1. Italian Troops attached to Fifth Army are rationed as follows:
 - a) Fifth Army requisitions on PES.
 - b) PES picks up the amounts requisitioned by Fifth Army from the Italian Army Depot and ships to Fifth Army.
2. The Italian Army Depot has been instructed to fill requisitions submitted by PES in order to insure that Italian rations will be available as needed for Italian Troops under Fifth Army Command.
3. A complete check of issues made by the Italian Army Depot to PES for shipment to Fifth Army, for the months of June and July has been made and is attached as Appendix "A".
4. The average ration strength of Italian Troops under command of Fifth Army for this period is estimated at a maximum of 8500. It is not possible for this office to figure exactly the ration strength, as men are on leave, sick in hospital, or absent for other reasons. Also, it is possible that some Italian Troops under command Fifth Army drew rations direct from Italian Depots.
5. Based on the 8500 ration strength for each day of the period, it is apparent that Fifth Army has overdrawn certain commodities as shown in Col. 4 of the Appendix. Pulses and dehydrated vegetables have not been figured, as these are substitute items, and the amount issued depends on the commodity.
6. Information is requested as to the method to be followed to adjust this account.



by the Italian Military, have been from U.S. stocks. Shipments received in excess of actual requirements were kept in U.S. stocks of Army Depot installations at Sparanise, Arunca, Rome, Anzio, Civitavecchia, and Piombino. As Army moved forward, these installations with stocks successively reverted to P.B.S. by transfer.

2. Administrative Memorandum, number 2, Allied Force Headquarters, 10 January 1944, subject: "Subsistence for Italian Military", has been the basis on which rations were issued to the Italian Military, including Carabinieri, as provided for in the above mentioned memorandum. This menu provides several variations in items issued, and the particular combinations, by which the weights contained in the basic communication were arrived at, cannot be determined. However, the average daily strength of Italian Military for the month of June was 9,858, and for the month of July 9,986, as compared with the figure of 8,500 used in the basic communication.

3. It is desired to emphasize the fact that it has been impossible to identify items of the ration for Italian Military, from any other type ration.

1. Direzione Commissariato Campania and Direzione, Commissariato, 212 Division have proposed to establish Distribution Depots in Naples and Aversa for the sole maintenance of 212 Division (US-ITI) in the Naples Area.

2. The Naples Distribution Depot (212 Division) will not be ready for operation until about 26 October. In the interim rations for 212 Division troops in the Naples Area will be drawn from Naples (ITI ITI) Distribution Depot and accounting will be accomplished by use of MMIS ST/8 form in accordance with MMIA Administrative Instruction #12 dated 12 October 1944.

3. In as much as approximately 95% of the units drawing rations from the Aversa (ITI ITI) Distribution Depot, are 212 Division (US ITI) troops, it was agreed, and approved by the Senior LO Naples, that the Aversa (ITI-ITI) Distribution Depot be turned over to the 212 Division. Remaining ITI-ITI troops maintained in Aversa area will draw rations from Aversa (212 Division to be) Depot.

Group with operating functions following the Allied Hqs, the strength of the 210 Division has increased very much and the strength of 10,000 men assigned to it previously.

Consequently, the rations which the 210 Div. must withdraw are actually about 12,500.

1. We wish to advise once again the policy governing shipments to 212 Division.

2. The policy and procedure is as follows:

a. HQ 212 Division will place a demand on you for rations; e.g., Piombino, Leghorn, or Civitavecchia.

b. You will determine the quantity of subsistence to be made available and advise HQ 212 Division when the rations will be ready for collection.

c. HQ, 212 Division (through Liaison Section, PBS) will procure transportation of these rations to destination desired.

d. When transportation (water, truck or rail) is available, 212 Division will collect rations from Naples Bulk Depot for despatch.

e. Responsibility ends in respect to Commissariato, Naples when subsistence is collected from the Naples Depot. 212 Division assumes responsibility when subsistence is signed for at the Naples Depot.

