Am Contacting 9-th Corps Commissariate to see if anything can be done to relieve this situation. Also to CANOSA I found that the Warehouse was devided into two buildings some 800 Yards apart. This is unsatisfactory. Am seeing what can be done about it

10. There is a lot of unfit food at BARLETTA. This food has been awaiting an inspection since the 14-th of January. Have checked up to see if this will not happen again. I am taking it on myself to dispose of food supplies unfit for consumption.

11. The Depot at TRANI was exceptionally clean, the two others could stand a little cleaning. This matter has been corrected.

18 & 19. The handing capacity of this Depots is very small because of the help. Each Depot is very short of labour. They are cut down of Military personnel and are not able to get secure civilian labour because the wage scale does not come up to the wage scale of the Allies.

E. 1. The food Depot accounts are in accord. I checked at the Bulk Depots on amount of supplies sent to each one of the Depots that I have visited. The figures have tallied out in every case. The new system is an easier and is considered by all a very good move.

Aug 18. Called NAPLES and gave the Numbers of cars on fourth shipment of Olive Oil.

Aug 20. Received Instructions on the new accounting system. The Instruction sheets have been sent the depot Commanders so that they might be ready to start on this system Sept 9-th.

Aug 21. 46 B.S.D. picked up from Italian Bulk Depot 263000 pounds of flour for repayment for flour loaned them in March. Arrangement with the Adriatic Depot has been made to furnish the Army Hospital (Italian) at Bitonto with 200 pounds of Ice per day beginning Aug 26. - Mailed receipts on Hartnett and Teal.

Aug 22. Visited Depots in BARLETTA, CANOSA and TRANI. Made arrangements to transfer 84 tons of Meat to NAPLES Area. Received a letter from ADST MMIA requesting 150 lbs of Preserved Meat be ~~sent~~ <sup>1032</sup> NAPLES sector. Called Maj. CANN and was informed to disregard this letter.

Aug 23. Sent 7 Wagons of Preserved Meat to NAPLES consisting of 1775 Cases Salmon or 93960 pounds, 1740 Cases Vienna Sausage or 68752 lbs, 700 Cases Meat and Vegetable Stew or 3775 lbs.

Aug 24. Sick in Quarters no activity.

Aug 25. Have never been furnished with a complete list of amounts due Allied Depots from Italian Military. Contacted Maj CANN and was assured I would receive a complete list of commodities to be returned to Allied Depots.

Preserved Meat 455238 lbs. Have yet to receive 33762 lbs.

2. a) Am to receive from 22 CRASC 7500 liters of Wine to be  
shipped to NAPLES

b) Am to receive 15 tons Canned Spread from TARANTO sector.

B. Food stocks of this sector are at the present satisfactory.

C. The Italian Distribution Depot at MOLFETTA was visited  
during this weeks activities.

1. There was only a small amount of food in this Warehouse.  
The turnover assures that no foods stuff will remain too long in the  
depot. This depot feeds 950 men. The depot was clean and tidy. Lt.  
COLLETTA seems to have the depot well in hand though having only  
three men to help with issuing of all Italian supplies in his district.  
They have no guards other than those that sleep there. But I consider  
them adquate.

The depot is supplied from BARI by rail which has proven  
satisfactory. The only unsatisfactory thing I noted were that ~~withdrew~~  
their Warehouse with food supplies were Piles of old sacks. This has  
been corrected.

Aug 11. Contacted TARANTO LO by phone to obtain for Transporta-  
tion 15-th Air Force the amount of food stuff ex Torre Jarl on second  
trip in late June. -

Contacted Movements BRINDISI and receive No's of Wagons  
and amount og goods that has been sent BARI ex S.S. Hartnett and S.S.

Aug 12. 22 CRASO called and informed us that they had for issue 7600 litres of wine. Contacted ADST and was informed that we could accept if any Italian Organisation wanted it. Asked Commissariato IX Corps and was informed that they did not care for it. Maj MURCELL contacted NAPLES office and they are accepting.

Aug 13. 3 -rd shipment of Olive Oil in Cars No's 64142 - 5928 - 1208310 left BARI on train No 8432 at 132120 for NAPLES.

Aug 14 Completed reception of all but 35762 lbs of rations from Adriatic Depot.

Aug 15. Completed off loading S.S. Hartnett and S.S. Teal in BRINDISI.

Aug 16. Brought Port Detachment back from BRINDISI.

Aug 17. Have unloaded 14 of the 20 Cars from BRINDISI.  
360,000 Cigarettes were sent forward on the 14 Aug and 657  
lbs on 17 Aug, by 46 BSD by authority of ST/6/12 AAI dated 9 Aug 44.  
Contacted 46 BSD and received wagon No's on 4-th shipment  
of Olive Oil to NAPLES.
