CITATION FOR THE MEDAL OF FREEDOM
Bronze Palm

Major Luigi Andrea Calabrini, Italian Army, performed meritorious services in Italy from January 1945 to January 1946 with the Military Mission to the Italian Army. As Chief Italian Liaison Officer for Land Forces Sub-Commission with the Italian War Ministry he was responsible for the coordination and maintenance of proper liaison with the War Ministry exercising great force, tact and diplomacy in his dealings to the end that he has contributed materially to the successful accomplishment of the directives and policies of Land Forces Sub-Commission in bringing the Italian Army to a high state of efficiency in a short period of time. Major Calabrini, by his unselfish performance of his duties of high responsibility, his untiring efforts and distinguished service contributed materially to the Allied War effort in Italy and the successful termination of the Italian campaign all of which reflects great credit on himself and the Allied cause.

Honours and Awards to Italian Air Force Personnel.

15th February, 1947.

It is understood that on the 6th July 1946 and at the request of the Military Secretary, the Military Mission to the Italian Army (MMIA) forwarded recommendations to G.H.Q. Italy for 136 decorations and 84 Mentions in Dispatches to be awarded to members of the Italian Army who took part in the later stages of World War No. 2. It is believed that the authorities in London may authorize the award of these honours and decorations shortly after the Peace Treaty with Italy is ratified. It is requested that parallel action may be favourably considered in respect of personnel of the Italian Air Force by the Air Ministry, London; if necessary it is requested that the awards to the Italian Army be held up pending agreement on awards which may be made to Italian Air Force individuals.

2. The authorized strength of the Italian Army (excluding carabinieri) at the end of hostilities was 39,000, and the authorized strength of the Italian Air Force was 31,000. It may be argued that the proportion of honours and awards should be similar for both the Italian Army and the Italian Air Force; that would permit of 12 decorations and 7 Mentions in Dispatches to be awarded to personnel of the Italian Air Force. However, because a larger proportion of the Italian Air Force was in combat against the Germans than was the case in the Italian Army, it is requested that a higher proportion may be permitted to personnel of the Italian Air Force, namely 40 decorations and 45 Mentions in Dispatches. It is desired to recommend the award of the following number of decorations - 1 C.B., 3 C.B.E's, 7 C.M.E's, 5 M.B.E's, 2 R.M.B's, 4 D.S.O's, and 14 D.F.C's may I be informed whether this is agreed.

3. For your information, the Italian Air Ministry has not been consulted on this matter but in selecting those officers and other ranks most deserving of honours and awards it would be advantageous if the subject could be discussed with the Italian Chief of Air Staff. Provided the policy of awarding honours to Italian Air Force personnel is agreed in principle, it is requested that I may be authorized to consult the Italian Chief of Air Staff. It is not the intention to recommend any honours and awards for services rendered except during the period between the Armistice with Italy and the cessation of hostilities against Germany.

4. Citations in respect of honours and awards to personnel of the Italian Air Force are, for the most part, completed but a review is now being made and copies will be forwarded to the British Embassy in case the policy is undecided by the time this Headquarters folds up or shortly after ratification day. If, however, citations and an order of priority are required they will be forwarded.