2. The average ration strength of all Italian units under command Fifth Army for the month of August was 3500. Therefore, a total consumption of 263,500 rations is indicated. The number of rations represented by the issue is shown by each item. Comparison of the rations furnished and the number which should have been consumed indicates either (1) a stockpile is being built up or (2) rations have been overdrawn and overissued.

1. Reference your AQ/2/13 of 19 September 1944.
2. Have submitted your figures for rations furnished Italian troops during the month of August to the Supply Section, G-4, 5th Army, but they tell me they are unable to tell me whether they are correct or not. Their records show, however, that they issued 482,424 rations to the Italian Military during August, which according to my figures, is 15,562 a day.
3. It is suggested, however, that the Status Reports for the Italian troops assigned to 5th Army for the month of August, show a ration strength of, approximately, 8500. But it is to be remembered that some Italian troops assigned to PBS and located in 5th Army area, drew rations from 5th Army dumps. What this figure is, I have never been able to learn.
4. Am inclosing copy of letter which I received today from 210 Division, in answer to my inquiry which I made of them after receiving your request, and at the same time, I asked G-4 for the information you wanted. This, as you will appreciate, adds nothing to an already confused situation.

SUBJECT: Situation of Rations ITI.-

TO : ITALIAN LIAISON OFFICE WITH FIFTH ARMY

Referring to your memorandum dated 24th Sept., we inform you that the amount of rations "ITI" received up to now from Dump Q 5/15 of Venturina, compared with the amount of the rations that should have been received on the base of the listing alledged to the above-mentioned memorandum, is the following:

The above-reported figures point out that there is no relation between the items assigned and the items recorded on the listing forwarded to us, and that the differences are in plus or even in less.

No other quantity of rations ITI has been delivered up to now; no withdrawal, therefore, has been made by the dependent units, the rations to distribute not being enough.

The figure of rations that should have been withdrawn on the base of the last strength situation of this Division is of 12,586 rations per day.

The listing of the units that should have drawn rations may be obtained from the situation and location - reports that are periodically forwarded also to your Office.

In regard to additional rations we inform you that this HQ has received up to the 31st of August, 44, from Dump Q 5/15 : 59,40 Qls of olive-oil - has not received tobacco, while we are ascertaining the amount of wine received which, to our opinion, seems to be much higher than the one recorded on the list of assignment.



1. Cheese is not an authorized substitute for the item of Meat or Fish on the single ration scale, and in no case will it be issued as such. We have a letter from the War Ministry stating that your office has given the Commissariato at Naples the authority to issue Cheese as a substitute for Meat and Fish. This practice will be discontinued immediately.
2. If the Italian War Ministry cannot make arrangements to distribute commodities equally between their depots after it has been delivered to them on the mainland of Italy, the Italian troops will have to be shorted on the ration scale of the commodity that cannot be equally distributed.

1. Cheese is not an authorized substitute for Meat or Fish, and in no instance will it be issued as such. We have informed our LO at Naples to have the Italian Depot to discontinue the issue of Cheese in lieu of Meat or Fish.

2. It is the responsibility of the Italian War Ministry to effect equal distribution of rations from their depots. There is sufficient stock of Meat and Fish in the Italian depots if equally distributed to maintain the issue from all depots of this item. If any commodity of the allied portion of the single ration scale is not present at a particular depot, and if an authorized substitute is not present, no other substitute will be used for the item. Therefore, your request to extend this issue of Cheese in lieu of Meat and Fish to all areas is disapproved.

Channels of Supply of Rations
for Italian Armed Forces in
Western Italy

STI/1

1. Commissariato Nazionale di Food Supplies issued by them to PBS in respect of maintenance of Italian Troops with 5 Army over dates March - end July 1944. These issues were made in compliance with instructions periodically received from Office of the Quartermaster PBS.

