Confirming my conversation last evening with Colonel Polese and Major Terranova the procedure laid down by Fifth Army for dealing with German Hospitals and Medical Units holding patients of enemy origin is as follows.

1. Owing to the large number of enemy sick and wounded in this area it is not possible to evacuate patients to Allied or Italian Hospitals and established German Hospitals will be left where at present situated. The German Medical Officers and orderlies will continue to care for their own wounded.
2. Rations will be obtained from the nearest German Unit or formation. 4 Corps will supply information as to the locality of such units.
3. Medical supplies can be obtained from German sources and it is estimated that the Germans have sufficient for eight months normal working.
4. Patients, when cured, will be taken to a concentration area. Care should be exercised to ensure that the German medical Officers do not retain patients already cured in the hospitals, with a view to delaying their evacuation to a concentration area.
5. The conditions regarding the treatment of prisoners and medical personnel as laid down in the Geneva Convention should be strictly complied with at all times.

The 332<sup>o</sup> Ospedale da Campo of the Legnano Gruppo is now without cedar-wood oil for use with the microscope and the Italian substitute is proving most unsatisfactory.

During a recent visit I was informed by the DDMS that it might be possible to provide a small quantity from British sources if the genuine oil could not be obtained from Italian medical stores. In spite of several enquiries it has been impossible to find a supply and it would be appreciated if about 10ccs could be made available for the hospital.



It would be appreciated if oil or paraffin stoves could be provided on a scale of two per hospital.

1. Hospital Diet Items

(a) AFHQ authorise the issue of hospital diet items only to Military Hospitals, but not to Unit Medical Officers. The issue of these items to Unit Medical Officers of COMBAT GROUPS has not previously been raised, but as a fairly generous estimate has always been made for the two Field Hospitals with each COMBAT GROUP, it is felt that a proportion of the Hospital allotment could be given to the Medical Section and Unit Medical Officers under arrangements entirely with the CHUPP. Please treat this as a suggestion only. Your allotment for FEBRUARY was authorised for release in 1 DISTRICT and was based on 200 beds.

(b) HQ 1 DISTRICT have a local arrangement with 209 Division who receive the bulk amounts for all Italian Hospitals in their Area. FOLGORE should therefore request 209 Division for their share for 516 and 517 Field Hospitals (200 beds)(see scale at APPX 'A') for the month of FEB.

(c) 8th ARMY find it more convenient to issue to individual Hospitals and the procedure is exactly the same for BRITISH Units, but issues are restricted as per scale at APPX 'A'.

2. Disinfectants etc. from RASC sources

(a) In the Rear of Army Boundaries, disinfectants are always obtained through Italian Medical supply channels in the same manner as for drugs. FOLGORE should therefore obtain these items as per scale at APPX 'B' from Medical Depot Store, ANCONA Military Hospital.

(b) 8th ARMY again find it more convenient to issue to Units direct from DIDs, although they may change this Policy as there is now an Italian Depot Med Stores at RIDINI.

3. Medical Supplies

These should be obtained from the Italian Depot at ANCONA Military Hospital. In Combat Areas 'S' or 'T' Adv Depots Med

(a) APPX authorises the issue of hospital items only to Military Hospitals, but not to Unit Medical Officers. The issue of these items to Unit Medical Officers of COMBAT GROUPS has not previously been raised, but as a fairly generous estimate has always been made for the two Field Hospitals with each COMBAT GROUP, it is felt that a proportion of the Hospital allotment could be given to the Medical Section and Unit Medical Officers under arrangements entirely with the CHIEF. Please treat this as a suggestion only. Your allotment for FEBRUARY was authorised for release in 1 DISTRICT and was based on 200 beds.

(b) HQ 1 DISTRICT have a local arrangement with 209 Division who receive the bulk amounts for all Italian Hospitals in their Area. FOLGORE should therefore request 209 Division for their share for 516 and 517 Field Hospitals (200 beds)( see scale at APPX 'A') for the month of FEB.

