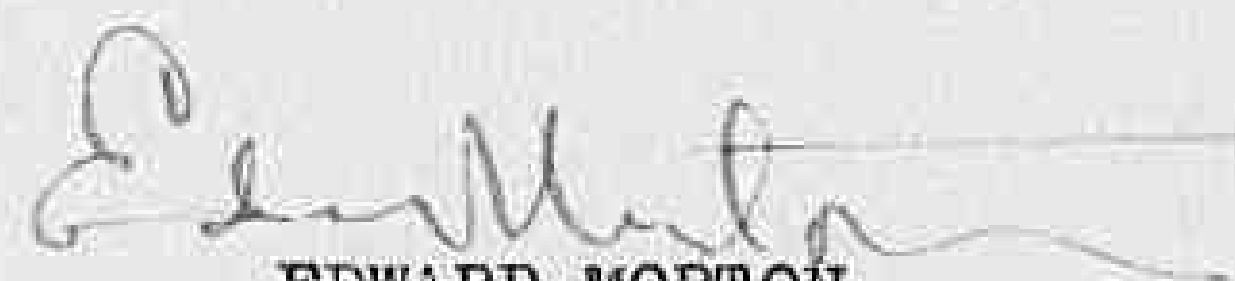

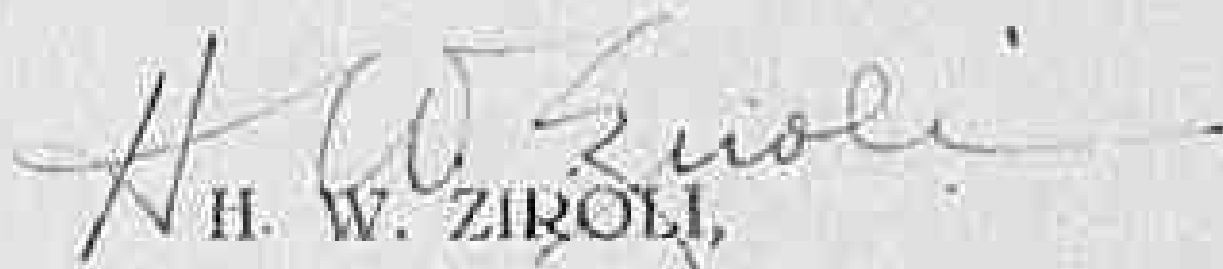

1. Ref. your NSC/1603 of 1 FEB 45, Para. 1 (a).
2. The motorboat in question was sold by Lt. INGRASSIA to Giuseppe and Giovanni BRIGNONE, who hold AMG F/F 1 No. 71453, dated 31 NOV 43, signed by Lt. INGRASSIA, acknowledging receipt of Lire 30,000 (thirty thousand) in respect of "2 motors and fishing boat". This description was amended later (I understand by the then Regional Finance Officer), who added "ALFA ROMEO 800 - Naval boat". The boat had in fact been taken over by the Italian Navy previous to the occupation of the island. The second motor was that of the boat. Neither engine was in complete running order, certain parts being missing.
3. The BRIGNONES have partially dismantled the boat with the view of its enlargement and conversion to a fishingboat. Following a visit of inspection by Capitano di Vascello INDELICATO of the Sicilian Lights Service, the Lampedusa Capitaneria received a communication from its command at Porto Empedocle. Work on the boat was blocked pending a settlement of the affair, the order to do so being confirmed by this CAO.
4. May I point out, incidentally, that C. di V. INDELICATO'S visit has not yet had the result of reorganising the Lights Service. The question of payment of auxiliary lighthouse men has not been settled, and they are still having to be kept by the Comune. Refund has not been made to AMG for advances to them from April to August 1944 or for kerosene supplied. Details of the amount involved have been forwarded to the Chief Finance Officer at his request. The only refund made has been in respect of the one regular lighthouse man. There are three lights, two at Lampedusa and one at Linosa.

With reference to the Ministry's letter No. SM.5559 of 22nd March, 1945, difficulty in obtaining materials stated to be available on the open market has also been experienced by Allied Naval Authorities.

2. In reply to representations on this subject, the Allied Forces Local Resources Section have pointed out that the Allied Military Government, as the only agency authorised to freeze stocks of materials in forward areas, has authority to freeze articles other than those on the Controlled and Restricted Lists drawn up by the Allied Forces Local Resources Section. It is therefore advisable that the availability of non-controlled and non-restricted materials should first be taken up with the appropriate Provincial Supply Officer, Allied Commission, to ensure that no difficulties are in the way of supply.

3. The Allied Forces Local Resources Section also mention that the publication of availabilities on the open market cannot be regarded as a guarantee that the materials have not, meanwhile, been disposed of.

Headquarters, Liguria Region's No. N.W.P./1 dated 27th January, 1945, is returned with the following comments, as requested in paragraph 2 of your covering letter No. NSG/1572 dated 29th January, 1945.

2. At the recent Conference held in Rome on 10th February, 1945, it was stated that the Royal Navy were unable to open the ports of Spezia, Genoa, Savona and Imperia simultaneously. It was hoped, however, that Genoa and Savona might, as far as possible, be opened together and that the 30 tons of stores for Spezia should be transported by road.

3. Facts about the time required to open the ports were also forthcoming from the Conference and the final estimate, which included both minesweeping and salvage, was two months. This was, of course, for Liberty ships. It is difficult to estimate how far in advance of this date it will be possible to get L.C.T. into the ports, but a month after capture is a possible, although an optimistic, estimate.

4. To carry out this initial lift of stores into Genoa, it is estimated 4 L.C.T. will be required. As it is presumed that the stores which we are unable to lift into Imperia, will be acceptable at Savona, 2 L.C.T. will be required for that port, making a total of 6 L.C.T. for the whole requirement.

5. It will be necessary to request an allocation of these L.C.T. from the Commander-in-Chief, Mediterranean, and no guarantee can be given that we shall be allocated the number of L.C.T. for which we request. But I should be grateful if you could approach the Regional Commissioner, Liguria Region, and certify whether my comments are acceptable and whether I can proceed with my request for the allocation of the L.C.T.