2. The figures are a combination of supplies requested in the name of 5 Army specifically and other supplies requested in the name of Single. The latter code-name was used first to cover Italian troops with 5 Army formations at Anzio and later has been used to refer to Italian troops with 5 Army formations at various points further north. The supplies listed in Appendix A were however all furnished in respect of Italian troops with 5 Army irrespective of variations in nomenclature.

3. Italian troops with PBS were originally supplied with food through the same channels as any other Italian troops in Campania i.e. by issues from Italian Army food distribution depots. When PBS extended northwards special arrangements came into existence similar to those already applying to Italian troops with 5 Army.

4. The position now reached in respect of channels of Supply of Rations for Italian Armed Forces in Western Italy is as follows:

- (a) There at present is a normal feeding strength of Italian Armed Forces in Campania (including Italian troops with PBS and III District) amounting to some 75000 troops. These troops all draw their Rations by units from the Italian distribution depots in Campania.
- (b) The Benevento Scheme is likely to mean a nett increase in the foregoing "normal" feeding strength amounting to an additional 20/25000 at the peak period in October (part of the troops at Benevento are already included in the strength figure in preceding sub-section).
- (c) About 1500 PBS Italian troops at present remaining at Anzio are fed from the Sezione Speciale di Sussistenza Posto Militare 181 which is a PBS-Italian food distribution depot supplied by PBS lorries this

cover Italian formations with 5 Army formations at Anzio and later has been used to refer to Italian troops with 5 Army formations at various points further north. The supplies listed in Appendix A were however all furnished in respect of Italian troops with 5 Army irrespective of variations in nomenclature.

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- (c) About 1500 PBS Italian troops at present remaining at Anzio are fed from the Sezione Speciale di Sussistenza Posto Militare 181 which is a PBS-Italian food distribution depot supplied by PBS lorries which draw in bulk from Naples Commissariato. This pocket of PBS Italian troops is expected to dwindle gradually.
- (d) 18000 Italian troops situated in the Rome Area will according to your ST/33/1 of 15 August 44 be fed w.e.f. 28 August 44 by means of a daily contingent of some 15 tons nett to be despatched by Naples Commissariato by rail to Littoria and thence by road.

(c) PBS Italian troops located in and near Civitavecchia totalling at present some 6500 are fed through the PBS-Italian food distribution depot at Civitavecchia (Base Logistica di Civitavecchia), which is maintained by means of consignments demanded by Comando Truppe Italiane PBS on Naples Commissariato and transported by road in PBS Lorries. The first such Civitavecchia consignment was 15000 Rations (30 days for 5000 men) moved early in July. A second parcel of 75000 Rations (15 days for 5000 men) was lifted at the end of July. A third parcel of 105000 Rations (15 days for 6500 men) was lifted on 17/21 August 44. These convoys consisting of negro drivers with Italian Carebinieri escorts with very limited officer personnel either from PBS proper or from Comando Truppe Italiane PBS are unsatisfactory administratively both as regards the loading operation and the actual convoy movement including protection of the cargo.

(f) Comando Truppe Italiane PBS (in their 02/805/Com. di Prot. of 19 August 44) have now placed a new demand on Commissariato Naples calling for 300000 Rations (30 days for 10000 men) to furnish a new PBS-Italian food distribution depot at Piombino (Base Logistica di Piombino) to service PBS Italian troops located at Grosseto - Piombino - Cecina - Livorno at present estimated at 6000 and increasing shortly to 10000. Action lies at time of writing with Commissariato Naples to communicate Itemised list including deadweight and cubage to PBS Italian Liaison Section in order that the means of transport for this consignment may be decided and arranged.

(g) 5 Army, in addition to Rations collected up to end of 11 August 44 (in Office of the Quartermaster PBS to Commissariato Naples) for 121900 Rations stated to represent 10 days for 14000 men. These Rations were alerted for collection for transport to dockside starting 21 August 44 but at time of writing the collection has not yet begun.

