is also requested, in order that the Italian Government may be notified of the position.

It results at this Ministry that the situation of It. Pow in England up to the 30th. August 1946 was as of 156.607. The total number having been 158.029, there are still 1.422 to be repatriated.

Your division, around about the end of July announced the arrival of a ship at Naples, date unknown, with 1.445 Pow onboard, but up to date this news has not been confirmed.

We therefore beg your division if possible, to inform us the date of arrival of these remaining prisoners from Great Britain and the exact number, furthermore can you tell us if there is Military personnel remaining in England because employed in that country.

The following information has been received from the War Office:-

The present policy regarding the repatriation of Italian PW (and also internees and evacuees) to Italian ex Colonies, is that repatriation is not permitted except in extremely compassionate cases, and it is not desired to increase the Italian population of these territories. Each individual case is considered on its merits by the Chief Administrator of the territory concerned, and, in the case of PW, it has been ruled that a certificate from both the Chief Administrator and the holding authority stating that repatriation to the Colony is advisable as a matter of public policy, is required before approval is given.

The case of 2/Lt PELOSI was forwarded to the Chief Administrator, Somalia, who has replied that although he has no objection to the return of the Italian, he is not prepared to issue the necessary certificate. The return of 2/Lt PELOSI to Somalia cannot therefore be approved.

1. There are at present forty-three (43) Italian Prisoners of War in the West African District. These PW's were generally either born in North Africa, or lived there before 1939.

2. Of the group, eight (8) desire to be repatriated to Italy, twelve (12) to settle in Tunisia, eighteen (18) to settle in Tripoli, and five (5) desire to remain in French Morocco. Individual papers covering each man have been sent to the Allied Control Commission in Rome, but so far no action has been taken there.

3. Request that action be initiated from HQ USFET in order that these Italians may be repatriated as indicated above prior to date of deactivation of WAD.

2. The Finance Office of the Italian Ministry for Post War Assistance, War Branch, point out that no ruling is contained in the a/m memorandum regarding the payment of Certificates of Credit to be issued to subject PoWs.
3. It is stated that this lack of a definite ruling makes the Italian Government think that the payment of such certificates will have to be made by the Italian Government the same as for all PoWs released from British custody and repatriated to Italy.
4. The Italian Ministry point out in this connection that:
 - (a) The released PoW will find himself in dire conditions ~~on~~^{being} restored to civilian status, as he will not be able to dispose in legal currency of his only credit, earned in long months of co-operation.
 - (b) Payment of such credits by the British Government would agree with ~~the~~ the spirit and the letter of the Geneva Convention and no inconvenience of financial nature will arise as such currency will remain in the issuing country.
5. It is requested that the above be brought to the attention of the War Office and that a definite ruling be given on the matter.

This gives reason to think that the A.C. will request that the It. Government accept the responsibility of the payment of credits of prisoners who on being released obroad, remain as free workmen.

If so, the ex Prisoner obroad,when restored to a Civilian status, will find himself in the impossibility of being able to despose of his credit in the currency of the counts and therefore will be deprived of his modest, inasmuch as is indispensable, learnings in order to affront his daily needs.

On the other hand, the payment in Lst. of the credits in question by the British Power would conform in spirit and letter with the Geneva Convention with-out any inconvenience to the English Power of a financial nature, as the currency in question will remain in that country.

We therefore beg the A.C. to take steps with the English Government in order to clear up the payments in question



1. As you are aware, the present ruling by the British War Office regarding occupied territories is that IPW cannot be released there, but must be repatriated to Italy.

2. In view of certain essential Italian personnel now in Tripolitania, a strong case for the revision of the terms of this ruling has been submitted by G.H.Q. Middle East.

Before the matter is proceeded with further, will you kindly state by return if you have any objection to the release of these special categories of PW in TRIPOLITANIA and to the retention of these shown in para 3 (a), (b) and (c) far as long as their services may be required. It should be noted that if you concur, that consequence will only become operative if the War Office policy is amended as recommended.

7. The repatriation of Italian PW from Tripolitania is being arranged direct to Italy and may take place at any time that a ship can be made available for that run. The matter is one of some urgency. "In such cases application will be made by Commands to War Office (P.W.I.) stating that the Civil Government has approved the retention of the individual and enclosing four copies of the prisoner's personal record (pro forma attached at Appendix A) and one copy of the prisoner's conduct sheet.

