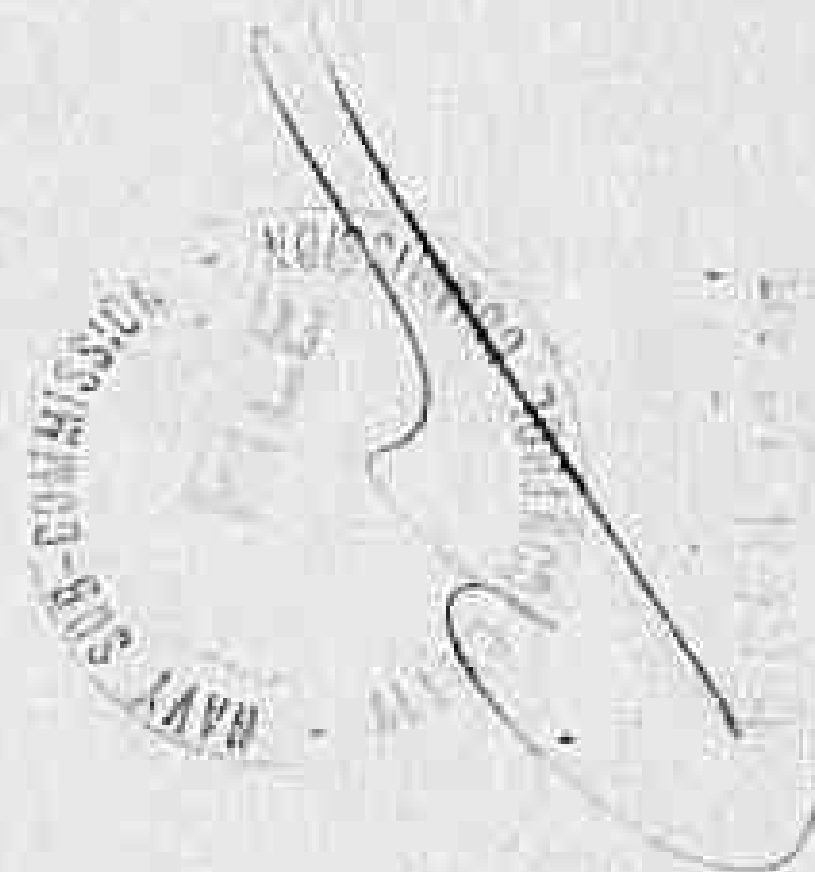

SUBJECT: Issue Allied Supplies and Stores to Italian Armed Forces.

1. These instructions pertain to the control of stores and supplies which have been or may be authorized for issue to the Italian Armed Forces by the Combined Chiefs of Staff on an Allied basis. They do not apply to stores or equipment which have been or may be authorized by any Allied Nation from its own stocks or depots to equip or maintain Italian units or services working directly for or on behalf of that Allied Nation. It does not apply to Air Force technical stores nor to Naval stores, except as these stores may be common user items furnished on an international basis. These instructions apply equally to the Italian mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an international basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The Army Sub-Commission (short title WMIA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores WMIA will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters AAI. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by CAO AAI and DCAO AAI, respectively, for British and United States commodities. The senior British officer at Headquarters WMIA will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior United States officer at Headquarters WMIA will supervise the supply of other stores.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by CAO AAI and DCAO AAI, respectively, for British and United States commodities. The senior British officer at Headquarters NMIA will supervise the supply of medical stores. The senior United States officer at Headquarters NMIA will supervise the supply of subsistence. They will jointly supervise the supply of clothing recognizing the primary interest of the nation of ownership. POL will continue to be handled as prescribed in AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 11 cs.

5. At Headquarters AAI, the review and supervision of the supply system will be the responsibility of the CAO (SR) for stores of British ownership and the DCAO (U.S.) for stores of United States ownership.

6. Issues of other common user stores and equipment except those which may be specifically authorized from National depots to Italian forces serving with National troops, will be controlled by NMIA. Repairable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued

under the provisions of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 5, 7 January 1944, will be allocated by MMIA to Italian forces and will not be issued directly by U. S. or British services without prior authority of MMIA. Where practicable such items after repair will be depoted in Italian depots prior to issue. MMIA will report monthly to the Chief Accountant the receipt of such salvage clothing received from Allied services in the theatre.

SUBJECT: Issue Allied supplies and stores to Italian Armed Forces.

1. These instructions pertain to the control of stores and supplies which have been or may be authorized for issue to the Italian Armed Forces by the Combined Chiefs of Staff on an Allied basis. They do not apply to stores or equipment which have been or may be authorized by any Allied Nation from its own stocks or depots to equip or maintain Italian units or services working directly for or on behalf of that Allied Nation. It does not apply to Air Force technical stores nor to naval stores, except as these stores may be common user items furnished on an international basis. These instructions apply equally to the Italian Mainland, Sicily, Sardinia and Corsica.

2. The following categories have been authorized and are being furnished on an international basis: rations, medical supplies, clothing and fuel (POL). The United States has assumed primary responsibility for rations (subsistence). The United Kingdom has assumed primary responsibility for medical supplies. Joint responsibility has been assumed for clothing. POL products will be furnished thru the normal existing petroleum state procedure.

3. The Army Sub-Commission (short title NMIA) has been designated as the executive agency for the supervision, distribution, allocation, and accounting for all the supplies and stores presently authorized by the CCS for issue to any or all of the Italian Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force). For all matters pertaining to these supplies and stores NMIA will operate directly under the supervision of Headquarters AAI. No other agency has authority to issue or allocate any of these commodities to any of the Italian Armed Forces.