5. It will be observed from the foregoing paragraph that under present dispositions the whole of the approved strength of the Italian Armed Forces in Western Italy from Salerno to north of Leghorn depend for their food supplies on bulk issues operated in Naples by the Naples Commissariato.

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5. It will be observed from the foregoing paragraph that under present dispositions the whole of the approved strength of the Italian Armed Forces in Western Italy from Salerno to north of Leghorn depend for their food supplies on bulk issues operated in Naples by the Naples Commissariato. These bulk issues are at present operated for items of Allied origin by the Naples Special Depot (Depot 590) and for items of Italian origin (Olive Oil, Wine, Salt, Tobacco) by the already inadequate Naples Distribution Depot (Depot 593 Caserma Sani). This makes for regulating or coordinating the incidence of the various demands in the previous paragraph, since they are initiated separately by different organizations. Bulk issues are therefore at present liable to clash both among themselves and with intakes from convoys or railroad.

6. Apart from the problems of the excessive turnover thus concentrated in Naples and the long haul of supplies to the

north resulting from the present dispositions, there is a further difficulty concerning the discharge points in Western Italy of ITI food supplies from overseas. Whereas all demands are at present channelled to Naples Commissariato as demonstrated in para 4, ITI food supplies from overseas arriving in Western Italy are discharging at various points. As previously reported in our STW/3 various dates, Merrill (part cargo) W. Moseley, Gideon Wells, Irvin Mc Dowell, all discharged ITI Rations at Civitavecchia. S. Blatchford, J. Fiske, Hillary Herbert (part cargo), Beland Stanford discharged ITI Rations at Piombino. Other vessels on UGS 48 are still outstanding and relatively substantial tonnages of ITI Rations are notified for early arrival in UGS 49 and UGS 50. It is an even chance whether these latter consignments will be put down at Naples or elsewhere.

7. It is not known in this office what has taken place in regard to the ITI Rations already discharged at Civitavecchia and Piombino. It is however observed as noted paragraph 4 that demands to feed Italian Armed Forces in Western Italy are apparently at present falling 100% on Naples Commissariato. Re future discharges it is on file QSignal LX 31340 of 15 July 44 (SOS Natousa to PBS info 5 Army) that ITI Rations discharging at 5 Army ports will be absorbed into Quartermaster dumps against repayment of quantities per Manifest by PBS to Italian Army in Naples. 8. In order to dispose at one stroke of the three difficulties of excessive turnover in Naples, long hauls to the north and the problem of utilisation of ITI Rations discharging at Western Italy ports other than Naples the following solution is put forward for consideration.

- (a) 5 Army, and PBS in Civitavecchia and further northwards, to feed Italian troops attached to them from U.S. Quartermaster Stocks.
- (b) 5 Army, and PBS as defined, to take into U.S. Quartermaster Stocks all ITI Rations arriving by sea at ports in their respective areas.
- (c) Supplies issued as (a) to be offset against supplies received as (b) and not

The immediate future during the intervening months before any general reorganization can take effect. It is emphasised at an early date, a breakdown is likely to occur in the position can be made key items or impossibility of exhaustion of Naples Stocks of simultaneous operations which will be loaded on to the Naples Commissariato machine and the inadequate Italian military road transport in Campania. At any rate it is recommended that the present dispositions, which have grown up piecemeal, should be urgently reviewed and reorganised.

10. Meanwhile action is being taken at this end forthwith to stock the Naples Special Depot with Olive Oil, Wine, Salt in bulk so that large bulk issues for 5 Army-Piombino-Civitavecchia-Benevento can be operated for all items through Depot 590. This will simplify loading operations and the problems of convoy control and prevent delays at Depot 593 which is not designed or equipped to carry out bulk issues.

TO : Commanding Officer, Adriatic Depot, APO 388, U. S. Army

1. Reports have reached this Headquarters indicating that units of Italian Armed Forces engaged with or on behalf of the U. S. Army have not been properly or adequately clothed and that these personnel have indicated inability to secure these items from sources available to them. Further instances have been reported where clothing has been issued from U. S. Army stocks to Italian Military personnel.

