The attached report from the Senior Public Safety Officer of this Province is forwarded.

From this it will be seen that I am now prepared to dispense with the British Guard and I suggest that the Italian Military Guards be reduced to 1 and 12 on each of the Gaols in Udine and Pordenone.

I consider these guards necessary owing to shortage of Carabinieri, reported regularly for the past year, and to the fact that the prison guards are not wholly reliable, and in my opinion might not be able to withstand a prison revolt if assisted by outside elements.

The agitation for the release of partisan and other prisoners, including the Schio murderers, leads me to think that an attempt might at any time be made by their supporters to effect their release.

1. The position as regards the employment of military personnel as exterior guards for prisons in Udine Province is as follows.
2. It is true to say that it is not a normal function of military to guard civil prisons, but owing to exceptional conditions prevailing in this territory during the past 12 months, it was deemed essential in the interests of Public Safety that exterior guards should be provided. That this has been necessary is evidenced by the fact that one serious break-out occurred at a concentration camp in this Province and two quite serious revolts at Udine Jail, but in neither instance were the two latter in any way successful and, although damage was caused, no prisoner escaped.
3. The reason for the employment of military on these duties has been that owing to the frequently reported shortage of Carabinieri in the Province, insufficient manpower has been available from this force to meet the demand.
4. The numbers at present employed on exterior prison guard duty are as follows:-

5. With the present improved Public Safety situation generally, the passing of the election phase and the decrease in the number of prisoners detained owing to the recent Amnesty, the time is now an opportune to consider effecting an appreciable reduction in the employment of military guards at the above mentioned two jails. In February of this year 470 prisoners were detained at Udine Jail and 187 at Pordenone. The present numbers are 210 and 99 respectively.

6. Having consulted Major WAX, my successor, and the Italian Police Chiefs, we are agreed that in present circumstances the military guards may be reduced to the following with immediate effect:-

Duties to be carried out by three men at any one time on a 6 hour in 24 hour basis, one guard being stationed at the main entrance and two patrolling surrounding walls; the NCO. to have a general 24 hour responsibility.

7. The above reduction is recommended for a trial period of say 2 months during which time the present rather troubled international situation, which in itself affects Public Safety, may have become somewhat clarified. It will be remembered that on a previous occasion immediately following the withdrawal of the British Military Guards at Udine jail trouble arose there and in present circumstances, whilst it is not considered that existing Public Safety conditions render the employment of Military guards absolutely indispensable, I strongly recommend this reduction, rather than a complete withdrawal, for an interim period of say 2 months as suggested above. At the expiration of this period the question to be then further examined with a view to the complete withdrawal of military guards.

2. The reason for this is twofold:-

(1) The TOMMASO EM. which provides the guards at UDINE and PORDENONE is also responsible for running the VENEZIA GIULIA Security Line. Owing to the recent demobilisation of the 135/25 classes, the Em. has lost a great many old soldiers and finds it impossible to fulfil its commitments.

(2) It is not a normal function of the military to guard Civil Prisons, and as far as I know UDINE is the only Province in which they are required to do so.

At one time, Military Guards were provided at the BELLUNO Prison, but this commitment has since been taken over by the Ministry of the Interior. No Italian Military Guards are provided in the provinces of PAVIA, TREVISO, ROVERETO etc.

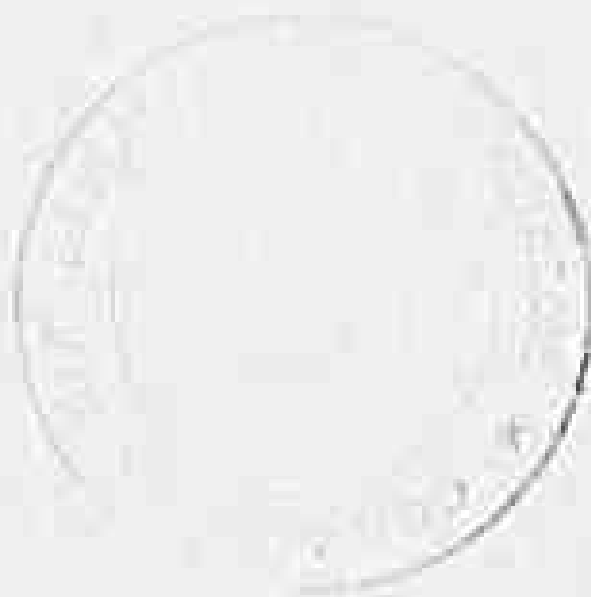

It is further reported that HQ 5 Territorial Region have requested the Ministry of War for relief of these guards in order that the men may accompany their own unit to ESTE for Election Duty; but that the Ministry of War have been unable to reach agreement with the Ministry of the Interior as to the provision of proper civilian guards and have therefore refused the request of 5 Territorial Region.

