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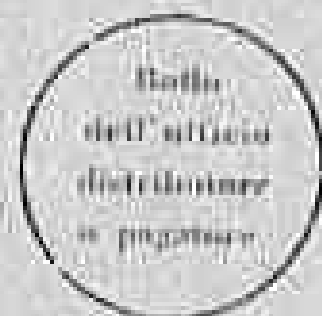

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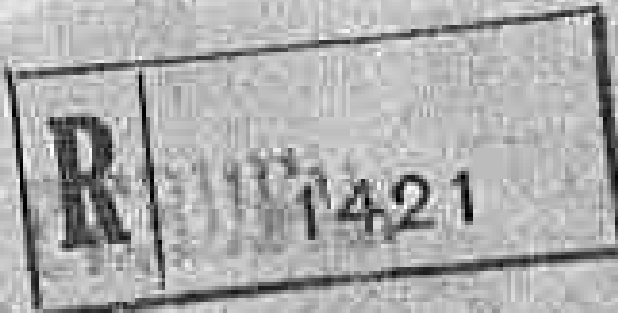

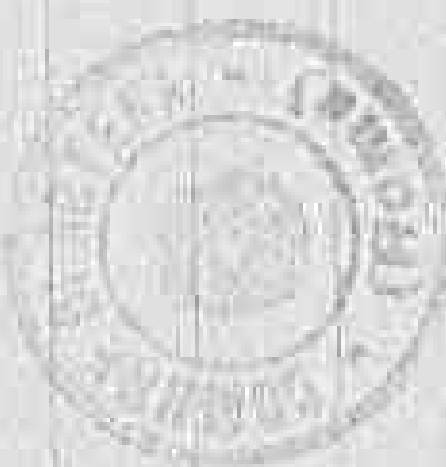

I the undersigned Molari Valeriano, residing at Moselice, Padova, via Argine Destro No. 1, father of the sargeant Molari Guerrino of the 88th Inf. Regt. Combat Group "Friuli" who died while fighting with the Allies at Abbazia Rioli dei Bagni (Ravenna) kindly requests you to help me in a just and human cause .

It is already two years that I awaiting the settlement of the war pension due to me for the death of my son, I have tried in every way to get this payment, but did not succeed, I hoped to receive same in order to get the corpse from Zattaglia to Monselice.

Further i was granted with a subsidy from the Community of Monselice, but eight months ago also this was taken off me.

Knowing what you are doing for all the combats, I take the liberty of asking you to intervene towards the Ministry of Defense in Rome in order to get the pension which is due to me, and if possible also towards the Prefect of Padua so as I may get back the subsidy.

I am sure that you will do this for me as you have done for all the people who have applied to you in similar cases.

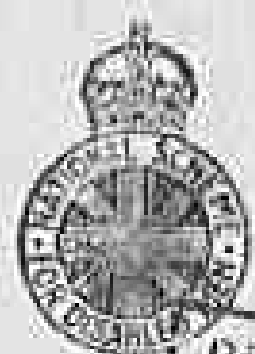

Your memorandum 64/A of 3rd May regarding claims by civilians: Vesnaver.

We agree with you that the British Government might well consider compensating Vesnaver's mother after verification of the facts. There is certainly some moral obligation on the part of the Government to do so.

Any legal obligation will depend on the conditions under which this man agreed to serve the British Army. Doubtless you will be able to find this out from the War Office, who must presumably grant the pension in any case.

In order subsequently to obtain the grant of a pension (which under existing arrangements would presumably have to be paid by the Italian Ministry of the Army) it would then be necessary to raise the case with them in a high-sounding letter in which reference would be made to Vesnaver's heroic sacrifice for the common cause, etc., etc., thereby leaving the Italians as little room as possible to suggest that his action had been that of a traitor to his country.