(c) 8th ARMY find it more convenient to issue to individual Hospitals and the procedure is exactly the same for BRITISH Units, but issues are restricted as per scale at APPX 'A'.

## 2. Disinfectants etc. from RASC sources

(a) In the Rear of Army Boundaries, disinfectants are always obtained through Italian Medical supply channels in the same manner as for drugs. FOLGORE should therefore obtain these items as per scale at APPX 'B' from Medical Depot Store, ANCONA Military Hospital.

(b) 8th ARMY again find it more convenient to issue to Units direct from DIDs, although they may change this Policy as there is now an Italian Depot Med Stores at RIMINI.

Re: Officer commanding,  
No 1 British General Hospital,

Personnel will only be issued to British Hospital units on the  
British Order of battle on the following conditions:-

- (a) On No 1 British General Hospital for the authorized representatives  
(b) Should be authorized to the non-British unit has received an  
adequate standard of competence in the use of the drug, in consider-  
ation this will involve specialist training.
- (b) No should be acquiesced with the conditions of storage.
- (c) He should be guaranteed that the unit can ensure adequate custody  
and strict accounting, and such time as will not be put to any  
unnecessary delay.
- (d) He will declare that, contents, he will have to be informed; however  
regarding to the command personnel for, certain supplies.
- (e) During the period of hospitalization personnel must be  
provided with a special member to other items thus going in for the  
category of this document.
- (f) In general, the use of some post war medical drugs in  
general hospital cannot be made as follows ~~in addition~~  
Sedative will be required, though denominationally similar to sedatives  
may be required.
- (g) The value of non-British in general, disease is at present, the  
subject of a large-scale investigation in Britain, and British personnel  
will this investigation be completed.
- (h) Other non-British personnel with consciousness may be granted with  
privileges only if the disease has been proved to be non-existent;  
and while personnel treatment will be carried out only in the ~~U.S.A.~~  
question of drugs in Veterinary, also.
- (i) All personnel will sympathize with contents to have the  
standard treatment with personnel etc.
- (j) Non-British, not issued to British, military medical units may be treated  
with morphine in the same way as British patients except as stated in  
Para 2(b).

4. This issue of authority to British Forces which are not on the British  
Order of battle is to be controlled by the D.P.M.C.

(e) OG No. 1 Penicillin Content -  
This should be entered in the non-medical unit personnel record on  
the same sheet of correspondence in the name of the unit. In certain  
cases this will involve multiple training.

- (f) He should be assigned with the conditions of storage.
  - (g) He should be informed that the unit can arrange storage custody  
and accountancy, and the drug will not be put to any  
unauthorized use, however.
  - (h) He will receive first exposure, if any, due to be learned, having  
refined to the extent possible for application control area.
  - (i) Training on methods of non-medical service personnel must be  
arranged for in a similar manner to other issues that come under this  
category of personnel storage.
3. (a) The treatment, type of use and method of storage will be discussed  
with the medical officer, and the latter will be made the authority  
of administration, though occasionally medical advice of certain authorities  
may be required.

- (b) The venue of recognition in general classes 1, 2 & 3B, the  
subject of a large-scale investigation in British and Polish personnel,  
until this investigation is completed:
- (1) Other anti-tuberculosis personnel will be treated with  
penicillin only if the disease has been diagnosed as no longer resistant,  
and this penicillin treatment will be carried out only in 6135  
district or division in Venereology, AMU.
  - (2) All other treatment personnel will continue to have the  
standard treatment with arsenicals etc.

- (c) Penicillin treatment in British Military Medical Units may be continued  
with penicillin in the same way as arsenicals except as stated in  
Para 2(d).

4. Kindness of penicillin to AIDS person which are not on the British  
Army of Service has not yet been established by AMO Office.
5. In this instruction the word "penicillin" refers to penicillin  
supplied by No. 1 Penicillin Control Room, and "British personnel" includes  
all members of the Armed Services of the United Kingdom.