2. In the opinion of this HQ it is not the function of ALPINE Regts to provide guards for civil prison. The AQUILA Bn is moreover below strength and will presumably require these seventy men at ESTE.

Reference your 21X47/1. L'Aquila Bn has been located at Belluno because there are no available barracks in this territory. If I should be in charge of garrison services in that place, I would be heavily loaded down with another province without equivalent. As far as it concerns the forces, the Comiliter - Bolzano, is much better placed than this and I don't think that it is necessary that I should take care of garrison services there. It is not in the Army's line to provide jail guard and it is necessary that the Ministry for grace and justice provide its own service within this month. Within this month the L'Aquila Bn will move to Este where it will stop until the situation clears up. With ref also to conversation we had in Rome on 15 May, it is necessary and pressing that "Prefetti" provide their own services with their own means, otherwise our little force will be unsuccessfully dispersed. In the case of 6 Brit and Div, this will be done in agreement with HQ 86 Area who are responsible for the territorial adm of, and soon in, the area in which the Div is located.

A copy of the signal ordering the move should be sent to G(SD) 13 Corps for amendment of the Corps Locn State.

Disbandment of 718 Raggruppamento.

Proposals for the disbandment of 718 have been submitted to 13 Corps for approval. 5 Comiliter are all for this as it is clear that, with the small number of BR-ITI Units in this area, 718 have served no useful purpose. Moreover passed experience has proved that all urgent matters concerning BR-ITI Units and the Tolmezzo Bn are handled, through 5 B.L.U., by 5 Comiliter.

718 have handled matters on three occasions and we would be pleased to see this Unit disbanded.

SUBJECT:- Incidents at 5 C.A.R. Modena.

The call-up of class 24 has taken place in the dependent territory with sufficient regularity and satisfactory discipline and relative operations should have been finished at 24 hours of March 28, 1946; but, practically, it happens still at almost all Military Districts that recruits come in later, owing to them having exercised their political franchise. Presumably it will last till April 8-9/1946.

I'll send a more details with the final report on the call-up, as required by you. However if the coming of the recruits has not allowed any remarks, the situation, after their enlistment in the C.A.Rs., is not so good everywhere. As a matter of fact, at the C.A.R. of MODENA happened some incidents, whose gravity comes out from the Commander's report, copy of which I think opportune to have forwarded to you integrally. But as to the concern, it is rightful, in my opinion, to say that the incidents lamented at the C.A.R. of MODENA are to be most probably linked to a local stretched situation. I have been allowed to think so, after the report on other incidents which occurred at MODENA recently, copy of which is herewith attached.

As far as it concerns the cause being taken as a pretext for the serious incidents that took place in the C.A.R., an immediate inquiry has been made by my order, and, as a result of it, it has been known that bread and rations in distribution there match with the regulations as well, either for quality or for make. I have already informed of above incidents 5 Comiliter of Udine, stating that an urgent inspection by its Commander would be a very opportune one, so that he might ascertain too whether there has been any failure of good command or of timely intervention.

The specific threats of individuals inside or outside the C.A.R., which are being disclosed by the attached report N. 1., may lead to believe that more serious incidents could take place again, which couldn't be faced, but with adequate, and exceptional and severe precautions.

So far, it has been provided for an intervention of patrolling troops of 155 "Mantua" Arty Regiment and of 87 "Feltre" Regt - "Granatieri" Bn., located at Reggio Emilia - taking into consideration the place in which new incidents could happen and the reaction to severe precautions in civil and political circles

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As a prevention advice, there is no possibility of intervention, in my opinion, but the transfer to other places, as proposed by the C.A.R. Commander, of the most undisciplined men, having already been detected; but such action is to be previously confirmed by investigations carried out, as above mention, by the Commander of 5 Comiliter of Udine. No remarkable inconveniences have been taken place inside of the C.A.R. of PESARO, except a

Report by RAVALLIOLI Q, Col Commander, 5 C.A.R..

Incidents which took place at 5 C.A.R. Modena.