1. Reference attached copy of letter from A.M.G.,
VENEZIA GIULIA.
2. Without dates and facts from both sides of the
question it is difficult to form an opinion in this case, but
it would appear that VESNAVER was shot by the Italian Government
(in power at that time) as a traitor.
3. He appears to have been in the employ of Great
Britain when Italy was then at war.
4. It may therefore be that the British Government
might consider compensating his mother. On the other hand
as the Italian Fascist Government was later replaced by one
friendly to Britain, that new Government might (though I doubt

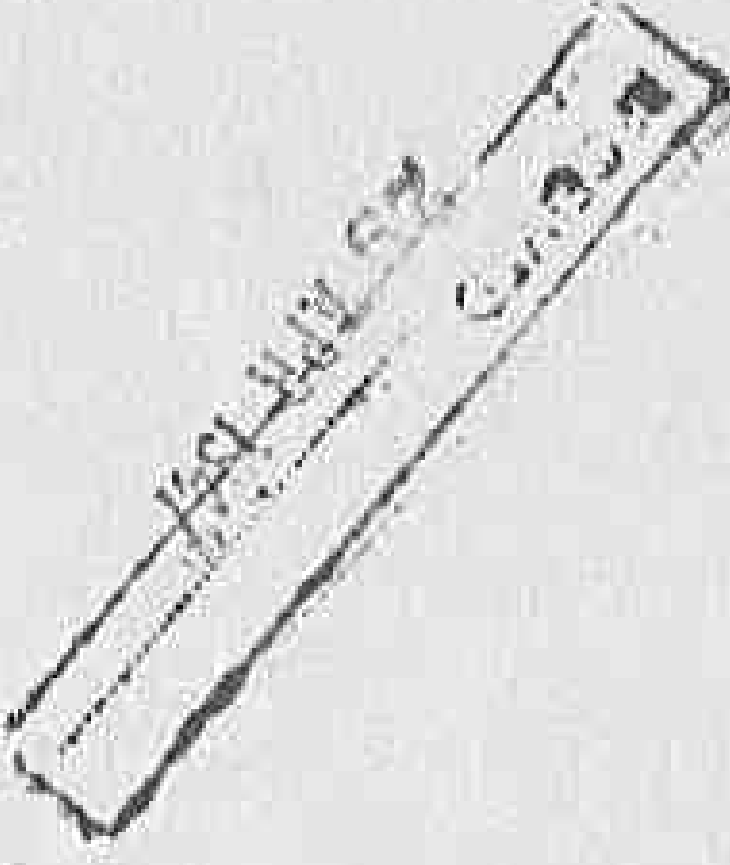

After the fall of Mussolini and apparently during the time when the Italians were secretly discussing armistice negotiations he was dropped by parachute in the Treviso area together with another friend of his one Andreoli Antonio. These 2 boys were captured apparently by pro fascist elements and after some sort of trial were condemned to death. They were shot at Maserata sul Piave near Treviso on 27.8.43 and their deaths are recorded in the Communal archives at Treviso (Tribunale Penale Civile Treviso under N. 216 RR 150 PM n. 506 cron.)

The mother of Vesnaver, Mrs. Rosa Vesnaver of Via Battara 22 - Trieste has made repeated applications for (a) compensation and (b) a pension without the slightest result and it seems apparent that somewhere in Italian officialdom there exists a voice which faintly whispers the word traitor.

1. I have read the letter from ANTONIO SARTORO dated 7 November 46 and memorandum of same date attached thereto, describing is activities in ETHIOPIA, BRITISH SOMALILAND, and ITALY, on behalf of the ALLIES.
2. Although not in a position to vouch for him in every respect, I can say that he was known to me (when Assistant Commandant of MANDERA Evacuation Camp) as a man working for the FSS in ETHIOPIA.
3. I remember one incident which took place at MANDERA, (where he lived as an "evacuee") late in 1942, viz., his visiting my tent one night to impart some information the nature of which I cannot now recall. This is probably what he refers to in penultimate paragraph of page 2 of memorandum.
4. Judging by the names of officers which he mentions, and knowing the conditions existing at the time, I would be inclined to believe a good part of his story.
5. As regards the War Office finding no trace of his name in official records, I can express very little surprise, and would quote the following paras of a private report I addressed to the Senior Evacuation Officer (Lt-Col T. MATTHEWS) on 30th March 1943:-

"6. In strict confidence I may say that I was astounded at the higgledy-piggledy fashion in which "Security" RECORDS were kept. NO Card-index system, NO nominal roll in alphabetical or other order and no proper register of ITALIAN civilians in DIHE DAWA except a sort of register supposed to be kept in chronological order (date when the man came first to the notice of "Security", dates of transfers etc.) but which was hopelessly incomplete and inaccurate. Capt MEEL said so himself.

7. The Sgt in the office who gave me the impression of being fairly efficient, had only been there a few days, and his predecessor had relied more on his own memory than on proper records (and his superior had apparently also relied on the same memory) with the results above described".
