Report on Visit by Ord Officer and G II (L).

The Ordnance Officer 5 Terr Comd, was visited, and from him we ascertained the system in use for the supply of stores and replacements in respect of clothing to the Divs under Command.

The scale of clothing is the same as that laid down in the letter from ILFB, and differs very little from our own scale. A snap check was made of soldiers entering the office, and from this it appeared that most first line troops were up to scale, but personnel employed in offices and in other sedentary jobs were on a slightly restricted issue of the scale. It was explained that this was to give full issue to troops on more active duties, such as training.

It was stated that not much reliance could be taken on indents received from Divs as it was certain that in most cases they were grossly over indenting.

All indents are placed in the first instance on Terr Comd, who supply all available stores. Non available items are then extracted and passed to the Ministry to be covered. It is understood that the Ministry then endeavours to supply from existing stocks. If complete stocks are not available, contracts are put out for local supply. It is understood that a series of running contracts are in being at the present time.

The Ministry have stores in each Terr Comd., and from these stores, clothing is passed to Div for issue to subordinate Comds. It was explained that a new system similar to our own is being organised. i.e, Base Ordnance Depot which supply the demands of ADOS or DADOS Dumps who in turn supply the demands made by the individual Units or Formations.

A soldier of the Alpini Regt was interrogated, and although he had certain deficiencies, it would appear that a sensible way of making issues had been employed. One man was issued with a boot brush and another with a clothes brush, and this system enabled two men to use one issue of kit. Many of the toilet articles shown on the scale were not issued, and the man stated that such items were bought at private expense. Under issues were made to men due for early release, and not to the soldier with a long term to serve.

1. The situation has been discussed with Defence Ministry (Army) Commissariato. Action is being taken to remedy deficiencies and priority will continue to be given to Folgore and Mantova Divisions.

Inquiries have been made and the following information obtained.

1. Ref your para 2.

(a) The troops are not fully equipped to scale. Main deficiencies are :-

(1) Boots. MANTOVA Div state that they are 11,000 pairs deficient. No definite figures have yet been obtained from FOLGORE Div, but it is evident that only a small percentage of men have two pairs. In most units there is a pool of boots and so, when a man sends his boots for repair, he is normally loaned another pair from the pool.

(ii) Shirts. MANTOVA Div deficient of 14,000. No figures yet from FOLGORE. As the scale is 3 shirts per man, it is not thought that the deficiency is serious.

(iii) Socks. MANTOVA Div have got 2 pairs per man. FOLGORE Div average 1 1/2 pairs per man. The quality is poor. The "Linen foot covers" are not popular with the MANTOVA Div.

(iv) Denims. As we know them are not in use. Certain Dvr Nees etc are issued with overalls. Divs try to issue each man with a part worn suit of battle dress (recovered from men who go on release) as a working dress.

(v) Waterproof
Cover. There is a large deficiency in both Divs.

(vi) Web
Equipment. There is a deficiency of belts (2,500 in MANTOVA Div) and arklata web.

(vii) P.T. Shoes. Only about 50% of the men have P.T. shoes.

(viii) Small
Kit. Many items, e.g. Brushes clothes and boot etc are shared one between two men.

(ix) Various Italian soldiers who, from time to time enter this HQ were questioned regarding the state of their kit, it was found that, in most cases, they were reasonably

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(viii) Small Kit. Many items, e.g. Brushes clothes and boot etc are shared one between two men.

(ix) Various Italian soldiers etc, from time to time enter this Div were questioned regarding the state of their kit, it was found that, in most cases, they were reasonably up to scale

(b) As far as can be seen energetic action is being taken by Div Staffs to make good the deficiencies. There did at one time appear to be a tendency to "hit back" - on the grounds that a soldier is supposed to arrive from the U.A.R. fully equipped, and as he is released in nine months time he should not want much clothing anyway. Div Staffs are now thinking otherwise.

(c) Divs are required to report to Territorial Command by the end of the month their deficiencies in winter clothing.

2. Ref your para 3.

I have not been able to get a very satisfactory answer regarding the channel of demand. It appears that Divs place all their demands on Territorial Command. If the latter cannot satisfy they in turn demand on the War Ministry. Terr Comd are authorised to make quite considerable local purchases.

3. Recommendations for an increase of scale have been suggested by Divs for the following items.

- (i) Two Khaki flannel shirts for use with Battle Dress
- (ii) K.D. Trousers increase from 1 to 2 pairs.
- (iii) Socks Increase from 2 to 4 pairs.
- (iv) Handkerchieves. Increase from 2 to 4.

1. Your AQ/55/6 dated 16 July 47 received in reply to this HQ Q. 003/LF dated 7 July 47 which called for an urgent report for the information of the GOC.

The reply is so ambiguous as to be of little or no value; nor, as it was signed by your Staff Captain, does it appear to have been seen by you before despatch. | *yes it was*

2. It is evident that these divisions are not yet in good shape as regards clothing. The Ministry of Defence have given an assurance they will receive priority and that their outstanding demands have been met.

What we want to know is:

- (a) Are the troops equipped to scale (See Appendix "A" attached).
- (b) Are you satisfied energetic action is being taken by Div staff to make good deficiencies and to benefit by the priority they are stated to enjoy.
- (c) Is provision being made for winter requirements.

3. The difficulties in the way of ascertaining this information without direct interference are appreciated, but you are on the spot and your report is needed to check Defence Ministry statements which often only reflect book keeping and ledger statistics.

The responsibility of 5 Territorial Command is also not clear as the Defence Ministry (Commissariato) state the Div Commanders are authorised to demand direct on them for some items and on Udine Depot for others.

1. I received folio 3 for action on Saturday 12th., and immediately contacted Terr. Comd., since they were the only source of infm at such short notice. The need for urgency of reply was stressed.
2. The infm was received (folio 5) on the 16th., after repeated demands to Terr. Comd, and despatched to I.L.F.B., at once (folio 6) pointing out the ambiguity of Terr. Comd's reply. It is difficult to see how more detailed infm could have been obtained in 48 hours - that given really only represented an interim report.

Visits of GS011 and myself to Div HQ's and units which are now taking place will give more concrete facts. This method is almost foolproof but takes time.
Tact has to be exercised since any suggestion of interference has to be avoided, but from the one visit we have already made I believe that Commanders will cooperate.
3. I feel that I.L.F.B. should have embodied para's 2 and 3 (inc scale of clothing and equipment) in their original letter, we would then have had something upon which to work.
4. I have now studied the scale of C & E and feel that this is adequate, except possibly that Trousers KD and Shorts KD should be increased to 2 per man.
5. The answers to para 2 (a) (b) and (c) of current I.L.F.B. letter can only be ~~xx~~ given by Div Commanders, and I respectfully suggest that the GS011 and myself should pay a personal visit to Div HQ's to request this infm.