Last Sunday 31 Mar there were administrative elections at Modena, in view of this troops were confined to barracks. This precaution was taken in view of the intense propaganda of the Comm at Modena and to prevent the new recruits from coming in contact with them. This preventative could be double edged, so to prevent this a special meal was laid on for Sunday evening, also a show by Orfei Circus from 17.30 hrs to 19.30 hrs. So

the day passed quietly. The next day, 1 Apr. following the victory of the Comm in the elections, all the town was merry making, parades with red flags, loud speakers applauding the victory, songs etc. The men were not confined to barracks as it was thought that this was not an opportune moment to suspend leave for two days and for political reasons. The troops on entering the town found a burning atmosphere of enthusiasm, anti-military, anti communist. One might have felt this as several recruits failed to report in to the barracks at the correct time, coming in late and entering the barracks by climbing the walls. Both, Gens, Armellini and Cessari, who had been all the afternoon paying a visit to the barracks, inspecting sleeping quarters, messes and cook-houses and also having a long talk with the men, were able to notice this.

Yesterday morning, at about 08.00 hrs, as I entered the barracks, the picket officer reported to me that a mutiny had taken place in No 8 Coy at reveille. Men in a sleeping quarter were refusing to get up and said that an NCO, who assisted with the distribution of coffee, said he would place under arrest, a recruit who refused to get up and that the bread was black and not white as it had been in the past few days.

The intervention of the Orderly officer, Sub Lt Polese, Sub Lt Petrini and inspecting Capt Zella (who has sleeping accommodation at the barracks by my order) made all men get up.

The Coy walked out for training purposes at about 07.10 hrs. Four recruits, the most undisciplined of them, (two of them still in civilian clothes for lack of uniforms) were placed under arrest.

I waited for the return of the Coy at 11.00 hrs and spoke for a short time with the Bn Comd, Maj Savorino (who meanwhile had addressed the men at the parade ground). At about 11.30 hrs I went to the jail to question personally the four arrested men and I stopped there an hour, attempting to persuade them to be reasonable. Some of their complaints are

Pte Rossi promised that he too would be a good soldier if the causes of his dissatisfaction were removed.

Pte Naccari frankly stated that everything was planned the night before: so the foregoing motives cannot be taken as reliable any longer. He added that his behaviour would be good if he was transferred to the Air Force in which he had previously served for 30 months.

So I understand that it was a question of collective in-discipline being planned outside the barracks the night before, in agreement with subversive individuals. Thinking that the news of what had happened would leak outside the barracks, I told the men I would have them transferred to another unit, but accepted their word to say nothing outside on this I released them. The names of these four are: Naccari Bruno, Rossi Paolo, Gullo Giovanni and Casotti Nino.

At 12.30 hrs I walked out of jail with these men, the Bn Comd, Major Severino and Adj Major Casu. As soon as I reached the court yard north side of the barracks, I saw a crowd of some 300 to 400 soldiers who were shouting, whistling and cursing and another little group were singing the Red Flag.

The inspecting Capt and the duty officer were making an attempt to quell the riot. The other officers were at the mess outside the barracks. I faced the soldiers who immediately shut up, I removed them from the gateway to as far as the cook-house, but not all the men followed me; new small groups were surrounding the other four officers and I listened for three hours to their complaints endeavouring to persuade them to a reasonable frame of mind.

Main complaints and objections are as far as I can remember:

1. Bread black and unentable.
2. Meals are unsatisfactory and always the same.
3. Macaroni always the same, spaghetti should be distributed.
4. An issue of 113 grams of meat not 80 grams.
5. Pay 25 lire instead of 24 (see attached folio).
6. Apples and almonds always issued. Could not these be replaced by other kinds?
7. The soldiers of the Mess Committee are not honest.
8. The officers enjoy much better food, they should get the same as ORs.
9. They were told at the Mil District that Allied rations would be given and not the bad ones they were getting. It is an injustice the soldiers only get 24 lire and a policeman gets 300 lire. 24 lire is not enough to send home letters.
10. The men called up are all poor, the rich have not been called up; they are paying the Mil Districts for this.
11. They are being cheated by those 2,000 lire.
12. 7 training hours are too long with the rations allowed.
13. The hrs of freedom are very few and lights out too early.
14. 18.00.

14. They have a mind to come back to barracks at their leisure, for a few sleeping hrs are enough for them.
15. The officers want to teach them how to be disciplined.
16. But they don't agree with it, being a fascist stuff.

