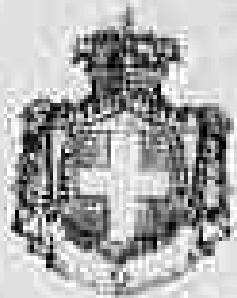

Subject: Messing of Greek Mercantile Marine.

1. In response to Communication No. 541 dated 5 March 1945 from the Greek Delegation to the Advisory Council for Italy, the Navy Sub-Commission has made enquiries concerning the British Naval facilities available at Naples for personnel of the Greek Mercantile Marine.

2. It has been determined that the arrangements at Naples are that there is a Mercantile Marine Club which is open to both officers and men of the Greek Merchant Marine Service. The Royal Navy Fleet Club is not large enough to accommodate all Merchant Marine personnel and therefore is not open to members of the Greek Service; however, there is no differentiation between Greek personnel and personnel of other nationalities.

3. In regard to messes, the Navy Sub-Commission has been informed that arrangements for Greek Mercantile Service officers and men are made by the British Ministry of War Transport, as in the case of British Mercantile Marine personnel.

MESSING OF GREEK MERCANTILE MARINE

With reference to your letter No. FOHAM 505-4 of the 19th March, the arrangements at Naples are -

- (a) there is a Mercantile Marine Club open to Officers and men of that Service;
- (b) the Royal Navy Fleet Club is not large enough to accommodate all Mercantile Marines, and therefore is not open to the Greek service, but there is no differentiation between Greek and other personnel;
- (c) if Messes are referred to, the Greek Mercantile Officers and men would be dealt with by M.W.T., as in the case of British personnel of the Mercantile Marine.

2. It is pointed out that visits of Greek Merchant ships to Naples are of rare occurrence.