The War Office will then obtain the man's discharge papers, releasing him from the Italian Army, and a passport. These will be forwarded to Commands who will transmit them to the man.

At the same time each prisoner will be given an individual statement of his credit balance, similar to that provided for repatriation, and the Italian Government should be notified of the credit balance

due to the prisoner at the time of his discharge, and he will have no further claim on any of the Governments of the British Commonwealth in respect thereof.

It is again emphasised that individuals will then acquire the status of a civilian alien and will in no circumstances revert to Prisoner of War Status, or qualify for repatriation as an ex-Prisoner of War.

Similar instructions are being issued to the Governments concerned."

Excuse me, please, about writing you. I know if you want, you can help me. I was a Italian prisoner of war in U.S.A. by August 7, 1943 to Sept 17, 1945. By August 7, 1943 to April 1, 1944 I was interred at "prisoner war camp Monticello" in Arkansas state. From April 3, 1944 to Sept. 17, 1945 was working very much in the Italian Service unit at "Letterkenny Ordnance Depot," in Pennsylvania. In October 1945, the American Command sent me back to Italy, and sir, you can imagine how much happy I felt, because I was thinking I was going home to hold my wife and children for ever. But, after I got in Italy, because my home is in Tripoli - Libia, and the Italian Command can't send me to Tripoli, because we have lost the war!

Sir, I know, if you want, you can send me to my home in Tripoli, because your country won the war and you are a high general, and you can do all what you like to do. I am praying you Sir, please, listen my pray and send me back to my home, where my wife and two little children are waiting for my return by long time. 

1. It is suggested that the Italian Government, through Ministry of Foreign Affairs, obtains permission for a/m PW to enter Holland. If said nation will accept him then efforts will be made to facilitate his return there.

You are informed that the Italian Government, in relation to particular cases that have presented themselves and further cases that will be presented, has given disposals that consents to the release of Italian Military Personnel PW who when freed, desire to remain in the Country where they find themselves, instead of returning to Italy.

The modalities that the POW must follows in these cases (who from the charge of the Italian representatives abroad) have been forwarded to said representatives (Italian Consuls).

For those PWs, who are still under the care of the Detaining Power, in Countries where there are no Italian representatives - Italian Consuls - (Colonies and British Dominions) disposals have been given that their request for release in those Countries, be made to the Italian Representatives in London through the Protecting Power.

The Italian Government has requested that the Italian Embassy in Madrid and the Italian Legations in Berna inform the Competent Authorities charged with the protection of our PWs of what is written above, and furthermore to inform the prisoners in question of these disposals and subsequently of the procedure to be followed.

In the meantime, in order that the procedures may not be delayed, the Italian Embassy in London has been asked to prospect to the Competent Authorities that the requests for release instead of passing to the protected Power, be sent directly from the interested parties to the Local Commands from which they depend, and which Commands will provide for the onward transmittal of said requests in the quickest manner, to the Control Authorities, that in turn will forward them to the Italian Diplomatic representative in Great Britain.

1. The a/m ex PW, of Cooperator Status, worked under the British Authorities in East Africa during the last part of his captivity, where he did excellent work, as can be seen by the attached correspondence.

2. Prior to his release, application was made for his direct repatriation to Somalia, where his family reside.

The family consists of his mother (old and sick) and his sister. He is the owner of a brewery in Mogadiscio.

Although it was obvious at the time of his release that no useful purpose would be served in returning him to Italy, where he has no interests or connections, instruction in force directed his repatriation to Italy; there was no way at that time by which he could be sent immediately to Somalia.

3. Apart from the fact that the circumstances warrant his presence in Somalia, his case would appear to come under the terms of Troopers' Signal: 57809 (AS2) of 171115 - May. A copy of this signal is attached at "A" for easy reference.

Unfortunately Pelosi is now in Rome, and the signal under reference lays down the procedure to be followed for the retention of the ex PW in the Command in which he is at present held.

In view of the foregoing circumstances, however, may application please be made for Pelosi to be returned to Somalia; if agreement can be obtained for this it is known that there will be no difficulty concerning a passage.