2. Attention is invited to the existence of the Army Sub-Commission (short title MMIA) which has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all supplies and stores (rations, medical supplies, clothing, and fuel) presently authorized by the Combined Chiefs of Staff for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces who maintain their own flexible supply system for commodities furnished by the Allied Governments. For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores, MMIA, which operates directly under the supervision of Headquarters, ATI, and maintains close liaison with the Italian War Ministry, is the only agency which has the authority to issue or allocate any of the commodities mentioned to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

3. This Headquarters has been informed that stocks exist in Italian base depots located in areas where Italian Armed Forces are employed for issue for the purposes enumerated above, that all bona fide Italian Military personnel are fully cognizant of their prescribed scales and own supply channels through whom these supplies are to be obtained. Further, that failure on the part of U. S. Army elements to require Italian Military to abide by their own supply channels not only burdens the functions and responsibilities specifically charged to MMIA, but constitutes a violation of the instructions of higher authority. It is essential that requisitions originate in Italian unit concerned and be forwarded through Italian military channels to the Italian War Ministry which secures necessary approval and allocation from MMIA.

4. It is requested that all concerned be familiarised with the



 Subject: Food ration for ITI Armed Forces in Rome

With the note dated June 25, sent to St. Col. Hovare of MMIA and to this Hq, it was established that Allied food rations could be requested for ITI Armed Forces on duty in Rome up to a maximum of 12,000 units including 6000 for Carabinieri.

At first said assignment was sufficient for the requirements of the units located in Rome, which had begun the work of military reorganization.

The successive influx to Rome of units from the south, which have been placed in order and which have the right to withdraw rations reduces considerably the possibility of containing the requirements within the maximum no established(12,000). In the meeting held on July 8 at MMIA, there was established a reduction in the W.L. of units of the garrison permitting a minimum of regularly recognized units, with a minimum of personnel, such however to permit the reorganization and the functioning of the garrison.

Said reduction effected, the units and personnel attached were reduced to 15 28 as is shown on attached sheet.

On the 15th by order of the War Min. Cabinetto (very urgent for 19) there was established, with previous agreement with Allied Mil. Authorities that the feeding of all Italian units located in Rome should be effected from the Commissariat Div. starting on the 16th.

Translation No.2

Following said order, all the recognized units of the garrison and also the units coming from the south which previously applied to Allied Mil. warehouses for their rations applied to the Commissariat Directorate.

Consequently its number of withdrawals rose to approximately 20.000 as reported by us to the War Ministry-Div.

Gen. Commissariat with letter 2351 dated July 17.

We attach its relative dated (attached 2/a 2/b 2/c 2/d)

On the 18th following agreements reached between MMIA and its Com. Div. Gen. the total or partial exclusion from the withdrawal of rations was ordered of units once recognized as part of the garrison (see attached No.1) and which in the meeting held on July 8 the indispensability and the minimum of personnel to be employed, was established.

Various units (see attached No 3) not directly dependent on this Hq. and who worked for Allies (example Verseti and A.P.C. (all attached No.4) were also excluded from the withdrawal of rations.

As in the affected exclusion certain organs are included whose activities are indispensable (example, The Intendency delegations which on the 20th will be absorbed into the services office of this Hq.

Transit camp 105 which takes care of sending soldiers in transit from and C.I.L. cleaning up offices of various depots: part of the personnel of the districts). Please reconsider the units excluded from withdrawal of rations in order to give them again on the basis of an objective examination of the need for their functioning the same treatment which they once enjoyed.

Translant No.3

An eventual decision contrary to what was predicted taking away the source of food from said units, would paralyze completely their activity.

Should MMIA not be able to permit in whole or part the feeding of the units which are now excluded, in spite of what was reported above (see attached 3) Please procrastinate the measure for 4 or 5 days in order to permit us to ordered the dissolving of the dependent units and to close all the activities now progress.
