1. The Italian Military Barracks accommodation in the neighbourhood of VENEZIA contains a number of empty quarters (a) The Mater Barracks (b) Mater Barracks and (c) The Mater Regina Elena Barracks as follows

2. The situation respecting these barracks reveals that in September of this year the Mater Barracks was in use as an HQ for the 22 British Airborne Div. Mater Barracks in VENEZIA house contained the files and documents of the Italian Military Liaison Unit and housed the Royal Police. The Regina Elena Barracks was also an Allied base and provided accommodation for Polish troops.

3. As a result of the above mentioned to remain possession of the Regina Elena Barracks as soon as this building was no longer required for Allied troops and arrangements were made for this end.

4. On 26 Nov 1946 Italian action was received indicating that the Polish troops had been allocated and without other notice it was learned that the Regina Elena Barracks had been handed over for the use of the Civil Police Authorities.

5. The matter was taken up with HQ 36 Area but nothing was achieved in writing. As a result this HQ was taken into an agreement with AIA & QMC 36 Area and a meeting took place on Sunday Nov 17, 1946.

6. A discussion meeting was held and was covered into covering the following main points:

- (a) DAA & QMC made it clear
 - (i) That QMC was the local owner of Regina Elena Barracks.
 - (ii) They urgently need to re-occupy it for use as a Military Formation HQ.
 - (iii) QMC directed ADIA 1003 No 10 dated 2 Nov 45. laid down the policy in this matter.
 - (iv) 5 Reg 3-6 had been by what seemed to be unilateral action, been deprived of the whole of their quarters in the Venezia Area.
 - (v) The necessity for occupation of Allied troops was well known and understood but the handing over of such quarters to the Civil Authorities was another matter.
- (b) ADIA 1003 Area decided as follows
 - (i) The policy in this matter was not disputed.
 - (ii) The action of 36 Area in converting the Civil Police to enter and occupy the Regina Elena Barracks was dictated by urgent local necessity to preserve law and order among the civil population as a result of certain serious incidents.
 - (iii) This action followed urgent requests made by Italian Ministry

REPORT ON VISIT TO THE HOSPITAL AT DDA 1000

1. DDA 1000 visited the above named hospital on Thursday 24 Nov 46 at 1400 hrs.
2. He was met by the Comander Officer and introduced to the medical officers of the hospital who received him in a most cordial and helpful manner which prevailed throughout the entire visit.
3. The main points arising from this visit were observed as follows:
 - (a) Lack of glass in many of the windows is largely nullifying attempts to keep the place warm, heated.
 - (b) This should be regarded as a matter for urgent attention. In the Officers Wing repairs are urgently required to the ceiling.