17. They want to report personally to the Colonel at their own convenience, not through the usual channels any more, because it is not democracy but facicism.
18. There is still the Crown of Savoia on the official seals as well as on the badges, and they want to get rid with this.
19. They have presented themselves on account of a lot of good things promised them, otherwise they wouldn't have come. If things are going on this way, they will return home.
20. The duty officer usually brings his revolver on the (Sam Browne) belt, and this is a challenge.
21. If the Government has no money to feed them properly and to improve their living standard, it is useless to call-up soldiers.
22. The men belonging to the first four-month period of class 1924 have served for a quarter only, while they have to serve for a year.
23. The Government is not entitled to call-up soldiers, as it is not a regular one. Moreover many of them stated that they should be exempt from military service, because of their family situation.

At 15.30 hrs I succeeded in getting them back to their sleeping quarters for training. A Coy, according to the programme, took ablutions.

Some officers reported to me that some soldiers went away while I was addressing them saying: Let hâm do it; we have not come here for them; we know why we got here!

Other men, astraddle on the wall were talking with civilians standing by Emilia street and looking for weapons. A corporal came on and sent them away.

At 17.30 hours the second meal was distributed without incidents. As soon as I returned to my office, I asked for a phone relay with 5 Territorial H.Q. Udine, but I did not get it, and with the Infantry Command of Venice too, but General Cessari was still out. Later I sent my adjutant to Bologna to report on to those Territorial H.Q. and I personally called upon the "Prefect" of Modena. Afterwards I informed the Group Command of Carabinieri of Modena about the incidents.

Through notices I have checked up that:

1. The meal distribution was issued at 11.15 hours very quietly.
2. At about 12.15 hours a score of soldiers, moving from the south-side of the barracks and calling downstairs their fellows from the pavillions, started a strike; the a crowd growing up gradually met at the north court-yard, where I still found them at about 16.30 hours.

I think that the reasons of above incidents are as follows: Undoubtedly the actual rations don't match with the habit and requirements of our soldiers. Perhaps no fresh or dry

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I think that the reasons of above incidents are as follows: Undoubtedly the actual rations don't match with the habit and requirements of our soldiers. Perhaps no fish or dry fruits, no tinned meat with vegetables, but more macaroni and rice and normal rations of fresh meat would be welcome. One cannot say that bread rations are not enough or bad, but white bread turning suddenly into black has been a pretext and caused discontentment.

Newspapers have promised too much, as well as the Communists and Mil Districts. As a matter of fact, these soldiers have come in full of striking pretenses, that are very difficult to deal with.

3.) They cannot really called recruits, many of them served either in republican or german or partisan formations and are already full of rebelling and antimilitarist spirit. In view of administrative and political elections, there has been an intense propaganda and the situation is somewhat uncertain. In my opinion, the left party has operated deeply in this zone, raising excitement, by organized and systematic work.

5.) Corporals, lance-corporals, N.C.Os. as well as the subaltern officers are not trained suitably and can't properly take care and morally master their men, neutralizing any suborning plot coming from outside.

6.) As each Coy numbers 325 men, no efficient control can be carried on.

7.) Subversive propaganda cells are existing among the recruits themselves, perhaps in any Coy or smaller unit too.

Last night to-day (April 3) everything was regular and very quiet. As soon as I came into the barracks, I was told that: 1. Soldiers of 1 Bn were very sorry for what happened yesterday and wished to apologize to me.

2. Other soldiers had a mind to strike again, and I believe that what has happened or will happen is due to outside influence.

Besides eventual provisions to make better meals and family-allowances, I think that it is necessary to have the rebelling servicemen transferred to Central or southern Italy, and to stop sending bad individuals from other C.A.Re. to that Modena; for the zone of Modena is particularly turbulent specially at this time. This is the advise of local Authorities too.

Herewith attached a report of the local press, to-day's issue, which is not reliable for its alterations of truth.

INTERNAL SECURITY
MAINTENANCE

1. Object of Study

It defines the co-ordination and control to be taken by all units located within the area in order to :-

- (a) Safeguard personnel and of 2nd class institutions.
- (b) To act in the event of low and action.

This letter is not intended to deal with the event of an outbreak of hostilities though the emergency measures indicated herein would normally be applicable to such an event.

2. Scope of possible disturbances

While the present state of civil and city security within the area is satisfactory, disturbances of the following nature might arise :-

- (a) Actual or assumed situation for or without violence or against exclusion or the Indian etc.
- (b) Any demonstration of a political nature possibly combined with a strike or other form of political action and thus indirectly against the Government.
- (c) Any demonstration, possibly organized by students against the Government.

- (d) Any action by certain political or others which might be taken against or against Indian interests in or of such kind activity in other ways.

The variety of situations, the small number of the available and the frequent change of units within the area makes the possibility of any such action or disturbance and necessitates the situation of the strongest possible response.

