POST WAR PAY CODE - OTHER RANKS.

1. The new Pay Code will take effect from 1st July 1946.
2. The INITIAL CLASSIFICATION of the rate of pay due to the soldier on 1st July 1946, (including rank and service increments) will be undertaken by the regimental paymaster and will be based on the rate of pay in issue on 30th June 1946.
3. The rates of pay (old and new) will be furnished by the regimental paymaster on Pay Form 84 (copy attached). This pay form requires to be returned to the regimental paymaster either agreed or not agreed. It will be appreciated that the old rate of pay upon which the new rate has been assessed may not include all Part II/III Orders up to 30th June 1946, the Part II/III Order not having reached the regimental paymaster when Pay Form 84 was submitted. In such cases the Pay Form 84 should be returned to the regimental paymaster "not agreed" and a reference to the Part II/III Order inserted at space 'C' of the pay form.

4. Attention is drawn to the following points as regards Pay Form 84 :-

(a) Paragraph 2.

The comparison of the old rate of pay shown on the pay form with the last rate already appearing in the soldier's A.B. 64 (Part II).

(b) Paragraph 3.

The transmission of the pay form to the new O.C. where the soldier has left your unit or return of the pay form to the regimental paymaster with Part 'B' only completed where the soldier has left for India/SEAC on his present whereabouts are not known.

(c) Completion of Part 'C' - "Agreed" or "Not Agreed".

Where "Agreed" the new rate of pay must be entered in the soldier's A.B. 64 (Part II).

Where "Not Agreed" the reason for such non-agreement must be clearly stated in the space provided on the pay form.

5. Entries in A.B. 64 (Part II).

The new rates of pay from 1st July 1946 should be entered in the soldier's A.B. 64 (Part II) on pages 5 and 6 as follows :-

- (a) Rank. In space already provided at Column 1.
- (b) Classification. Star classification in space "Class" at Column 2 thus:-
"1 star", "2 stars", "3 stars".
- (c) Highest Skilled or Recruit. In space "Trade" or "IP" at Column 3 thus:-
"Highest Skilled", or "Recruit".

(d) Rate of Pay. In space "Rate", Part II of Column 4.

Where "Agreed" the new rate of pay must be entered in the soldier's A.B. 64 (Part II).

Where "Not Agreed" the reason for such non-agreement must be clearly stated in the space provided on the pay form.

5. Entries in A.B. 64 (Part II).

The new rates of pay from 1st July 1946 should be entered in the soldier's A.B. 64 (Part II) on pages 5 and 6 as follows :-

- (a) Rank. In space already provided at Column 1.
- (b) Classification. Star classification in space "Class" at Column 2 thus:-

NOTE: The line on pages 5 and 6 of A.B. 64 (Part II) immediately below the last pay particulars already appearing therein should be used where a fresh heading to a column is necessary O.G., Additional Pay, War Bonus, etc. The new pay particulars being entered on the following line.

6. Classifications and Reassignments on and after 1st July 1946.

Commanding Officers will publish in Part II/III Orders as soon as possible after 1st July 1946, the particulars of soldiers who were eligible on 1st July 1946 for a higher classification than that which has been assessed by the regimental paymaster in the INITIAL classification.

Commanding Officers are responsible for publication in Part II/III Orders of classifications and reassignments consequent upon casualties affecting a soldier's pay which occur on and after 1st July 1946.

7. Rank and Service increments on and after 1st July 1946.

The regimental paymaster will attach rank and service increments on and after 1st July 1946 as they fall due and these increments will not require to be published in Part II/III.

1. The question of travelling allowances, raised at the general conference held recently at this H.Q., has been under consideration.

