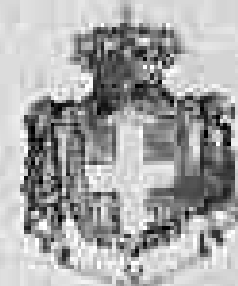

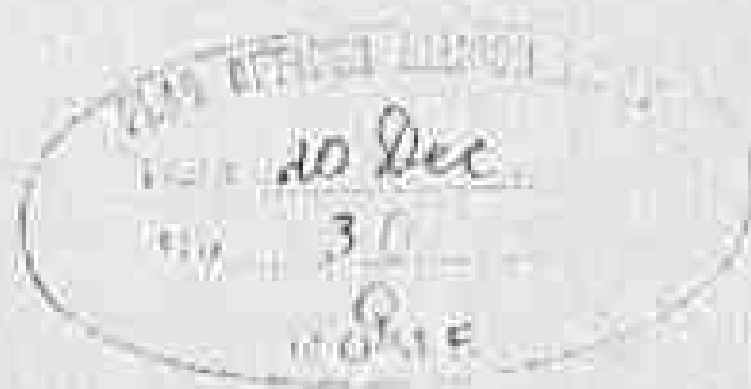

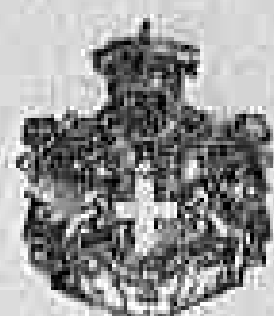

After a long year I can now write to you. You cannot imagine how anxiously I followed the Allied Advance, and now that Nice has been liberated I hasten to let you have news of me which I hope will reach you soon. Am in excellent health and I hope you are the same. I am very far away from you and also away from all danger; there is only one thing I regret and that is the lack of news from you. I know that as I am far away you will never be easy in your mind - but just think about and take care of yourself and the rest can wait.

When you get this letter please reply at once; you can do this through Allied Command.

I must leave you now, Mother, in the hope that this letter will make your mind easier than it will have been for more than a year. With a long embrace I say Goodbye, looking forward to a reply from you. I shall write a longer letter shortly. Dante is well.

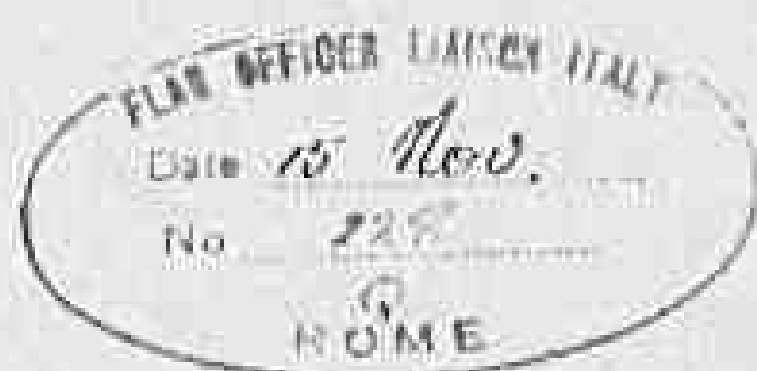

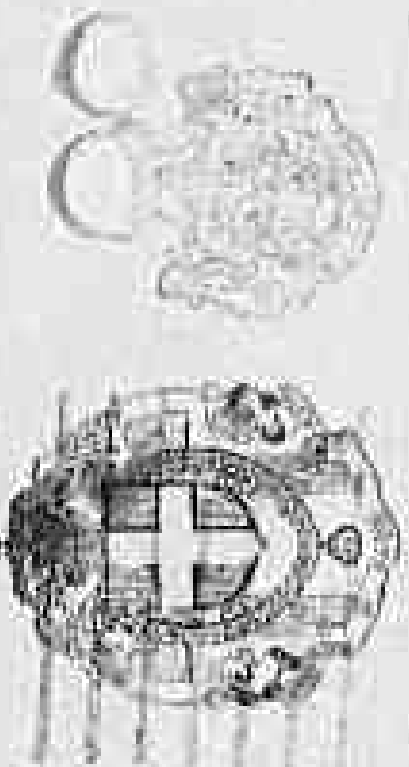

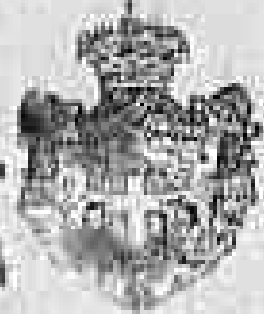