3. Local Mil Movement

- (a) General Principles

Responsibility for the state of the and under rests on all who hold the guns and city police forces. Only when the Provincial Commissioner or his senior may on the spot consider that the situation is becoming so serious to public safety that it cannot be handled by the police forces at their disposal is full intervention necessary.

When the decision that the situation is beyond their power is made, the Provincial Commissioner must decide the situation is beyond their power.

1622

(b) SHI ACTION

Request for all assistance will normally be made by the Provincial Government to the SHI. In an emergency situation, it may be made by any Provincial Officer to the nearest SHI and who will coordinate his assistance as to whether the urgency of the situation warrants him taking action without prior reference to the SHI.

Whilst every effort will be made to ensure that the safety of the personnel and property under their charge, assistance to SHI will not be given without authority of the SHI by units located within 100 miles of them. Units located outside the 100-mile radius shall act on their own when the SHI could be satisfied that he has sufficient force to achieve the desired effect and that the delay in referring to the SHI will prejudice the achievement of this effect.

4. SHI ACTION

(a) The object of SHI action is to restore the situation so that the intent of law and order can revert to SHI.

To this end only the minimum force will be used and all action of an offensive nature will cease as soon as it is apparent that the object, i.e., restoration of order, security of vital points, etc. has been achieved.

(b) When SHI operations will be taken to ward against surprise, i.e., pre-emptive action, of over value, security of SHI. This is particularly necessary if the SHI is located in a high-risk area and on the receiving of a message.

(c) When a reasonably large number of individuals of different SHI units have to be rapidly assembled, there will be an increase, SHI, etc. and a definite chain of command.

(d) If, in the opinion of the SHI, it is necessary to open fire, the following procedure will, wherever possible, be adopted:-

(i) SHI will be SHI that SHI will be effective i.e. - not over their heads.

4. Self-Defense

(a) The object of self-defense is to avert the situation so that the right of innocent persons is not lost.

To this end only the minimum force may be used and all notion of an offensive action will disappear as soon as it is apparent that the object, i.e., the preservation of the right of innocent persons, has been achieved.

(c) When an apparently innocent person, individually or collectively, is to be treated as a criminal, there must be one instance, i.e., one and a definite case of self-defense.

(d) If, in the opinion of the person in command, it is necessary to use force, the following principles apply, however possible, no matter:-

(1) (a) Second aim is that there will be no excessive force - not over their heads.

(2) (a) That the person in command is not to allow clearly no more than the minimum force or the minimum use of force the number of persons to be taken.

(3) (a) First aim, however possible, to prevent the situation.

(4) (a) Every effort must be made to avoid injury to women or children.

(5) (a) Immediate action will be taken to recover those injured.

- (ii) Grenades will only be issued to and used by the on the orders of an officer.
- (iii) The fact that a smoke or tear gas grenade will be used will, when possible, be notified to the rioters as well as to the police.
- (iv) Care is to be taken to ensure that the crowd have adequate means of rapid dispersal and are not so restricted by buildings etc. that any use of the use of such gas could result in serious casualties, more especially to women and children.
- (v) The use of smoke gas, including "White Phosphorus Smoke" is forbidden.
- (vi) A small issue of tear gas grenades is authorized for use only in 1st, these will be carried by selected individuals ready for issue and use if so ordered by an officer.

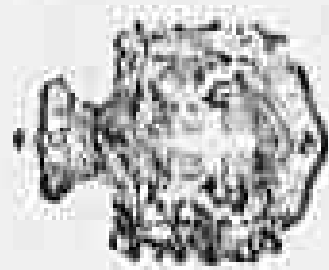

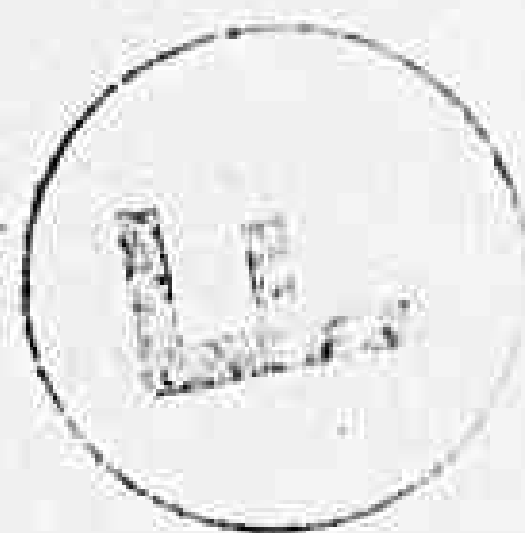