4. To comply with the directive of the CCS that the nation of ownership shall exercise controlling authority over issues the following will apply, subject to policy control by CAO AAI and DCAO AAI, respectively, for British and United States commodities.

POL will continue to be handled as prescribed in ARHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 11 ca.

5. At Headquarters AAI, the review and supervision of the supply system will be the responsibility of the CAO (Br) for stores of British ownership and the DCAO (U.S.) for stores of United States ownership.

6. Issues of other common user stores and equipment except those which may be specifically authorized from National depots to Italian forces serving with National troops, will be controlled by MMIA. Repairable salvaged shoes and clothing which are issued

Such buildings and churches will be treated in exactly the same manner as the Vatican City State, except that during the assault on ROME the diplomatic immunity of these Vatican properties will not be allowed to interfere with military operations, bombing, artillery fire, etc.

This must be done in agreement with the Vatican authorities. - (a) All other Vatican property throughout ITALY will be accorded the treatment of property of a neutral state in foreign territory.
- (b) Except in the case of urgent military necessity no Vatican property or property which existing occupants claim to be the property of the Vatican, will be requisitioned or converted to military use without the authority in writing of this HQ.

(c) In the case of urgent military necessity the procedure laid down in Administrative Instruction No 10, par 3, for Historical Buildings will be adopted. (This Administrative Instruction is reprinted in the Allied Control Commission Lists of Protected Monuments).

(d) At Appendix "B" is given a list of Vatican Property outside ROME, which is of special religious and historical significance; these require special efforts to preserve them from damage.

5. RELIGIOUS PROPERTY OTHER THAN VATICAN PROPERTY.

(a) Religious property other than Vatican property, if essential for military operations, may be occupied. Churches are subject to special provisions see sub-para (c) below.

(b) All questions relating to requisition or occupation of religious property will in every case be referred to this HQ.

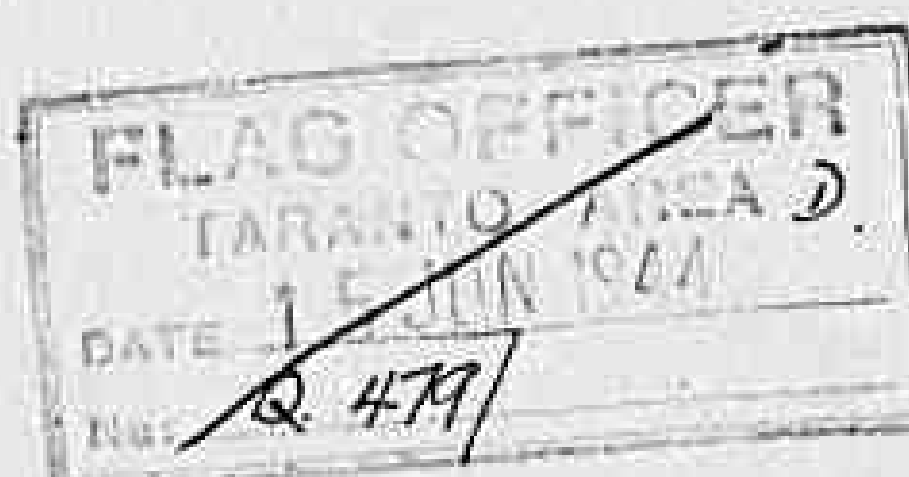

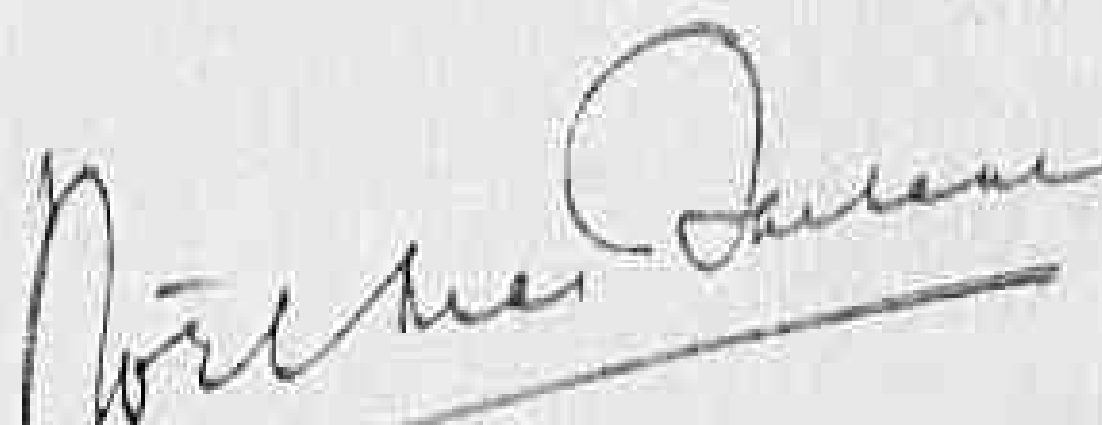

1. At a meeting held in the office of the Brigadier, Q(AE), on Friday 13 Oct 44, it was suggested that the present practice of requisitioning vehicles in this theatre should be reviewed in view of the shortage of certain types of military vehicles.

2. At present vehicles in Italy can be requisitioned only on behalf of the ACC except in cases of operational necessity. This rule was made by AAI at a time when the shortage of vehicles in the ACC was acute compared with the situation in the American and British Armies. This situation has now changed. The following new procedure is suggested, and will be discussed further at a meeting in the office of the Brigadier, Q(AE), at 1500 hours on Wednesday 25 Oct 44.