1. Attached at Appendix 'A' to this letter is a summary of the terms of a white paper recently published on the subject of Post War Emoluments for other ranks.
2. The question of Post War Emoluments for officers is still under consideration.
3. Soldiers on Indian rates of pay, locally enlisted personnel, reunited overseas, women's services and personnel serving "boy service" are not covered by the terms of this white paper. These personnel will be dealt with separately.
4. It is the intention of the Government to institute new and simplified codes for pay, allowances, service pensions and gratuities for Navy, Army and RAF, giving more or less equal terms for all three services.
5. Copies of this White Paper are being forwarded to overseas commands but until distribution is effected the provisions affecting the army are repeated for INFORMATION ONLY.
6. CG Units will ensure that the provisions of the White Paper at Appendix 'A' are given the widest publicity.

APPENDIX 'A'

1. CLASSIFICATION FOR PAY

The present army system will be altered as far as it affects personnel who have passed the recruit stage.

All soldiers up to and including the rank of corporal will be classified as one star, two star or three star according to Military or trade qualifications.

In the case of Sgts and above there will be two classes; one for very highly skilled tradesmen and the other, for all others whether tradesmen or not.

Thus, with a few exceptions, tradesmen and non tradesmen will have the same scales of pay.

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15. DEPENDANTS ALLOWANCE AND WAR SERVICE GRANTS

No new claims for dependants allowance or war service grants, by regular soldiers, will be admitted after 1st January 1946. Men serving on regular engagements on that date, and men entering into regular engagements from active service or from release leave, between 1st January and 1st July 1946, will be allowed provisionally to continue these allowances if already in issue on 1st January. But the necessity for continuing allowances after 1st July 1947 will be reviewed before that date.

New rates of qualifying allotment for marriage allowance will as from 1st July 1946, be applied to ordinary dependants (which is the amount of state contribution to the allowance (which is inclusive of allotment) will be varied accordingly. Allowances will be payable under the family allowance act in respect of children of service men, in the ordinary way.

MISCELLANEOUS19. INSURANCE UNDER THE NATIONAL HEALTH SCHEME

Subject to the necessary modifications a soldier and his family will be eligible for the full range of benefits of the national insurance scheme or broadly equivalent benefits (eg Medical Attendance) under service arrangements. The present system of contributions will be adapted to suit the wider scope of the new scheme.

20. LENGTH OF ENGAGEMENT

The contemplated normal regular engagement will be, in future, for 5 years with the colours. In future all regular soldiers will normally be granted, pending discharge or transfer to the reserve, on completion of the normal period of service with colours, 28 days paid leave. He will be provided with a suitable outfit of civilian clothing or cash grant in lieu. Those whose colour service ends during currency of the present release scheme will receive same benefits as non-regulars.

23. PENSIONS

There will be a completely revised service pension scale which will become immediately applicable to all soldiers at present serving on regular engagements as well as those enlisting in the future. Pensions will be given on discharge, after 22 or more years colour service, on an improved scale under which, for instance a private with 22 years service in all may receive pension 26/- a week and serjeant with 22 years service in all may receive pension at the age of 40 of about 34/- a week. 1. Period of Service

It is hoped that the normal period of Foreign Service for men on first tour of duty will be reduced to 5 years as to men compared with 7 years before the War.

2. Transfer on Discharge and Re-entry

In future all regular soldiers will be sent home, discharged or transfer to the reserve on completion of normal period of service with the colours, ~~THEY WILL NOT BE~~ provided with a suitable allotment of civilian clothing or cash grant in lieu. Those who are on service and during current present release scheme will receive a benefit on re-regularity.

3. Pensions

There will be a completely revised Service Pension Scale which will become immediately applicable to all soldiers at present serving, as well as to those on whom it is operating in future.

Pensions will be given on discharge after 22 or more years of regular service on approved scale of pension, for instance, a Private with 22 years service in all may receive a pension of 24/- per week and a Sergeant with 22 years service in all may receive a pension of about 34/- a week; the maximum rate of pension for Warrant Officer Class 1 of very long service will be 55 per week.

As provided is in contemplation of future review of these new pension scales.

4. Gratuity on Termination of Service

Soldiers joining in future on regular engagements who do not serve on for pension but leave with not less than 15 years service will get gratuity ranging from 250 to 1200 according to length of service.

Soldiers already serving on regular engagements will qualify for these gratitudes according to service given after date of this announcement.
