Application was made by Agriculture Sub Commission in Sept 1944 for authority to have the above named Italian Officer, then described as of the Field Artillery, assigned to their Fisheries Division. This authority could not be given see attached copy letter.

There is no establishment for Italian Liaison Officers in this formation, and the above named Officer is not held on the strength of any of the Italian units controlled by this Branch.

Italian Officers can be assigned to units only on the authority of A.F.H.Q., and it is the policy of A.F.H.Q. that Italian Officers will not be assigned to civil positions.

If Lt. FERRARO is now an Officer of the Italian Royal Navy, it would appear that this is a matter for the decision of the Navy Sub Commission.

Reference your AGI/507/6 dated 25 Sept 44 addressed to Army Sub Commission.

1. A reply has been received from M.M.I.A. stating that the Italian Army personnel cannot be assigned to duties which are not military, and as the Minister for War has no connection with the operation of fisheries, authority cannot be given for the posting of the above named officer to the Agriculture Sub Commission for duty with the Fisheries Division.
2. If it is desired to use Italian Army officers, on civil works, such officers must be demobilized from the Army and revert to civilian status.
3. Should Lt. Ferraro desire to be demobilized from the Army and be employed as a civilian by the Italian Civil Ministry concerned, it is suggested that his application for demobilization from the Army, together with your recommendation, be forwarded to this H.Q. for onward transmission, through M.M.I.A. to the Minister of War.

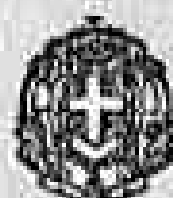

These personnel will be sent only upon the request of N.O.I.C. Trieste, to whom they must apply always for instructions and support.

The personnel sent are to wear civilian clothing, or better working-overalls, without distinctive markings, in order to avoid hostile demonstrations by local elements of malintent.

Means of transport will be provided by the Allied Authorities.

The date of commencing this service and the order putting it into effect will be communicated to you.

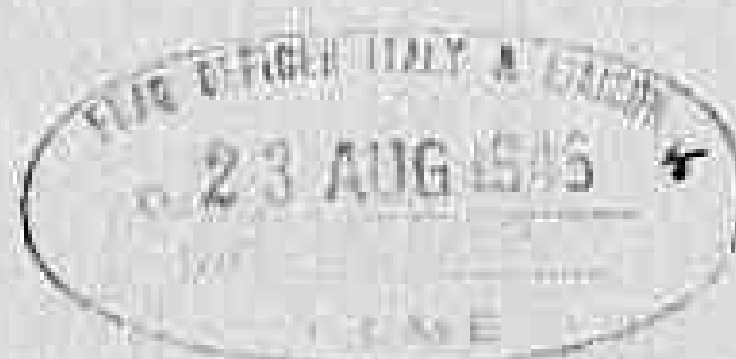

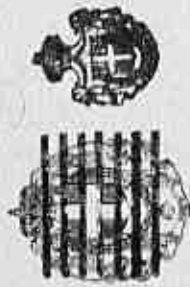

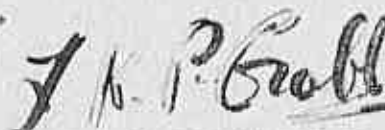
