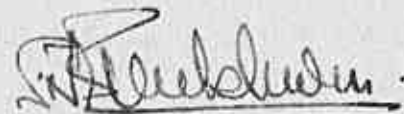

1. G-5 Section, AFHQ, has informed this Headquarters that it has been agreed that the Italian Government may be permitted to appoint service attaches to neutral capitals subject to each individual appointment being approved by both the British and American representatives as well as the Supreme Allied Commander, Mediterranean. Consideration would also be taken as to whether such appointments would be useful to the Allied war effort.

2. In the case of the United Nations, appointments would be limited to countries whose forces are actively engaged in the Italian theatre and would also be subject to SACMED's approval.

3. It is not intended that this information be transmitted to the Italian Government unless applications have been received by you from the Italian Government for the appointment of service attaches. Therefore, it would be appreciated if you would inform the Executive Commissioner's Office if any applications have been received to date.

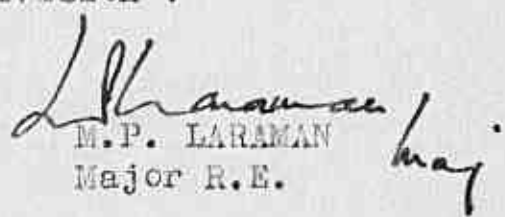

MEMORANDUM FOR THE ALLIED COMMISSION

Subject: Italian diplomatic Missions to South America.

1. Reference is made to previous correspondence on the above subject and in particular to this Ministry's Memorandum n. 3/2593/1326, dated August 5th, 1945.

2. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs warmly thank the Allied Authorities for the interest they have displayed in this matter and for their granting a general authorization for the voyage of the Italian destroyer "Mitragliere" to Barcelona.

3. However in view of the fact that the final permit for said destroyer's voyage had not reached this Ministry in time, reservations on the Spanish s/s "Cabo de Hornos" for the members of the Italian diplomatic Missions to South America were cancelled.

4. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs beg to inform the Allied Commission that they still intend to make use of the aforesaid authorization as soon as the Italian Embassy in Madrid will communicate the next scheduled sailing for South America of a Spanish steamer.

5. Since this date is believed to be near, the Ministry for Foreign Affairs would be very grateful if the Allied Commission could take those steps that may seem fit in order to expedite the issuance of the final permit for the above named Italian destroyer's voyage to Spain.

6. It will be greatly appreciated if the A.C. will consider the matter as very urgent.
